TONIGHT'S GAME: Is **Game 1** of a 4-game series vs **Cothran Togna's Marlins** and **Game 7** (2-4) of the Reds' last road trip of the season (1-2 at Cubs, 1-2 at Mil, **0-0 at Mia**)...the Reds are **7-22** in their **last 29 road games**...following this series and Monday's off day the Redlegs will finish the **2018 championship season** with a 5-game homestand vs the **Royals** (2g) and **Pirates** (3g).

SERIES NOTES: The Reds haven't produced a winning season vs the **Marlins** since they went **4-3 in 2014**...since then, and including a 2-1 series loss in **May at Great American Ball Park**, Cin is **9-15 vs Mia** (3-4, 3-4, 2-5, 1-2)...the Reds earned a 6-4 win in the teams' final 2017 meeting to snap an **8-game losing streak** here at **Marlins Park**...over the previous 3 seasons, Cin **lost 9** of its **last 11 games** here...Cin is **3-0** with the **Marlins Park** roof open, **6-12** with the roof closed...**Reds vs Marlins** info on **Page 323**.

ROYALS UP NEXT: The Reds and Royals meet **Tue & Wed** for their second series of the season...the Reds are **10-13 all-time vs the Royals**, including a 2-game series sweep at **Kaufmann Stadium** earlier this season (**6/12-6/13**)...the **5-1 victory** on **6/12** snapped a **5-game losing streak** on the **eighth anniversary** of the Reds' last win vs KC (11-5, **6/12/10 at GABP**)...**Reds vs Royals** information is on media guide **Page 334**...this season the Reds are **10-8 vs the American League**, including a **6-game winning streak vs the AL** from **4/29-7/2** that ranks as their **longest interleague winning streak**...beginning in **1997** the Reds are **148-205 all-time vs the AL**, at **.419** the **second-lowest interleague winning percentage** of any Major League team (SD, 156-218, .417)...Cin hasn't produced a **winning record vs the American League** since **2013** (11-9)...in **5 seasons** since then are **33-65 vs AL** (.337)...**Reds vs AL opponents** information is on media guide **Page 332**.

SHUT OUT: The Reds have been **shut out** 12 times this season, their highest total since **2015** (13 SHO) and including twice in the last 3 games and 3 times in the last 5 games...are coming off **2 shutout losses** in the series at **Miller Park** and were shut out **5 times overall** by the Brewers this season...were shut out 5 times in a season by a single team for the first time since the **1960 Pirates** shut out the Reds 5 times...the Reds have been held to **3 runs or fewer** in 8 consecutive games for the first time since an **11-game stretch** from **7/18-7/29, 2014**...during this 8-game stretch Reds batters are **hitting .206** (53-257), including **.064 with RISP** (3-47), with **11 runs scored** (1.38 r/g)...Reds pitchers during this 8-game stretch are **3-5, 3.44** (68ip, 26er).

APRIL 19: The Reds are **62-73** since **4/19**, when they replaced manager **Bryan Price** and pitching coach **Mack Jenkins**...bench coach **Jim Riggleman** became interim manager, Class AAA Louisville manager **Pat Kelly** (#60) was promoted to serve as interim bench coach, and Class AA Pensacola pitching coach **Danny Darwin** (#52) joined the Reds' Major League staff as interim pitching coach...**Price** went **279-387 (.419)** in his 5 seasons as manager, including **3-15 this year**.

HURLING: The Reds have used **32 pitchers**, tying the **2016 franchise record** for pitchers in a season and including **4 position players** (**Cliff Pennington** on 4/12 vs StL; **Alex Blandino** on 7/11 at Cle; **Dilson Herrera** on 8/8 at NYM; **Brandon Dixon** on 8/13 vs Cle & 8/31 at StL) and **7 rookies** (**RHP Tyler Mahle**, **RHP Tanner Rainey**, **RHP Jackson Stephens**, **RHP Zack Weiss**, **RHP Kevin Shackelford**, **RHP Keury Mella**, **RHP Jesús Reyes**).

QUERIES ABOUT SERIES: The Reds went **17-28-3 in their previous 48 series**, including **12-12-2 in the last 26 series** beginning **6/19**...beginning **6/21**, the Reds went **5-2-2** in their last 9 series vs **teams in first place** when those series began (16-15, .516, 4-0 vs Cubs, 2-1 at Atl, 2-2 vs Mil, 2-1 vs Cle, 3-1 vs Phi, 2-1 vs Ari, 0-3 vs Cle and 0-4 at Chi, 1-2 at Chi)...the Reds' **2-1 series loss at Cubs** completed on **7/8** snapped their **5-series unbeaten streak**, their longest since a **6-series winning streak** from **7/15-8/4, 2016**...the Redlegs had the best record in the NL Central Division in **June** (15-11, .577).

ALL-STAR INFIELD: The Reds' **infield** includes **3 National League All-Stars** and collectively leads the Major Leagues in **hits, batting average** (.285) and **on-base percentage** (.360)...All-Star **1B Joey Votto** is on pace to lead the NL in on-base percentage for the seventh time...All-Star **2B Scouter Gennett** leads the National League in 3-hit games while ranking second in hitting and third in both hits and multi-hit games...All-Star **3B Eugenio Suárez** is 1 of only 5 Major League players to hit at least **.283** with at least **32 HR** and **101 RBI**...**SS José Peraza** leads all Major League shortstops in hits; is the only player in the Major Leagues with at least 174 hits, 31 doubles, 13 HR and 23 stolen bases; and among all National League players ranks fourth in hits and fifth in multi-hit games.

SLAMMING: The Reds lead the Major Leagues with **11 grand slams**, a new single-season franchise record (9 slams, 2002) and 1 shy of the **National League record** (12 slams, 1997 Braves, 2000 Cardinals)...the Major League record for grand slams in a season is **14** (2000 Athletics, 2006 Indians)...the Reds produced a streak of **6 slams** over a **17-game span** from **6/13-7/1** and **9 grand slams** in the first half...the Reds hit **5 in June**, a new club record for **grand slams** in a **calendar month**...the Reds' **11 grand slams** were hit by **Adam Duvall** (2), **Joey Votto** (2), **Scouter Gennett**, **Eugenio Suárez**, **Jesse Winker**, pitcher **Anthony DeSclafani**, pitcher **Michael Lorenzen** (pinch-hit), **José Peraza** and **Scott Schebler**.

SILVER SLUGGER: RHP **Michael Lorenzen** is trying to become the **first relief pitcher** ever to win a **Louisville Silver Slugger Award**...until **Tue's start at Mil**, was trying to become the first player in the **live ball era** to produce at least 4 HR in a season **without starting a game**...he has **4 HR**, including 2 HR as a pitcher and 2 HR as a pinch-hitter (including a pinch-hit grand slam on 6/30 vs Mil off **Jacob Barnes**)...as a **pinch hitter**, **Lorenzen** is **3-for-12** (2hr, 5rbi) this season and **4-for-19** (3hr, 6rbi) in his career, with **pinch-hit HR** on **4/6/17** off Phi's **Adam Morgan**, **6/24/18** off Chi's **Mike Montgomery** and **6/30/18** off Mil's **Jacob Barnes** (grand slam)...5 times in his career came off the bench to homer, as a reliever or as a pinch hitter...all other active Major League pitchers combine for just 2 such games.

Tonight's Pitcher - #25 Cody Reed, LHP

RED HOTS

Cody Reed on **4/15** turned **25 years old** but already is in his **third Major League season**...tonight is making his 16th appearance and sixth start of the season... will make his second career appearance and start vs the **Marlins**...is **0-1, 5.40** in 5 starts (21.2ip, 13er) and **0-1, 2.31** in 10 relief apps (11.2ip, 3er)...between his first 2 starts of this season, his season debut and then again **8/30 vs Mil**, made all 10 of his apps in relief (0-1, 2.31, 11.2ip, 10h, 3er, 3bb, 10k, 1hr)...made his **last 4 apps as a starter (0-1, 4.82, 18.2ip, 20h, 10er, 9bb, 20k, 2hr)**...is in his third stint of the season with the Reds...was added to the roster after the **Opening Day rainout** forced the Reds to add a fifth starter...was scheduled to start the Reds' fifth game of the season, on **4/3 vs Cubs**, but it, too, was rained out...instead, he threw a simulated game the next day **in Louisville**, then made his regular season debut in a start on **4/9 at Phi**...made 1 start and 3 relief apps before he was optioned to Louisville on 4/20, when **OF Scott Schebler** came off the disabled list...was 2-6, 4.57 in 12 starts for the Bats when he was recalled on 7/4, the day after the Reds' 12-inning, 12-8 loss vs WSox...spent 7/4 on Cin's roster without pitching and was returned to Louisville the next day...was promoted again on **8/13**, when **RHP Keury Mella** (KAY-oo-h-ree MAY-uh) was optioned to Louisville...**in spring training** made 1 start and 5 relief apps before he was optioned to Louisville on 3/25, the day the Reds left Goodyear.

RED HOTS

Luis Castillo at just **25 years old** is in his second **Major League season**...tomorrow will make his 31st start of the season and his **46th Major League** appearance and start...will be his second career appearance vs his **former team**...leads the staff in **win, starts, quality starts (10), innings pitched** and **strikeouts**...in his **4 September starts** is **3-1, 1.46**...in his 4-0 win on 9/1 at StL recorded a **career-high 11 strikeouts**, the second-highest total by a Reds pitcher in a game this season (**Tyler Mahle**, 12k, 6/30 vs Mil)...in the 4-0 win on **7/29 vs Phi** made the **longest scoreless start** of his career (7ip)...his **3-game winning streak** from **5/8-5/24** (4gs, 3-0, 2.78) was the **first winning streak** of his career...in his 7-2 win on **5/8 vs NYM**, retired his **first 14 batters** before **Amed Rosario** singled with 2 outs in the fifth inning...in the **10-4 win on 4/16 at Mil**, took a 2-hitter and a 9-0 lead into the bottom of the seventh inning before allowing 2 runs on 3 hits and a walk...during spring training, from 3/13-3/17 spent time in New York with wife **Delores** while celebrating the birth of their first child, **Brittany**.

- Despite missing 16 games in April with a fractured right thumb ranks T4th in the National League in RBI and T9th in HR...Dave Parker in 1985 was the last Reds batter to lead the NL in RBI in RBI (125)...see media guide page 397.
- From 4/9-4/25 was disabled with a fractured right thumb...suffered the injury on 4/8 at Pit, when he was hit by a Jameson Taillon pitch...missed 16 games (3-13).
- On 3/16 signed a 7-year contract extension through the 2024 season with a club option for 2025...following last season was eligible for arbitration for the first time while under team control through 2020.
- Is on Major League Baseball's roster for the November 8-15 Japan All-Star Series with Nippon Professional Baseball.

51 BLAKE TRAHAN, inf

Road Trip: 2g, 0gs, 1-2

- The Louisiana native's last name is pronounced TRUH-haw...bio is on page 253.
- Singled in 2 of his last 3 apps...played SS the last 2 innings of last night's 7-0 loss at Mil.
- In the 5-1 loss on 9/3 at Pit started at SS in his Major League debut...in the seventh inning singled off Trevor Williams for his first career hit...is his only start.
- Is 1 of 9 Reds players to make Major League debuts this season (IF Alex Blandino, RHP Tanner Rainey, RHP Zack Weiss, IF/OF Rosell Herrera, IF/OF Brandon Dixon, RHP Jesús Reyes, OF Aristides Aquino, Gabriel Guerrero).
- On 9/1 was promoted from Louisville (129g, .245, 17 2b, 1 3b, 2hr, 31rbi, 6sb)...for the Bats made all 127 defensive apps at SS...for the Reds has played 2B, 3B and SS.
- When promoted was tied for the International League lead in apps (129) and sacrifice bunts (12)...finished the season ranked sixth in the IL in apps and T1st in sac bunts.
