HERE'S THE STORY

- ♦ The D-backs are 7-4 in their last 11 games since July 22.
- ♦ **Patrick Corbin** has posted a 0.92 ERA (3 ER in 29.1 IP) in his last 6 appearances (4 starts) vs. Giants @ Chase Field, and is 5-3 with a 2.16 ERA (19 ER in 79.1 IP) in 14 games (12 starts) vs. Giants all-time at home.
- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt** is 1 home run shy of 200 for his career...is hitting .383 (18-for-47) with 7 doubles, 1 triple, 3 home runs and 9 RBI vs. Giants this season.

LAST NIGHT'S RECAP

- ♦ The D-backs dropped the series opener vs. Giants, 8-1.
- ♦ **Zack Greinke** (12-6) took his first loss since June 13, allowing 2 runs in 6.0 innings...it was his fourth consecutive start of 6.0+ innings allowing 2 runs or less.
- ♦ **David Peralta** went 4-for-5...**Eduardo Escobar** was 1-for-4 with a RBI.

- ♦ Today, the D-backs reinstated LHP **Andrew Chafin** from the Paternity Leave List and optioned INF/OF **Chris Owings** to Triple-A Reno.

- ♦ On Wednesday, **Andrew Chafin** and his wife Shelbi, gave birth to their first child, a daughter, Addilyn.

FIRST PITCHIN' ALL AROUND NEW ENGLAND

- ♦ D-backs Special Assistant to the President & CEO **Roland Hemond** will throw out the ceremonial first pitch tonight prior to the Triple-A Pawtucket game at McCoy Stadium, where he grew up attending games...last night, Hemond tossed the first pitch at Fenway Park on the 39th anniversary of when he gave current Red Sox special assistant, Tony LaRussa, his first managerial job with the White Sox (1979).

VROOM, VROOM

- ♦ **Brad Ziegler** became the first D-backs player to use the OnTrac Bullpen Cart in a regular season game last night vs. Giants when he entered the game in the seventh inning...Ziegler also rode the bullpen cart on June 1 as a member of the Marlins, making him the first player to ride both the home and visiting carts.

- ♦ On this day in 2000, **Tony Womack** established a club record with 4 stolen bases vs. Braves...Womack, a member of the D-backs 20th Anniversary Team, will take batting practice and shag in the outfield while wearing a microphone for FOX Sports Arizona this afternoon.

CORBIN AT A GLANCE

- ◆ Sixth season with the D-backs.
- ◆ **Is a 2-time NL All-Star (2013, '18).**
- ◆ Named NL Player of the Week for April 16-22 after going 2-0 with a 1.20 ERA, 2 walks, 19 strikeouts and a 0.33 WHIP in 2 starts.
- ◆ Was a finalist for the 2013 Rawlings Gold Glove Award.
- ◆ Acquired on July 25, 2010 with LHP Joe Saunders, LHP Tyler Skaggs and RHP Rafael Rodriguez from Los Angeles Angels for RHP Dan Haren...selected by Angels in second round of 2009 First-Year Player Draft.

WHAT TO KNOW...

- ◆ Needs 12 strikeouts to match his career high (178 in 2013, '17).
- ◆ Will be making his first start @ Chase Field since July 4 vs. Cardinals.
- ◆ Owns a 2.76 ERA (13 ER in 42.1 IP) with 49 strikeouts over his last 7 starts.
- ◆ Has not surrendered a home run in 7 straight starts, the longest streak of his career and longest by a D-back starter since Trevor Cahill (7; Sept. 5, 2013-April 2, 2014)...last D-backs with 8 consecutive starts without a homer was Cahill from Aug. 16-Sept. 24, 2012).

20TH ANNIVERSARY TEAM

- ◆ Was named to the D-backs' 20th Anniversary Team, as voted upon by fans, on July 20.

LAST START

- ◆ Did not factor into the decision on July 28 @ Padres, allowing 4 runs on 6 hits with 8 strikeouts.

VS. GIANTS

- ◆ Is 2-0 with a 1.69 ERA (5 ER in 26.2 IP) in 4 starts in 2018 and 7-7 with a 3.00 ERA (44 ER in 132.0 IP) in 23 career appearances (21 starts).
- ◆ Has gone 5-3 with a 2.16 ERA (19 ER in 79.1 IP) in 14 games (12 starts) @ Chase Field, including a 0.92 ERA (3 ER in 29.1 IP) in his last 6 appearances (4 starts).
- ◆ Threw a 1-hit shutout on April 17 vs. Giants, his first career shutout and fourth complete game...began the game with 7.2 hitless innings before surrendering a check-swing, infield single to Brandon Belt.

ON THE NL LEADERBOARD

- ◆ Ranks among the NL leaders in strikeouts (2nd, 166), strikeout-to-walk ratio (4th, 4.49), strikeouts per 9.0 IP (3rd, 11.04), WHIP (5th, 1.06), opponent average (7th, .213), IP (7th, 135.1) and ERA (10th, 3.26).

PLAYER PROFILE

- ◆ 2007 graduate of Cisero North Syracuse (N.Y.) High School...did not play baseball until his junior year...went to tryouts wearing jeans and told coaches he wanted to be a pitcher.
- ◆ Played basketball and baseball at Mohawk Valley Community College in Utica, N.Y. before transferring to Chiopla Junior College (Fla.).
- ◆ Traveled to Australia in Nov. 2013 as part of a Major League Baseball goodwill tour.

HOME IS WHERE THE WINS ARE (VS. NL WEST)

- ◆ Is 4-0 with a 1.35 ERA (6 ER in 40.0 IP) when facing a NL West opponent @ Chase Field in 2018.
- ◆ Allowed 2 runs or fewer in all 6 starts, including 1 run or fewer 4 times.

ORDER UP!

- ◆ Limiting opponents to a .165 AVG/.203 OBP/.282 SLG the first time through the lineup this season.

KEEPING IT IN THE PARK

- ◆ Averages 0.73 home runs per 9.0 innings, the fourth-best mark in the NL.
- ◆ Has not surrendered a home run in 7 straight starts, the longest streak of his career and longest by a D-back starter since Trevor Cahill (7; Sept. 5, 2013-April 2, 2014)...8 would be the longest by a D-back since Trevor Cahill (8; Aug. 16-Sept. 24, 2012).

STRIKEOUT STATS

- ◆ His 38 3-pitch strikeouts are second most in the NL...Max Scherzer/WSH is first with 46.
- ◆ Is second in the NL with 143 strikeouts swinging, trailing Scherzer (176).
- ◆ Ranks second in the NL with a 24.9 swinging strike pct., behind Scherzer (25.3) and ahead of Jacob deGrom/NYM (23.6) and Kenta Maeda/LAD (23.8).

- ◆ Has thrown 2.0+ innings 18 times, the second most in baseball behind Tyler Glasnow/PIT (19)...thrown 3.0+ 5 times, tied for fourth most (5 others).
- ◆ Lefties are hitting .186 (19-for-102), eighth-lowest among all relievers (min. 100 BF).

- ◆ **NL RANKINGS (RELIEVERS):** 3rd in SV (25), 9th in SV PCT. (83.3).
- ◆ Is 25-for-30 in save chances with a .192 opp. average (20-for-104) and 40 strikeouts.
- ◆ Owns a 2.70 ERA (4 ER in 13.1 IP) in his last 14 games.
- ◆ Right-handed hitters are batting .081 (3-for-37) over his last 18 games since June 6.
