## SD Notes

- With the loss, the Padres are riding a five-game losing streak opposite SF...they have a 3-4 record vs. SF @ Petco Park this season...SD also snapped its win streak in **Bryan Mitchell's** starts, now having won three of his last four and four of his last six.
- **Franmil Reyes** is riding a 9-game hitting streak since Sept. 7 at CIN (.387, 12-for-31)...a hit in his next appearance will tie his career-high 10-game streak (Aug. 25-Sept. 4).
- **Austin Hedges** hit his 14<sup>th</sup> home run of the season (four shy of tying his career high of 18 in 2017)...Padres catchers have combined to hit the second-most HR of any catching crew in the NL this year (entering the game, they had 20, trailing just LAD's 25).
- Now in two career appearances, **Brad Wieck** has tossed 3.0 innings, allowing one hit and fanning four of the 10 batters he's faced...all four came on Monday night vs. SF.

## SF Notes

- **Andrew Suarez** was credited with his first winning decision on the road since June 29 @ ARI...tonight was his first decision against SD in three appearances this season.
- **Chris Shaw** singled once and doubled twice in the game for a career-high three hits...his trio of hits came a game after he logged his first-career two-hit game.
- **Brandon Crawford** homered in the fourth inning, and with his 2-for-4 performance Monday night, he's now 10-for-25 (.400) in six games @ Petco Park this season.
- **Evan Longoria's** homer put the Giants up 4-1 in the fifth inning...it snapped SF's 11 game streak of scoring three runs or fewer, tying the franchise record...it also made it the third occasion in the last 39 games in which the Giants have had a multi-HR game (also: Aug. 25 vs. TEX & Sept. 3 @ COL).
