STUCK IN THE MIDDLE WITH YOU

- The Rockies continue the first homestand of their 25th Anniversary Season with the second game of a three-game set against the San Diego Padres.
- Colorado lost the first game of the series 7-6 last night at Coors Field on the 25th anniversary of the first home game in franchise history (April 9, 1993 vs. Montreal at Mile High Stadium) ... the loss dropped the Rockies back below .500 for the first time since April 3.
- The Rockies fell 4-0 to the Braves on Sunday, losing the first home series of the season 2-1 to the Atlanta Braves ... it was their first shutout loss since falling 5-0 to the Padres on Sept. 23, 2017, and the first at Coors Field since losing 3-0 to St. Louis on May 27, 2017.

UP IS DOWN

- The Rockies hit three home runs in last night's game and now lead the National League with 16 home runs ... in 2017, Colorado ranked 10th in the NL with 192 home runs.
- Through 11 games, the Rockies .232 team batting average ranks 12 in the National League ... their .273 batting average in 2017 led the Major Leagues.

PINCH ME

- Rockies hitters have gone 0-for-19 with 10 strikeouts in pinch-hit at-bats so far this season ... they are one of four National League teams without a pinch hit while their 19 pinch-hit at-bats are the most in the Majors.

AMBULATORY

- The Rockies won Saturday night's game in 10 innings on a walk-off walk to Tony Wolters ... each of the Rockies' last three walk-off wins have come via a bases-loaded walk (also: Aug. 3, 2017 vs. New York-NL, Sept. 4, 2017 vs. San Francisco) ... it is the first time in franchise history that the Rockies have earned three consecutive walk-off wins via walk, and the first time it has happened in the Major Leagues since Toronto in 1997.

NO GASLAMPS HERE

- Colorado and San Diego meet 19 times this year, including 10 times this month ... played a four-game series last week (Colorado won 3-1), play three this week (April 9-11) and then three times at Coors Field April 23-25.
- Colorado is 25-16 vs. the Padres since April 10, 2016 ... the Rockies have also won 19 of the past 31 meetings since Sept. 11, 2016 ... Colorado was 12-7 vs. San Diego last season, including 6-4 at Petco Park ... prior to '17, the Rockies had not had a winning record at Petco Park since going 5-4 in 2013.
- At Coors Field, the Rockies went 6-3 against San Diego in 2017, including a three-game sweep July 17-19 ... outscored the Padres 67-35 at home last year.
- The Rockies have finished at or above .500 at home against San Diego each season since 2012, and have outscored the Padres 335-269 over that span with a record of 36-21.

WE THREE KINGS

- Since the start of the 2015 season, Charlie Blackmon (587), DJ LeMahieu (564) and Nolan Arenado (558) rank first, second and third, respectively, among National League players in hits.
- Since the start of the '15 season, LeMahieu's .319 batting average is the highest in NL.
- Nolan Arenado leads all Major Leaguers with 460 RBI since 2014.

WHERE HE LEFT OFF

- Charlie Blackmon is 11-for-39 (.282) to begin the season with two doubles, four home runs and six RBI ... signed a six-year contract that includes two player options on April 3.
- He hit home runs in three consecutive games March 30-April 2 for the second time in his Major League career (April 20-23, 2014), including his first multi-home run game of the season on March 31 at Arizona.

MY COUSIN VINNY

- With two hits last Monday, Carlos González passed Vinny Castilla to move into fourth place all-time in Rockies history with 1,207 hits ... he is 67 hits from passing Dante Bichette (1,278) for third-most in franchise history.

PHOENIX RISING

- Bryan Shaw has worked six scoreless outings thus far in his first year with the Rockies ... his strikeout of Hunter Renfroe on Monday night was the 400th of his career.

OTTOMATIC

- Adam Ottavino has multiple strikeouts in five of his six games pitched, including striking out the side three times, and is currently tied for the Major League lead with 14 strikeouts ... has allowed one hit and one walk over his seven innings or work across six appearances.

HIT CHARITABLY

- New at Coors Field this season is a 18'x30" "Hit the Mitt" target beyond the wall in the left-field corner ... each time a Rockies hitter strikes the target with a home run, UHealth will make a donation in the amount of \$5,000 via the Colorado Rockies Foundation to Gold Crown Foundation, a Colorado nonprofit 501(c)(3) that offers youth sports and education programs to nearly 20,000 children throughout Colorado and the surrounding areas ... UHealth will be tracking the accumulating donation throughout the season and present a check to Gold Crown Foundation at the end of the 2018 season.

A NEW BEGINNING

- The 28-year-old left-hander is a member of his second career Opening Day roster in his third Major League season ... made his Major League debut on June 12, 2016 vs. San Diego.
- The University of Oregon product selected as the Rockies' first-round selection (20th overall) in Major League Baseball's 2011 First-Year Player Draft ... was also drafted in '08 by the Minnesota Twins, but did not sign.

LAST TIME OUT

- Pitched six shutout innings, allowing four hits with no walks and four strikeouts against the Padres at Petco Park on April 5 ... did not factor in the Rockies 3-1 win over San Diego.
- Fourth time in his career he has pitched at least six shutout innings, the first time on the road ... it was the second time he tossed six shutout innings against the Padres (also: Sept. 16, 2017).

BEACHY

- Will be making his second consecutive start against the Padres, first start of the season at home.
- In four career starts against San Diego, is 1-1 with a 1.50 ERA (24.0 IP, 4 ER), three walks and 19 strikeouts.
- Made two starts against the Padres last season, going 1-1 with a 2.31 ERA (11.2 IP, 3 ER), three walks and nine strikeouts.
- Is 1-0 with a 0.73 ERA (12.1 IP, 1 ER), two walks and nine strikeouts in two career starts against the Padres at Coors Field

HOME COOKING

- In 20 career appearances, 19 starts, at Coors Field, has posted a 3.39 ERA (119.1 IP, 45 ER), the lowest ERA at Coors Field in franchise history (min. 100 IP).
- In 2017, went 3-3 with a 4.14 ERA (41.1 IP, 19 ER) in eight games, seven starts at Coors Field ... did not allow a run over his final two starts at home in 2017, tossing 13 innings and allowing six hits with two walks and eight strikeouts.
- Was 5-2 with a 3.00 ERA (78.0 IP, 26 ER) in 12 starts at Coors Field in 2016 ... recorded nine quality starts and pitched at least six innings 11 times.
- His 3.00 ERA at home in 2016 was the second-lowest home ERA in franchise history (min. 75 innings pitched) behind Jorge De La Rosa's 2.76 home ERA (81.2 IP, 25 ER) in 2013.

FUN IN THE SUN

- Made five starts in Spring Training, going 0-1 with a 6.32 ERA (15.2 IP, 11 ER), 23 hits, nine walks and seven strikeouts ... surrendered four home runs.
- Pitched four innings on the back fields on Sunday at Salt River Fields ... last official Cactus League appearance came on March 20.

2017

- In 15 starts and two relief appearances in 2017, went 6-6 with a 4.81 ERA (86.0 IP, 46 ER) ... the two relief appearances were the first of his professional career.
- Was 5-6 with a 5.11 ERA (81.0 IP, 46 ER) as a starter, 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA (5.0 IP, 0 ER) in his two relief appearances.
- Had two separate stints on the 10-day disabled list and one stint on the 60-day DL ... placed on the 10-day DL on June 4 with left knee inflammation ... reinstated on June 22 but made just two appearances (one start) before being placed on the disabled list again on June 26 ... underwent arthroscopic surgery on his left knee on July 3 and was transferred to the 60-day DL on July 26.

FINISH STRONG

- After being reinstated from the disabled list on Sept. 10, went 3-1 with a 1.19 ERA (22.2 IP, 3 ER), three walks and 18 strikeouts in four appearances (three starts) to end the regular season.

JUST A TASTE

- Pitched one inning of relief in the National League Wild Card Game at Arizona ... entered the game in the third inning and allowed two runs on two hits with one strikeout ... allowed a two-run home run to Daniel Descalso.

AWAY WE GO

- Is 3-7 with a 5.34 ERA (89.1 IP, 53 ER) in 18 career games, 17 starts, away from Coors Field.
- In two road starts this season, is 0-0 with a 7.56 ERA (8.1 IP, 7 ER), four walks and seven strikeouts ... all seven runs came on March 30 at Arizona, in a career-low tying 2.1 inning start.
- Went 3-3 with a 5.44 ERA (44.2 IP, 27 ER) in nine games, eight starts, on the road in 2017 ... allowed a home run in eight of his nine games outside of Denver ... homer-less relief stint on Sept. 11 at Arizona, his first road game with no homers since Sept. 25, 2016 at Los Angeles-NL.

SOMETHING TO BUILD ON

- Went 4-3 over his first 10 starts in 2016 with a 3.25 ERA (61.0 IP, 22 ER) with 12 walks and 52 strikeouts ... allowed three or fewer earned runs over his first six career starts.
- His 3.54 ERA (114.1 IP, 45 ER) was the eighth-lowest in franchise history among pitchers with a minimum 100 innings pitched ... it was the second-lowest among rookies in franchise history (Jhoulys Chacin, 3.28 ERA, 2010).
- Had a 67.0 strike percentage in 2016, which ranked 11th among qualifying Major League starting pitchers.
