### TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

**Aug. 1, 1975:** Billy Martin replaces Bill Virdon as manager after the Yankees get off to a 53-51 start. The club would finish third in the AL East with an 83-77 record.

**Aug. 1, 1941:** Lefty Gomez records a 9-0 shutout victory vs. the St. Louis Browns, despite walking 11 batters. Gomez remains one of only two pitchers in MLB history to record at least 11BB and allow OR (also Mel Stottlemyre on 5/21/70 vs. WSH—11BB, OR).

**Aug. 1, 1937:** In a 14-5 victory over the St. Louis Browns, Lou Gehrig hits for the cycle for the second time in his career.

### TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

**Aug. 2, 2009:** Melky Cabrera becomes the 11th Yankee to hit for the cycle in an 8-5 win over the White Sox in Chicago. Cabrera is the most recent Yankee to accomplish the feat.

**Aug. 2, 1979:** Yankees captain Thurman Munson passes away in a plane crash in Canton, Ohio, at age 32. His No. 15 is immediately retired.

**AT A GLANCE:** The Yankees complete their two-game series today vs. Baltimore...are 4-1 on their six-game homestand (went 3-1 vs. Kansas City; are 1-0 vs. Baltimore so far)...depart for a seven-game road trip on Thursday, including 4G at Boston (Thurs.-Sun.) and 3G at Chicago-AL (8/6-8).

- ▶ **At 68-37 (.648), have the Majors' second-best record** behind Boston (75-34, .688)...the Yankees and Red Sox have held (at least a share of) the Majors' two best records on 82 of the last 90 days (since the end of play on 5/3).
- ▶ **Are a season-high 31G over .500**...marks their first time they have reached 31G over .500 since finishing the 2011 season 32G over .500 (97-65).
- ▶ Are 5.0G behind first-place Boston in the AL East.
- ▶ Have lost just four of their last 30 series, going 21-4-5 since 4/19...are 59-28 in their last 87G...are 50-8 (.862) when scoring first...are a Major League-best 42-6 (.875) when their starter tosses at least 6.0 innings.
- ▶ **Have won three straight games for the first time since winning four straight from 6/18-21.**
- ▶ Are 1-0 so far in their stretch of 20 consecutive game days (7/31-8/19).

**YESTERDAY'S NEWS:** The Yankees won their third straight game, defeating Baltimore, 6-3, at Yankee Stadium...**RHP Masahiro Tanaka** tossed the 6.0 scoreless innings to earn his ninth win of the season (3H, 2BB, 8K, 1HP, 1WP)...extended his scoreless streak to 17.1 innings...**3B Miguel Andújar** (1-for-4) hit a three-run HR in the fifth inning, his first HR since 6/29 vs. Boston...**2B Gleyber Torres** (1-for-4) hit an RBI single in the first...**SS Didi Gregorius** (2-for-3, 1R, 1RBI, 1BB) hit an RBI single in the third inning...**1B Greg Bird** (0-for-3, 1RBI) hit a sac fly in the fifth...**LF Brett Gardner** (1-for-3, 2R, 1BB, 1SB) recorded his 251st career stolen base, tying Willie Randolph (251) for third-most in Yankees history...**LHP Aroldis Chapman** (1.0IP) struck out all 3BF to record his 29th save of the season.

**FAN FAVORITES:** Through 53 home games, the Yankees lead the AL in total home attendance (2,293,140) and average attendance per home game (43,267), trailing only the Dodgers in both categories (2,520,613 / 46,678).

- ▶ **Their 21 sellouts this season have set a single-season record for the current Yankee Stadium** (previous: 20 in 2011)...have sold out 14 of their last 18 home games (since 6/16).

**SONNY DAYS:** RHP Sonny Gray has won three straight starts for the first time as a Yankee and first time since 7/5-19/17, posting a 1.10 ERA (16.1IP, 2ER) over that span...has allowed 3H in each of the starts with opponents are hitting just .155 (9-for-58) with 1HR, 6BB and 19K over the stretch.

- ▶ In three starts vs. Baltimore this season, is 3-0 with a 2.00 ERA (18.0IP, 4ER), going 6.0IP in each of those starts...all other Yankees pitchers have combined to go 3-5 vs. the O's this year.
- ▶ **With a win today**, would become the first Yankees pitcher since CC Sabathia in 2010 (5-1) to win at least four games vs. Baltimore in a single season...also with a win today, would join Cleveland's Trevor Bauer (4-0 vs. Detroit) and Atlanta's Brandon McCarthy (4-0 vs. Philadelphia) as the only pitchers with four wins vs. a single opponent this season.
- ▶ Has made five starts vs. Baltimore as a Yankee, going 4-1 with a 2.93 ERA (27.2IP, 9ER).

**MASA-PIECE:** RHP Masahiro Tanaka tossed 6.0 scoreless innings to earn his ninth win of the season on Tuesday (3H, 2BB, 8K, 1HP, 1WP)...extended his scoreless streak to 17.1 innings (since the fifth inning on 7/15 at Cleveland)...marks the third-longest active scoreless streak in the Majors.

- ▶ Has tossed back-to-back scoreless starts for the second time in his career (also 2GS from 8/19-24/16).
- ▶ Is 2-0 with a 1.76 ERA (30.2IP, 6ER) in his last 5GS (since 6/8).
- ▶ Is 7-0 with a 3.20 ERA (76.0IP, 27ER) during his career-best 13-start unbeaten streak (since 4/23), tied for the third-longest such streak by a Yankee since 2005 (Iván Nova-20, CC Sabathia-15, Nathan Eovaldi-13)...opponents are hitting .202 (55-for-272) over the streak.

**HOME COOKING:** The Yankees are 38-15 (.717) at Yankee Stadium in 2018, tied with Boston (38-15, .717) for the best home record in the Majors...are 33-10 in 43 home games since 4/21.

- ▶ Are in the midst of a stretch of 19-of-29 games at home...are 6-4 so far (5-2 at home, 1-2 on the road).
- ▶ Since their only home series loss of the season (1-3 from 4/5-8 vs. Baltimore), are 12-0-3 in 15 home series, their longest streak without dropping a series at home since going 20-0-5 over 25 home series from 9/15/97-8/16/98...are 12-0-2 in 14 home series since 4/19.
- ▶ Are 19-1-3 in their last 23 home series (since 8/31/17), going 52-19 in 71G over that span.
- ▶ Are in the middle of a stretch of three straight home series vs. the AL's three last-place teams (4-1 through the first 5-of-10 games): 3-1 vs. Kansas City, 1-0 vs. Baltimore so far, 4G vs. Texas.
- ▶ **Have scored at least 5R in nine consecutive home games**, the longest streak at the current Yankee Stadium...marks their longest such streak at home since they scored at least 5R in 10 consecutive games from 7/21-8/13/07...is tied for the longest streak in the Majors this season (Baltimore-9G, 4/26-5/12)...scored 69R in 11 home games in July (6.27 runs/game).

**BRONX BOMBERS:** Yankees batters hit .281/.355/.468 with 46 doubles, 2 triples and a Major League-high 37HR in July while averaging 5.60 runs per game (140R/25G)...was their first calendar month with a team BA of .280-or-better since hitting .288 in August 2011.

- ▶ **Have hit a Major League-leading 168HR**...are on pace to hit 259HR (the MLB record is 264HR by Seattle in 1997).
- ▶ Have homered in five straight games (6HR total) after hitting just 1HR in their previous 5G...have 7HR in 10G since the All-Star break after hitting 30HR in their first 15G in July.
- ▶ Lead the Majors in slugging (.458) and OPS (.791) and rank second in XBH (376) and runs per game (5.20).

**MATINEE'D IN THE SHADE:** The Yankees are 23-10 (.697) in day games this season, the second-best record in the Majors (Boston, 26-5, .839).

**JUST DÚ IT:** 3B Miguel Andújar hit safely in 21-of-24 games in July, batting .330/.379/.443 (29-for-88) with 13R, 7 doubles, 1HR, 8RBI, 6BB and 1HP.

- ▶ Is batting .292 (104-for-356) this season...only 10 rookies in Yankees history have qualified for the batting title with a BA of .290-or-better, most recently Robinson Canó in 2005 (.297).
- ▶ Leads all Major League rookies in extra-base hits (45) and SLG (.497) and ranks second in hits (104), BA (.292) and multi-hit games (31).

**SIR DIDI:** SS Didi Gregorius had 17RBI in 25G in July after totaling just 13RBI in 47G over May and June.

- ▶ Has reached base safely in each of his last 27 games vs. the Orioles (since 10/2/16), batting .398/.451/.676 (43-for-108) with 27R, 12 doubles, 6HR, 25RBI, 10BB and 4SB over that stretch...has recorded a hit in 26 of those 27 games.

**VIC-TORR-E.S.:** The Yankees are 49-20 (.710) when INF Gleyber Torres plays this season, and 19-17 in games without him...only 10 players who debuted since 1908 appeared in more team wins over their first 69 career games.

**SAVES THE DAY:** LHP Aroldis Chapman has struck out each of his last 7BF...prior to the stretch, had struck out only two of his previous 15BF.

- ▶ Is fifth in the Majors in saves, while his 96.7% save conversion rate (29-for-30) leads all relievers (min. 15 save opps).
- ▶ Has converted 22 consecutive save chances since 5/8, the third-longest streak of his career (29 straight from 7/4/14-5/30/15; 27 straight from 6/26-9/4/12)...is the longest streak by a Yankee since Andrew Miller converted 24 in a row from 4/8-8/6/15.
- ▶ Opponents are hitting .130 (19-for-146) this season, the lowest opp. BA among qualified AL relievers and second-lowest among all relievers (Josh Hader-.119).
- ▶ His 15.91 K/9.0IP ratio (76K/43.0IP) is second among MLB relievers (Josh Hader-16.60).

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP SONNY GRAY (8-7, 5.08 ERA)

**RHP Sonny Gray** will make his 21st start of the season in today's series finale vs. Baltimore...the 28-year-old will start on extended five days' rest due to Monday's scheduled team off day...earned the win on Thursday vs. Kansas City (5.0IP, 3H, OR, 2BB, 5K) and improved to 3-0 with a 1.10 ERA (16.1IP, 2ER) in his last three starts...made his fourth career Opening Day active roster (also 2014-16 with Oakland)...went 4-7 with a 3.72 ERA (65.1IP, 27ER) in 11 regular season starts with the Yankees in 2017 after being acquired along with international signing bonus pool money from Oakland in exchange for OF Dustin Fowler, RHP James Kaprielian and INF/OF Jorge Mateo on 7/31/17...was an AL All-Star and finished third in AL Cy Young Award voting in 2015...was originally selected by Oakland in the first round (18th overall) of the 2011 First-Year Player Draft out of Vanderbilt University.

**LAST START:** Earned his third straight win in the Yankees' 7-2 victory vs. the Royals on Thursday (5.0IP, 3H, OR, 2BB, 5K)...has allowed exactly 3H in three straight starts...was his third scoreless start of the season (also 6/6 at Toronto, 8.0IP and 7/11 at Baltimore, 6.0IP)...was his first career scoreless outing at Yankee Stadium (in 16 starts, 15 as a Yankee)...limited Royals batters to 0-for-4 with RISP.

**GETTING BACK ON TRACK:** Has won three straight starts for the first time as a Yankee (and first time since 7/5-19/17), with a 1.10 ERA (16.1IP, 2ER) during the streak...has allowed 3H in each of the starts with opponents are hitting just .155 (9-for-58) with 1HR, 6BB and 19K over the stretch...has received 18 runs of support over the span, while receiving just four runs of support in total over his previous four starts.

**2018:** His .317 BABIP is seventh-highest in the AL (min. 400BF)...has failed to complete 5.0IP in a career-high seven starts.

- ✦ His 140BF with RISP are tied for the seventh-most in the Majors...opponents are hitting .235 (27-for-115) with 17BB and 32K with runners in scoring position...batters are 0-for-10 with RISP in his last three starts, after opponents hit .500 (9-for-18) with RISP in his previous three outings.
- ✦ Has tossed at least 5.0IP in 12 of his last 15 starts after failing to complete 5.0IP in four of his first five starts, including a career-high streak of three straight (4/12-4/25).
- ✦ Has given up 30-of-58ER this season in the first and second innings...has a 6.75 ERA (40.0IP, 30ER) in the first two innings, compared to a 3.98 ERA (61.0IP, 27ER) from the third inning on.
- ✦ Opponents are batting .186 (13-for-70) with 7BB, 32K and 3HR in plate appearances ending with a slider (Brooks Baseball).
- ✦ His 48.2% groundball rate is the lowest in his career, while his 21.7% line-drive rate and 34.7% hard contact rate are career highs (FanGraphs)...has a career-worst 9.8% walk rate.

**HOME COOKING:** Is 4-3 with an 6.80 ERA (46.1IP, 35ER) in 10 home starts in 2018...did not allow a home run in his last start for the first time since 4/7 vs. Baltimore, snapping an eight straight home games with at least 1HR, which was tied for the second-longest streak by a Yankee at the current Yankee Stadium, trailing only Vidal Nuno's nine-game streak from 5/30/13-6/21/14.

- ✦ In 15 home starts as a Yankee, has a 6-6 record with a 6.36 ERA (75.0IP, 53ER)...has allowed HRs in 13-of-15 outings (17HR total).
- ✦ His last home start was his first career scoreless appearance at Yankee Stadium in 16 starts (15 as a Yankee).

**VS. BALTIMORE:** Is 5-4 with a 4.07 ERA (48.2IP, 22ER) in nine career starts against Baltimore...has made five starts vs. Baltimore as a Yankee, going 4-1 with a 2.93 ERA (27.2IP, 9ER)...is 1-1 with a 7.20 ERA (10.0IP, 8ER) in two starts vs. the O's at Yankee Stadium...with a win today, would become the first Yankees pitcher since CC Sabathia in 2010 (5-1) to win at least four games vs. Baltimore in a single season...also with a win today, would join Cleveland's Trevor Bauer (4-0 vs. Detroit in 2018) and Atlanta's Brandon McCarthy (4-0 vs. Philadelphia) to record at least four victories vs. a single opponent this season.

- ✦ Is 3-0 vs. Baltimore this season, while all other Yankees pitchers have combined to go 3-5 vs. the O's.
- ✦ In three starts vs. Baltimore this season, is 3-0 with a 2.00 ERA (18.0IP, 4ER), going 6.0IP in each of those starts...last faced the O's on 7/11 at Baltimore (6.0IP, 3H, OR, 1BB, 8K), and tied a season high in strikeouts...at Camden Yards on 6/1, allowed 4H and 1ER in 6.0IP (0BB, 6K, 1HR)...also earned the win on 4/7 at Yankee Stadium (6.0IP, 4H, 3ER, 2BB, 4K)...used just 11 pitches in the first two innings to retire 6BF in order in that game.
