RECENT REDBIRDS: The Cardinals used a season-high 5 HR's and 13 hits last night in a 9-5 win, as they won their 2nd-straight game on their 6-game, 7-day road trip (SD-4, MIN-2), improving to 7-2 in May...the Cardinals began the day in 1st place in the N.L. Central, 1/2-game in front of Milwaukee.

PHANTASTIC PHAM: Tommy Pham homered for a 2nd straight game last night and upped his total to a team-high 4 round-trippers in May...Tommy is batting .350 this month with a .950 slugging pct. and 1.135 OPS...the Cardinals are a perfect 7-0 in his seven games played during the month.

GYORKO & THE PADRES: Former Padre (2013-15) Jedd Gyorko has thrived against his former team the past two seasons, compiling a .525 (21-for-40) batting mark with 8 HR & 17 RBI in 12 games, hitting safely in 10 of the 11 when he's taken an at-bat and collecting a HR and/or RBI in 10 of the games.

FREQUENT FLYERS VS. FRIARS: The Cardinals hit a season-high 5 home runs last night, their most ever in 239 regular season games played in San Diego...the Cardinals have won 8 of their last 10 games played at PETCO Park, hitting 18 home runs in those 10 games.

CLOSE COMFORT: Thursday night's 2-1 win was the Cardinals 8th win by a margin of just one run and their 5th one-run win in the month of May...the Cardinals rank 4th in the majors in one-run wins (BOS-11, MIL-10 & ARI-9)...the Cardinals have won an MLB best six games by a margin of two runs, giving them 14 wins by two runs or less, 2nd only to Milwaukee (16).

TIGHT FITS: Of the Cardinals eight wins by one-run margins, five have been in games during which they scored three or fewer runs...the Cardinals 8 wins by one run were their most in the team's first 35 games since also doing so in 2008.

PITCHING PLANS: The Cardinals will activate RHP Adam Wainwright (right elbow inflammation) from the 10-day disabled list tomorrow and he will make his first start since April 17. Waino is 1-2 with a 3.45 ERA in three starts this season. Rookie RHP Jack Flaherty (0-1, 3.60) has been named as Tuesday's starter at Minnesota and he will be recalled to make his third start of the season for St. Louis. Flaherty is 4-1 with a 2.27 ERA (4th in Pacific Coast League) and 41 strikeouts (T3rd in PCL) in five starts for Memphis (AAA). He fanned a season-high 13 batters in 6.2 IP in his last start (May 9) at Oklahoma City.

HELPING HAWAII: The Cardinals, in collaboration with Kolten Wong and his wife, Alissa, announced the team will sell specially-priced \$15 tickets to the Sunday, May 20, game against the Philadelphia Phillies to help those impacted by the Kilauea volcanic eruptions and earthquakes in Kolten's native state of Hawaii. Fans can purchase the specially-priced tickets now at cardinals.com/Hawaii. For every specially-priced \$15 ticket purchased, \$10 will be donated to the Wongs' relief efforts aiding the American Red Cross and local accredited organizations working to rebuild the impacted areas on the Big Island and help the thousands of families who have been displaced due to flowing lava. SAN DIEGO CONNECTIONS

Infielder Jedd Gyorko played parts of three seasons with the Padres (2013-15)...originally selected by San Diego in the 2nd round of the 2010 MLB Draft...traded by the Padres with cash to St. Louis for outfielder Jon Jay (December 8, 2015).

Pitcher Luke Gregerson pitched five seasons (2009-2013) with San Diego...acquired by San Diego from St. Louis as the player to be named, to complete the December 4, 2008 trade of pitcher Mark Worrell in exchange for infielder Khalil Greene (March 23, 2009).

Pitcher Miles Mikolas pitched parts of two seasons with San Diego (2012-13) and made his MLB debut on May 5, 2012 vs. Miami...originally selected by San Diego in the 7th round of the 2009 MLB Draft...later traded to the Pirates with infielder Jaff Decker in exchange for outfielder Alex Dickerson (November 25, 2013).

Outfielder Dexter Fowler and pitcher Jordan Lyles were once traded for one another (December 3, 2013)...Colorado sent Fowler and a player to be named to the Astros in exchange for Lyles and outfielder Brandon Barnes.

Pitcher Bud Norris signed as a free agent with San Diego (August 11, 2015)...pitched in 20 games during the 2015 season.

Norris and Lyles were Astros teammates for parts of three seasons (2011-13).

Outfielder Tommy Pham's first MLB hit (double) was July 4, 2015 vs. San Diego...hit his first MLB home run the following day off Ian Kennedy and had all three RBI in the team's 3-1 win.

Infielder Greg Garcia was born in nearby El Cajon, Calif...graduated from Valhalla (Calif.) High School...currently resides in Santee, Calif.

Pitcher Greg Holland (2007) and first baseman Eric Hosmer (2008) were both drafted and developed by Kansas City...were Royals teammates for parts of five seasons (2011-15).

Pitcher Tyler Lyons earned a win in his MLB debut at San Diego (May 22, 2013).

Outfielder Marcell Ozuna was a teammate of pitcher Brand Hand (2013-15) and catcher A.J. Ellis (2017) while in Miami.

Pitching Coach Mike Maddux pitched parts of two seasons with San Diego (1991-92)...signed with the Padres as a free agent (March 31, 1991)...later traded by San Diego to the Mets for pitchers Mike Freitas and Roger Mason (December 17, 1992).

Hitting Coach John Mabry played part of the 2000 season with the Padres...originally traded by Seattle with pitcher Tom Davey to San Diego for outfielder Al Martin (July 31, 2000).

Cardinals Hall of Famer and broadcaster Jim Edmonds played part of the 2008 season for San Diego (26 games)...traded by St. Louis to San Diego for infielder David Freese (December 14, 2007).

Future Cardinals Hall of Famer Ray Lankford played parts of two seasons for San Diego (2001-02)...traded by St. Louis with cash to the Padres for pitcher Woody Williams (August 2, 2001).

Padres pitcher Joey Lucchesi pitched two seasons for Southeast Missouri State Univ. (2015-16).

Hall of Famer Ozzie Smith was selected by San Diego in the 4th round of the 1977 MLB Draft...played four seasons with the Padres (1978-81)...later traded by San Diego with pitchers Al Olmsted and Steve Mura to St. Louis for pitcher Luis DeLeon, outfielder Sixto Lezcano and shortstop Garry Templeton (December 10, 1981).

Padres bench coach and Cardinals Hall of Famer Mark McGwire played in parts of five seasons for St. Louis (1997-2001)...broke Roger Maris' single-season home record with 70 in 1998...made three NL All-Star teams (1998-2000)...later served as St. Louis' hitting coach for three seasons (2010-12), where he was a member of the coaching staff that won 2011 World Series...originally traded by Oakland to St. Louis for pitchers Eric Ludwick, T.J. Mathews and Blake Stein (July 31, 1997).

Padres First Base Coach Skip Schumaker played eight years in St. Louis (2005-12)...member of 2011 World Series Champion Cardinals...originally selected by the Cardinals in the 5th round of the 2001 MLB Draft...later traded by St. Louis to the Dodgers for infielder Jake Lemmerman (December 12, 2012).

Padres broadcaster Carlos Hernandez appeared in 17 games for St. Louis in 2000.

Outfielder Dexter Fowler (Cubs) started for the National League in the 2016 MLB All-Star Game at PETCO Park, while Matt Carpenter (injured) and Marcell Ozuna (Marlins) were named as reserves.

- Makes his 8th start of the season and the 120th of his career (129th appearance).
- His next win will be the 50th of his career. Is attempting to become the 11th-youngest Cardinals pitcher to reach the 50-win milestone (since 1900).
- Needs 5.2 innings to reach 700.0 for his career.
- Tied for 4th in the National League in wins & 2nd on team to Miles Mikolas (5).
- His four-game active win streak is T3rd in the NL (Scherzer currently 6, Mikolas 5).
- St. Louis has won each of his last six starts dating back to 4/7 vs. ARI.
- Received 25 runs of support while on the mound; his 6.21 run support average is the 14th-highest mark in the NL (Miles Mikolas is 10th at 6.36 & Luke Weaver 12th; 6.25).

- Held his opposition to two runs or less in each of his last four starts (1.96 ERA) ranking 17th among N.L. pitchers over that period. (5 ER/23.0 IP/1.96 ERA).
- Dexter Fowler hit walk-off two-run HR in the bottom of the 14th inning.

- Allowed 2 walks and 2 runs in the 4th inning of 5/1 start vs. White Sox and was on the hook for loss before Cardinals rallied with two 9th inning runs for 3-2 walk-off win.
- Went 4-0 in April for the second time in his career; also did so in 2015 in route to a 17-7 season.
- Won his 4th consecutive start in St. Louis' 9-1 win over the Mets on 4/25 at Busch Std.
- Recorded strikeout No. 600 (Michael Conforto, swinging) in the 1st inning of his 4/25 start vs. NYM...became the 5th youngest pitcher in Cardinals history to reach milestone.
- Beat Cincinnati in consecutive starts (4/12 & 4/20), improving to 10-1 lifetime in 16 starts against the Reds.

CAREER

- Of his 119 career starts, 72 have been at least 6.0 innings (66 quality).
- His .613 winning percentage (49-31) over the past six seasons (2013-2018) ranks 11th among National League pitchers.
- Is a lifetime 27-12 with a 3.53 ERA in 62 starts (36 quality starts) at Busch Stadium...his .692 home win pct. ranks 8th in the NL since 2013.
