WHITE SOX AT A GLANCE

- The Chicago White Sox have lost six of their last eight games and 15 of 23 as they open a brief trip tonight at Tampa Bay.
- RHP Lucas Giolito is scheduled to start for the White Sox, who have completed two-thirds of their season with a 38-70 record ... they are on pace to finish with a 57-105 record.
- The Sox are coming off a 2-4 homestand vs. Toronto (1-2) and Kansas City (1-2), which ended yesterday with a 6-4 victory over the Royals.
- Following this three-game series at Tropicana Field, the Sox return home for six games in seven days vs. the Yankees (8/6-8) and Cleveland (8/10-12).
- The White Sox went 3-4 on their last trip from 7/20-26 at Seattle (1-2) and the Angels (2-2).

TONIGHT'S STORYLINES

- The White Sox are on pace to win 57 games, which would be their fewest in a full season since 1970 (also 57).
- The Sox have won three of their last six road games after losing 12 of their previous 14.
- Lucas Giolito struck out a career-high 10 batters over 7.0 IP in his only career start against the Rays on 9/3/17 in Chicago.
- José Abreu is hitting .385/.455/.821 (15-39) with five doubles, five home runs, eight RBI and 12 runs scored over his last 10 games ... Abreu has seven homers and 26 RBI in 27 career games vs. Tampa Bay.
- Omar Narváez is batting .407/.457/.640 (35-86) with four homers and 17 RBI over his last 27 games (since 6/7).

ROSTER MOVES

- Prior to tonight's game, the White Sox placed C Kevan Smith on the Paternity List and recalled C Dustin Garneau from Class AAA Charlotte.
- Garneau, 30, is hitting .206 (21-102) with five home runs and 19 RBI in 33 games with Charlotte after being claimed off waivers from Oakland on 5/24.
- Smith and his wife, Jessica, are expecting their first child ... he is hitting .307 (31-101) with no home runs and 10 RBI in 27 games this season

YESTERDAY'S RECAP

- Pinch-hitter Daniel Palka hit a three-run homer off Jason Hamel with one out in the eighth inning as the White Sox avoided a three-game sweep with a 6-4 victory over Kansas City.
- After pinch-hitter Whit Merrifield hit a three-run homer off Xavier Cedeño to give the Royals a 3-2 lead in the eighth, José Abreu tied the game with a solo shot off Jason Adam in the bottom of the frame ... Avisail García followed with a double, and Omar Narváez was walked intentionally to set up Palka's game-winner.
- Reynaldo López posted a no decision despite allowing two runs on five hits over 7.0 IP ... Cedeño earned his first win after suffering his first blown save, and Luis Avilán recorded the final two outs for his first career save.
- Abreu's homer was the 141st of his career, moving past Ron Kittle into 10th place in White Sox history ... Palka hit his third pinch home run of the season, tying the franchise record.

COMING THROUGH IN A PINCH

- Daniel Palka hit his third pinch home run of the season yesterday, tying Oscar Gamble (1977), John Romano (1959) and Ron Northey (1956) for the White Sox franchise record.
- Palka's three homers and nine RBI as a pinch-hitter this season are both tied for the major-league lead ... his nine RBI are the most by a Sox pinch-hitter since Jerry Hairston in 1987 (10).
- Palka ranks among the American League rookie leaders this season in home runs (2nd, 16), slugging percentage (2nd, .508), RBI (3rd, 42) and total bases (4th, 124).

HOMER HAPPY

- The White Sox have homered in 11 of their last 12 games (19 total) and have hit 35 in their last 24 (since 7/3), tied for the fifth-highest total in the major leagues.
- Avisail García has hit 10 homers in his last 25 games, and Daniel Palka has connected on nine in his last 21.

DOUBLE TROUBLE

- José Abreu has joined Magglio Ordóñez (1999-2003) as the only players in White Sox history to hit 30-plus doubles in five straight seasons ... he and Matt Carpenter are the only players to hit 30-plus doubles in each of the last five seasons (2014-18).
- Abreu also has joined Frank Thomas (nine), Paul Konerko (eight), Ordóñez (five), Ray Durham (five), Willie Kamm (five) and Bibb Falk (five) as the only players in Sox history with five-plus seasons of 30 or more doubles.

WHITE SOX VS. TAMPA BAY

- Tampa Bay leads the season series, 2-1.
- The White Sox are hitting .232/.339/.384 (23-99) with a 3.67 ERA (11 ER/27.0 IP) and have been outscored, 12-11.
- Ten of the last 11 games between the teams have been decided by two runs or less.
- Chicago is 4-11 in its last 15 games at Tropicana Field.
- The Sox lead the all-time series, 83-69 ... they are 45-31 at Guaranteed Rate Field and 38-38 at Tropicana Field.

LOOKING FOR AN EDGE VS. THE EAST

- The White Sox are 186-226 vs. the American League East since 2007, with their only winning record during that span coming in 2016 (19-14).
- The Sox are 7-9 vs. the AL East this season (3-3 on the road) after going 13-20 in 2017.

SHIELDS, 10 YEARS LATER

- James Shields returns to Tropicana Field this weekend to help celebrate the 10-year anniversary of Tampa Bay's 2008 club, which won the American League East title and reached the World Series in its first-ever postseason berth.
- Shields, who was selected by the Rays in the 16th round of the 2000 draft, is the franchise leader in numerous categories, including wins (87), IP (1,454.2), starts (217), strikeouts (1,250), complete games (19) and shutouts (8).
- He is scheduled to start Sunday's series finale.

PILING UP CROOKED NUMBERS

- Yoán Moncada has recorded 19 doubles, five triples, 14 home runs and 44 RBI in 100 games this season.
- Moncada is one of nine major-league players this season to record at least 15 doubles, five triples, 10 homers and 40 RBI, joining Javier Báez, Cody Bellinger, Andrew Benintendi, Corey Dickerson, Teóscar Hernández, Jurickson Profar, Trevor Story and Chris Taylor.

STOLEN BASE ... STOLEN BASE!

- The White Sox rank fifth in the major-leagues this season with 77 stolen bases and are the only team to feature five players with 10 or more steals.
- Tim Anderson leads the Sox with 21 stolen bases, followed by Adam Engel (12), Leury García (11), Yoán Moncada (11) and Yolmer Sánchez (10).
- The last time five or more Sox players recorded 10-plus stolen bases was 2005 (Jermaine Dye, Willie Harris, Tadahito Iguchi, Pablo Ozuna, Scott Podsednik and Aaron Rowand).

POWER AND SPEED

- Tim Anderson (14 HR/21 SB) is one of seven players in the major leagues this season with at least 14 home runs and 20 stolen bases, joining Andrew Benintendi, Mookie Betts, Starling Marte, José Ramírez, Mike Trout and Trea Turner.
- Anderson, who is on pace for 21 homers and 32 steals, is looking to join Alex Ríos (201) and Tommie Agee (1966) as the only players in White Sox history to record 20-plus homers and 30-plus steals in a season.

QUALITY AND QUANTITY

- The White Sox have made a major-league leading 1,361 quality starts since the start of the 2003 season, three more than the second-place New York Mets (1,358) and 45 more than Oakland (1,316), the next-closest American League team.
- The Sox are tied for seventh in the AL in 2018 with 47 quality starts ... James Shields lead the team and is tied for 12th in the AL with 13 this season.

ABREU IN ELITE COMPANY

- José Abreu entered 2018 as one of three players in major-league history to begin his career with at least four consecutive seasons of 25-plus homers and 100-plus RBI, joining Joe DiMaggio (1936-41) and Albert Pujols (2001-10) ... he needs eight homers and 40 RBI to reach 25 and 100 this season.
- Abreu also has joined Al Simmons (11, 1924-34), Pujols (10, 2001-10), Ted Williams (1939-42, '46-49) and DiMaggio (1936-42) as the only players in history to record 100 or more RBI in each of his first four seasons.

ON THE AIR

- The White Sox-Yankees game this Monday has been selected by ESPN for a national broadcast ... the game will be blacked out on ESPN in the Chicagoland viewing area, and will air locally on NBC Sports Chicago ... first pitch remains at 7:10 p.m. CT.
- TV analyst Steve Stone will be off for the Sox series from 8/13-15 at Detroit ... Tom Paciorek will fill in alongside Jason Benetti.

GIOLITO AT A GLANCE

- The 24-year-old makes his 22nd start of the season (11th on the road) and first against the Rays.
- Is 2-1 with a 3.75 ERA (10 ER/24.0 IP) over his last four starts, allowing 19 hits.
- Has gone 3-4 with a 7.76 ERA (46 ER/53.1 IP) over 11 starts at home this season and 4-4 with a 4.92 ERA (33 ER/60.1 IP) in 10 road starts.
- Ranks last among major-league pitchers (min. 20 starts) in ERA (6.26), SO/BB ratio (1.09), walks per 9.0 IP (5.15) and opponents on-base percentage (.363).
- Owns an 8.57 ERA (20 ER/21.0 IP) and .472 opponents on-base percentage in the first inning this season.
- Has received zero runs of support seven times and one run on four occasions.
- Made his first career Opening Day roster.
- Lost 10 pounds in the offseason, dropping from 255 to 245.
- Was acquired from Washington on 12/7/16 with RHP Dane Dunning and RHP Reynaldo López in exchange for OF Adam Eaton.

LAST START

- Posted a no decision on 7/28 vs. Toronto, allowing five runs on nine hits over 4.1 IP ... walked one and struck out three ... gave up one run on three hits in the first inning, two runs on three hits in the second and a solo homer to Russell Martin in the third ... left with a 5-1 deficit after throwing 94 pitches (62 strikes) ... Sox rallied to win, 9-5.

2018 STARTS OF INTEREST

- Threw 6.1 scoreless IP on 7/15 vs. Kansas City ... lost on 7/8 at Houston despite allowing two runs on three hits over a career-high 7.1 IP ... carried a no-hitter through 5.1 IP on 6/28 vs. Minnesota ... pitched into the eighth inning for the first time in his career on 6/22-2 vs. Oakland.
- Allowed a career-high nine hits on 5/29 at Cleveland but did not issue a walk for the first time this season ... lasted 1.1 IP on 5/24 vs. Baltimore, the shortest start of his career ... won 5/13 at the Cubs despite walking a career-high tying seven batters ... became the third Sox pitcher since 2005 to earn the victory while issuing seven-plus walks, joining Derek Holland on 8/8/17 vs. Houston (seven over 5.2 IP) and Gavin Floyd on 4/13/09 at Detroit (seven over 5.0 IP).
- Earned his first victory of the season and first career road win on 4/26 at Kansas City ... allowed career highs of nine runs and seven walks over 2.0 IP on 4/21 vs. Houston ... his three HBP on 4/7 vs. Detroit were the most by a Sox starter since Chris Sale on 9/21/16 at Philadelphia (also three).

DAY AND NIGHT

- Has gone 7-4 with a 3.72 ERA (35 ER/84.2 IP) and .195 (59-303) opponents average over 14 starts during the day since 2017, compared to 3-7 with a 6.78 ERA (56 ER/74.1 IP) and .280 (82-293) opponents average in 14 starts at night.
- His 0.99 ERA during the day in 2017 would have led the American League with the required IP.

IT'S ALL ME

- Is one of 35 members of the Taylor Hooton Foundation advisory board, which is recognized as the leader in advocacy against appearance and performance enhancing drug use by the youth of America.
 - The advisory board is comprised of at least one member from each of the 30 Major League clubs ... the players will participate in the THF 2018 public service campaign, including "It's All Me" themed PSAs which will appear in MLB's 2018 All-Star Game, League Championship Series and World Series programs.
- #### 2017 RECAP
- Made 24 starts with Class AAA Charlotte and seven with the White Sox in his first season in the organization.
 - Went 3-2 with a 1.83 ERA (8 ER/39.1 IP), 20 strikeouts, a .177 (25-141) opponents average and 0.94 WHIP over his final six starts ... five of the outings were quality.
 - Was recalled on 8/23 and made his White Sox debut that night vs. Minnesota (4 ER/6.0 IP; 3 HR) ... earned his first win with the Sox on 8/27 vs. Detroit, allowing just three hits over 7.0 scoreless IP.
 - Allowed one run and struck out a career-high 10 over 7.0 IP on 9/3 vs. Tampa Bay ... became the first Sox pitcher to strike out 10-plus batters within his first three starts with the club since Chris Sale in 2012.
 - Received a ND on 9/13 at Kansas City, allowing one run on four hits in 6.1 IP ... became the 15th Sox pitcher to make four-plus straight starts of 5.0-plus IP and four hits or less allowed.
 - Began the season with Charlotte ... threw his first professional no-hitter on 5/25-1 vs. Syracuse (7.0 IP), marking the first no-hitter in BB&T Ballpark history ... was named IL Pitcher of the Week for 5/22-28.
 - Entered the season ranked by MLB.com as the No. 12 Prospect in baseball.

- His parents, Rick Giolito and Lindsay Frost, are Hollywood actors ... Rick has appeared in "As the World Turns," "Who's the Boss," "Hunter," "Jake and the Fatman," "Twin Peaks" and "Hit the Dutchman" ... Lindsay acted in "The Ring," "Collateral Damage," "Without a Trace," "The Unit," "Boston Legal," "Crossing Jordan," "Lost," "Frasier" and "CSI."
- His uncle, Mark Frost, is a co-creator and writer of the ABC and Showtime drama "Twin Peaks."
- Grandfather, Warren Frost, was a veteran actor who played George Costanza's father-in-law, Henry Ross, on the award-winning sitcom "Seinfeld."

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

- Was selected by Washington in the first round (16th overall) of the 2012 First-Year Player Draft ... was committed to play baseball at UCLA prior to signing with the Nationals.
- Is a 2012 graduate of Harvard-Westlake High School in Los Angeles, where he was teammates with RHP Max Fried ... Fried was selected by San Diego with the seventh overall pick in the 2012 draft and currently pitches for the Atlanta Braves.

VS. TAMPA BAY RAYS

- Makes his second career start against the Rays and first at Tropicana Field.
- Won his only previous start on 9/3 at Guaranteed Rate Field, allowing just one run on three hits with a career-high 10 strikeouts over 7.0 IP.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTER

- LHP Carlos Rodón (3-3, 3.24) makes his 10th start of the season and fifth on the road ... is limiting opponents to a .193 (41-212) average ... is 2-0 with a 1.88 ERA (6 ER/28.2 IP) and 27 strikeouts over his last four starts, allowing just 15 hits.
- Posted a no decision in his last start on 7/29 vs. Toronto, allowing two runs on five hits over 7.2 IP ... carried a no-hitter through 5.2 IP and a one-hit shutout into the eighth inning on 7/24 at the Angels (2 ER/7.2 IP) ... his streak of 15.1 consecutive IP ended in the eighth.
- Began the season on the disabled list to continue his recovery from left shoulder surgery before being reinstated on 6/9.
- Is 0-0 with a 5.19 ERA (5 ER/8.2 IP) in two career starts against the Rays, both in Chicago.
