METSCELLANEOUS: New York has lost four straight and is 4-6 in its last 10 games...The Mets are 19-24 vs. the NL East...New York is 19-42 in its last 61 games...The Mets are 10-20 in one-run games this season (5-11 at home).

AT HOME: New York is 7-9 in its last 16 home games and 9-24 in their last 33 home games...Overall, the Mets are 21-35 at home this year, the second-worst winning percentage (.375) in the National League, behind San Diego (.357).

ATLANTA: The Mets are 3-11 vs. Atlanta with five games remaining...The last time the Mets lost 11 or more games in one year to the Braves was in 2012 (6-12)...The Mets are 0-5 vs. the Braves at home this year...It is the club's longest home losing streak to the Braves since they dropped six straight, June 17-September 21, 2016.

OFFENSE: The Mets have been held to one run or less 24 times this year, tied with Miami for the second-most in the majors... Only Baltimore (27) has been held to one run or less more times this season.

GOOD EYE: New York is 10th in the majors with 378 walks and is eighth in the majors with a 9.4 % walk rate.

NIMMO NOTES: Brandon Nimmo is 13th in the NL with a .373 on-base percentage and tied for seventh in the majors with six triples...Nimmo has a career-high 14 homers, but just two in his last 37 games.

MICHAEL CONFORTO: Is 13-for-45 (.289) with three homers, four doubles and nine RBI, a .365 OBP and a .578 slugging percentage in 13 games since the All-Star break...Over his last 16 games, Conforto is hitting .281 (16-57) with four home runs, four doubles, 12 RBI, 12 runs scored and a .382 OBP over his last 17 games (July 12)...Conforto has a 14.6 percent walk-rate, the 10th-best in the majors.

JOSÉ BAUTISTA: His next home run will be his 340th career homer and tie him with Jack Clark for 98th on major league baseball's all-time list...Bautista is sixth among active players in home runs, behind Albert Pujols, Adrián Beltré, Miguel Cabrera, Edwin Encarnacion and Nelson Cruz.

1,000: Bautista has scored 999 runs during his career...He will be one of 10 active players with 1,000 runs scored.

FROM THE ELIAS FILES: Wilmer Flores had started 16 straight games at first base dating to July 12, before José Bautista started at first last night...It was the longest streak by a Mets first baseman this year.

AUSTIN JACKSON: Has gone 5-16 (.313) since joining the Mets with a .389 OBP and a .500 slugging percentage (six games).

LUIS GUILLORME: Has not struck out in 49 straight plate appearances the longest active streak in the majors.

BRAVES-METS NOTES: The Mets have lost five straight home games to the Braves for the first time since they lost six consecutive home games to Atlanta in 2016.

HONORING RUSTY STAUB: Mets Hall of Famer Rusty Staub passed away on March 29 at age 73... The Mets will wear a patch on the right sleeve on their home and away uniforms during the 2018 season honoring Staub...A six-time All-Star, he had 2,716 hits and 292 homers during his 23-year career.



WHEELZ UP: Zack Wheeler has won three straight starts for the first time in his career and the Mets are 4-0 in his last four starts... The three-game winning streak is tied for the second-longest of his career...Wheeler won six consecutive decisions from July 6-August 20, 2014.

FAST WHEELS: Wheeler's average fastball velocity on the season is up to 96.3, the sixth-highest among MLB qualifiers... Here is a month-by-month look at Wheeler's average fastball: 95.3 in April, 96.0 in May, 96.7 in June, and 97.0 in July.

BOBBY WAHL: Made his Mets debut Thursday, retiring the only two batters he faced...Wahl was acquired from Oakland on July 21 as part of the Jeurys Familia trade...He had 73 strikeouts in 45.0 minor league innings and 292 strikeouts in 221.2 career minor league innings.

AMED ROSARIO: Is tied for third in the NL with three stolen bases since the All-Star break...Overall, is tied for seventh in the majors with six triples...Rosario has been successful in eight of his last 10 stolen base attempts.

IN THE MINORS: Peter Alonso went 3-6 with a homer and three RBI last night for Las Vegas (AAA) vs. Omaha...It was his 10th homer with the 51s in his 40th game...He also has 41 RBI with Vegas...Overall, Alonso leads all minor leaguers with 93 RBI and is tied for fifth with 25 homers.

PRIDE NIGHT: The Mets, along with LGBT Network CEO David Kilmnick, will host Pride Night for the third year in a row tonight ...Thousands of fans will wear commemorative Pride Night shirts with a portion of each ticket sale going to support the LGBT Network's anti-bullying programs in Long Island and New York City schools...The Mets were the first New York team among the four major sports leagues to host a Pride Night when they did so in 2016.

SYNDERGAARD AS THOR BOBBLE: Tonight, the first 25,000 fans attending the Braves-Mets 7:10 p.m. will receive a Noah Syndergaard as Thor bobblehead presented by Marvel.

LAST TIME OUT: Won his third-straight start in the Mets's 1-0 victory over the Pirates on July 29 at PNC Park...Marks the first time in his career he's won three-straight starts (t-second-longest winning streak of his career overall)...Wheeler threw 6.0 scoreless innings, allowing five hits while fanning seven and walking one...Was his third scoreless outing of the season...The Mets have won each of Wheeler's last four starts following a stretch during which they went 1-11 in his previous 12 starts from May 4-July 3...Over his last eight starts, Wheeler is 3-1 with a 2.96 ERA (17 earned runs/51.2 innings)...Has not lost any of his last six starts following a streak of 13 winless outings.

WHEELER AT THE PLATE: Drove in the Mets' only run of their 1-0 win in his last start with an RBI double, making him the first Mets pitcher to provide the only RBI of a 1-0 win since Niño Espinosa on September 14, 1977 vs. Philadelphia...Wheeler has a career-high eight hits (previous career-high was four hits) and four RBI (previous career-high was three RBI) this season...His two doubles are tied for second-most among all pitchers this season, while his four RBI are tied for seventh-most and his eight hits are tied for fifth-most.

VS. BRAVES: Wheeler today faces the Braves for the second time this season and 10th time in his career...Took the loss on June 12 at Atlanta in the Mets' 8-2 setback...In that start, Wheeler tossed 5.2 innings allowing six runs, earned, on eight hits while walking four and fanning two...Wheeler's four walks in that outing are his most in a start this season.

AT CITI: The Mets have won Wheeler's last three home starts after losing his first eight of the season...Is 2-2 with a 2.75 ERA (16 earned runs/52.1 innings) over his last eight home starts...Overall, Wheeler is 2-5 with a 4.35 ERA (33 earned runs/68.1 innings) in 11 starts at home this season...In 41-career home starts, Wheeler is 10-20 with a 4.73 ERA (122 earned runs/232.0 innings).

THE 7.0 LINE: Wheeler has pitched at least 7.0 innings in five of his last six home starts, including a season-high 7.2 innings on July 14 vs. Washington, his longest-ever home start...Had three home starts of at least 7.0 innings in his career prior to this season, one each in 2013, 2014 and 2017.

QUALITY WHEELS: Wheeler has completed at least 6.0 innings in 15 of his 20 starts this season, including 11 of his last 13...Seven of his last 11 starts have been quality outings...Has 11 quality starts overall after posting six quality starts in 17 outings in all of 2017...However, the Mets are 5-10 (.333 win pct) in his 15 starts of 6.0 or more innings and are 3-2 (.600) in his five starts of fewer than 6.0 innings.

STRIKEOUTS: Wheeler owns a career 8.56 K/9 ratio (468 strikeouts/492.0 innings)...In his 20 starts this season, owns a rate of 8.68 K/9 (116 strikeouts/120.1 innings)...Has fanned at least seven batters 11 times this season, including six of his last eight outings (career-high 13 such games in 2014).

DIGGING INTO THE DATA: Wheeler leads the NL and ranks second in the majors with a 25.7 percent soft contact rate (trails Chris Sale, 28.8 percent)...Generates the third-lowest rate of hard contact in the majors (second-lowest in NL) with a 26.9 percent hard-hit rate...Has the eighth-highest WAR (2.3) among NL pitchers according to Fangraphs...Among qualifying NL pitchers, throws the second-fastest fastball (average velocity 96.3 mph) and the hardest slider (91.3 mph).

BY INNING: This season, Wheeler has a 4.95 ERA (11 earned runs/20.0 innings) in the opening frame...From the second inning onward, his ERA is 3.95 (44 earned runs/100.1 innings)...Wheeler has a 4.81 career ERA (46 earned runs/86.0 innings) in the first inning...Owns a 3.77 career ERA (170 earned runs/406.0 innings) in all subsequent innings.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP COREY OSWALT (1-2, 5.27)

LAST START: Earned his first major league win on July 25 at Citi Field in the Mets' 6-4 victory over the Padres... Tossed 5.0 innings and allowing two runs, earned, on three hits with a pair of walks and two strikeouts...Has pitched at least 5.0 innings and allowed three or fewer hits in each of his last three starts...The last Mets starter to have such a stretch was Noah Syndergaard from August 21-September 2, 2016.

2018 SEASON: Oswalt has appeared in six games (five starts) over six stints with the Mets...Has made 11 starts for Triple-A Las Vegas this season, going 4-4 with a 6.02 ERA (35 earned runs/52.1 innings)...Has 52 strikeouts and 20 walks for the Las Vegas 51s...Allowed one hit over 5.0 scoreless innings on April 13 at El Paso... Tossed 6.0 shutout innings on June 11 vs. Round Rock...Has four quality starts in 11 outings at Triple-A.

- His 339 career homers are sixth-most among active players...Trails Albert Pujols (631), Adrián Beltré (467), Miguel Cabrera (465), Edwin Encarnación (372) and Nelson Cruz (351).

- His 10 walk-off RBI are most in the majors since 2014...According to Elias, Flores' franchise-leading 10 walk-off RBI are second-most among active players who lead their franchise in walk-off RBI and still play for that team...Ryan Zimmerman holds the Nationals/Expos record with 16 walk-off RBI.
