ROSTER MOVE: The Mets today reinstated David Wright from the 60-day Disabled List and placed RHP Eric Hanhold on the 60-day DL, with a strained left oblique muscle...Wright hit .171 (7-41) with one double, two RBI, two walks and four runs scored in 12 rehabilitation games between St. Lucie (A) of the Florida State League and Las Vegas (AAA) of the Pacific Coast League...He last played on August 29 for the 51s vs. Tacoma...Wright's last major league game was May 27, 2016 vs. the Dodgers, going 1-4 with a solo homer.

THE CAPTAIN: David Wright is a seven-time All-Star, two-time Gold Glove winner and two-time Silver Slugger recipient...He holds the franchise record for hits (1,777), RBI (970), runs scored (949), doubles (390), total bases (2,945), extra-base hits (658), walks (761) and go-ahead homers (87).

INTERESTING TO NOTE: Wright has homered in his last three major league games - May 23-27, 2016...Wright has homered in four straight game once during his career (June 7-10, 2007).

METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets are 5-5 in their last 10 games...The Mets are 29-20 in their last 49 games and 41-35 since July 1...New York is 36-34 vs. the NL East...The Mets are 20-17 in their last 37 home games and 33-42 overall at home.

SERIES NOTES: New York is 10-3-2 in its last 15 series.

ATLANTA: The Mets are 4-12 vs. Atlanta with three games remaining...The last time the Mets lost 12 or more games in one year to the Braves was in 2012 (6-12)...The last time they had more than 12 losses was 2009 (5-13).

SEPTEMBER: The Mets are 14-8 this month, tied for the seventh-best winning percentage (.636) in the majors...The pitching staff has a 3.61 ERA this month, the ninth-lowest in the majors.

SINCE THE ALL-STAR BREAK: The Mets have scored 300 runs since the All-Star break, tied for the seventh-most in the majors.

CONFORTO CONNECTS: Michael Conforto has 16 homers (the eighth most in the majors) and 50 RBI (third in the majors) since the All-Star break...He is tied with Christian Yelich for the major league lead with 41 RBI since August 1 and tied for fifth in homers (13) during that span...Conforto has 80 RBI, extending career-high...He also has a career high-tying 27 homers (matching last year's total).

SIZZLING SEPTEMBER: Conforto leads all major leaguers with 27 RBI and is tied for the major league lead with eight homers and 15 extra-base hits this month.

NIMMO NOTES: Nimmo is second the NL with a .432 on-base percentage since the All-Star break...He has drawn 22 walks in September, the second-most in the majors and is sixth in the NL with a .440 OBP this month...He has reached base safely in 29 of his last 30 games...Overall, Nimmo is third in the NL with a .397 OBP, 12th with a .880 OPS, tied for third with eight triples and leads the majors with 22 HBP (a single-season franchise record)...Nimmo also has a career-high 17 homers.

JAY BRUCE: Has six homers, 19 RBI, 13 runs scored in 27 games since returning from the DL on August 24.

BRAVES-METS NOTES: The Mets have one home win vs. the Braves...The last time they finished with one or fewer wins at home vs. Atlanta was 1993 (1-5).

SEPTEMBER STARTERS: Mets starting pitchers are 8-4 with a 3.03 ERA (43 earned runs/127.2 innings), the third-lowest ERA in the majors this month.

NOAH NOTES: Noah Syndergaard is 10-3 in his last 15 starts...He is 3-1 with a 2.70 ERA (eight earned runs/26.2 innings) and 27 strikeouts in September.

MLB RECORDS: Jacob deGrom has held opponents to three runs or less in 28 straight starts, the longest single-season streak in major league history...DeGrom has hurled 23 straight quality starts, the longest single-season streak in major league history...He has set a major league record with 19 starts in which he pitched 6.0 or more innings and allowed three or fewer runs but did not win...Research courtesy of Elias.

LEADERBOARD: DeGrom leads the majors in ERA (1.77), FanGraphs WAR (8.3), RA-9 WAR (8.6), FIP (2.03), Opponent's Slugging (.284), Opponent's OPS (.533) and Road ERA (1.87)...He is tied for most quality starts in the majors (27), leads the NL in HR/9 (0.43), DRA (2.15), ERA+ (209), Home ERA (1.66) and xwOBA (expected weighted on-base - .255).

AMED ROSARIO: Has 69 hits since the All-Star break, tied for the eighth-most in the NL...Is tied for fifth in the majors with 29 hits this month and ranks eighth in the NL with a .319 batting average...Rosario is hitting .319 (29-91) with five doubles, two triples, two homers, seven RBI, 16 runs scored and six stolen bases this month...Rosario has become the 33rd player in team history with 20 or more stolen bases in a season...Rosario ranks second in the NL with 16 stolen bases since the All-Star break...He's hitting .300 (61-203) with 10 doubles, two triples, five homers, 23 RBI and 37 runs scored since August 1 (47 games).

HIT MACHINE: Jeff McNeil has a .340 (68-200) batting average since his debut on July 24, which is the fifth-highest in the majors (min. 190 PA)...He is tied for eighth in the majors in hits since his debut...Is tied for second in the majors with 30 hits this month...Has the third-highest batting average (.370) in the majors this month (min. 60 PA)...McNeil has 68 hits through his first 57 career games with the Mets...Only José Reyes (72) had more...McNeil's .340 average in his first 57 career major league games with the Mets, is the highest average in franchise history (min. 180 PA).

FOUR-HIT GAMES: McNeil has three four-games since August 1, tied for the second-most in the majors during that span...Only Mookie Betts (four) has more.

TRIPLES: McNeil is tied for the major league lead with six triples since the All-Star break...Only Mookie Wilson (8 triples in 1981) and Darryl Strawberry (7 triples in 1983) had more as a rookie in team history.

LAST TIME OUT: Syndergaard tonight makes his 24th start of the season...In his last start, September 19 at Philadelphia, tied his shortest outing of the season, pitching 4.0 innings at Citizens Bank Park vs. the Phillies...Allowed three-runs, earned, on four hits with three walks and six punchouts...Allowed a season-high-tying two home runs for the first time since Opening Day...His other 4.0-inning start this season also came vs. the Phils on April 4 at Citi Field.

VS. ATLANTA: Syndergaard is 0-2 with a 4.13 ERA (15 earned runs/32.2 innings) against Atlanta in his career...That is his highest ERA vs. any NL East opponent...The Braves remain the only team Syndergaard has not defeated that he has faced more than once...Syndergaard has at least one win vs. the remaining 13 NL clubs (also no wins vs. the Mets).

SYN-CITI: Syndergaard tonight makes his 12th home start of the season...Has won each of his last six home starts and is 7-1 with a 3.55 ERA (25 earned runs/63.1 innings) overall in 11 starts at Citi Field this season with 69 punchouts and 20 walks...The Mets are 9-2 in those 11 starts...Is tied for seventh in the NL with seven home victories this season...Has yielded three or fewer earned runs in 28 of his last 33 home starts...Owns a 2.81 ERA (83 earned runs/265.2 innings) in 44 games (43 starts) at Citi Field, the second-lowest ERA among all pitchers with at least 120.0 innings pitched at the ballpark, trailing only staffmate Jacob deGrom and his 2.17 ERA at home.

CITI STREAK: Syndergaard tonight aims to become the first pitcher in Citi Field history to win seven-straight starts at the ballpark...Is 6-0 with a 3.50 ERA (14 earned runs/36.0 innings) in his last six outings at Citi Field...The last Mets pitcher to win at least seven-consecutive home starts was Frank Viola, who won seven in a row from September 7, 1989-May 12, 1990.

LIMITING THE LONG BALL: Syndergaard has allowed three home runs in his last three starts after having his career-best 49.0-inning homerless streak snapped on September 8...Has allowed home runs at a rate of 0.58 HR/9 this season (nine home runs/139.1 innings), fourth-lowest in the majors (min. 135.0 innings)...After allowing two home runs in 6.0 innings on Opening Day, has allowed seven homers in his next 133.1 innings (0.47 HR/9)...Since the start of 2016, has the lowest HR/9 rate (0.51) among all 119 pitchers who have thrown at least 300.0 innings over the last three seasons...Is the only pitcher in that group with a HR/9 rate under 0.65 in that span.

CONTACT: According to Fangraphs, Syndergaard induces soft contact 24.1 percent of the time, the third-highest rate in the NL and fifth-highest in the majors...Only 22.1 percent of balls in play against Syndergaard are of the hard-hit variety, the lowest percentage in the majors by over two percentage points (min. 120.0 innings)...Staffmate Zack Wheeler is next-closest with a 24.8 percent hard-hit rate.

FAST AS LIGHTNING: According to PitchF/X average pitch velocity data, Syndergaard throws MLB's fastest four-seam fastball (98.2 mph), changeup (90.9 mph), slider (92.6 mph) and curveball (83.7 mph) among all 92 pitchers who have thrown at least 130.0 innings this season.

IN ELITE COMPANY: Syndergaard's 3.02 career ERA is the fourth-lowest among active major league hurlers with at least 75 career starts...His 3.02 career ERA (169 earned runs/503.1 innings) trails only Clayton Kershaw's 2.38 career ERA, staffmate Jacob deGrom's 2.69 career ERA and Chris Sale's 2.88 ERA...Has the best strikeout-to-walk ratio among active NL pitchers with at least 75 starts (4.93 K/BB)...Is the only pitcher in modern MLB history (since 1900) to have a SO/BB ratio of 5.0 or greater in each of his first three seasons.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP JACOB deGROM (9-9, 1.77 ERA)

LAST START: Earned his ninth win of the season in the Mets' 4-2 victory at Nationals Park, pitching 7.0 innings of one-run ball, allowing three hits and a walk while fanning eight batters...Did not cross the 100-pitch mark for the first time since July 28...Was his NL-leading 17th start allowing one or no runs this season.

RECORD-BREAKING SEASON: Has thrown an single-season MLB-record 23-straight quality starts...Has not allowed more than three runs in 28-consecutive starts, also a single-season MLB record...He is one start shy of tying the overall MLB record for consecutive starts allowing three runs or fewer (Jake Arrieta, 29, 2015-2016).
