WHITE SOX AT A GLANCE

- The Chicago White Sox have lost five of the last six games and 14 of the last 21 as they continue a six-game, seven-day homestand tonight vs. Kansas City.
- RHP Dylan Covey is scheduled to start for the White Sox, who are a season-high 32 games under the .500 mark.
- The Sox opened the homestand by losing two of three vs. Toronto and falling in last night's opener to the Royals.
- Chicago owns the third-worst record in MLB ahead of Kansas City (33-73, .311) and Baltimore (32-75, .299).
- Following tomorrow's series finale vs. the Royals, Chicago will take a brief three-game, weekend trip to Tampa Bay (8/3-5) before returning to Guaranteed Rate Field for a six-day, seven-game homestand vs. the Yankees (8/6-8) and Cleveland (8/10-12).
- The White Sox went 3-4 on their last trip from 7/20-26 at Seattle (1-2) and the Angels (2-2) and 3-2 on their last homestand vs. St. Louis (1-1) and the Royals (2-1) from 7/10-15.

TONIGHT'S STORYLINES

- The White Sox have lost five of their last six games and been outscored, 49-31, during that span ... by comparison, Chicago went 6-3 in its previous nine contests from 7/11-24.
- The Sox have lost four of the last six games vs. Kansas City after starting the season series on a five-game winning streak.
- Chicago starters own a 7.28 ERA (41 ER/50.2 IP) with 16 homers allowed in the last nine games ... by contrast, the group surrendered just one earned run in the previous three contests.
- Matt Davidson has hit eight home runs vs. the Royals this season, tied for the most by a White Sox vs. the club in a season.
- José Abreu is 13-36 (.361) with three home runs, seven RBI, and a 1.119 OPS in his last nine games (hit safely in eight).

LAST NIGHT'S RECAP

- Wily Peralta struck out Yoán Moncada, the potential tying run, to end the game and close out Kansas City's 4-2 win.
- The Royals took a 2-0 lead in the fifth on Ryan O'Hearn's two-run homer, the first of his career ... Brett Phillips added a two-run shot in the seventh to extend the Kansas City lead to 4-0.
- The White Sox cut the deficit to 4-2 on Matt Davidson's two-run home run in the bottom of the seventh.
- James Shields suffered the loss after allowing four runs on five hits, including two homers, with eight strikeouts in 7.0 IP.
- José Abreu went 2-4 with a double, his 30th of 2018, marking his fifth straight season with 30-plus ... the Sox went 3-12 with RISP, left 13 on base and struck out 11 times.

RAISED VS. THE ROYALS

- Matt Davidson is 16-37 (.432) with eight home runs and 14 RBI in 10 games vs. Kansas City this season.
- He is tied with Albert Belle (1998) and José Valentín (2003) for the most homer by a Sox vs. the Royals in a single season.
- The last player to hit eight homers vs. a team was Adam Dunn (2013 vs. Minnesota) ... Gus Zernial, who hit 11 vs. the St. Louis Browns in 1950, owns the club record (STATS LLC).

DOUBLE TROUBLE

- José Abreu last night reached 30-plus doubles for the fifth consecutive season, becoming the first White Sox to reach the mark in each of his first five MLB seasons.
- He joined Magglio Ordóñez (1999-2003) as the only White Sox to hit 30-plus doubles in five straight seasons.
- The only other player in MLB to record 30 or more doubles every season since 2014 is St. Louis' Matt Carpenter.
- Abreu joined Frank Thomas (nine), Paul Konerko (eight), Ordóñez (five), Ray Durham (five), Willie Kamm and Bibb Falk (five) as the only Sox with five-plus seasons of 30-plus doubles.

MAJOR MINOR HONORS

- Class AAA Charlotte OF Eloy Jiménez has been named the White Sox Minor League Player of the Month for July, while Class AA Birmingham RHP Dylan Cease has been named Pitcher of the Month as voted by a panel of Chicago-area media members.
- Jiménez batted .435 (27-62) with seven doubles, six home runs, 13 RBI, 13 runs scored, a .455 OBP, .839 SLG and 1.293 OPS in 16 games in July ... he hit safely in 14 of the 16 games, including a 10-game hitting streak from 7/19-30.
- Cease was 2-0 with a 1.20 ERA (4 ER/30.0 IP), 42 strikeouts and a .165 (17-103) opponents average over five starts in July.

\$25 FOR 25 CAMPAIGN

- CWS Charities (CWSC) holds its annual 25-hour fundraising campaign, \$25 for 25, from noon on 8/2 through 1 p.m. on 8/3.
- Donors will have the opportunity to win a new prize during each hour of the campaign, with the final "power hour" of the campaign (noon-1 p.m. on 8/3) allowing for 25 different prizes.

WHITE SOX VS. KANSAS CITY

- The White Sox lead the season series, 7-4, going 2-2 at Guaranteed Rate Field and 5-2 at Kauffman Stadium ... Chicago owns a 66-43 edge in runs scored this season.
- The Sox are hitting .293/.361/.529 with 22 home runs, and own a 3.27 ERA (36 ER/99.0 IP) and five quality starts.
- Chicago is 17-13 vs. K.C. since 2017 (40-72 from 2011-16).
- The White Sox are 8-5 over the last 13 games at Guaranteed Rate Field but 15-17 since 2015 (lost five of the last nine).
- The White Sox lead the all-time series, 392-376 ... they are 216-172 at home (124-102 at Guaranteed Rate Field) and 176-204 on the road (165-182 at Kauffman Stadium).

TELEVISION TIDBITS

- Next Monday's Yankees-White Sox game has been selected by ESPN for a national broadcast ... the game will be blacked out on ESPN in the Chicagoland viewing area, and will air locally on NBC Sports Chicago ... first pitch remains at 7:10 p.m. CT.
- TV analyst Steve Stone will be off for the Sox series from 8/13-15 at Detroit ... Tom Paciorek will fill in alongside Jason Benetti.

ROYAL CONNECTIONS

- RHP James Shields (2013-14), and coaches Joe McEwing (2005) and Nick Capra (1988) all played for Kansas City.

LOOKING FOR CENTRAL COMMAND

- The White Sox are 15-27 against the American League Central in 2018, going 7-14 at home and 8-13 on the road.
- Chicago is 4-10 over its last 14 games, 8-17 in the last 25 and 9-21 in the last 30 ... the club has scored three runs or less 17 times during the 30-game span ... the Sox are 4-7 in the last 11 and 6-11 in the last 17 contests at Guaranteed Rate Field.
- The Sox are 306-404 vs. the AL Central since 2009, posting a losing record every season except 2012 (37-35).

PILING UP CROOKED NUMBERS

- Yoán Moncada has recorded 19 doubles, five triples, 13 home runs and 43 RBI in 98 games this season.
- He joins Javier Báez, Cody Bellinger, Andrew Benintendi, Corey Dickerson, Teóscar Hernández, Jurickson Profar, Trevor Story and Chris Taylor as the only MLB players to record 15+ 2B/5+ 3B/10+ HR/40+ RBI this season.

STOLEN BASE ... STOLEN BASE!

- Tim Anderson (21), Adam Engel (12), Leury García (11), Yoán Moncada (11) and Yolmer Sánchez (10) have all stolen 10 or more bases for the White Sox this season.
- The Sox are the only team in MLB this season with five players to record double-digits in stolen bases ... the last time five or more Chicago players recorded 10-plus stolen bases was 2005 (Dye, Harris, Iguchi, Ozuna, Podsednik, Rowand).
- Chicago ranks fourth in MLB with 77 steals in 2018.

"X" MARKS THE SPOT

- Xavier Cedeño has not allowed a run in 17 of his 19 games this season (11 of his outings have been hitless) ... opponents are hitting just .154 (8-52) in 2018 (righties are 3-24, .125).
- Cedeño has allowed just three of 13 (23.1 percent) inherited runners to score, and first batters faced are 2-17 (.118).

POWER AND SPEED

- Tim Anderson (14 HR/career-high 21 SB) is one of five players in MLB this season with 14-plus homers and 20-plus steals (also Mookie Betts, Starling Marte, José Ramírez and Mike Trout).
- Anderson is on pace for 21 homers and 32 steals in 2018 ... he is looking to become the third White Sox to record a 20+ HR/30+ SB season, joining Alex Ríos (2010) and Tommie Agee (1966).

BARRELING BACKSTOPS

- Omar Narváez and Kevan Smith are hitting a combined .344 (66-192) with nine doubles, four home runs, 28 RBI and 21 multihit efforts in 55 games since 6/1 (hit safely in 43 contests).
- Narváez (1st, .379) and Smith (2nd, .309) lead all MLB catchers in average since 6/1 (minimum 100 plate appearances).
- Narváez owns 13 multihit efforts and has hit safely in 21 games since 6/1 ... Smith has hit safely in 22 of his 26 games in 2018 since being recalled from Class AAA Charlotte on 6/5.
- Narváez is 16-42 (.381) with two doubles, one triple, three home runs, nine RBI and a 1.113 OPS over his last 12 games.

QUALITY AND QUANTITY

- James Shields has made 13 QS, tied for 10th in the American League ... the Sox are tied for eighth in the AL with 44 QS.
- The White Sox have made 1,360 QS since the start of 2003, three more than the New York Mets (1,357) for the most in MLB ... the next closest AL team is Oakland at 1,315 quality starts.

COVEY AT A GLANCE

- The 26-year-old right-hander is scheduled to make his 14th start of the season, sixth at home and sixth career start against Kansas City.
- Is 1-4 with a 9.00 ERA (28 ER/28.0 IP), 15 strikeouts, seven home runs allowed, 14 walks and a .302 (35-116) opponents average over his last six starts ... went 3-0 with a 1.53 ERA (5 ER/29.1 IP), 30 strikeouts, eight walks and a .246 (28-114) opponents average in his previous five starts.
- Was selected by the White Sox from the Athletics in the major-league portion of the Rule 5 Draft on 12/8/16 ... entered the 2017 season with zero major-league experience.
- Has gone 20-26 with a 4.06 ERA (181 ER/401.1 IP) and 288 strikeouts over 81 appearances (78 starts) over five minor-league seasons in the Athletics (2013-16) and White Sox (2017-18) organizations.
- Attended the University of San Diego from 2010-13 ... was teammates with Chicago Cubs third baseman and 2016 National League Most Valuable Player Kris Bryant.
- Was originally selected by Oakland in the fourth round of the June 2013 First-Year Player Draft.
- Bio is on page 63 of the 2018 Chicago White Sox media guide.

LAST START

- Suffered his sixth loss of the season on 7/26 at Los Angeles-AL after allowing six runs on nine hits and two walks with two strikeouts over 4.2 IP.
- Allowed two solo home runs to Kole Calhoun and Ian Kinsler, a RBI single to Justin Upton and a two-RBI triple to Andrelton Simmons.
- Departed with the White Sox trailing, 6-2, in the fifth inning ... tossed 86 pitches (55 strikes) ... Chicago went on to lose, 12-8.

HOME SWEET HOME

- Is 2-1 with a 3.54 ERA (11 ER/28.0 IP), one home run allowed, 10 walks, 26 strikeouts and a .274 (31-113) opponents average over five home starts this season, compared to 2-5 with a 6.69 ERA (30 ER/40.1 IP), seven home runs allowed, 20 walks, 24 strikeouts and a .280 (45-161) opponents average over eight starts on the road.
- Suffered the loss in his last home start on 7/10 vs. St. Louis after allowing five runs (four earned) on nine hits and two walks with five strikeouts over 5.0 IP.

WHERE'S THE RUN SUPPORT?

- Is receiving a 3.88 run support average over his last 10 starts ... has received two runs of support or less in six of those starts.
- Has received one or no runs of support in 10 of his 25 career starts ... his career run support breakdown: zero (three), one (seven), two (seven), three (three) and four-plus (five).

SECOND INNING STRUGGLES

- Owns a 7.62 ERA (11 ER/13.0 IP) in the second inning this season ... has allowed runs in the second frame in three of his last seven starts ... by comparison, owns a 2.08 ERA (3 ER/13.0 IP) in the first this season.
- Has allowed 13 runs in the second, tied for the 12th-most among American League pitchers in 2018 ... four of his eight home runs allowed this season have come in the inning.

2018 MINOR LEAGUE STARTS

- Went 3-1 with a 2.33 ERA (10 ER/38.2 IP), 36 strikeouts and a .226 (32-141) opponents average over seven starts with Class AAA Charlotte this season.
- Did not receive a decision in his last start with Charlotte on 5/15, allowing one unearned run on four hits with one walk and six strikeouts over 6.0 IP.

COVEY'S COVER STORY

- Originally was selected by Milwaukee in the first round (14th overall) of the June 2010 First-Year Player Draft ... following his post-draft physical and before signing a contract, was diagnosed with Type 1 diabetes.
- Following the diagnosis, elected not to sign with the Brewers and committed to play at the University of San Diego ... was teammates with Chicago Cubs third baseman and 2016 National League Most Valuable Player Kris Bryant.
- Pitched for the Toreros from 2010-13 before being drafted by Oakland in the fourth round in 2013.
- Former White Sox and current Boston Red Sox left-hander Chris Sale was selected one spot ahead of Covey with the 13th overall pick in the 2010 draft.

VS. AMERICAN LEAGUE CENTRAL

- Is scheduled to make his 13th career appearance (11th start) against the American League West.
- Has gone 1-6 with a 5.43 ERA (37 ER/61.1 IP), seven home runs allowed, 33 walks, 31 strikeouts and a .281 (64-228) opponents average against the division lifetime.

VS. KANSAS CITY ROYALS

- Is scheduled to make his sixth career start against Kansas City.
- Is 0-4 with a 6.04 ERA (19 ER/28.1 IP), four home runs allowed, 13 walks, 13 strikeouts and a .248 (26-105) opponents average over five starts lifetime.
- Suffered the loss in his last start on 4/28-2 at Kansas City after allowing four runs on seven hits and three walks with three strikeouts over 6.0 IP.

TOMORROW'S SCHEDULED STARTER

- RHP Reynaldo López (4-9, 4.57) is scheduled to make his 22nd start of the season, 10th at home and sixth career against Kansas City ... is 0-4 with an 8.72 ERA (21 ER/21.2 IP) in his last four starts.
- Is 2-2 with a 5.57 ERA (20 ER/32.1 IP) and .260 (33-127) opponents average over his last five starts at Guaranteed Rate Field.
- Suffered his ninth loss of the season in his last start on 7/27 vs. Toronto, allowing a career-high eight runs on seven hits and four walks with three strikeouts over 4.1 IP ... surrendered a career-high five home runs.
- Is receiving a 3.47 run support average (47 RS/122.0 IP) this season, the seventh-lowest in the American League and 10th-lowest in baseball.
- Is 2-1 with a 3.90 ERA (14 ER/32.1 IP), 16 strikeouts and a .294 (40-136) opponents average against Kansas City over five career starts.
