**LEADING OFF:** Angels play the seventh contest (3-3) of a 10-game, 11-day trip to Houston (2-2), Texas (Sept. 3-5; 1-1) & Chicago White Sox (Sept. 7-9)...Halos are off tomorrow...Angels are 7-8 in 'rubber' games this season...LAA has dropped 10 of 14 and are 18-24 since the break...Halos have spent last 69 days in fourth place...19 of 22 remaining games are with divisional foes: Six with Texas (6 at home), six vs. Oakland (3 home, 3 road), four vs. Seattle (all at home) & three at Houston...Following the trip, Angels return home to face Rangers (Sept. 10-12) & Seattle (Sept. 13-16).

**WE MEET AGAIN:** The 23-year, 55-day age difference between Bartolo Colon and rookie Jaime Barria is the largest in any game in franchise history (with LAA pitcher either older or younger)...These two hurlers faced off earlier this season at Angel Stadium (June 1).

**YOUTH SERVED:** In his last seven games, Jaime Barria is 4-1 with a 2.78 ERA (35.2 IP – 11 ER) after going 0-6 with a 5.19 ERA (34.2 IP – 20 ER) in previous seven starts...Barria leads MLB rookie starters with nine wins (min. 10 GS)...In his three starts vs. Texas this year, Barria is 2-0 with a 1.13 ERA (16 IP – 2 ER) and 14 strikeouts (made MLB debut here May 3<sup>rd</sup>).

**CONQUERING COLON:** Halos with strong career numbers vs. Bartolo Colon include: Mike Trout (.550; 11/20, 3 HR), Andrelton Simmons (.464; 13/28, 2 2B, 1 3B) and Justin Upton (.308; 4/13, 1 HR).

**LIVIN' THAT GLOBE LIFE:** Mike Trout is batting .336 (76/226) with 17 doubles, four triples, 12 HRs & 47 RBI in 62 career games at Globe Life Park...Two of the first three big league homers for Taylor Ward have come in Arlington (5 of first 8 RBI here as well)...In six career games at Globe Life, David Fletcher is batting .417 (10/24) with four runs, three doubles and five RBI.

**DID YOU KNOW?** Shohei Ohtani's home run last night was first against a lefty in his MLB career...RHP Junichi Tazawa is the fifth Japanese native in Angels' history (Shigetoshi Hasegawa, Hideki Matsui, Hisanori Takahashi & Ohtani).

**FAST FACTS:** Ohtani has recorded 63 strikeouts this season, an Angels' record through a pitcher's first 10 career starts (previous was 56 by Bo Belinsky in 1962)...Ohtani is the first player since Babe Ruth in 1919 with at least 50 IP and 15 HR in a single season.

**PUJOLS SURGERY:** On August 30<sup>th</sup>, Albert Pujols underwent an arthroscopic debridement of his left knee. A general timetable to return to playing following this procedure is 6-8 weeks. Updates will be provided when appropriate...Pujols ranks 23<sup>rd</sup> all-time with 3,082 hits (Ichiro is 22<sup>nd</sup> with 3,089) and sixth all-time with 633 home runs (Willie Mays is 5<sup>th</sup> w/660 HR)...He is one of four players with 3,000 hits & 600 HR (Mays, Hank Aaron & Alex Rodriguez).

**MINOR MENTIONS:** Salt Lake shortstop Luis Rengifro split time on three minor league levels this season (A+ Inland Empire – 41 G, AA Mobile – 40 G & AAA Salt Lake – 46 G). The Venezuelan prospect combined to hit .299 (150/502) with 109 runs, 30 doubles, 13 triples, seven home runs, 64 RBI and 41 stolen bases in 127 games played. Rengifro, who batted leadoff for the Bees, boasted a .399 on-base percentage this season...LHP Patrick Sandoval (Mission Viejo HS), made seven combined starts in Angels' system at Mobile (AA) & Inland Empire (A+) allowing just three earned runs in 34.1 IP (0.79 ERA; 3 R, 3 ER, 18 H, 14 BB, 48 K)...All told, he went 11-1 with two saves and a 2.43 ERA (122.1 IP – 28 ER; 29 BB, 145 K) in 26 games 20 starts) this season.

**SHO OFF:** Shohei Ohtani's 16 HRs are two shy of matching the MLB rookie record by a Japanese native set by Kenji Johjima in 2006 with Seattle (144 games)...Ohtani is the first player in MLB history with 15+ HR & 50+ pitching Ks in same season (STATS).

**2019 SCHEDULE:** Angels' highlights of the 2019 schedule include a two-game series (May 4-5) against Houston at Estadio de Béisbol in Monterrey, Mexico...LAA heads south of the border for first time since 2000 when hosting an exhibition game vs. Arizona in Hermosillo, Mexico...Angels previously played internationally in San Juan, Puerto Rico for a three-game series with Montreal in 2003... Matching up against the N.L. Central for interleague play, LAA faces St. Louis at Busch Stadium (June 21-23), Albert Pujols' first visit to St. Louis as an opponent.

**THE NEW ME:** In 65 games in return from D.L., Kole Calhoun is batting .280 (67/239) with 48 runs, 14 doubles, a triple, 17 HRs & 43 RBI (hit .145 with 1 HR and 11 RBI over first 50 games)...Calhoun's 17 HRs since June 18<sup>th</sup> rank tied for third in A.L.

**HI, MY NAME IS...** 58 players (35 pitchers - 14 starters) have appeared in 2018 to set single-season franchise marks (MLB record for players used is 64 by 2014 Texas Rangers)...14 players have made MLB debuts in 2018 breaking team record of 12 (1996 & 1975).

**TROUT TRIFECTA:** With an MLB-leading 109 walks, Trout is the first player in MLB history with three seasons of 25 home runs, 20 stolen bases and 100 walks by age-26 season-or-younger...Joins Jeff Bagwell (3), Bobby Abreu (3) & Barry Bonds (7) as only players with at least three such seasons in career.

**GOLD STANDARD:** Three-time Gold Glove Andrelton Simmons leads A.L. shortstops with 202 putouts (2<sup>nd</sup> in MLB) and has second fewest errors (8) in junior circuit among shortstops (min. 100 GS)... Leads MLB with a 16.1 Ultimate Zone Rating in 2018 (UZR) – FanGraphs...Since 2015, his 95 defensive runs saved (DRS) also lead MLB...Thru 907 career games, Simmons' defensive WAR is 25.0 – best by any shortstop in MLB history.

**GLOVE STORY:** With 67 errors committed, Angels are on pace to break club record for fewest miscues in a full campaign (80 set last season)...Fewest in a strike-shortened season is 76 in 1994...Club ranks fourth in A.L. with .987 fielding pct...Halos lead MLB turning 148 double plays (team record is 203 in 1985)...Catchers own a 41.2 caught stealing pct. (28 of 65), tops in A.L...Mike Trout is only CF in MLB (min. 70 G) with a 1.000 fielding pct...Kole Calhoun's 27 OF assists since 2016 lead A.L.

**BULLPEN BITS:** 3.72 bullpen ERA ranks sixth in A.L...Halo relievers lead MLB in inherited runners scored pct. allowing just 22.0 % to score (49 of 223)...Bullpen has logged 528 IP, second in A.L. to Tampa Bay...Since 2016, Jose Alvarez's 196 games pitched lead A.L. (162.2 IP)...Over last two seasons (2017-18), Alvarez and Blake Parker are tied for A.L. lead with 132 games pitched apiece.

**THIS N' THAT:** 32 players are on Angels' current active roster...Club is 18-26 when lefty starts (49-46 vs. RHS)...LAA had a club-record 15 players on D.L. simultaneously twice this season...Halos sent 25 different players to D.L., most in MLB this season...Shohei Ohtani is batting .316 (6/19) with four runs, a double, two home runs and four RBI as a pinch hitter this season - tied for A.L. lead among pinch hitters with 13 total bases (D. Palka, CWS)...Halos are one of seven teams in A.L. with a positive run differential (+23)...Angels' 179 HRs hit rank sixth in A.L...Andrelton Simmons leads MLB in PA per SO at 15.32 (521 PA/34 K) - also ranks second in MLB batting .293 (48/164) with two strikes...Mike Scioscia (1,637 wins) ranks 18<sup>th</sup> on the all-time managerial wins list (Jim Leyland 17<sup>th</sup> with 1,769)...A. Heaney is one strikeout shy of 150 on season, would be first Halo to reach the mark since 2015 (Garrett Richards; 176 & Hector Santiago; 162).

**FISH FACTS:** Mike Trout & Willie Mays are only players with three 30 HR/20 SB seasons by age-26 season-or-younger (Trout is only player in A.L. history)...Trout turned age 27 on August 7<sup>th</sup>...His 62.3 career WAR is currently second-highest all time by a position player through age-26 season (Ty Cobb, 63.4).

**HOT HALOS:** Over his last four starts, Felix Pena has posted a 2.88 ERA (25 IP – 8 ER)...Jose Fernandez has hit safely in 12 of 18 games with Angels this season (hits in nine of 12 starts)...18 of last 21 outings for Justin Anderson are scoreless...David Fletcher has hits 16 of last 19 games (eight multi-hit efforts) and is batting .323 (27/77) with 11 runs, four doubles, a triple and nine RBI in span...Jose Alvarez has not been scored upon in 16 of last 18 outings (1.15 ERA; 15.2 IP – 2 ER)...Mike Trout has successfully reached base in 21 of his last 22 games with 17 runs, six home runs, 13 RBI and 25 walks in that span.

**@ TEXAS:** Halos lead 2018 season series 7-5 (5-4 on road)...Six games remaining with Texas (all at home)...Angels are 28-19 in Arlington since 2014...Kole Calhoun is batting .312 (59/189) with 8 HR & 34 RBI in 47 career games at Globe Life...David Fletcher is batting .542 (13/24) against Texas this season.

**WHITE SOX ON DECK:** 2018 season series is tied 2-2...LAA has won 16 of last 19 meetings at home but have dropped nine of last 12 in Chicago...Angels are 34-20 overall vs. CWS since 2011.

**THIS DATE IN ANGELS HISTORY**

**September 5**

(1961) Lee Thomas became the first Angel to post three home runs in a game in the second contest of a doubleheader at Kansas City... Thomas also set a club record with eight RBI and finished 5-for-5 in the game (9-for-11 in doubleheader).

**September 6**

(1996) Darin Erstad hit his first career inside-the-park home run off Brad Radke in club's 6-2 loss at Minnesota.

**TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER – RHP JAIME BARRIA**

**9-8, 3.46 ERA**

*In last seven starts, 4-1 with a 2.78 ERA (35.2 IP – 11 ER)*

- **BACK IN THE BIGS:** Is making 22<sup>nd</sup> start of the season for Angels and 11<sup>th</sup> on the road...Recalled from Adv.-A Inland Empire on July 23 for sixth stint of season with Angels (did not pitch for 66ers during stint with the team).
- **GENERATION GAP, PART 2:** When they faced off on June 1 at Angel Stadium, the 23 years, 55 days difference in age (8456 total days) between **Bartolo Colon** (45 years, 8 days) and **Jaime Barria** (21 years, 318 days) was the largest in any Angels game in franchise history...They will match that record tonight.
- **THERE'S NO PLACE LIKE THE ROAD:** Is pitching to a 2.77 ERA (52 IP – 16 ER) on the road this season, compared with a 4.12 ERA (54.2 IP – 25 ER) at Angel Stadium...His road ERA ranks fifth in the American League (min. 50 IP) this season.
- **LAST TIME OUT:** Earned win in last start on Friday at Houston after tossing six scoreless innings and allowing three hits with one walk and four strikeouts...Marked fourth scoreless start of the season.
- **THREE-OR-FEWER:** Has allowed three-or-fewer runs in 12 of last 15 starts and in 17 of 21 starts on the season.
- **WALKS UP:** Has walked 21 batters across last 13 starts after walking nine in previous eight starts to begin the year.
- **HOT AND COLD:** In last seven starts, is 4-1 with a 3.34 ERA (35.2 IP – 11 ER)...During seven game period from June 12 – July 23, was 0-6 with a 5.19 ERA (34.2 IP – 20 ER) but allowed two-or-fewer earned runs in four of the seven games...In his first seven starts, Angels were 5-2 and he went 5-1 with a 2.48 ERA (36.1 IP – 10 ER).
- **ROOKIE RANKINGS:** Ranks second among Major League rookies in wins and is seventh in innings pitched...Is fifth (min. 75 IP) among all MLB rookies in ERA and ninth in batting average against (.252)...Is the first Angels pitcher to record 9+ wins in his first Major League season since **Jose Arredondo** (10 wins in 2008).
- **VS. TEXAS:** In three starts vs. Rangers this year, is 2-0 with a 1.13 ERA (16 IP – 2 ER) and 14 strikeouts...Has pitched at least five innings and allowed one-or-fewer runs in all three contests.
- **AT GLOBE LIFE PARK:** In two games at Globe Life Park, is 1-0 with a 1.80 ERA (10 IP – 2 ER)...Has pitched exactly five innings and allowed one run in each of two previous starts...Made Major League debut on May 3 at Globe Life Park.
- **FIRST HALF RECAP:** Made 13 first half starts for the Angels and pitched to a 5-6 record and 3.55 ERA (66 IP – 26 ER) with 52 strikeouts.
- **STREAKING:** Won four straight decisions between May 3 – June 1, which is the longest streak by any Angels pitcher in 2018.
- **HALOS FROM PANAMA:** Barria is the first Panama-born pitcher in Angels history...The only other player in franchise history who was born in Panama is Hall of Famer **Rod Carew**.
- **NO-HIT BID:** Carried a no-hitter through first 5.1 innings of start on May 3 vs. Baltimore before allowing a single to **Trey Mancini**...Recorded first quality start of career and first winning decision at Angel Stadium.
- **RECORD BREAKING FRAME:** During start on April 22 vs. San Francisco, tossed 49 pitches in a scoreless first inning, including a Major League record 21-pitch at-bat vs. **Brandon Belt** (previous record was 20 pitches seen by Houston's **Ricky Gutierrez** vs. Cleveland RHP **Bartolo Colon** on June 26, 1998...Became first pitcher to throw 49+ pitches in an inning without allowing a run since D-backs **Nick Bierbrodt** on June 13, 2001 vs. Cubs).
- **BIG LEAGUE DEBUT:** Made Major League debut with Angels on April 11 at Texas and earned the win after tossing five innings and allowing one run on one hit (HR by **Ryan Rua**) with three walks and three strikeouts.
- **STARTING WITH A START:** In Major League debut on April 11, became the first player to make his Major League debut as a starting pitcher for the Angels since **Matt Shoemaker** on Sept. 20, 2013 vs. Seattle...He also became the first player to earn a win in MLB debut as a starter since **Sean O'Sullivan** on June 16, 2009 at San Francisco.
- **YOUTH WINS:** Is the youngest player (21.267 on day of first win) to have earned a winning decision in the American League this season.
- **YOUNG ANGELS:** At 21 years, 267 days, Barria was the youngest Angels player to make his Major League debut since **Mike Trout** (19 years, 335 days) on July 8, 2011...He's the youngest pitcher to debut with Angels since **Tyler Chatwood** (21 years, 85 days) on June 19, 2011.
- **WITH THE BEES:** In four starts with Triple-A Salt Lake this season, is 0-0 with a 3.60 ERA (15 IP – 6 ER) and 16 strikeouts.
- **IN THE RANKINGS:** Entered 2018 ranked by *Baseball America* as the #6 prospect in the Angels organization and was the top pitching exclusive prospect (RHP/DH **Shohei Ohtani** was ranked #1)...He was also ranked #7 by *MLB.com* in the Halos system.
- **MINOR LEAGUE HONORS:** Was selected to 2017 All-Star Futures Game at Marlins Park and pitched one scoreless inning in relief with one walk and two strikeouts for Team World...Named a 2017 California League Mid-Season All-Star and 2016 Midwest League Mid-Season All-Star...Selected as Angels Organizational Player of the Month for May and June 2017.
- **CAREER NOTES:** Native of Panama City, Panama...Originally signed with Angels as an international free agent, April 11, 2013.
