9th Inning Home Runs

The Braves hit three home runs in the ninth inning yesterday, including a go-ahead three-run shot by Ender Inciarte.

The barrage marked the first time the Braves hit three home runs in any inning since April 14, 2014 at Philadelphia, and the first time in the ninth inning since May 25, 1999 at Milwaukee. The club was tied 2-2 in that game before hitting three solo shots.

TONIGHT'S GAME: The Braves and Giants open a three-game set tonight with the fourth meeting between the teams this season...The Giants swept a three-game set at SunTrust Park earlier this season, May 4-6.

A The Braves have not won a series in San Francisco since sweeping a three-game set, April 22-24, 2011...They are 0-4-2 in series play at AT&T Park over this stretch.

A Since that sweep, the Braves are 8-13 in San Francisco, and have been outscored 104-70.

A LHP Sean Newcomb is set to face the Giants for the second time in his career...He went 6.0 innings and allowed one run, earned, in a no-decision last season on June 21...The lefty struck out three in the 5-3, 11-inning win at SunTrust Park.

A RHP Dereck Rodríguez is set to face Atlanta for the first time in his career...The rookie is 4-1 with a 1.72 ERA (14 ER/73.1 IP) in his last 12 appearances, 11 starts.

NEVER QUIT WITH SNIT: The Braves rallied for a 9-5 victory yesterday, scoring six runs in the ninth inning to win a series in Arizona for the first time since 2012...The win was the Braves' 19th in their last at-bat, which is tied for the most such victories in the National League with tonight's opponent, San Francisco.

A Each of the Braves' last six wins have come in their last at-bat...It's the team's longest such streak since another six-game run from July 20-July 28, 1995 and tied for the longest such stretch by a team in baseball this season...The Chicago White Sox also had a six-game run this season, July 28-August 10.

A Since Brian Snitker was named interim manager on May 17, 2016, the Braves have 56 last at-bat wins, the most in the major leagues...They have also won 12 games that they trailed in the ninth inning since that date, tied for the fifth most in the N.L., according to the Elias Sports Bureau.

A The Braves led the N.L. in last at-bat victories the last two seasons...They had 20 in 2017 and 19 in 2016.

A The Braves have scored 239 times in the seventh inning or later this season, tied for the second-most such runs in the National League this season.

A Yesterday's win coupled with Philadelphia's loss at New York dropped Atlanta's magic number to clinch the National League East to 16...They are a season high-tying 4.5 games up in the East.

ON THE ROAD: The Braves are 42-30 (.583) away from SunTrust Park this season, which is the best road record in the National League and the fourth best in baseball.

A The 42 road wins are the most since the 2012 club went 46-35 away from Turner Field.

NO. 25: OF Ronald Acuña Jr. hit his 25th home run yesterday, and now has the fifth most home runs in a single season prior to turning 21... Acuña Jr. tied Hall-of-Famers Eddie Mathews (1952) and Orlando Cepeda (1958), while moving within two of another Hall-of-Famer, Al Kaline (1955), for fourth place.

A Boston's Tony Conigliaro had 32 in 1965... Cincinnati's Frank Robinson hit 34 of his 38 homers in 1956 before turning 21, while New York's Mel Ott holds the record with 42 in 1929.

A Acuña Jr. also moved past Mike Trout for most home runs overall prior to turning 21... Acuña Jr. is tied for 10th in baseball history and one behind Alex Rodríguez and Andruw Jones for eighth place.

A Acuña Jr. is now hitting .333 (63-for-189) with 18 home runs, 43 runs scored, 12 stolen bases, a .420 on-base percentage and a .709 slugging percentage since moving to the leadoff spot for the first game out of the All-Star break on July 20.

A He leads the National League in runs and home runs since the All-Star break, while his 63 hits and .709 slugging percentage are second.

STOLEN BASES: OF Ronald Acuña Jr. stole a base for the third consecutive game yesterday, giving him 14 this season...Due to an official scoring change for September 8, he was credited with a ninth-inning stolen base for that game.

A Acuña Jr. is trying to become just the third player in baseball history to go 20-20 in his age-20 season or earlier... Los Angeles' Mike Trout hit 30 and stole 49 bases in 2012, while Cincinnati's Vada Pinson had 20 and 21 in 1959.

A Only three National League rookies of any age have ever gone 20-20, with the last being Arizona's Chris Young in 2007... Pinson did so in 1959, while Washington's Buck Freeman had 25 and 21 in 1899.

HOME RUNS: OF Ender Inciarte hit his 10th home run of the season yesterday, driving a 3-2 pitch out to right-center field in the ninth inning to give the Braves a 6-4 lead.

A Inciarte became the ninth different player to reach double figures home runs in an Atlanta uniform this season, joining Ronald Acuña Jr., Ozzie Albies, Johan Camargo, Charlie Culberson, Freddie Freeman, Nick Markakis, Kurt Suzuki and Dansby Swanson

A The nine different players with double-digit home runs is tied for the highest single-season total in franchise history...The 2007 team set the franchise record with nine different players.

A The nine players are also tied for the most by any National League team this season... Los Angeles also has nine... New York and Toronto both have 10.

A C Tyler Flowers has six home runs.

Tonight's Game

- A* Makes his 28th start of the season and the 47th of his career.
- A* Is receiving 5.79 runs of support per 9.0 innings, and Atlanta has scored 96 total runs with him on the mound this season.
- A* Newcomb is undefeated when getting at least four runs of support, going 8-0 with a 2.57 ERA in 13 total games, while Atlanta is 10-3 as a team...In 14 games in which he receives three runs of support or less, Newcomb is 3-8 while the Braves are 4-10.
- A* Only two pitchers in the National League are getting more run support per 9.0 innings than Newcomb...Chicago's Jon Lester leads the N.L. (6.44), while Colorado's German Marquez (5.97) ranks second.
- A* Throws a first-pitch strike in just 53.8% percent of his opponents' at-bats, the third-lowest percentage in the majors...Among qualified pitchers, only Lance Lynn (53.5%) and Gio Gonzalez (53.6%) find the strike zone with their first pitch less frequently than Newcomb.
- A* In 293 plate appearances in which the count started 1-0, opponents are batting .248/.396/.397 with 57 walks against Newcomb.
- A* In 302 plate appearances in which the count started 0-1, opponents are batting .177/.220/.273 with just 16 walks.
- A* Faces San Francisco for the first time this season and for the second time in his career...Tossed 6.0 one-run innings against them, 6/21/17 at SunTrust Park, and allowed three hits and one walk while fanning three.
- A* The start against the Giants last season was the third appearance of his major league career, and he became just the third pitcher in Atlanta franchise history to begin his career with three consecutive quality starts.

2018 Recap

- A* His 11 wins lead the Atlanta staff...Became the first left-hander to win 11 games for Atlanta since Mike Minor won 13 in 2013.
- A* The Braves logged just 33 wins by left-handed starters from 2014-2017, tied for fifth fewest in the National League.
- A* Tossed 6.0 scoreless innings, 8/23 at MIA, to defeat the Marlins 5-0.
- A* Went 4-0 with a 0.75 ERA (2 ER/24.0 IP) in his four starts against Miami this season...Became the third Atlanta starter in franchise history to beat the Marlins four times in a single season, joining Tom Glavine and Greg Maddux, who both did so in 2002.
- A* Fell one strike shy of a no-hitter, 7/29 vs. LAD...Chris Taylor hit a two-strike single to left with two outs in the ninth for the Dodgers first hit.
- A* Newcomb's performance was the longest a Braves pitcher took a no-hit attempt since Shelby Miller also went 8.2 no-hit innings on 5/17/15 at Miami...Miller allowed a first-pitch single to Justin Bour.
- A* Miller and Newcomb are the only two pitchers in Atlanta franchise history to lose a no-hitter with two outs in the ninth inning, according to research from the Elias Sports Bureau.
- A* Held Miami to four hits and one run, 7/23 at Marlins Park...Stopped a season-worst three-game losing streak, and stopped a five-game skid by Atlanta in his starts.
- A* Went 7-1 with a 2.49 ERA over his first 12 starts of the season...Went 1-4 with a 5.45 ERA in his next seven turns.
- A* Made 19 starts before the All-Star break in his first full major league season, going 8-5 with a 3.51 ERA and 97 strikeouts.
- A* Eight wins before the break were most on the Atlanta staff, and the most for a Braves pitcher since 2014 (Julio Teheran and Aaron Harang).
- A* Set career lows in innings pitched (2.2) and pitches (70), 7/3 at NYY...Allowed a season high-tying five earned runs.
- A* Yielded just three hits, two of which were home runs...Has allowed nine home runs over his last eight starts after allowing just three homers in his first 12 turns.
- A* Beat the Padres 1-0, 6/16 at SunTrust Park...Tossed 6.0 scoreless innings with two hits and seven strikeouts.
- A* Is 3-0 with 18 scoreless innings against the Padres...Has thrown 6.0 scoreless frames in each of his three career starts.
- A* Finished the month of May 5-0 with a 1.54 ERA (6 ER/35.0 IP) and no home runs allowed...Atlanta went 5-1 in his six starts.
- A* His five wins in the month were most in the majors, while his 1.54 ERA ranked sixth best in the N.L...His batting average against of .158 was the lowest in the league among qualifying pitchers.
- A* Tossed 6.0 scoreless innings and allowed a career-low one hit, 5/13 at MIA...The start was his third consecutive scoreless turn.
- A* Became the first Braves pitcher over the last 110 seasons to allow two hits or fewer and no runs in three consecutive starts.

Career Recap

- A* Selected by the Los Angeles Angels of Anaheim in the first round (15th overall) of the 2014 First-Year Player Draft.

Saves/Opp: 0/0 **Holds:** 0 **1st Batter/Retired:** 2/2 **Inherited Runners/Scored:** 0/0

- Recalled, 8/29, from Triple-A Gwinnett for his fourth stint on the active roster...Was also up from 8/11-18, and on 8/7 and 7/31...Was added to the roster as the 26th man for the doubleheader on 8/7...Had his contract selected, 7/31, and started versus Miami in his major league debut...Optioned to Triple-A Gwinnett postgame that night.
- Has allowed seven earned runs over 3.0 innings in two relief appearances with the Braves...Last pitched for Atlanta on 8/17 vs. COL (1.0 IP, 4 H, 3 R).
- Started vs. MIA, 7/31, in his major league debut...Allowed nine hits and five runs (four earned) over 5.0 innings to earn the win...At the age of 20 years, 352 days, became the youngest left-hander to win his debut for the Braves since Charlie Vaughan did so on September 3, 1966 at the age of 18 years, 332 days.
- Is 6-4 with a 2.72 ERA (34 ER/112.1 IP) in 19 starts for Triple-A Gwinnett this season.

Jesse Biddle • LHP • 6-5 • 220 • 26 yrs • #63

Saves/Opp: 1/4 **Holds:** 9 **1st Batter/Retired:** 52/36 **Inherited Runners/Scored:** 13/3

- Has a 2.48 ERA in 52 relief appearances for Atlanta this season, the third lowest ERA by a left-handed rookie reliever in franchise history...Jonny Venters' 1.95 ERA in 2010 is lowest.
- Allowed three hits and two runs, 9/6 at ARI, to blow his third save and snap a nine-game streak without allowing an earned run...Earned his fifth win after Atlanta won in 10 innings, most among Atlanta relievers.
- Pitched more than 1.0 inning in 14 outings this season, compiling a 0.95 ERA (3 ER/28.1 IP) with 43 strikeouts...Three of his five wins this season have come in outings longer than 1.0 inning.
- Opponents are 8-for-43 (.186) with runners in scoring position, including 3-for-19 (.158) with two outs.
- Converted the first save of his career, 8/5 at NYM...Joined Arodys Vizcaino, A.J. Minter, Luiz Gohara, Luke Jackson, Jonny Venters and Dan Winkler as Atlanta relievers with a save this season.
- Set career highs in IP (3.0) and strikeouts (8), 6/2 vs. WSH... Became the first Braves reliever in 110 seasons to strike out at least eight batters in that few innings...MIL's Josh Hader struck out eight in 2.2 IP, 4/30/18 at CIN.

Brad Brach • RHP • 6-4 • 205 • 32 yrs • #46

Saves/Opp: 12/16 **Holds:** 10 **1st Batter/Retired:** 63/44 **Inherited Runners/Scored:** 19/4

- Has allowed just two earned runs in 21 appearances (18.2 IP) since the Braves acquired him on 7/29...Earned his first save with Atlanta, 9/6 at ARI, and has seven holds since being acquired.
- Took his second loss with Atlanta, 8/31 vs. PIT after allowing one unearned run in 0.2 innings...Both of his losses with the Braves, and his two blown saves, have come in games in which he did not allow an earned run.
- Holding right-handed batters to a .243 (33-for-136) average, while lefties are hitting .320/.409/.410 in 116 plate appearances.
- Atlanta acquired him, 7/29, from the Baltimore Orioles in exchange for an international signing slot...Made his Braves debut, 7/30 vs. MIA, with a scoreless eighth inning to earn his fourth hold of the season.
- Went 1-2 with a 4.85 ERA (21 ER/39.0 IP) in 42 games with Baltimore, converting 11-of-13 save chances.

Shane Carle • RHP • 6-4 • 210 • 26 yrs • #51

Saves/Opp: 0/1 **Holds:** 13 **1st Batter/Retired:** 49/31 **Inherited Runners/Scored:** 28/9

- Has five scoreless appearances spanning 3.2 innings since returning from the disabled list on 9/1...Went on the disabled list on 8/7 and missed 25 games with right shoulder inflammation.
- Inherited the bases loaded, 9/8 at ARI, and retired the only batter he faced to strand all three runners.
