MEDICAL MATTERS—Yesterday **Adeiny Hechavarria** (right hamstring strain) began a rehab assignment with Class-A Charlotte, going 0-for-3 and playing 6 innings at shortstop at Dunedin (Blue Jays)...today **Kevin Kiermaier** (torn ligament in right thumb) will begin a rehab assignment with the Stone Crabs, batting leadoff as the designated hitter...Kiermaier has been on the disabled list since April 16, and the Rays have gone 27-23 (.540) in his absence, compared to 29-32 in 2017 and 14-34 in 2016.

COMMUNITY CORNER—Before every Tuesday home game, the Rays host a youngster from the Make-A-Wish Foundation or Children's Dream Fund as a part of the "Tuesday's Champion" program...today, the Rays welcome 10-year-old **Jhorden Eberhart** from the Children's Dream Fund...he will meet Rays players and coaches and throw a ceremonial first pitch.

RAY MATTER—Last night the Rays overcame 1-0, 3-1 and 4-3 deficits to win, 8-4, and the 8 runs were their most since May 27 vs. BAL (8)...each time they fell behind, they tied or took the lead in the bottom half of the inning...the Rays are 2-9 in their last 11 games, but have won two of three following an 8-game losing streak...prior to the 8-game skid, they were 12-4 in their previous 16 games and 24-13 in their previous 37 games.

- + This 2-9 stretch has seen the Rays go from a season-high 2 games over .500 (28-26) to 5 games under .500 (30-35)...with last night's win, they passed the Blue Jays for sole possession of 3rd place in the AL East, after one day in 4th place...the Rays have been tied or alone in 3rd place in the division for 24 of the last 25 days.
- + In the last 11 games, the Rays are batting .232 (86-for-371) overall and .211 (16-for-76) with RISP, and they have scored 3 runs or fewer seven times...they have pitched to a 4.45 ERA in these 11 games.
- + The Rays are 10-11 in series play this season and 4-5 at home.
- + The Rays have played 29 games at home, tied for fewest in the AL.

JUNE SWOON—The Rays are 2-8 (.200) since the beginning of June, tied with the Royals for the lowest pct. in the AL and tied for 2nd-lowest in the majors to the Mets (.125)...they are batting .234/.280/.361 this month and rank 8th, 11th and 11th in the AL in batting avg., OBP and SLG, respectively, while their 4.15 ERA (89-IP, 41-ER) ranks 10th in the AL...they have totaled 25 XBH this month, 2nd-fewest in the AL to the Orioles (19)...through the end of May, the Rays ranked 2nd in the AL in batting avg. (.261), 2nd in OBP (.333), 11th in SLG (.403) and 7th in ERA (3.97).

CLOSE SHAVES—The Rays are 9-17 (.346) in 1-run games this season—most losses in the majors and 2nd-most 1-run games in the majors to the Mariners (30)...the Rays have lost their last 5 games decided by 1 run, dating back to the start of June, and are 4-9 in their last 13 one-run games.

- + 40.0 pct. of the Rays games this season have been decided by 1 run, compared to 27.7 pct. of games in the majors (542 of 1,956).
- + 72.3 pct. of the Rays games this season have been wins or 1-run losses...they have lost by 2 runs or more in 27.7 pct. of their games.
- + The Rays are on pace for 42 one-run losses, which hasn't been done since the 1971 Astros (43)...the club record for a season is 30 (2015).
- + Since 2016, the Rays are 43-68 (.387) in 1-run games, 2nd-worst winning pct. in the majors over that span to the Twins (.355).

RAYS vs. BLUE JAYS—The Rays are 3-1 against the Blue Jays this season, all at home...tonight is the fifth of 19 meetings between the two clubs this season (9 at Tropicana Field, 10 at Rogers Centre)...the two teams meet only six times before the All-Star break, compared to 13 times in the second half (and 10 times in September)...the Rays went 9-10 last season (6-4 at home, 3-6 on the road), just the second time they lost a season series to the Blue Jays in the "Rays" era (since 2008)...they are 188-168 (.528) all-time against Toronto, their most wins against any opponent.

REDEFINING RELIEF—So far this season, Rays relievers have totaled:

- + **21 apps of at least 50 pitches**, most in the majors, ahead of BAL/DET/MIA (8 each), and their most for any season since 2005 (23)
- + **11 apps of at least 70 pitches**, most in the majors, ahead of the Marlins (5), and their most for any season in club history (2004, 7)
- + **40 apps of at least 2 IP**, tied for 2nd in the majors (Padres, 44)
- + **22 apps of at least 3 IP**, most in the majors (SD/KC, 11)
- + **17 apps of at least 4 IP**, most in the majors (Marlins, 4)
- + Rays relievers lead the majors with 285.2 IP, 26.2 IP more than any other team (Reds, 259 IP) while Rays starters have covered 295.2 IP, fewest in the majors by 36 IP (Dodgers, 331.2 IP).

FOUNTAIN OF YOUTH—The Rays active roster currently includes nine rookies: four pitchers and five hitters...15 rookies have already appeared in a game for the Rays, most in the majors ahead of the Marlins (14) and Padres (14), while the closest AL team is the Angels (11)...the club record for rookies used in an entire season is 18 (2015)...only twice previously have the Rays used even 12 rookies before the All-Star break: 2015 (16) and 1998 (12)...the average age of the Rays active roster is 27.84.

- + Yesterday the Rays got multi-RBI games from **Willy Adames** and **Jake Bauers**, the first time they had multiple players age 22 or younger with 2 RBI (or more) in the same game since June 5, 2007 at TOR, when **Delmon Young** and **Melvin Upton Jr.** did it.
- + Tonight's starting lineup includes Adames, Bauers and **Christian Arroyo**, which will be the first time the Rays start three hitters age 23 or younger since July 9, 2008 at NYY, when the lineup included **Evan Longoria**, **Reid Brignac** and Upton Jr.

RAKE BAUERS—**Jake Bauers** has 4 XBH, tied with **Delmon Young** in 2006 for the most by a Ray through the first 5 games of his major league career...last night Bauers hit a go-ahead, 2-run homer in the 4th inning, the first of his career...at 22 years, 248 days, he became the youngest Ray to homer since **Wil Myers** on Aug 14, 2013 vs. SEA (22.247), the youngest Rays infielder to homer since **Evan Longoria** on June 9, 2008 at LAA (22.246) and the youngest first baseman to homer in club history.

- + Bauers also doubled in the 1st inning, his third straight game with a double...he became the second Ray with a multi-XBH game within the first 5 games of his career, joining Longoria...he was the third Ray to reach four times in a game within the first 5 games of his career, joining **Akinori Iwamura** in 2007 and Young in 2006.

GUT CHECK—This series against the Blue Jays is the only one for the Rays from June 1–July 1 against a team not currently positioned to make the postseason...the Rays are 19-9 (.679) against teams currently below .500 and 11-26 (.297) against teams .500 or better...they have played 26 games against the 10 teams currently positioned to make the postseason, and they are a combined 5-21 (.192) in these games against the Yankees (0-2), Indians (0-0), Mariners (1-6), Red Sox (4-9), Astros (0-0), Nationals (0-2), Cubs (0-0), Diamondbacks (0-0), Brewers (0-0) and Braves (0-2).

- + The Rays are in the middle of a stretch of 40 games in 41 days from May 11–June 20, and they have gone 15-16 over this span so far.

ALL-STAR WORTHY—**Wilson Ramos** trails NYY **Gary Sánchez** by 15,311 votes as of this afternoon's first AL All-Star Game balloting, the tightest race among any position...Ramos leads AL catchers with 57 hits, 10 more than 2nd-place OAK **Jonathan Lucroy** (47)—and 19 more than 9th-place Sánchez...Ramos and Sánchez are the only two AL catchers who qualify for the batting title, and Ramos is batting .285 to Sánchez's .190...Ramos ranks in the top five among AL catchers with 9 2B, 30 RBI and 16 XBH.

- + Ramos is attempting to make the All-Star Game for the second time in his career (2016, with WAS)...he would become the second catcher in club history to go (**Dioner Navarro**, 2008).

#VOTERAYS—For the fourth consecutive season, All-Star balloting is being conducted exclusively online and via mobile devices at mlb.com, all 30 club web sites and the MLB At Bat and MLB Ballpark apps...the Midsummer Classic will be held on July 17 at Nationals Park in Washington, D.C., the fifth All-Star Game to be played in the nation's capital.

- + Fans can cast votes for starters a total of 35 times, including a maximum of five valid ballots cast in any 24-hour period.

SIGNING UPDATE—Yesterday the Rays signed two of their selections from the 2018 June Draft in INF **Ford Proctor** (3rd round, No. 92 overall) and RH **Taj Bradley** (5th round, No. 150 overall)...Proctor was first team All-Conference USA this season, batting .346/.431/.515 (82-for-237) with 8 HR and 45 RBI as a junior...Bradley, who turned 17 years old in March and became the first draft pick in major league history born in 2001, will forego his college commitment to the University of South Carolina.

THIS DATE IN RAYS HISTORY—On June 12, 2010 vs. FLA, **Carlos Peña** homers in a club-record sixth consecutive game, passing **José Canseco** (5) from May 16-21, 1999...Peña becomes the first player to accomplish the feat since OAK **Frank Thomas** (6) from Sep 5-11, 2006.

BETTER OF LATE—Eight of his last 9 apps (3 starts) have been scoreless...has yielded 2 runs in 10.2 IP over this span, bringing his season ERA from 7.36 to 3.14...last pitched on Sun vs. SEA and pitched a scoreless 9th inning...retired his first 2 BF, but then allowed a 2-out single and walk, and totaled 24 pitches in the frame.

- + His last start was on Thurs vs. SEA, a scoreless 1st...escaped a bases-loaded, 1-out jam with a strikeout and inning-ending groundout...threw 30 pitches, his most since his season debut on May 8 vs. ATL (40 pitches in 1.2 IP).
- + Will be facing the Blue Jays for the first time in his career.

A NEW LOOK—Will be making the fourth start of his career, all since May 26...is 0-1 with a 4.50 ERA (4-IP, 2-ER) in his 3 starts...he started 41 games in the minors, most recently on June 4, 2016 at Double-A Jacksonville (Marlins)...in that game, he totaled 6 IP, 5 H, 1 R/ER, 3 BB, 10 SO, 100 pitches—just the second game of his career with double-digit strikeouts...hasn't gone more than 1.2 IP or thrown more than 40 pitches this season, although his career highs are 2 IP and 47 pitches (both last season).

HOMEBODY—Hasn't allowed a run in 6 apps (2 starts) spanning 6.2 IP at Tropicana Field this season, compared to a 5.87 ERA (7.2-IP, 5-ER) in 7 apps (1 start) on the road... last season, he was better on the road, pitching to a 2.84 ERA (6.1-IP, 2-ER) in 9 apps compared to a 7.24 ERA (13.2-IP, 11-ER) in 12 apps at home.

MAKING THE LEAP—Recalled on May 19 for his second stint with the Rays this season (also May 5-12)...started the season with Triple-A Durham and pitched to a 1.86 ERA (9.2-IP, 2-ER) and 17 SO in 10 apps for the Bulls...over the last two minor league seasons, has a 1.33 ERA (54.1-IP, 8-ER) with 77 SO and .210 opp avg.

MIX & MATCH—Is one of 13 different starting pitchers used by the Rays so far this season, most in the majors ahead of the Dodgers (11) and Athletics (11)...this is only the fifth time the Rays have used 13 different starting pitchers for an *entire season*, following 2004 (14), 2003 (14), 2000 (13) and 1999 (13).

STAR POWER—Has yielded 2 HR this season, a grand slam to **Manny Machado** on May 11 at BAL and a 2-run shot to **Mike Trout** on May 19 at LAA...hasn't allowed a homer in his last 9 apps (3 starts) spanning 10.2 IP...has yielded 8 HR in 34 apps (3 starts) spanning 34.1 IP in his career, but 5 HR came over a stretch of 5 apps and 6 IP, over multiple stints in the majors from June 8-Sep 2, 2017.

GIVE HIM THE HEATER, RICKY—Has averaged 98.3 mph on his fastball this season, according to StatCast, and his max velocity is 100.5 mph in his start on May 26 vs. BAL...only two other pitchers have reached 100.5 mph in a *start* this season: LAA **Shohei Ohtani** was clocked between 100.6-101.0 four times on April 24 at HOU, and HOU **Gerrit Cole** was clocked at 100.7 once on June 1 vs. BOS...last season he averaged 98.1 mph on his fastball, and made 14 pitches of 100 mph or more, most by a Ray since **Fernando Rodney** (23) in 2013...last Sep 2 at CWS, he allowed a solo homer to **Avisail Garcia** on a 100.7 mph pitch, according to StatCast—the fastest pitch thrown by a Ray that was hit over the fence since data is available (2008).

- + Has been ranked by *Baseball America* as having the Best Fastball in the organization in each of the past two seasons.

ELITE COMPANY—Was named after Hall of Famer **Ryne Sandberg** despite being born into a family of Cardinals fans...last season, became the third "Ryne" in major league history, following Sandberg and All-Star pitcher **Ryne Duren**...his manager in Durham was Sandberg's nephew, **Jared Sandberg**.

- + Is in his fourth season as Rays manager...at age 40, is the majors' youngest active skipper—5 months younger than SD **Andy Green**.
- + His last ejection was July 18, 2017 at OAK, his seventh ejection as Rays manager...his 7 ejections are tied for 4th in franchise history.
- + Is the sixth Tampa-born manager in major league history, and second to manage the Rays...that list includes Hall of Famers **Al Lopez** and **Tony La Russa**, **Lou Piniella**, **Dave Miley** and **John Hart**.
- + Played 12 professional seasons as a catcher, incl. parts of eight seasons in the majors (2002-10) and two years (2005-06) in the Rays org.
- + Played in the 1989 Little League World Series (Tampa Northside LL), 1999 College World Series (Florida State) and earned World Series rings in 2007 (Red Sox) and 2009 (Yankees).
