WHITE SOX AT A GLANCE

- The Chicago White Sox have lost five of their last six games and 22 of their last 31 as they conclude a brief three-game homestand this afternoon against the Milwaukee Brewers.
- RHP Dylan Covey takes the mound for the White Sox, who are a season-high tying 21 games under .500 and own the second-worst record in the major leagues at 17-38 (Baltimore, 17-41).
- The Sox have split the first two games of this series, rallying on Friday for an 8-3 win before suffering a 5-0 loss yesterday.
- Following today's game and a day off tomorrow, the White Sox take a seven-game trip to Minnesota (6/5-7; DH on 6/5) and Boston (6/8-10).
- The Sox went 1-5 on their last trip to Detroit (1-2) and Cleveland (0-3) from 5/25-30 and 5-3 on their last homestand vs. Texas (3-1) and Baltimore (2-2) from 5/17-24.

TODAY'S STORYLINES

- The White Sox are looking for their sixth consecutive series victory over Milwaukee.
- The Sox have won 13 of their last 17 games against Milwaukee, including seven of nine at home.
- The White Sox are 8-23 in interleague play since 2017.
- José Abreu owns an 18-game interleague hitting streak (.408, 29-71), the longest active in the major leagues and second-longest in White Sox history behind Paul Konerko (20 from 2004-05).
- Abreu is a career .337/.385/.572 (112-332) hitter with 23 doubles, 17 homers and 58 RBI in 86 career interleague games.

YESTERDAY'S RECAP

- Jhoulys Chacín combined with two relievers on a five-hitter as Milwaukee recorded a 5-0 victory over the White Sox.
- The Brewers broke open a 1-0 game with one run in the seventh inning and three in the eighth.
- James Shields suffered the loss despite making his fourth straight quality start, allowing three runs (all solo homers) on eight hits over 7.0 IP ... Shields owns a 2.86 ERA (9 ER/28.1 IP) over his last four starts.
- The Sox went 0-6 with RISP and left seven runners on base as they were shut out for the sixth time this season.
- José Abreu extended his interleague hitting streak to 18 games.

AUTISM AWARENESS DAY

- The White Sox, in partnership with Autism Speaks, will hold Autism Awareness Day today in support of MLB's Autism Awareness Initiative.
- On Autism Awareness Day, the gameday experience will not include fireworks and designated Quiet Areas will be available for fans throughout the sensory-friendly concourse at the ballpark.

HAWK'S FAREWELL

- Ken "Hawk" Harrelson, who is in his 33rd and final season in the White Sox television booth in 2018, will work primarily Sunday home games this season as well as select other contests.
- Harrelson will serve as a team ambassador throughout the 2019 season, marking his eighth decade in baseball.

PATH TO THE DRAFT

- The White Sox own the No. 4 overall pick in the First-Year Player Draft, which begins tomorrow ... MLB Network and MLB.com will provide pick-by-pick coverage during the first round, Competitive Balance Round A, the second round and Competitive Balance Round B, beginning at 6 p.m. CT.
- Rounds 3-10 are on Tuesday beginning at Noon CT, and rounds 11-40 on Wednesday beginning at 11 a.m. CT ... every pick from rounds 3-40 will be broadcast on MLB.com.
- A.J. Pierzynski and Aaron Roward, members of the 2005 World Championship club, will represent the Sox at the draft.

QUALITY AND QUANTITY

- The White Sox have made a major-league leading 1,337 quality starts since the start of the 2003 season, three more than the second-place New York Mets (1,334) and 42 more than Oakland (1,295), the next-closest American League team.

DANNY TAKES THE MOUND

- White Sox pitcher Danny Farquhar threw out a ceremonial first pitch on Friday ... Farquhar was surrounded by his wife, children and the RUSH University Medical Center team who helped care for him after he suffered a brain hemorrhage from a ruptured aneurysm during a home game on 4/20 vs. Houston.
- Chicago White Sox Charities (CWSC) will donate proceeds from last night's fundraising efforts to the Joe Niekro Foundation, an organization committed to supporting patients and families, research, treatment and awareness of brain aneurysms.

WHITE SOX VS. MILWAUKEE

- The White Sox and Brewers are meeting for the eighth time in interleague play and fourth time in Chicago.
- Chicago is 15-7 vs. Milwaukee during interleague play (since 1998), hitting .287 (.231-805) with a 3.92 ERA (91 ER/208.2 IP) and 126-102 edge in runs scored.
- The Sox have won five straight series (since 2000), going 13-4 during that span.
- The White Sox lead the all-time series, 194-169, going 101-79 at home (35-19 at Guaranteed Rate Field) and 93-90 on the road (7-2 at Miller Park).

INTERLEAGUE INSIGHT

- The White Sox are 2-9 during interleague play in 2018 ... they are hitting .231/.292/.355 (84-363) with a 5.59 ERA (58 ER/93.1 IP) and have been outscored, 62-36.
- The Sox are 208-186 (.528) all-time during interleague play, including a 108-85 record at home ... they are 26-45 since 2015.
- Chicago ranks second all-time with 489 interleague home runs, trailing only Toronto (508).

WINDY CITY-BREW CITY TIDBITS

- Milwaukee RHP Matt Albers (2015-16), RHP Junior Guerra (2015), LHPs Dan Jennings (2015-17) and Boone Logan (2006-08) and INF Tyler Saladino (2015-18) all played for the White Sox, while first base coach Carlos Subero managed Class AA Birmingham in 2008.
- Sox RHP Dylan Covey was selected by the Brewers in the first round (14th overall) of the 2010 draft but did not sign.
- The White Sox played 20 "home" games at Milwaukee's County Stadium during the 1968-69 seasons, going 8-12.

NO REST FOR THE WEARY

- The White Sox begin a stretch on Tuesday where they play 21 games in 20 days from 6/5-24, starting with a straight doubleheader at Minnesota.
- Chicago's next off day following that stretch comes on 6/25.

30/30 THREAT

- SS Tim Anderson (11 HR/12 SB) is one of three players in the major leagues this season with at least 10 home runs and 10 stolen bases, joining Boston's Mookie Betts (17/13) and the Angels Mike Trout (19/13).
- Anderson is on pace to record career highs with 32 homers and 35 steals ... the 32 home runs would be the most by a shortstop in Sox history, and the 35 steals would be the most since Ozzie Guillén in 1989 (36).

STOP! THIEF!

- The White Sox lead the major leagues with 49 stolen bases this season and rank third with an 81.7 (49-60) success rate.
- The Sox are on pace to steal 144 bases this season, which would be four less than their combined total of 148 from 2016-17 ... they have not led the majors in steals since 1966 (153).

TRIPLE THE FUN

- The White Sox lead the American League and rank fourth in the majors this season with 17 triples ... the Sox led the AL with 37 triples last season, their highest total since 1999 (also 37).
- Yolmer Sánchez leads the majors with six triples in 2018, while Daniel Palka is tied for 12th with three.

LONG BALL

- The White Sox are on pace to hit 188 home runs, which would be their highest total since 2012 (211).
- The Sox homered in a season-high eight straight games from 5/23-30 (14 total), their longest streak since 9/2-11/17 (10).

NO RISP, NO REWARD

- The White Sox rank 13th in the American League and 27th in the majors with a .227 (95-419) average with RISP in 2018.
- The Sox are hitting .348 (24-69) with RISP in their last nine home games (since 5/18).

ON DECK: MINNESOTA TWINS

- The White Sox open a seven-game, six-day trip on Tuesday with a straight doubleheader at Minnesota ... RHPs Reynaldo López (1-4, 3.80) and Lucas Giolito (3-6, 7.53) are scheduled to start for the Sox.
- The Twins lead the season series, 1-0, after winning the opener of a scheduled four-game series at Target Field from 4/12 ... each of the final three games of that series were postponed by snow.
- According to Elias, the three straight postponements in that series were the most in the major leagues since Seattle and Cleveland endured four in a row in April 2007.

COVEY AT A GLANCE

- The 26-year-old right-hander is scheduled to make his fourth start of the season and first career appearance vs. Milwaukee.
- Made six relief appearances last season, posting a 7.94 ERA (10 ER/11.1 IP) with four home runs, seven walks and seven strikeouts ... opponents hit .325 (13-40) during those games.
- Has received one or no runs of support in six of his 14 career starts (42.8 percent) ... his career run support breakdown: zero (one), one (five), two (five), three (one) and four (one).
- Was selected by the White Sox from the Athletics in the major-league portion of the Rule 5 Draft on 12/8/16 ... entered the 2017 season with zero major-league experience.
- Has gone 20-26 with a 4.06 ERA (181 ER/401.1 IP) and 288 strikeouts over 81 appearances (78 starts) over five minor-league seasons in the Athletics (2013-16) and White Sox (2017-18) organizations.
- Attended the University of San Diego from 2010-13 ... was teammates with Chicago Cubs third baseman and 2016 National League Most Valuable Player Kris Bryant.
- Was originally selected by Oakland in the fourth round of the June 2013 First-Year Player Draft.
- Bio is on page 63 of the 2018 Chicago White Sox media guide.

LAST START

- Did not receive a decision on 5/28 at Cleveland after allowing five runs (two earned) on five hits with three walks and three strikeouts over 4.1 IP.
- Allowed Greg Allen to score on a wild pitch in the third inning and José Ramirez scored on a groundout by Melky Cabrera in the fourth.
- Left the game with the game with the White Sox 5-2 after tossing 80 pitches (48 strikes) ... the Sox went on to lose 9-6.

INTERLEAGUE STRUGGLES

- Is scheduled to make his fourth career appearance (third start) during interleague play ... has gone 0-1 with an 8.22 ERA (7 ER/7.2 IP), four homers allowed, three walks and 10 strikeouts lifetime.
- Suffered the loss in his last IL start on 5/23/17 at Arizona ... allowed four runs on five hits with one strikeout over a career-low 2.1 IP

2018 MINOR LEAGUE STARTS

- Went 3-1 with a 2.33 ERA (10 ER/38.2 IP), 36 strikeouts and a .226 (32-141) opponents average over seven starts with Class AAA Charlotte this season.
- Did not receive a decision in his last start with Charlotte on 5/15, allowing one unearned run on four hits with one walk and six strikeouts over 6.0 IP.

2018 SPRING RECAP

- Appeared in two games (one start) for the White Sox during Cactus League play ... went 0-0 with a 2.70 ERA (1 ER/3.1 IP).
- Made his first start on 2/23 at Los Angeles-NL, working 2.0 IP and allowing one run on two hits ... worked 1.1 IP in a relief appearance on 2/26 vs. Oakland.

BETTER AT HOME

- Is set to make his sixth career start at Guaranteed Rate Field ... is 1-1 with a 4.29 ERA (17 ER/35.2 IP), opponents average .227 (29-128) six homers allowed, 15 walks and 33 strikeouts lifetime compared to 0-7 with an 8.71 ERA (50 ER/51.2 IP) and .338 (72-213) opponents average, 14 homers allowed, 26 walks and 22 strikeouts on the road.
- Earned his first career win in his last home start on 5/23 vs. Baltimore ... allowed one run on six hits with one walk and eight strikeouts over 7.0 IP.

LOOKING BACK AT 2017

- Made his major-league debut on 4/14/17 at Minnesota ... did not receive the decision after allowing one run on five hits with three walks and one strikeout over 5.1 IP.
- Went 0-7 with a 7.71 ERA (60 ER/70.0 IP) in 12 starts with the Sox ... the last Sox pitcher to begin his MLB career winless over seven or more starts was Ramon García from 5/31/91-7/6/91 (eight straight starts) ... source: STATS LLC.
- Was on the 10-day disabled list from 5/26-8/15/17 (retroactive to 5/24) with a strained left oblique.
- Made two appearances with Class AAA Charlotte, going 0-0 with a 3.00 ERA (2 ER/6.0 IP), one walk and three strikeouts ... opponents batted .227 (5-22) with one home run.

COVEY'S COVER STORY

- Originally was selected by Milwaukee in the first round (14th overall) of the June 2010 First-Year Player Draft ... following his post-draft physical and before signing a contract, was diagnosed with Type 1 diabetes.
- Following the diagnosis, elected not to sign with the Brewers and committed to play at the University of San Diego ... was teammates with Chicago Cubs third baseman and 2016 National League Most Valuable Player Kris Bryant.
- Pitched for the Toreros from 2010-13 before being drafted by Oakland in the fourth round in 2013.
- Former White Sox and current Boston Red Sox left-hander Chris Sale was selected one spot ahead of Covey with the 13th overall pick in the 2010 draft.

VS. MILWAUKEE BREWERS

- Is scheduled to make his first career start against Milwaukee.

TUESDAY'S SCHEDULED STARTERS

- RHP Reynaldo López (1-4, 3.80) is scheduled to make his 12th start of the season, seventh on the road and second career against Minnesota in Game 1 of a straight doubleheader.
- Suffered his fourth loss of the season in his last start on 5/30 at Cleveland, allowing seven runs on eight hits with one walk and two strikeouts over 2.2 IP.
- Is 0-3 with a 6.00 ERA (20 ER/30.0 IP) and .305 (36-118) opponents average over six road starts.
- Will make his 11th career start against an American League Central opponent ... is 3-3 with a 3.98 ERA (27 ER/61.0 IP) and a .273 (65-238) opponents average in his career.
- RHP Lucas Giolito (3-6, 7.53) is scheduled to make his 12th start of the season, seventh on the road and third career against Minnesota in Game 2 of a straight doubleheader.
- Suffered his sixth loss of the season in his last start on 5/29 at Cleveland, allowing five runs on nine hits with three strikeouts
- Is 2-3 with a 4.75 ERA (19 ER/36.0 IP) and .233 (30-129) opponents average over six road starts.
- Will make his 10th career start against an American League Central opponent ... is 3-4 with a 3.86 ERA (24 ER/56.0 IP) and a .224 (46-205) opponents average in his career.
