RECENT RESULTS: The Tigers lost the series finale to the Indians, 8-1, on Sunday afternoon at Comerica Park. Niko Goodrum, José Iglesias, Leonys Martin, Victor Reyes and Ronny Rodriguez each had one hit in the loss, while Nicholas Castellanos drove in Detroit's only run of the game. Jordan Zimmermann started and took the loss, giving up five runs on six hits with one walk and two strikeouts in 3.0 innings. The Tigers continue their five-game homestand tonight as they begin a two-game series vs. Cincinnati. Following the series vs. the Reds and an off day on Thursday, Detroit hits the road for a six-game trip, which includes three games at Oakland (August 3-5) and three games at Los Angeles (AL) (August 6-8).

TIGERS ACQUIRE WILLI CASTRO FROM CLEVELAND IN EXCHANGE FOR LEONYS MARTIN AND KYLE DOWDY: The Detroit Tigers announced earlier today that they have acquired SS Willi Castro from Cleveland in exchange for OF Leonys Martin and RHP Kyle Dowdy.

Castro, 21, is ranked as Cleveland's No. 8 prospect by MLB Pipeline, and was originally signed by the Indians in 2013. Through 97 games with Double A Akron this season, the switch-hitter carries a .245 (91x371) batting average with five home runs, 20 doubles, two triples and 39 RBI. Castro was named an Eastern League All-Star earlier this season.

Over five seasons in the Indians organization, the Rio Piedras, Puerto Rico native has posted a .263 (472x1795) average with 26 home runs, 182 RBI, 79 doubles and 19 triples. Castro was selected as an Indians' organization All-Star by MiLB.com last season, and was named to the 2017 midseason and postseason Carolina League All-Star Team after leading Single A Lynchburg, and ranking second in the league with 136 hits, and recording career-bests with 11 home runs, 58 RBI and 69 runs scored.

GERBER RECALLED FROM TRIPLE A TOLEDO: To fill Leonys Martin's 25-man roster spot, the Tigers have recalled OF Mike Gerber from Triple A Toledo. Gerber, who is No. 25 on MLB Pipeline's Tigers top prospects list, is on the Major League roster for the third time this season.

V-MART STAYS HOT: Victor Martinez went 1x4 in Saturday's game to extend his hitting streak to six games. Over the six games, Martinez has posted a slash line of .455/.520/.773 with a double, two home runs and six RBI during the streak.

RUN AT YOUR OWN RISK: Nicholas Castellanos threw out Edwin Encarnacion at home plate in the fifth inning of Saturday's game. Castellanos now has seven outfield assists on the season, which ranks tied for seventh in the American League. As a team, Detroit outfielders have combined for 23 outfield assists, which is the third-highest total in the Majors (Baltimore and Texas, 25).

THE 'PEN IS MIGHTIER: Despite allowing three runs in 6.0 innings on Sunday, the Tigers bullpen has been one of the best in the American League this month. Detroit relievers have combined for a 3.52 ERA (76.2IP/30ER) during the month of July, which is the third-lowest in the American League, trailing only New York (AL), (3.27 ERA) and Oakland (3.41 ERA). The Tigers bullpen also ranks fifth in the AL with a 1.21 WHIP and .244 (71x291) opponents batting average.

TIGERS TIDBITS: Alex Wilson struck out two batters in a scoreless inning on Sunday vs. Cleveland. Over his last 10 appearances, Wilson has posted a 0.82 ERA (11.0IP/1ER) with five hits allowed, one walk and six strikeouts...José Iglesias went 1x3 with a double on Sunday and has now recorded an extra-base hit in three of his last four games.

TIGERS AND REDS: The Tigers are 0-2 against the Reds this season after being swept in a two-game series at Great American Ball Park in June. The Reds lead the all-time series against Detroit 13-11, and the Tigers are 5-3 against Cincinnati at Comerica Park. The two teams last met in 2015, when the Reds won three of the four meetings.

INTERLEAGUE INTRIGUE: The Tigers are 1-9 in Interleague play this season. Detroit has a 207-186 (.527) record vs. National League opponents since Interleague play began in 1997. Only eight other Major League teams have at least 200 wins in Interleague history (New York (AL), Boston, Los Angeles (AL), Oakland, Texas, Chicago (AL), Minnesota, Seattle). Over the last 13 seasons (since 2006), the Tigers are 136-

100 (.576) in IL play, which ranks fourth among all ML teams over that stretch, trailing only Boston (158-77, .672), New York (AL) (143-100, .588) and Texas (137-98, .583).

AT COMERICA PARK: The Tigers are 1-2 on their current five-game homestand, which includes three games vs. Cleveland (1-2) and two games vs. Cincinnati (July 31-August 1. Detroit is 27-27 at Comerica Park this season, but have lost 10 of its last 14 home games. The Tigers are hitting .251 (459x1828) as a team at home, while the pitching staff has posted a 4.06 ERA (497.0IP/224ER).

NOTES ON THE SKIPPER: Ron Gardenhire is in his first season as the Tigers manager after being named to the position on October 20, 2017.

*Enters tonight's game with a 45-62 (.421) record as the Tigers manager and a 1,113-1,101 (.503) career record as a manager, which is the eighth-most wins among active managers and ranks 54th in baseball history.

*Earned the 1,100th win of his managerial career on June 13 vs. Minnesota.

*Spent the 2017 season as the bench coach for the Arizona Diamondbacks, who captured a National League Wild Card spot and advanced to the National League Division Series.

*Served as manager of the Minnesota Twins from 2002-14 and is the winningest manager in Twins history, posting a record of 1,068-1,039 (.507) over his 13 seasons...is one of 10 managers in baseball history to win 1,000-or-more games with a single team.

*Guided the Twins to six postseason appearances (2002-04, 2006, 2009-10), including a berth in the 2002 American League Championship Series...was the first manager in MLB history to guide his team to the postseason in six of his first nine seasons.

*Named the BBWAA American League Manager of the Year in 2010...also finished runner-up for the honor on five occasions.

ABOUT MATTHEW: Boyd will make his 21st start of the season tonight in the series opener vs. Cincinnati.

LAST TIME OUT: Boyd earned his fifth win of the season on Wednesday at Kansas City, allowing two runs on seven hits with seven strikeouts in 6.0 innings.

VS. CINCINNATI: Boyd's only career appearance against the Reds came earlier this season on June 19 at Great American Ball Park when he took the loss after giving up five runs on six hits with three walks and five strikeouts in 4.0 innings.

AT COMERICA PARK: Boyd has made 37 career appearances, including 35 starts, at Comerica Park and has compiled a 10-11 record with a 4.14 ERA (198.0IP/91ER) and 151 strikeouts. In nine home starts this season, Boyd is 3-3 with a 3.40 ERA (50.1IP/19ER) and 41 strikeouts.

INTERLEAGUE ACTION: Boyd has made seven appearances, including five starts, in his career during Interleague Play, posting a 1-4 record with an 8.03 ERA (24.2IP/22ER) and 26 strikeouts. In two Interleague starts this season, Boyd has a 0-2 record with a 10.57 ERA (7.2IP/9ER) and eight strikeouts.

RECORD IN JULY: Boyd has started 12 games in his career during the month of July, compiling a 6-4 record with a 5.19 ERA (60.2IP/35ER) and 63 strikeouts. In four July starts this season, Boyd has a 1-3 record with a 6.00 ERA (21.0IP/14ER) and 24 strikeouts.

LEFT VS. RIGHT: Lefthanded hitters have posted a .267 (85x318) career batting average vs. Boyd, while righties are hitting him at a .270 (333x1234) clip. In 20 starts this season, lefties are hitting .248 (25x101) against Boyd, while righthanded hitters are batting .221 (68x308).

TIGERS PITCHER OF THE MONTH FOR MAY: Boyd was named the Tigers Pitcher of the Month for May after posting a 3-2 record with a 3.18 ERA (34.0IP/12ER) and 31 strikeouts. He allowed three runs-or-less in five of his six starts in May.

IMPRESSIVE START TO 2018: Boyd threw 6.0-or-more innings and allowed one run-or-less in each of his first three starts this season. He became the first Tigers lefthanded pitcher since at least 1908 to work at least 6.0 innings and give up one run-or-less in each of his first three starts of the season.

NEAR NO-NO: Boyd came just one out shy of his first career no-hitter on September 17, 2017 vs. Chicago (AL). Boyd threw 8.2 no-hit innings before allowing a double to Tim Anderson. He completed the shutout, allowing just one hit and striking out five.

STRONG FINISH TO 2017: Boyd was named the Tigers Pitcher of the Month for September, 2017 after compiling a 1-3 record with a 2.95 ERA (36.2IP/12ER), 30 hits allowed, 11 walks and 30 strikeouts. Boyd ranked fourth in the American League with 36.2 innings pitched during the month, while he was 10th with a .216 (30x139) opponents batting average.

NAMED A MINOR LEAGUE ALL-STAR: Boyd was selected as a 2015 Minor League All-Star by *Baseball America*. In 19 starts in the minors in 2015, Boyd had a 9-2 record with a 1.65 ERA (114.2IP/21ER) and 108 strikeouts. He led all qualified starters in the Minor Leagues in WHIP (0.85) and opponent average (.176), while he was second in ERA.

EARNING HIS FIRST BIG LEAGUE WIN: Boyd picked up the first win of his Major League career in his Tigers debut on August 5, 2015 vs. Kansas City. Boyd allowed just one run on seven hits with two strikeouts in 7.0 innings vs. the Royals.

MAKING HIS MAJOR LEAGUE DEBUT: Boyd made his Major League debut with the Toronto Blue Jays on June 27, 2015 against Texas. Boyd took the loss in the game, allowing four runs on nine hits with seven strikeouts in 6.2 innings. Boyd's seven strikeouts tied the Toronto record for most strikeouts by a pitcher making their debut as a starter (also, Mark Rzepczynski, July 7, 2009 at Tampa Bay). Also, his 6.2 innings pitched without issuing a walk were the most by a Toronto starter making their debut.

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES: Boyd was acquired by the Tigers along with lefthanded pitchers Daniel Norris and Jairo Labourt from the Blue Jays on July 30, 2015 in exchange for lefthanded pitcher David Price. Boyd was selected by the Blue Jays in the sixth round of the 2013 MLB First-Year Player Draft. Boyd attended Oregon State University and helped the Beavers to the 2013 College World Series. He earned All-Pac-12 First Team honors and was named a third-team All-American by *Baseball America* as a senior.

LAST TIME OUT: Fiers turned in his 10th quality start of the season on Friday vs. Cleveland, but did not factor into the decision after allowing three runs on five hits with two walks and four strikeouts in 6.0 innings.

VS. CINCINNATI/AT COMERICA PARK: Fiers has faced the Reds nine times in his career, including seven times as a starter, posting a 3-4 record with a 2.72 ERA (43.0IP/13ER) and 35 strikeouts. He last pitched against the Reds on June 19, 2016 and earned the win after tossing 5.2 shutout innings with four hits allowed, one walk and five strikeouts. Fiers has started 13 games in his career at Comerica Park, compiling a 5-2 record with a 2.64 ERA (78.1IP/23ER) and 61 strikeouts. In 11 home starts this season, Fiers is 5-2 with a 2.85 ERA (66.1IP/21ER) and 52 strikeouts.

AMONG THE AL LEADERS: Fiers currently ranks sixth in the American League with 2.00 walks per nine innings.
