WINS AND LOSSES: The Rangers shut out the Angels, 10-0, last night to open this final series before the All-Star break...club is now 2-2 on this 6-game, 7-day homestand against BOS (1-2) and LAA (1-0) leading up to the All-Star break...the Rangers have won consecutive games for the 1st time since 6/24-25 and are seeking to win 3 in a row for the 1st time since 5 straight wins, 6/9-13, with a victory tonight... Texas has still lost 3 of 5, 6 of 9, and 7 of 11, with club's 8-11 (.421) record beginning 6/18 ranking as T5th-lowest win pct. in A.L. in that span...club is still 15-12 (.556) since 6/9, 5th-best in the A.L. in that stretch...Texas has won 16 of 29 and 29 of 53...club has a 37-34 (.521) record beginning 4/20, T4th-best in A.L., this after opening the year at 5-10.

• At 42-44 (.488), the Rangers are 9th in the A.L. in winning percentage...club is under .500 for the 9th straight day, this after a .500-or-better record on 6 of the 7 previous days... Texas has had a winning record on just 3 occasions in the last 44 days, 34-33 on 6/17, 38-37 on 6/25, and 39-38 on 6/27...current win pct. is same thru 86 G as 2015 (42-44/42-45)...club was 53-33/53-34 in 2016.

• Team is currently 2 games below .500...club has been season-high 3 G above .500 twice, last on 5/21 (24-21), and was a 2017 high 7 games under .500 (13-20) on 5/8...season best 10-G win streak from 5/9-19 was 4th-longest in franchise history...the Rangers are 4-3-2 in their last 9 overall series.

IN THE STANDINGS: The Rangers are tied with the Angels for 2nd place in the division, this after the club was in 4th place as recently as following a loss on Tuesday vs. BOS... days in each position in 2017 (alone or tied): 1st-0 days, 2nd-27, 3rd-25, 4th-31, 5th-13...Texas has gained ground in the A.L. West just twice in the last 20 days, currently 16.5 games back...season-high 17.0-G deficit both Tuesday and Wednesday, team's greatest at any point since end of the 2014 season (21.0 GB)...The Rangers are still just 3.0 GB of a wild card spot in the A.L.

AT HOME: The Rangers have won 2 straight at Globe Life Park, this after the club dropped 5 of its previous 7 games in Arlington...Texas has still lost 10 of last 17 at home, going 8-11 in home games since 5/29 after opening year w/ a 16-8 record in Arlington...that season-opening span included an 8-0 homestand from 5/10-18, just 2nd undefeated homestand of 7+ G in Rangers history (also 8-0, 5/20-29/05)... club's 24-19 (.558) record ranks T6th in the A.L.

• Texas ranks 2nd in A.L. w/ both 244 runs and 5.67 R/G at home in '17 (NYY: 246/6.00).

VS. LOS ANGELES-AL: Rangers are 4-3 vs. Halos in '17, after a win in last night's series opener...Texas won series 4/11-13 at LAA (2-1) and lost series 4/28-30 in Arlington (1-2)... have won 4 of last 6 since dropping 1st meeting of '17...team is 5-2-1 in 8 series vs. Halos in 2016-17...Texas has won 8 of last 13 meetings after a 2-5 span, but is just 26-38 overall since start of 2014 after posting a 15-4 mark in 2013...Texas went 10-9 vs. the Angels last season, winning season series for 1st time since 2013...club was 6-3 in Arlington last year, taking all 3 series, but is just 12-21 in home games vs. LAA since start of 2014...Angels lead all-time series 365-337, but Rangers have leads of 185-170 in Arlington, including 103-98 at GLPIA...final 3 series between the clubs come in a span of 28 days from 8/21-9/17.

FIRST INNING: The Rangers scored 3 runs in the first inning last night to raise their run total in the opening frame this year to 62, most in the A.L. and 4th-most in MLB (MIL-75; MIA-67; CIN-64)...Texas is also batting .306 (102-333) in the first inning, 3rd-highest in the majors (MIL/HOU-.308).

• Nomar Mazara's 14 RBI in the 1st inning are 3rd-most in the A.L. (SEA's Nelson Cruz - 23 and CWS' Jose Abreu - 17).

2-OUT RUNS: With all 10 runs scored last night after 2 outs, the Rangers are now 3rd in the majors with 180 2-out runs overall (HOU-208; LAD-195)...the club's 48 2-out home runs are 3 more than any other ML team (BAL-45).

ELVIS ACTIVE: Elvis Andrus has been activated from MLB's Paternity Leave List for tonight's game...to make room on the roster, Jurickson Profar has been optioned to Round Rock (AAA)...Andrus' stint on the Paternity List marked the first time that he had not been on the Rangers' active roster in the regular or postseason since he made his big league debut on opening day in 2009.

COLE HAMELS improved to 4-0 with 7.2 scoreless innings last night and has totaled 13.1 scoreless innings over his last 2 starts, 3rd-longest active scoreless streak by a starter (NYM's Steven Matz-17.0 IP, PIT's Jameson Taillon-15.1 IP)... with the victory, Hamels improved to 26-6 (.813) since joining the Rangers on 7/31/15...the Elias Sports Bureau notes that Hamels' win percentage in that span is the 2nd-highest in the majors among pitchers with 20-or-more decisions, behind only Clayton Kershaw (.825 on a 33-7 record)

• Hamels is now 13-2 (.867) in 27 career starts at Globe Life Park, more than 100 points better than any other pitcher with at least 25 starts at this facility (Aaron Sele is next at .692, 27-12).

SHUTOUT: The Rangers posted their 4th shutout of the season last night, ending a 51-game shutout drought...the drought was the longest in the majors and 13 more than any other club (BOS/COL-38)...the club had also gone 35 games since its last shutout at Globe Life Park on 4/20/17 (1-0 win vs. KC), 3rd-longest shutout drought in Arlington since 2011 (75 G, 9/12/15-8/17/16 and 41 G, 5/31-8/29/15).

5000: Adrian Beltre has hit safely in each of his last 3 games, going 6-for-12 in that span...with 2 hits last night, Beltre brought his career total bases figure to 5003, becoming the 21st player in ML history to surpass 5000 TB.

HOME RUNS: The Rangers hit 3 more home runs last night and have now homered in 28 of their last 29 games, totaling a ML-high 60 long balls in that span...Texas also has multiple home runs in 4 straight, one shy of the club's longest such streak in '17 (5, 6/24-28)...the Rangers have homered in 71 games overall, 2nd-most in the majors (HOU-72)...Texas is now 2nd in the A.L. and 3rd in the majors with 133 home runs overall (HOU-142; MIL-135).

• All 3 Texas home runs last night came on full counts, just the 2nd time since pitches were first tracked in 1988 that the club has hit 3 such HR in one game (other 9/19/06 vs. SEA: Matthews/Teixiera/Blalock)...Texas now has 14 home runs on full counts this season, T4th-most in the majors, along with a ML-best 39 home runs on the 1st pitch of an at-bat.

• Rougned Odor has homered in 2 straight, 3 of 4, and 5 of his last 7 games...his 10 home runs since 6/4 are T4th in the A.L. and T7th in the majors over that span.

SHORTS: The Rangers will don 1977 powder blue uniforms, while the "California" Angels will also wear replica 1977 road uniforms for tonight's game...Jason Grilli has retired all 6 batters faced with 4 strikeouts over his 1st 2 relief outings with Texas...Shin-Soo Choo has gone 26 consecutive plate appearances without a strikeout, 4th-longest streak in the majors...Texas was 4-for-6 w/RISP last night and have gone 8-for-18 in their last 2 G, 1st time with 4+ H w/RISP in consecutive games since 5/29-30 vs. TB (8-for-20)...Cole Hamels induced 3 ground ball double plays last night, matching the most by a Texas pitcher this season (Andrew Cashner on 5/17 vs. PHI).

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER

#44 Tyson Ross, RHP
(1-1, 6.41)

TONIGHT: The 30-year-old right-hander is slated to make his 5th start of the season tonight in the middle game of this 3-game series with the Angels...will be working on extended 5 days' rest following Thursday's off day, and took no decision in last start on Sunday at CWS (5.0 IP, 4 R-ER), a 6-5 Texas loss...prior to earning win in season debut on 6/16 vs. SEA, had not appeared in majors since Padres' 2016 season opener due to right shoulder issues and eventual 10/13/16 surgery to relieve Thoracic Outlet Syndrome...was the 10th starter used by the Rangers in 2017...his 5.03 BB/9 would be highest since becoming a full-time starter in 2013...made 4 rehab starts for Triple-A Round Rock this season in his return to the majors, going 2-1 with a 7.71 ERA (16 ER/18.2 IP)...signed with Texas as a free agent on 1/19/17 after spending the last 4 seasons with San Diego...selected in the 2nd round of the 2008 MLB Draft by Oakland and spent his 1st 5 pro seasons with the A's before being traded to San Diego on 11/16/12.

RETURN FROM INJURY: Was the Padres' Opening Day starter in 2016 but missed rest of the season with right shoulder trouble that ultimately resulted in surgery to relieve Thoracic Outlet Syndrome in October...had surgery on 10/13/16 in St. Louis, performed by Dr. Robert Thompson...was not tendered a contract by the Padres prior to 12/2/16 deadline, making him a free agent...signed with Texas on 1/19/17 and began season on the 10-day DL before being transferred to the 60-day DL on 5/27...rehab was briefly slowed in April due to back spasms.

LAST START: Took ND in a 6-5 Texas loss on Sun. at CWS (5.0 IP, 4 H, 4 R-ER, 5 BB, 3 SO, 1 HR, 97 pitches/54 strikes)...allowed home run to Melky Cabrera in 1st inning, just his 2nd allowed this season...exited with a 5-4 lead, as Texas offense supported him with 5 runs after scoring 3 runs combined over previous 2 starts...issued a season-high 5 walks, but induced a pair of double plays...White Sox took lead on 2-run home run by Yolmer Sanchez off Jose Leclerc in the 8th.

VS. LOS ANGELES-AL: Has gone 1-1, 1.98 (8 ER/36.1 IP) in 9 G/5 GS career vs. Halos, his lowest ERA vs. any club with 6+ G against...posted quality starts in 4 of 5 starts, all in Anaheim...last faced Angels on 5/25/15, taking ND for Padres (6.0 IP, 3 R-2 ER)...each of other 8 outings came as member of A's from 2010-12...earned only career save in ML debut on 4/11/10 at LAA (3.0 IP, 1 R-ER).

IN ARLINGTON: Tonight marks 3rd home start of '17...has gone 1-1 with a 9.35 ERA (9 ER/8.2 IP) in 2 G/GS in Arlington this season...took loss in last home start on 6/21 vs. TOR (3.0 IP, 7 R-ER), the 4th time in his career to allow 7+ ER...victory in Texas debut on 6/16 vs. SEA (5.2 IP, 2 R-ER) was 1st win since beating Rangers on 8/31/15 at Petco Park...opponents batting .257/.333/.429 at home compared to .171/.318/.286 on the road.

ROUND ROCK: Made 4 rehab starts for Triple-A Round Rock, going 2-1 with a 7.71 ERA (16 ER/18.2 IP), 11 SO/11 BB...opponents batted .324 (.23-71) with 11 XBH (7 2B, 3 HR, 3B)...took loss in last rehab outing on 6/9 at OKC (Dodgers AAA) (5.0 IP, 8 R-ER)...picked up the win in his 1st start on 5/23 vs. Las Vegas (Mets AAA), tossing 5.0 SHO IP with 5 K's...longest rehab outing came on 6/3 vs. New Orleans (Marlins AAA) (5.1 IP, 2 R-ER).

KEEP IT DOWN: Induced 60.3% ground balls in his last 2 full seasons on the mound in 2014-15, 2nd in MLB (Dallas Keuchel-63.3)...has allowed **0.57 HR/9 in career, lowest among active pitchers (min. 650.0 IP)**...from 2014-15, was 16th in N.L. with 38 GDP and 8th with 0.87 GDP/9...through 4 starts, has induced 39.3% ground balls (22 GB/21 FB) and 3 GDP, including 2 on Sun. at CWS.

BY THE NUMBERS: Right-handed hitters slashing .235/.325/.383/.707 w/ 3 XBH (3 2B, 1 HR), while lefties are .194/.326/.333/.659 w/ 3 XBH (2 2B, HR)...is 31-46 with a 3.63 ERA (249 ER/617.2 IP) in 106 career starts, compared to 2-8 with a 4.46 ERA (36 ER/72.2) in 51 relief outings...has been used exclusively as a starter since 2nd half of 2013 season, last appearing out of bullpen on 7/7/13 at WAS for Padres...career run support average (4.07) ranks 9th-lowest among active starters (min. 650.0 IP), as teammate Andrew Cashner ranks lowest at 3.77...from 2014-15, ranked 3rd in N.L. with 30.5 swing and miss percentage, behind only LAD's Clayton Kershaw (30.6) and PIT's Francisco Liriano (33.5).

2017: Robinson Chirinos has caught 3 starts (1-0, 3.78, 7 ER/16.2 IP) and Jonathan Lucroy caught 6/21 vs. TOR (L, 3.0 IP, 7 R-ER)...victory in Texas debut on 6/16 vs. SEA (5.2 IP, 2 R-ER) was 1st win since beating Rangers on 8/31/15 at Petco Park (7.0 SHO IP)...only other starter in last 25 years (beg. 1993) to allow 2-hits-or-less while recording 17+ outs in their Texas debut was Chi Chi Gonzalez on 5/30/15 vs. BOS (5.2 IP, 2 H) in ML debut...loss on 6/21 vs. TOR (3.0 IP, 7 R-ER) marked 2nd shortest start by a Ranger in '17 (Griffin-1.1 IP on 5/26 at TOR, left game with injury).

2016: Became the 29th different pitcher to start on Opening Day for the Padres, as he took the loss on 4/4/16 vs. Los Angeles-NL (5.1 IP, 8 R-7 ER) in a 15-0 setback...felt discomfort following a bullpen session ahead of his next scheduled start and was placed on the 15-day DL on 4/9 with a diagnosis of right shoulder inflammation...was assigned to Lake Elsinore (High-A) for rehab assignment on 8/25 and lost start at Rancho Cucamonga (0.2 IP, 4 R-ER)...continued to experience soreness, was removed from rehab assignment, and transferred to the 60-day DL on 8/31.
