**MARYVALE:** The Colorado Rockies will travel to Maryvale today for their second of four games against the Brewers this Spring ... left-hander Tyler Anderson will make his third start of Spring ... he will be opposed by left-hander Brent Suter.

**TRIBE:** The Rockies fell to the Indians 8-5 on Friday afternoon ... Jon Gray pitched 3.1 innings, allowing six runs on six hits with two walks and two strikeouts ... outfielder David Dahl went 2-for-3 with his third home run of the Spring ... infielder Ryan McMahon went 2-for-4 with one run scored.

**DODGER THAT:** Colorado returns to Salt River Fields on Sunday to face the Los Angeles Dodgers for the first of two meetings this Spring ... right-hander German Márquez will make his third start of Spring ... he will be opposed by left-hander Hyun-jin Ryu.

**MAKING MOVES:** The Colorado Rockies announced today that they have optioned right-handed pitcher Zach Jemiola to Triple-A Albuquerque, and have optioned right-hander Jesus Tinoco, catcher Chris Rabago and outfielder Yonathan Daza to Double-A Hartford ... additionally, right-hander Peter Lambert, catcher Dom Nuñez and outfielder Sam Hilliard have been reassigned to Minor League camp ... the Rockies have 50 players remaining in Major League camp, including 14 non-roster players.

**SOUND FAMILIAR?:** Yesterday snapped a streak six consecutive one-run games for the Rockies... they have played seven one-run games this Spring and have had 12 games decided by three runs or less, including one tie ... in 2017, the Rockies went 21-14 in one-run games, the second-best record in MLB.

**CARRY A BIG STICK:** Through 15 games so far this Spring, the Rockies are batting .288 (155-for-538) the fourth-highest batting average in MLB ... the Rockies 19 stolen bases are the most in the Cactus League ... Trevor Story is batting .471 (8-for-17) with four doubles, two triples, one home run, four walks and five strikeouts ... DJ LeMahieu is batting .429 (9-for-21) with two doubles ... Ryan McMahon leads the club and is tied for the lead in the Cactus League with 14 hits, including three doubles and one home run ... David Dahl leads the team with three home runs.

**THE PEN IS MIGHTY:** Both Jairo Díaz (4.0 IP, 1 H, 2 BB, 5 SO) and Adam Ottavino (4.0 IP, 2 H, 3 BB, 3 SO) have yet to allow a run this Spring.

**TRAINING ROOM:** Outfielder Gerardo Parra, who underwent surgery prior to camp to remove the broken hook of the hamate bone in his right hand, is expected to make his Cactus League debut tomorrow ... infielder Shawn O'Malley fractured a metacarpal in his left hand on March 2 while making a diving play at second base ... infielder Pat Valaika and right-hander Carlos Estévez each have a left oblique strain.

**TV ON THE RADIO:** Today's game at Milwaukee can be heard on KOA NewsRadio 850 AM/94.1 FM. ... AT&T SportsNet will broadcast the game tomorrow vs. the Dodgers.

**BACKFIELDS:** Minor League games will begin on March 15, with Triple-A and Double-A players traveling to Oakland ... the Triple-A and Double-A squads will host Oakland on the Salt River Fields backfields on March 16.

**IS IT OPENING DAY YET?:** The Rockies will open the regular season March 29 with the first game of a three-game series at Arizona with first pitch set for 7:10 p.m. MT ... the Rockies will play their home opener on Friday, April 6 against the Atlanta Braves to begin a three-game series ... tickets to the home opener are available by purchasing a mini-plan or season ticket package ... for ticket information, call (303) 762-5437 or visit www.rockies.com/tickets.

**BULLETIN BOARD:** Current roster and schedule information is available from the Communications office adjacent to the clubhouse entrance ... online Spring Training information as well as daily video content is available at rockiespressbox.com.

**MEDIA SCHEDULE:** Rockies Manager Bud Black is available to the media at approximately 9:30 a.m. each day in his office (subject to change) ... this time is variable depending on meetings and other obligations, so expect a member of the Communications department to alert media in the media work rooms ... Black will also be available for a brief (less than five-minute) recap outside the Rockies dugout after each game, home and road ... Colorado's clubhouse is open to media from 7:30-8:30 a.m. (clubhouse media times subject to change without prior notice) ... during Spring Training games, the Rockies clubhouse opens for interviews when the Colorado starting pitcher is announced as available to the media.

**NETTING:** The Rockies have begun installation of protective netting behind home plate, replacing the current netting with an upgraded material and extending it at the same height to the end of each dugout ... along with the new netting and scoreboard, the Rockies will also be renovating the stadium speakers, the Wells Fargo Club Level and the home clubhouse.

## TODAY'S SCHEDULED ROCKIES PITCHERS

**Tyler Anderson, LHP - #44:** Colorado's first-round pick in the 2011 First-Year Player Draft ... made his first Opening Day roster in 2017 and went 6-6 with a 4.81 ERA (86.0 IP, 46 ER) across 15 starts and two relief appearances ... had two different stints on the 10-day disabled list, and one stint on the 60-day DL, with left knee inflammation ... after being reinstated on Sept. 1, went 3-1 with a 1.19 ERA (22.2 IP, 3 ER) in four appearances, three starts to finish the season ... made his Major League debut on June 12, 2016 vs. San Diego and posted a 3.54 ERA (114.1 IP, 45 ER) in 19 starts, the second-lowest ERA by a rookie in franchise history (min. 100 IP).

**Yency Almonte, RHP - #62:** Acquired via trade from the Chicago White Sox in exchange for RHP Tommy Kahnle, Nov. 24, 2015 ... added to the 40-man roster after the 2016 season ... attending his second Major League Spring Training ... was named an Eastern League Mid-Season All-Star as well as a MiLB.com Organization All-Star in 2017 ... promoted to Triple-A on July 25, his first experience at the level ... made nine relief appearances in the Arizona Fall League and was named to the 2017 Fall Stars Game ... ranked by *Baseball America* as the seventh overall prospect in the Rockies organization.

**Bryan Shaw, RHP - #29:** Signed by the Rockies to a three-year contract, Dec. 15, 2017 ... made 79 relief appearances with Cleveland in 2017, tied for the most in the Major Leagues ... among American League relievers, finished first in games, seventh in relief innings and fourth in holds while setting career-highs in innings pitched and saves ... has made at least 70 appearances in five consecutive seasons ... since 2013, his 378 appearances are the most in the Majors ... in 19 career postseason appearances, has gone 2-1 with a 2.45 ERA (22.0 IP, 6 ER).
