HERE'S THE STORY...

- ♦ The D-backs' 8-3 start is tied for the second-best 11-game start in team history (also: 2010) behind 2008 (9-2)...they have started 9-3 twice ('00, '08).
- ♦ The D-backs are 8-3 in their last 11 games vs. Giants.
- ♦ With a win today, Arizona would open the season with 4 consecutive series victories for the first time in franchise history... prior to this season, the D-backs had never won more than their first 2 series of a season in a row.
- ♦ The D-backs are 26-10 (.722) vs. NL West opponents since Aug. 25 of last season.
- ♦ **Robbie Ray** is 8-0 with a 2.98 ERA (18 ER in 54.1 IP) and 84 strikeouts in his last 10 starts dating back to 2017.

YESTERDAY'S RECAP

- ♦ The D-backs lost @ Giants, 5-4.
- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt** went 2-for-4, including a game-tying home run in the ninth inning... **A.J. Pollock** was 1-for-4 with a double and 2 RBI, and **Jarrod Dyson** went 2-for-5 with a double.
- ♦ **Patrick Corbin** allowed 3 runs and struck out 9 in 5.1 innings... **Fernando Salas** threw 1.2 scoreless frames.

YESTERDAY'S TRANSACTION

- ♦ Prior to yesterday's game the D-backs traded OF **Jeremy Hazelbaker** to the Tampa Bay Rays for cash considerations...he was designated for assignment on April 6.

THE EVENT IMMEDIATELY BEFORE THE SECOND PITCH

- ♦ D-backs television analyst **Bob Brenly** will throw out the ceremonial first pitch prior to today's game...Brenly, who played parts of 9 seasons with the Giants (1981-89), will throw the pitch as a part of the Giants' season-long celebration for their 60th anniversary in San Francisco.

ANOTHER DAY, ANOTHER DEBUT

- ♦ Today will be the second consecutive day the D-backs will face a starting pitcher making his Major League debut...prior to this series, Arizona had faced a starter making his Major League debut just 3 times since the start of the 2012 season: Chad Green/NYY on May 16, 2016, Tyler Wagner/MIL on May 31, 2015 and Matt Harvey/NYM on July 26, 2012.

LOVIN' LEFTIES

- ♦ The D-backs have won each of their 7 games when their opponent starts a left-handed pitcher since Sept. 26, 2017, with the opposing lefties posting a 9.20 ERA (30 ER in 29.1 IP).
- ♦ Since Aug. 12, 2017, Arizona is 18-3 when its opponent starts a left-handed pitcher.

MILESTONE WATCH

- ♦ **Robbie Ray** needs 9 strikeouts to reach 600 for his career...he enters today with 94 career games and 503.2 innings pitched, and is looking to be 1 of the fastest left-handed pitchers in Major League history to reach the milestone [STATS LLC]:

- ◆ Born in Brentwood, Tenn.
- ◆ Won a gold medal with USA Baseball's 18U National Championship Team that participated in the 2009 Pan-American Championships in Venezuela...was teammates with Cory Hahn, D-backs Coordination, Professional Scouting.
- ◆ Had committed to pitch at the University of Arkansas before signing with the Nationals.
- ◆ Wears a protective cap insert on the left side of his head after being struck by a 108-mph line drive on July 28, 2017 @ Cardinals...was on the disabled list from July 29-Aug. 24.

- ◆ Established a career high in wins and ERA, going 15-5 with a 2.89 ERA in 28 starts...matched his career high with 218 strikeouts (also: 2016).

- ◆ Has a 12-game scoreless streak (12.0 IP) dating back to Sept. 9, 2017.
- ◆ Left-handers are 0-for-5 (.000).
- ◆ Named the D-backs closer by manager Torey Lovullo on March 27.

- ◆ 6 of his appearances have been scoreless.
- ◆ Has at least 1 strikeout in 8 straight outings dating back to 2017 (13 SO total).
