LEADING OFF: Angels play the second game (1-0) of an 11-game home stand vs. **Minnesota** (May 10-13; 1-0), **Houston** (May 14-16) and **Tampa Bay** (May 17-20)...LAA is 7-2 this month to move into a first place tie with Astros in A.L. West... Halos are 10-11 since a club-record 13-3 start...LAA owns an MLB-best 14-4 road record, best 18-game away start season in club history... Halos are 8-3-1 in 12 series completed...Next road trip is an 11-day, 10-game swing to **Toronto** (May 22-24), **New York Yankees** (May 25-27) and **Detroit** (May 28-31).

START ME UP: LAA starting pitchers have gone 5+ innings of no-run baseball in six of last nine games...Halo starters have fashioned an A.L.-best 2.04 ERA this month (see below).

MOVIN' ON UPTON: Justin Upton has homered in three straight and in four of his last five games...Sixth time in career homering in three straight games (never 4 straight)...Hitting .353 (12/34) with five home runs and 12 RBI over his last eight games.

SIMBA SIZZLIN': **Andrelton Simmons** has hit safely in 14 of his last 15 games batting .429 (24/56) with two home runs and 16 RBI...His .351 clip season ranks second in A.L...Last night marked his sixth game with 3+ hits (third-most in Majors).

CLOSE TO COBB: **Albert Pujols** enters tonight's game with 1,939 career RBI to rank ninth all-time...Next up on the all-time list is **Ty Cobb** with 1,944 RBI (*source Baseball Reference*).

MORE ON ALBERT: **Pujols** connected for his 628th career two-bagger last night (11th all-time) to move within four of Top 10 all-time (**David Ortiz**, 632).

ANOTHER DAY FOR SHOHEI: **Shohei Ohtani** has recorded a hit in 14 of 16 of his starts at DH this season...Last night was his seventh multi-hit game...His five home runs are tied for A.L. lead among rookies (Tyler Austin).

WALK IN THE PARK: **Mike Trout** has 17 BBs across his last 18 games...With his 600th career free pass May 8, became the 5th player with 600 walks/200 HRs prior to age-27 season, joining **Mickey Mantle, Eddie Mathews, Mel Ott & Jimmie Foxx**.

3,000!!! With a fifth inning single to right field May 4th at SAFECO Field, **Albert Pujols**...

- Became 32nd player all-time to reach 3,000 hits - second in as many seasons (**Adrián Beltré**; July 30, 2017 vs. Baltimore).
- Has matched **Stan Musial** and **Alex Rodriguez** as only players with 3+ MVP Awards and 3,000 hits.
- Fourth player in MLB history with at least 3,000 knocks and 600 HRs (**Hank Aaron, Willie Mays & Alex Rodriguez**).
- 6th foreign-born player to reach 3K (2nd Dominican – **Beltre**).
- Is one of four players with 3,000 hits, 450 HRs and 600 doubles (**Aaron, Carl Yastrzemski, Beltre & Musial**) - *STATS LLC*.
- Joins **Rod Carew** (Aug. 4, 1985 vs. Minnesota) as only players to log 3,000th hit in an Angels' uniform.

TWO-WAY SHOHEI: **Ohtani** is just the fourth player in modern era with 25+ pitching strikeouts and four+ batting home runs in a month – first since **Fergie Jenkins** in Sept., 1971...Tied club record for most XBH (7) through first 13 career games with a plate appearance (**Jackie Warner** in 1966)...Named A.L. Rookie of the Month for April...As a DH, batted .359 (14/39) with four HRs, 12 RBI and a 1.148 OPS...In four starts, went 2-1 with 26 strikeouts in 20.1 IP.

ASTROS ON DECK: **LAA took two of three in first meeting of 2018, April 23-25 at Minute Maid Park...** Astros claimed 2017 series 12-7 and have won four of last five season series...Angels are 15-26 vs. Houston since 2017...Halos are 20-17 in last 37 home games vs. Astros but 15-24 in last 39 at Minute Maid Park... **Albert Pujols'** 57 HRs are most by any player all-time vs. Houston (regular season).

May 11

(1977) **Bobby Bonds, Don Baylor** and **Ron Jackson** hit back-to-back-to-back home runs in the second inning of a 6-0 win vs. Baltimore; (1990) Angels traded pitcher **Mike Witt** to the Yankees in exchange for outfielder **Dave Winfield**, who was later named Comeback Player of the Year by *The Sporting News*; (1962) **Bo Belinsky** wins his fifth consecutive start, 1 of 2 players (**Jered Weaver**) in LAA history to win their first five MLB starts.

May 12

(1997) The Angels scored 13 runs in the seventh inning to erase a 6-2 deficit and win 16-8 over the Chicago White Sox at Anaheim Stadium...13 runs equaled the most scored in an inning by the Angels in franchise history (Sept. 14, 1978 at Texas, 9th inning); (1998) The Angels turned six double plays in a 5-2 loss to the White Sox, tying the club record.

First career start vs. Twins

- Making eighth start of the season and fourth at home...Is in sixth Major League season (fourth with Angels)...Made Opening Day roster for third time in career (also, 2014 & 2017).
- **OFF THE BOARDS:** Has allowed two-or-fewer runs in six of seven starts this season...His six starts with two-or-fewer runs are second most in the Majors this season among left-handers.
- **INSIDE THE PARK:** Has yielded just two home runs this season in 38 innings pitched...The 0.47 HR/9 innings rate ranks tied for fourth best in the American League this season.
- **LAST TIME OUT:** Did not factor in the decision in last start on Saturday at Seattle after tossing 5.1 innings and allowing two earned runs on six hits with one walk and seven strikeouts; carried shutout into sixth inning.
- **300 K's:** Recorded 300th career strikeout against **Aaron Hicks** in 4th inning on April 29 vs. New York (A.L.)
- **THERE'S NO PLACE LIKE...THE ROAD:** Has pitched to a 3-0 record and 1.14 ERA (23.2 IP – 3 ER) on the road this season, compared with a 0-2 record and 6.28 ERA (14.1 IP – 10 ER) at home...His road ERA ranks fourth in the American League.
- **EARLY SUCCESS:** In 16 career regular season starts during March/April, is 6-3 with a 3.43 ERA (97 IP – 37 ER) and 83 strikeouts...The six wins are his most for any month...Start on Saturday at Seattle was first start in May since 2014.
- **GETTING FAMILIAR:** Since start of 2017, has not allowed a home run the first time through the batting order in a game (207 PA), but has yielded 14 HR in 204 PA the second time through the order in a game in that span.
- **VS. MINNESOTA:** First career appearance vs. Twins (Minnesota is only American League team – excluding Angels – that he has not faced).
- **AT ANGEL STADIUM:** In 24 career starts at the Big A, is 3-9 with a 4.90 ERA (128.2 IP – 70 ER)...In three home starts this season, is 0-2 with a 6.28 ERA (14.1 IP – 10 ER)...In eight home starts last season, was 2-3 with a 4.78 ERA (43.1 IP – 23 ER)...Angels have won 13 of his 24 career home starts.
- **NEW CAREER HIGH:** Set career high with 114 pitches thrown on April 10 at Texas (previous was 105 pitches for Arizona on Aug. 27, 2012 vs. Cincinnati).
- **SEASON DEBUT:** Earned the win in first start of year on March 30 at Oakland after working 6.1 scoreless innings, allowing three hits with no walks and five strikeouts...With win this year, is now 5-1 with a 1.60 ERA (39.1 IP – 7 ER) in his six career season debuts.
- **COMMUNITY SPOTLIGHT:** During the offseason, represented Angels at the annual Kids Holiday Party event for the Angels Baseball Foundation at the ESPN Zone in Downtown Disney.
- **2017 RECAP:** Made 16 starts for Angels last year and pitched to a 2-6 record and 4.55 ERA (85 IP – 43 ER) with 76 strikeouts...Missed 85 games on disabled list with a right oblique muscle strain suffered on Apr. 28 at Texas...Allowed three-or-fewer earned runs in seven of 11 contests following return from disabled list.

CAREER NOTES:

- Owns a 16-23 career record with a 4.43 ERA (353.2 IP – 174 ER) and 308 strikeouts in 64 career games (all starts).
- Underwent Tommy John surgery on August 13, 2014 by **Dr. Neal Elattrache** after suffering left forearm strain during start on July 31, 2014 at Baltimore
- Originally drafted by Angels in 1st round (40th overall) of the 2009 amateur draft...Was traded by Angels to D-backs on August 7, 2010 in the deal which brought **Dan Haren** to the Halos...Acquired back by Angels on December 10, 2013 along with LHP **Hector Santiago** in trade which sent OF **Mark Trumbo** and RHP **A.J. Schugel** to Arizona.
