#### PITCHER OF THE MONTH

RHP Luis Castillo (5gs, 3-1, 1.09 in September) is making a bid to become the first Reds pitcher to win a National League Pitcher of the Month Award since LHP Denny Neagle in September 1999 and the first righthander since Jeff Shaw in September 1997...Castillo this month leads the National League in ERA (1.09), with 3 wins is just 1 behind the NL leaders and ranks fifth in the Major Leagues in innings pitched.

<u>TONIGHT'S GAME</u>: Is Game 1 of a 3-game series vs Jimmy Trdinich's Pirates and Game 3 (0-2) of the final homestand of the 2018 championship season that included a 2-0 series sweep loss vs the Royals.

<u>SERIES NOTES</u>: The Reds' active 6-game losing streak vs Pit is their longest vs the Pirates since a 6-game losing streak from 4/17-7/19, 2011... haven't lost more than 6 consecutive games vs Pit since a 9-game losing streak from 5/1-7/19, 1991...the Pirates swept 3-game series from 7/20-7/22 at Great American Ball Park and from 9/3-9/5 at PNC Park...Reds vs Pirates information is on media guide Page 327.

LAST 14 GAMES: Beginning 9/11, Reds batters have been held to 3 runs or fewer in 13 of the last 14 games...from 9/15-9/23 they scored only 10 runs in 9 games, their first streak of 10 runs or fewer over any 9-game stretch since 6/10-6/22, 1945...over the last 14 games beginning 9/11, Reds batters hit .195 (88-452), including .104 with RISP (8-77), with 20 runs scored (1.43 r/g)...Reds pitchers over the last 14 games went 4-10 despite an ERA of 3.44 (120.1ip, 46er)...the Reds have been shut out 14 times this season, their highest total since 2014 (17 SHO) and including 5 times in the last 11 games...on the recent road trip, the Reds were shut out once by the Cubs, twice by the Brewers and twice by the Marlins...were shut out 5 times overall this season by the Brewers, the most in a season by a any team since the 1960 Pirates shut out the Reds 5 times.

APRIL 19: The Reds are 63-78 since 4/19, when they replaced manager Bryan Price and pitching coach Mack Jenkins...bench coach Jim Riggleman became interim manager, Class AAA Louisville manager Pat Kelly (#60) was promoted to serve as interim bench coach, and Class AA Pensacola pitching coach Danny Darwin (#52) joined the Reds' Major League staff as interim pitching coach...Price went 279-387 (.419) in his 5 seasons as manager, including 3-15 this year.

<u>HURLING</u>: Reds have used **32 pitchers**, tying the **2016 franchise record** for pitchers in a season and including <u>4 position players</u> (Cliff Pennington on 4/12 vs StL; Alex Blandino on 7/11 at Cle; Phillip Ervin on 8/8 at NYM; Brandon Dixon on 8/13 vs Cle & 8/31 at StL) and <u>7 rookies</u> (RHP Tyler Mahle, RHP Tanner Rainey, RHP Jackson Stephens, RHP Zack Weiss, RHP Kevin Shackelford, RHP Keury Mella, RHP Jesús Reyes).

<u>ALL-STAR INFIELD</u>: The Reds' infield includes 3 National League All-Stars and collectively leads the Major Leagues in hits (706), batting average (.283) and on-base percentage (.357)...All-Stars 2B Scooter Gennett and 3B Eugenio Suárez are finalists for the Silver Slugger Award at their positions, along with RHP Michael Lorenzen...All-Star 1B Joey Votto is on pace to lead the NL in on-base percentage for the seventh time...SS José Peraza leads all Major League shortstops in hits and leads National League shortstops in hitting.

SLAMMING: The Reds lead the Major Leagues with 11 grand slams, a new single-season franchise record (9 slams, 2002) and 1 shy of the National League record (12 slams, 1997 Braves, 2000 Cardinals)...the Major League record for grand slams in a season is 14 (2000 Athletics, 2006 Indians)...the Reds produced a streak of 6 slams over a 17-game span from 6/13-7/1...the 1996 Expos, 1997 Braves and 2006 Mets are the only other teams in Major League history to produce at least 6 grand slams over a 17-day span...the Reds produced 9 grand slams in the first half, tying the 2010 Yankees for the most ever prior to the All-Star break...the Reds hit 5 in June, a new club record for grand slams in a calendar month...the Reds' 11 grand slams were hit by Adam Duvall (2), Joey Votto (2), Scooter Gennett, Eugenio Suárez, Jesse Winker, pitcher Anthony DeSclafani, pitcher Michael Lorenzen (pinch-hit), José Peraza and Scott Schebler...on 6/23 vs Chi (off Brian Duensing), DeSclafani became only the fourth pitcher in Reds history to hit a grand slam (Bob Purkey 1959, Al Hollingsworth 1936, Ice Box Chamberlain 1892)...Lorenzen on 6/30 off Mil's Jacob Barnes became the first pitcher to produce a pinch-hit slam since Tommy Byrne of the WSox on 5/16/1953 at NYY.

SILVER SLUGGER: RHP Michael Lorenzen is trying to become the first relief pitcher ever to win a Louisville Slugger Silver Slugger Award...he has been named a finalist for the award... prior to his start on 9/18 at Mil, was trying to become the first player in the live ball era to produce at least 4 HR in a season without starting a game...he has 4 HR, including 2 HR as a pitcher and 2 HR as a pinch-hitter (including a pinch-hit grand slam on 6/30 vs Mil off Jacob Barnes)...the franchise record for HR as a pitcher is 4 by converted outfielder Hal Jeffcoat, who hit 4 HR in 1957, all as a pitcher...Tom Parrott hit 4 HR in 1894, including 2 as pitcher, 1 as a left fielder and 1 as a second baseman...as a pinch hitter, Lorenzen is 3-for-12 (2hr, 5rbi) this season and 4-for-19 (3hr, 6rbi) in his career, with home runs on 4/6/17 off Phi's Adam Morgan, 6/24/18 off Chi's Mike Montgomery and 6/30/18 off Mil's Jacob Barnes (grand slam)...7 times in his career, including 6 times this season, entered games as a pinch hitter and remained in the game to pitch...5 times in his career came off the bench to homer, as a reliever or as a pinch hitter...all other active Major League pitchers combine for just 2 such games.

<u>JAPAN ALL-STAR SERIES</u>: 3B Eugenio Suárez has been named to Major League Baseball's roster for the upcoming Japan All-Star Series with Nippon Professional Baseball...the event includes 7 games across Japan from November 8-15...MLB's early roster also includes StL's Yadier Molina, Mil's Christian Yelich, Atl's Ronald Acuña Jr., Phi's Rhys Hoskins & Carlos Santana, KC's Whit Merrifield and LAD's Chris Taylor.

# Tonight's Pitcher - #28 Anthony DeSclafani, RHP

# **RED HOTS**

Anthony DeSclafani's last name is pronounced DEE-sclafani...tonight is making his 21st start of the season...in his last 3 starts is 0-3, 7.04...the 3-game losing streak is 1 shy of his career high (4g, 4/26-5/17, 2015)...threw at least 6.0 innings in all 5 starts in August (3-1, 2.62), 1 start shy of his career high for consecutive 6.0-inning starts (6gs, 6/21-7/20, 2016) and including a season-high 14.0 scoreless innings snapped in the third inning on 8/17 vs SF...from 8/4-8/17 became the first Reds pitcher to throw at least 7.0 innings in 3 straight starts since he did it from 8/21-9/2, 2016, tying his career-best streak...in the 11-2 win on 6/23 vs Cubs hit a grand slam (off Brian Duensing), the first home run of his career and only the fourth grand slam by a Reds pitcher (Bob Purkey on 8/1/59 vs Cubs, Al Hollingsworth on 5/28/1936 at Cubs, Ice Box Chamberlain on 4/30/1892 vs Wsh)...in the 9-6 loss on 6/5 vs Col made his first appearance for the Reds since a 2-1 win on 9/28/16 at StL...between his September 2016 and June 2018 apps, 17 pitchers made starts for the Reds...began the 2018 season on the 60-day disabled list while recovering from a left oblique strain suffered in his third spring training appearance...before he was reinstated the day of his 6/5 start vs Col, from 5/14-5/30 made 4 rehabilitation starts for Class AA Pensacola and Class AAA Louisville (0-3, 4.66)...spent the entire 2017 season on the disabled list with a sprained ulnar collateral ligament in his right elbow.
