TUIVAILALA PLACED ON 10-DAY D.L.; MAYERS RECALLED: The Cardinals placed right-handed relief pitcher Sam Tuivailala on the 10-day disabled list (retroactive to April 10) with a left knee strain. RHP Mike Mayers (MY-ers) was recalled from Memphis (AAA). Mayers has appeared in two games for the Cardinals this season and was optioned on April 9 before his recall today.

RUNNING CIRCLES: The Cardinals scored 53 runs over 10 games at Great American Ballpark in 2017, their most at any opposing stadium and trailed the Chicago Cubs (56) for most by any Reds opponent. The two clubs averaged 9.9 runs and 2.4 home run per game during the 19-game series last season.

SEEING RED: Tonight's starting pitcher Michael Wacha is a career 8-1 vs. the Reds and the Cardinals have won his last 10 starts (pitched 2.1 IP in relief 9/26/16) against Cincinnati dating back to Sept. 20, 2014. Wacha has held the Reds to four runs or less in each of those 10 starts and two or less in eight.

RUNNING RETALIATION: Tommy Pham stole six bases vs. the Cincinnati Reds last season, the most by any opposing player. It comes a year after the Reds' Billy Hamilton pulled off 15 successful thefts against the Cardinals in 2016. Pham's six career steals against the Reds are his most against any MLB opponent.

THE O-ZONE: Outfielder **Marcell Ozuna** began the season 0-for-8, but has hit safely in his next 10 games and is currently T3rd in the National League with 16 hits. His active 10-game hit streak co-leads the N.L. with **Asdrubal Cabrera**. Ozuna's career-long hitting streak is 16 games (4/30-5/16/16).

HEATING THINGS UP: Rookie relief pitcher **Jordan Hicks** has been lighting up the speed gun according to MLB Statcast. The 21-year old flamethrower currently has the eight fastest pitches in MLB this season topping out at **101.6 MPH** (two-seam fastball) and has the highest average speed for a two-seam fastball (98.9 MPH) and sinker (98.9 MPH).

STRANDED! **Jordan Hicks** stranded both of his inherited runners Tuesday to give St. Louis a MLB-leading 30 total inherited runners, with an 80% (24/30) strand rate...**Bud Norris** stranded the bases loaded in the 10th inning Mon night, marking the second time in a week the newly acquired pitcher has done so, both against the Brewers. Norris currently ranks 2nd in MLB in inherited runners with nine, trailing only former Cardinal, **Sam Freeman** (ATL, 10).

EXIT STAGE LEFT: According to MLB Statcast leaders, **Marcell Ozuna (95.9 MPH)** and **Tommy Pham (95.6 MPH)** rank 3rd and 4th respectively in MLB in Average Exit Speed Velocity trailing only **Jose Abreu (96.9 MPH)** and **Giancarlo Stanton (96.9 MPH)**.

SWING AWAY: **Marcell Ozuna** is one of four MLB players to appear in 12 or more games this season and yet to draw a walk (52 plate app.). Joining Ozuna is **Ozzie Albies** (56 PA), **Jonathan Villar** (42) and **Cory Spangenberg** (31).

CINCINNATI CONNECTIONS

Cardinals Manager **Mike Matheny** (1988) graduated from nearby Reynoldsburg (Ohio) High School...his daughter, Katie, played women's ice hockey at The Ohio State University.

Cardinals outfielder **Marcell Ozuna** and Reds pitcher **Austin Brice** were Marlins teammates in 2016.

Cardinals infielder **Jedd Gyorko** and Reds pitcher **Kevin Quackenbush** were Padres teammates for two seasons (2014-15).

Cardinals pitcher **Michael Wacha's** uncle, **Dusty Rogers**, was a Reds first round draft pick in 1984...played in the Reds minor league organization for five seasons (1984-88)

Reds Executive Advisor to the CEO **Walt Jocketty** served as the Cardinals General Manager for 13 seasons (1995-2007)...during tenure, the Cardinals compiled seven NL Central Division championships (1996, 2000-02, '04-06), two NL Championships ('04, '06), and one World Series Championship ('06)...the Cardinals recorded seven straight winning seasons under Jocketty, including a pair of 100+ win seasons ('04-05)...named MLB Executive of the Year (2000, '04, '10).

Reds Player Performance Special Assistant **Eric Davis** played two seasons (1999-2000) for St. Louis.

Reds bench coach **Jim Riggleman** spent 18 seasons (1976-90, 2005-07) in the Cardinals system as a minor league player (1976-81), minor league coach (AA-Arkansas, 1981), minor league manager (High-A-St. Petersburg, '82-84 & AA-Arkansas, '85-88), Director of Player Development ('88-89), St. Louis First Base Coach (1989-90) and minor league fielding coordinator (2005-07).

Reds professional scout **Bruce Manno** (2002-07) previously worked in the Cardinals front office for six seasons (2002-07)...served as Director of Player Development (2002-06) and Senior Director of Pro Scouting & Special Assistant to the General Manager (2007) before joining Atlanta.

Reds assistant pitching/bullpen coach **Ted Power** pitched in 23 games for St. Louis in 1989.

Reds catching coach **Mike Stefanski** played parts for six seasons in the Cardinals minors (1996-2001)...originally acquired by St. Louis from Milwaukee in exchange for catcher **Marc Ronan** (November 19, 1995).

Reds Special Assistant to the General Manager, Player Personnel **Cam Bonifay** worked for the Cardinals as a special assistant, evaluating the American League East from October of 2007-08.

Reds broadcaster **Jeff Brantley** pitched in 48 games for St. Louis (1998).

Reds Special Assistant to the GM **Marty Maier** spent 24 seasons with St. Louis as an area scout, Latin American coordinator, asst. director of scouting, scouting director and special asst. to the GM.

Reds Special Assistant to the General Manager **John Morris** played five seasons for St. Louis (1986-90).

Cardinals broadcaster and Hall of Famer **Jim Edmonds** played 13 games for the Reds during his final professional season (2010).

Reds broadcaster **George Grande** was a Cardinals play-by-play announcer for two seasons (1991-92).

Cardinals Principal Owner and Chief Executive Office **William DeWitt Jr.** was a prior owner of the Reds, and a shareholder of the Cincinnati Bengals...his father, **William O. DeWitt**, was a sole owner of the Reds from 1961-67.

Reds President and Chief Executive Office **Robert Castellini**, Chairman **W. Joseph Williams Jr.** and Vice Chairman **Thomas Williams** were investors in the Cardinals from 1995-2006...their interests were sold as a condition of their acquisition of a controlling ownership stake of the Reds.

Reds Media Relations Intern **Ben Barnette** was a 2015 Cardinals Spring Training Intern and 2016 Memphis Redbirds (AAA) Media Relations Intern.

- Makes his third start of the season and the 115th of his career (124th appearance).
- Is a lifetime 11-4 with a 2.67 ERA (121.1 IP) and 112 strikeouts in 20 career April starts...since 2014, ranks 3rd among NL pitchers in win pct (.733), T3rd in wins and 6th in ERA.
- Is nine strikeouts away from reaching 600 for his career.

LAST TIME OUT

- Earned his first win of the season in a 5-3 victory over the Diamondbacks on Saturday at Busch Stadium.
- His five walks tied a single-game career-high for the third time.
- Gametime temperature was 37° (29° wind chill) at first pitch; was the lowest recorded first pitch temperature at Busch Stadium III and in St. Louis recorded history (*Baseball-Reference*).

- Opposing left-handed hitters are 2-for-19 (.105), while right-handers are 7-for-17 (.412) with 2 2B and 2 HR.
- Three of six total runs this season have come in the first inning...last season, recorded career-best 1.20 ERA (30.0 IP/4 ER) and .200 opponent average against (22-110) in the first innings of starts (T1st among qualified NL starting pitchers with Colorado's Tyler Anderson).

CAREER

- Of his 114 career starts, 70 have been at least 6.0 innings (64 quality).
- His .597 winning percentage (46-31) over the past six seasons (2013-2018) ranks 11th among National League pitchers.
- Is a lifetime 25-12 with a 3.61 ERA in 58 starts (34 quality starts) at Busch Stadium...his .676 home win pct. ranks 8th in the NL since 2013.
- Earned 2015 Major League All-Star selection (Manager's selection) for the NL.

2017

- Matched single-season career-high (2015) with 30 starts (165.2 IP) while reaching double-digit wins (12) for the second time in his career. Also established a career best 158 strikeouts, 2nd-most on the club.
- Was one of six N.L. pitchers to record at least two scoreless starts of at least 8.0 innings: 9/10 vs. PIT (8.0 IP) & 7/18 at NYM (9.0 IP). Carlos Martinez led with three.
- Had more success at home, ranking T7th among National League pitchers in wins (8) and 14th in ERA (3.41).
- Pitched at least 6.0 frames in 18 outings with 15 quality starts (STL was 12-6): 11-3, 2.61 ERA (113.2 IP) 102 strikeouts.
- Allowed only 17 homers, ranking 3rd-fewest among National League pitchers with 0.92 HR/9 IP.
- His career-high 48.6 ground ball percentage ranked 9th among National League pitchers. Induced 18 ground ball double plays and ranked 7th in the N.L. in GDP/9.0 (0.98).
