HERE'S THE STORY...

- ♦ The D-backs' 24-12 record is the club's second-best 36-game start all-time, behind 26-10 in 2000...their best 37-game starts are 26-11 in 2000 and 23-14 in 2008.
- ♦ The D-backs have the NL's best record (.667) and Majors' third best behind the Yankees (26-10, .722) and Red Sox (25-11; .694).
- ♦ Arizona won 2 of 3 games @ Nationals Park from April 27-29.
- ♦ **A.J. Pollock** is hitting .315 with 2 doubles, 3 triples, 2 homers, 9 RBI and 3 walks in his last 14 games vs. Nationals.
- ♦ **Zack Greinke** is 5-1 with a 1.49 ERA (7 ER in 42.1 IP), 40 strikeouts and 7 walks in 7 career starts vs. Nationals/Expos.
- ♦ **Daniel Descalso**, in his last 9 games, is hitting .429 (9-for-21)/1.413 OPS with 4 doubles, 1 triple, 1 homer, 5 RBI, 4 walks and 2 hit-by-pitches.
- ♦ **Archie Bradley** has 10 consecutive scoreless outings (10.1 IP).
- ♦ Of the D-backs 273 hits, 115 have been for extra bases...their 42 percent of extra base hits-to-hits leads the NL, ahead of Cubs (38 pct.), Braves (37) and Rockies (37).

YESTERDAY'S RECAP

- ♦ The D-backs saw their 3-game winning streak snapped after losing to the Dodgers, 6-3.
- ♦ **Nick Ahmed** was 1-for-4 with an inside-the-park home run in the first inning, the 15th in D-backs history.
- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt** went 1-for-4 with a RBI...**Ketel Marte** was 2-for-4.
- ♦ **Patrick Corbin** struck out 7 in 5.0 innings (1 ER)...**Fernando Salas** (3-3) took the loss after allowing 3 runs in 0.2 innings...**Silvino Bracho** tossed 1.1 hitless innings.

- ♦ Today D-backs pitching coach **Mike Butcher** is celebrating his 53rd birthday...he shares a birthday with the likes of Bono (58), Missy Franklin (23) and Fred Astaire (119).

- ♦ Today, the D-backs will celebrate the 2001 World Series Championship team and wear the 2001 Home Alternate Vest uniform...the ceremonial first pitch will be thrown by Luis Gonzalez, Mark Grace, Armando Reynoso and Junior Spivey, who will also sign autographs in the 20th Anniversary Experience during the second inning.

SET THIS PARTY OFF RIGHT

- ♦ Arizona has opened the season with 10 series victories and 2 ties, the third-longest streak of not losing a series by a Major League team at any point of the season since 2017 [source: STATS LLC]:

- ♦ The D-backs were the first NL club to win their first 9 series of a season since the 1907 Cubs' won a Major League-record 11 straight, and the first in the Majors since the 2001 Mariners (won 9) and the 1978 Tigers (won 9)[Source: Elias Sports Bureau].

FUN FACT: GREINKE EDITION

- ♦ **Zack Greinke** is 5-1 with a 1.49 ERA (7 ER in 42.1 IP), 40 strikeouts, 7 walks and .218 opponent average in 7 career starts vs. Nationals/Expos...he has a 16.0-inning scoreless streak vs. Nationals since the second inning on May 5, 2014.
- ♦ His ERA vs. Nationals/Expos is the best among active players [min. 40.0 IP] and is the second best all-time among players with 5+ starts and 40.0+ innings pitched, trailing only Jose Fernandez (0.99 ERA; 7 ER in 63.2 IP).
- ♦ He won his Major League debut vs. Montreal on June 8, 2004 (0 ER in 7.0 IP)...he is 1 of 2 active Major League pitchers with a win against the Expos (also: Bartolo Colon June 22, 2002).

REALLY GOOD @ HOME

- ♦ Arizona's starters, who are 10-2 @ Chase Field, won their first 9 decisions at home to become the first NL team to do so since the 1923 Pirates [source: STATS LLC].
- ♦ D-backs starters have posted a 2.84 ERA (36 ER in 114.0 IP) with a .209 opponent average in 19 starts @ Chase Field this season, including allowing 2 or fewer runs in 14 of their last 15 games at home.

AN INSIDE JOB

- ♦ **Nick Ahmed** recorded his first career inside-the-park home run and the 15th in team history in the first inning yesterday @ Dogders (off Alex Wood).
- ♦ Per MLB.com's Stat Cast, Ahmed rounded the bases in 15.43 seconds, the fastest home-to-home time in the Majors this season, and the fourth fastest in by a D-backs player in the Stat Cast Era (since 2015), trailing Ketel Marte's inside-the-park homer on July 26, 2017 (14.86), Chris Owings' triple on Sept. 9, 2016 (15.08) and Jean Segura's inside-the-park home run on April 7, 2016 (15.36).
- ♦ Ahmed was the first player to hit an inside-the-park home run vs. a Dodgers left-handed pitcher since Tony Gwynn on June 26, 1997 (off Mark Guthrie)...yesterday would have been Gwynn's 58th birthday.

THE NAME IS DESCALSO...DANIEL DESCALSO

- ♦ **Daniel Descalso's** 6 go-ahead RBI are second on the team behind A.J. Pollock (12) and are tied for ninth in the NL.
- ♦ In his last 16 games, is hitting .385 (15-for-39)/1.224 OPS with 6 doubles, 1 triple, 2 homers, 12 RBI, 8 walks and 2-hit-by-pitches.
 - Among NL players since April 21 (min. 30 PA), he ranks third with a 1.224 OPS, fifth with a .730 slugging pct and .480 on-base pct. and sixth with a .385 average.

EL POLLO LOCO

- ♦ **A.J. Pollock** is batting .347 (26-for-75)/1.144 OPS with 2 doubles, 2 triples, 8 homers, 20 RBI, 7 walks and 4 stolen bases in his last 19 games since April 18.
- ♦ Ranks among the NL leaders this season in OPS (1st, 1.034), SLG (1st, .669), total bases (1st, 89), go-ahead RBI (1st, 12), game-winning RBI (T-4th, 4), extra-base hits (2nd, 23), RBI (2nd, 32), homers (T-2nd, 11), stolen bases (T-5th, 8), average (8th, .308).

- ♦ The D-backs are 18-1 (.947) when scoring 4+ runs, the best mark in the Majors ahead of the Angels (18-2, .900), Yankees (24-3, .889), Giants (17-3, .850), Mets (15-3, .833)...the D-backs have won 13 straight games when scoring 4+ runs, 21 of 22 games (since Sept. 26, 2017), 25 of 27 (since Sept. 13, 2017) and 35 of 40 (since Aug. 22, 2017).

DOWN ON THE FARM

- ♦ The D-backs named Double-A Jackson INF **Galli Cribbs** and Single-A Advanced Visalia RHP **Bo Takahashi** the organization's Minor League Player- and Pitcher-of-the-Month for April.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP MATT KOCH (2-0, 2.13)

- ♦ Earned the win in his last outing on May 6 vs. Astros, throwing 6.1 innings of 1-run baseball.
- ♦ He will face off against Max Scherzer tomorrow, his third consecutive start vs. a former Cy Young Award winner (May 1 vs. Clayton Kershaw; May 6 vs. Justin Verlander)...he will be the first pitcher in team history to face 3 different Cy Young Award winners in 3 consecutive starts [source: STATS LLC].

GREINKE AT A GLANCE

- ◆ Third season with the D-backs...signed a 6-year free agent contract on Dec. 11, 2015.
- ◆ Won the 2009 AL Cy Young Award and finished runner-up in 2015 race to the Cubs' Jake Arrieta.
- ◆ Is a 4-time All-Star (2009, '14-15, '17), won 3 NL Rawlings® Gold Gloves (2014-16) and earned a Louisville Slugger® Silver Slugger™ in 2013.
- ◆ 1 of 3 pitchers all-time with a Cy Young, Silver Slugger and Gold Glove (also: Fernando Valenzuela and Orel Hershiser).
- ◆ Won 2 ERA titles: 2009 (2.16) & 2015 (1.66)...1.66 ERA was the lowest in the Majors since Atlanta's Greg Maddux (1.63) in 1995...6 career 200+ strikeout seasons (2009, '11-12, '14-15, '17).

DID YOU KNOW?

- ◆ Gave his 2009 AL Cy Young Award to his parents but kept the samurai sword Mizuno presented him in recognition of his season.
- ◆ Was a tennis prodigy at 8 years old.
- ◆ Began his career at Rookie level as a shortstop and pitcher...after just 1 workout, he gave his infielder glove to Andres Blanco because he decided to become a pitcher.
- ◆ During his 2004 rookie season with the Royals, lived with Hall of Famer George Brett.

LAST START

- ◆ Tossed 5.2 innings with 1 run allowed vs. Astros on May 5 but did not figure in the walk-off, 4-3 win.

VS. NATIONALS

- ◆ Has a 16.0-inning scoreless streak vs. Nationals since the second inning on May 5, 2014.
- ◆ His ERA vs. Nationals/Expos is the best among active players [min. 40.0 IP] and second best all-time among players with 5+ starts and 40.0+ innings pitched, trailing only Jose Fernandez (0.99 ERA; 7 ER in 63.2 IP).
- ◆ Has held the Nationals scoreless in his last 2 starts with 6.0 scoreless innings (6 H, 1 BB, 6 K) on August 11, 2015 (in LA) and 8.0 shutout frames (3 H, 1 BB, 11 K) on July 19, 2015 (in DC).
- ◆ Won his Major League debut on June 8, 2004 vs. Expos with 7.0 shutout innings (3 H, 5 K)...1 of 2 active pitchers with a win against the Expos (also: Bartolo Colon on June 22, 2002).
- ◆ In 7 career starts vs. Expos (1 GS)/Nationals (6 GS), is 5-1 with a 1.49 ERA (7 ER in 42.1 IP), .218 opponent average (34-for-156), 7 walks and 40 strikeouts.

PLAYER PROFILE

- ◆ Is an avid fantasy football player.
- ◆ 2002 Gatorade National Baseball Player of the Year...played shortstop at Apopka (Fla.) High School before transitioning to starting pitcher his senior season.
- ◆ Committed to Clemson University before signing with the Royals.
- ◆ Donates 1% of his annual salary to the Arizona Diamondbacks Foundation.

VS. NL EAST

- ◆ In 45 career starts vs. NL East, his team is 34-11, while he is 26-5 with a 2.91 ERA, .226 opponent average and 262 strikeouts...his .839 winning pct. is the best all-time vs. NL East (min. 40 GS).

FREE PASSES AT A MINIMUM

- ◆ His 7 walks are tied for sixth fewest by a NL starter (min. 3 GS) [leaders are Miles Mikolas/STL (2) and Andrew Suarez/SF (2)].
- ◆ Since 2017, his 51 walks are tied for fourth fewest by a starter (min. 35 GS), with Jeremy Hellickson and Masahiro Tanaka, behind Ivan Nova (44), Jeff Samardzija (45) and Corey Kluber (46).
- ◆ Since joining the D-backs in 2016, when he issues 2 walks or less, he is 31-9 with a 3.54 ERA, .239 opponent average, 54 walks and 341 strikeouts.

MORE STRIKEOUTS + LESS WALKS = GOOD PLAN

- ◆ Has 47 strikeouts and 6 walks, the Major's second-best strikeout-to-walk ratio (7.83; 47 SO:6 BB), behind Miles Mikolas/STL (15.50, 31:2).

MAY NUMBERS

- ◆ In 11 May starts as a D-back, is 8-2 with a 3.39 (28 ER in 74.1 IP), a .210 opponent average (57-for-271), 14 walks and 77 strikeouts.

CLIMBING THE K CHARTS

- ◆ His 2,283 career strikeouts are seventh among active pitchers behind C.C. Sabathia (2,869), Justin Verlander (2,486), Bartolo Colon (2,483), Felix Hernandez (2,380), John Lackey (2,294).
