LEADING OFF: HAPPY BIRTHDAY TO ANDREW HEANEY!... Tonight the Halos play the fifth contest (3-1) of six-game home stand vs. **Texas** (June 1-3; 2-1) and **Kansas City** (June 4-6; 1-0)...Halos have won three of last four games since dropping four of previous five...Angels went 14-15 in May and are 20-25 since a club-record 13-3 start...**Angels are 10-7-2 in 19 series...** Following home stand, LAA heads out to **Minnesota** (June 8-10), **Seattle** (June 11-13) and **Oakland** (June 15-17).

ROYAL PAIN: **Mike Trout, Justin Upton** and **Albert Pujols** (Angels' 2-4 hitters) have each hit safely in all four games this season vs. Royals...

Trout: 8/17, 2 HR, 5 RBI, 6 Runs

Upton: 9/19, HR, 3 RBI, 3 Runs

Pujols: 7/18, HR, 5 RBI, Run

Combined: 24/52 (.444 AVG), 4 HR, 13 RBI, 10 Runs (STATS)

ABOUT LAST NIGHT: Nine runs scored marked most at home since May 3rd vs. Baltimore (12 runs)...**Justin Upton** homered for a second straight game (33rd time in career with HR in consecutive games)...**Jefry Marte** matched a career best with four hits (also May 31, 2016 vs. Detroit)...His 22 hits on the season match total from 2017...**Albert Pujols** recorded his 3,024th and 3,025th career hits, passing **Lou Brock** for 27th all-time (**Rod Carew** is 26th with 3,053)...His 1,950 career RBI are one shy **Stan Musial** for 7th all-time (*Baseball Reference*).

YOUNG BLOODS: Yesterday the Angels selected outfielder **Jordyn Adams** (1st round, 17th overall) out of Green Hope HS (Cary, NC) and INF **Jeremiah Jackson** (2nd round, 57th overall) from St. Luke's Episcopal School (Mobile, AL) on the first day of the 2018 First-Year Player Draft...LAA chose high school players with both of their first two picks in a draft for the first time since 2010 when **Kaleb Cowart** (18th overall) and **Cam Bedrosian** (29th overall) were selected.

JUNE BUG: **Mike Trout's** .354 (183-for-517) career batting average in the month of June is the highest average amongst active players (min. 400 PA) in any month of the season...Is hitting .500 (8-for-16) so far this June.

FROM THE START: Halo starters have held opponents to three runs-or-less in 28 of last 33 games...**LAA starting pitchers have pitched to an A.L. best 2.74 ERA (190.2 IP – 58 ER) since May 1**...Angels' team ERA of 2.86 ERA for May was best month since September 2010 (2.72), and best May since 1989 (2.66).

ALL-STAR SIMMONS? **Andrelton Simmons** has hits in 11 of 12 and 31 of his last 36 games hitting .350 (48-for-137) with 13 XBH and 25 RBI in the span...**He has struck out just twice since May 1 (138 PA)**...Has reached base safely in 38 of last 40 games...**Leads MLB in PA per SO with 24.1 (241 PA/10 K) and ranks 4th in A.L. batting .330**...Leads LAA with 19 multi-hit games.

YOU READ THAT RIGHT: **Mike Trout** is on pace for a 14.5 WAR season – would be the best ever by a position player...He is tied for MLB lead with 19 HRs...**On pace for a career-best 50 homers**...Also leads MLB lead with 146 total bases.

SHO-KKKKK: **Shohei Ohtani** has 57 strikeouts this season, an Angels' record through a pitcher's first seven career starts...57 Ks are already a club record through nine starts as well.

MIKE'S MILESTONE: **Mike Scioscia** posted career win #1,600 on May 29th to pass his former manager of 13 seasons **Tommy Lasorda** (1,599) for sole possession of 20th all-time.

THIS DATE IN ANGELS HISTORY

June 5

(1964) **Lou Clinton** became the third Angels player in history to collect a HR in his first game with the club.

June 6

(1964) **Dean Chance** pitched a club-record 14 innings (no decision) allowing just three hits (one through nine innings) while striking out 12 Yankees...Angels lost the game, 2-0 in 15 innings...Chance went on to capture the Cy Young award that season, going 20-9 with 15 complete games, 11 shutouts and a 1.65 ERA; (1961) **Lee Thomas** hit the first grand slam in club history off Milt Pappas at Baltimore leading the Angels to a 7-3 victory; (2000) The Rally Monkey is born as a video clip is displayed on the Jumbotron featuring the monkey in the bottom of the 9th as the Angels trail the San Francisco Giants 5-4...The Halos rally for two runs to win.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER – LHP ANDREW HEANEY

2-4, 3.66 ERA

Is pitching to a 1.08 ERA (25 IP – 3 ER) across last four starts at Angel Stadium

- **CELEBRATING 27th BIRTHDAY TODAY**...First career appearance pitching on his birthday.
- **BACK ON THE MOUND**: Making 10th start of the season and sixth at home...Opened the year on the disabled list with left elbow inflammation (missed Angels first 14 games).
- **RECENT QUALITY**: Has been charged with two-or-fewer earned runs in six of last seven starts, while pitching to a 2.34 ERA (42.1 IP – 11 ER) in that span...Had streak of five consecutive quality starts snapped in last start on Thursday at Detroit.
- **FIRST PITCH SWINGING**: Opponents have swung at the first pitch 35.6% of the time vs. Heaney, which is the third highest rate in the Majors (min. 50 IP).
- **INSIDE THE PARK**: Has allowed just four home runs this season (three came on April 20 vs. SF)...Rate of 0.70 HR/9 innings ranks fifth among left-handers (min. 50 IP) in the Majors (second in A.L.)...Seven starts of 5+ innings and zero HR allowed this season are second most in A.L. among lefties.
- **LAST TIME OUT**: Charged with loss in last start on Thursday at Detroit after tossing five innings and allowing five earned runs on eight hits with one walk and three strikeouts.
- **HOT AT HOME**: In last four starts at Angel Stadium, is 2-1 with a 1.08 ERA (25 IP – 3 ER) and 28 strikeouts.
- **VS. KANSAS CITY**: Tonight marks second career start vs. Royals; Is 0-0 with a 5.40 ERA (5 IP – 3 ER)...Did not factor in decision in first start of year vs. Royals on April 13 at Kauffman Stadium (season debut) after working five innings and allowing four runs (three earned) on seven hits with one walk and seven strikeouts.
- **AT ANGEL STADIUM**: In 18 career starts at Angel Stadium, is 6-5 with a 3.92 ERA (103.1 IP – 45 ER)...This season, is 2-2 with a 3.92 ERA (29.1 IP – 10 ER)...Has allowed two-or-fewer runs in 11 of the 18 starts...Angels won each of his first six starts at The Big A, but have lost eight of last 12.
- **CAREER HIGHS**: Set career highs on May 14 eight innings pitched and 10 strikeouts.
- **9 K's IN 5 IP**: On April 27 vs. New York (A.L.), became first Angels pitcher with 9+ strikeouts in five-or-fewer innings since Hector Santiago on July 20, 2015 (Game 1) vs. Boston.
- **STARTING NINE**: With first start of year on April 13, became ninth different starting pitcher used by Angels this season...Nine different starting pitchers through the first 15 games of a season set a new Angels record and were the most by any team since the 1960 Orioles. (STATS LLC)
- **REHAB ASSIGNMENT**: Made one start for Adv.-A Inland Empire on April 6 vs. San Jose and earned the win after working 6.1 innings and allowing one earned run on two hits with one walk and six strikeouts.
- **2017 RECAP**: Missed majority of season on disabled list recovering from Tommy John surgery (July 1, 2016)...Following six rehab starts, made return to Angels on Aug. 18 at Baltimore...Made five total starts for Angels, going 1-2 with a 7.06 ERA (21.2 IP – 17 ER).
- **OFFSEASON TRIPS**: Participates in offseason humanitarian mission trip to Honduras each offseason along with several other Major League and Minor League players to help build a new learning center, distribute new backpacks and shoes and teach kids the basics of baseball.
- **CAREER NOTES**: Originally selected by Miami in first round (ninth overall) of 2012 First-Year Player Draft...On Dec. 10, 2014, was traded twice in one day; Was first sent by Miami to Dodgers along with C/INF Austin Barnes, RHP Chris Hatcher and OF Enrique Hernandez in exchange for INF Dee Gordon, RHP Dan Haren, INF Miguel Rojas and cash considerations...Later that day was dealt by Dodgers to Angels for INF Howie Kendrick.
