BEATING THE BEST

The Reds finished their recent homestand with a **3-1 series win** vs the first-place **Phillies**...in their last 5 series **vs first-place teams**, beginning **6/21**, the Reds went **4-0 vs Cubs**, **2-1 at Atl**, **2-2 vs Mil**, **2-1 vs Cle** and **3-1 vs Phi** (13-5, .722).

All-Star **3B Eugenio Suárez** is on a 162-game pace to become the first Reds batter to hit **.300** with at least **37 HR** and **123 RBI** since **George Foster** in **1977** (.320, 52hr, 149rbi)...only 4 batters in Reds history reached those marks (**Foster**, **Frank Robinson** twice, **Tony Perez**, **Ted Kluszewski**)...**Suárez** is chasing the leaders in the National League's **Triple Crown** statistical categories:

REACHING BASE

The Reds have 2 of the top 9 leaders in the National League in **on-base percentage** in **Joey Votto** (1st, .425) and **Eugenio Suárez** (9th, .382)...injured Reds rookie **Jesse Winker** (.405) ranked second in the NL through Tue but as of Wed's game no longer has enough plate apps to qualify among the leaders.

Scouter Gennett is 1 of only 5 players since **1968** to produced at least **40 HR** and **150 RBI** in his **first 2 seasons** with the **Redlegs**...he is the only player to do it while **hitting at least .300** (.304, 261-859).

TODAY'S GAMES: Are **Games 2 & 3** (0-1) of a 4-game series vs **Diana Headlee's Nationals** and **Games 4 & 5** (0-3) of an 9-game road trip that included a **2-game series sweep loss** at Det's **Comerica Park** and features an upcoming series at NYM's **Citi Field** (3g)...following this trip the Redlegs return to **Great American Ball Park** for a 9-game homestand vs the **Diamondbacks** (3g), **Indians** (3g) and **Giants** (3g).

26th PLAYER: RHP **Austin Brice** (#40) will be serve as the **26th player** on the Reds' roster for tonight's scheduled game.

DOUBLE DIPPING: In their **14 day/night doubleheaders** since **1997** the Reds went **2-6** with **6 splits**...the Reds **last played** at **day/night DH** earlier this season, on **5/19 vs Cubs** (5-4 Reds win in 11 innings, 10-0 Cubs win)...the Reds **last swept** a **day/night doubleheader** on **7/8/14 vs Cubs** (4-2, 6-5 wins)...the Reds **last were swept** in a **day/night doubleheader** on **9/17/16 vs Pit** (10-4, 7-3 losses).

SERIES NOTES: Dating back to a **6-2 win** here on **6/25** of last season, the Reds have lost their **last 8 games vs Wsh**...went **1-2 at Nationals Park** last year, losing the first 2 games while winning that series finale on **6/25**...Cin hasn't won a **season series vs Wsh** since **2015** (5-1)...in 3 seasons since then, including the Nats' 3-game series sweep at **Great American Ball Park** to open this season and Thu's 10-4 loss, the Reds are **4-14 vs Wsh**...**Reds vs Nationals** information is on media guide **Page 331**.

RETURNING ALL-STARS: The American League won the **All-Star Game** held here at **Nationals Park**, 8-6 in 10 innings...**1B Joey Votto** (1-3, solo HR in 10th inning off Tor's **J.A. Happ**) was an **All-Star** for the sixth time...**2B**

Scouter Gennett (pinch-hit, 2-run HR in 9th inning off Sea's **Edwin Díaz**) and **3B Eugenio Suárez** (0-1, HBP by Hou's **Charlie Morton**) were first-time **All-Stars**...**Gennett's** dramatic 2-run HR in the bottom of the ninth inning tied the game at 5-5, the third game-tying HR in the ninth inning or later in **ASG history** (**Ralph Kiner** 1960, **Fred McGriff** 1994)...**Gennett** became the **21st player** and **second Red** (**Gus Bell**, 1954) to produce a **pinch-hit HR** in **All-Star Game**...his homer was the **seventh** of the game, establishing a new **All-Star Game record**...he donated the baseball to the **Hall of Fame** in **Cooperstown**...**Votto** is 1 of 7 players and only the **second Red** (**Tony Perez**, 1967, 15th inning) to produce a home run in extra innings in the **ASG**...he is the only player **born in Canada** to homer in the **ASG**.

APRIL 19: The Reds are **45-46** since **4/19**, when they replaced manager **Bryan Price** and pitching coach **Mack Jenkins**...bench coach **Jim Riggleman** became interim manager, Class AAA Louisville manager **Pat Kelly** (#60) was promoted to serve as interim bench coach, and Class AA Pensacola pitching coach **Danny Darwin** (#52) joined the Reds' Major League staff as interim pitching coach...**Price** went **279-387 (.419)** in his 5 seasons as manager, including **3-15 this year**.

METS UP NEXT: Beginning **9/24/13** the Reds have lost **24** of the **last 31 games** vs the **Mets** (**0-2** in 2013, **2-4** in 2014, **0-7** in 2015, **0-6** in 2016, **3-4** in 2017, **2-1** in 2018)...Cin has lost **11** of the **last 13 games** at **Citi Field** and each of the **last 4 series** there (**1-3** in September 2017, **0-3** in April 2016, **0-3** in June 2015, **1-2** in April 2014)...**Reds vs Mets** information is on media guide **Page 325**.

QUERIES ABOUT SERIES: Beginning **6/19** the Reds went **8-3-1** in their **last 12 completed series** (22-15, .595, 2-0 vs Det, 4-0 vs Chc, 2-1 at Atl, 2-2 vs Mil, 2-1 vs CWS, 1-2 at Chc, 2-1 at Cle, 2-1 at StL, 0-3 vs Pit, 2-1 vs StL, 3-1 vs Phi, 0-2 at Det)...the Reds' **2-1 series loss** at **Cubs** completed on **7/8** snapped their **5-series unbeaten streak**, their longest since a **6-series winning streak** from **7/15-8/4, 2016**...the Redlegs had the best record in the NL Central Division in **June** (15-11, .577).

ALL-STAR INFIELD: The Reds' **infield** includes **3 National League All-Stars** and collectively leads the Major Leagues in **hits** (487), **batting average** (.284) and **on-base percentage** (.365)...**All-Star 1B Joey Votto** leads the National League in **on-base percentage** and ranks second in **walks**...**All-Star 2B Scouter Gennett** ranks among the leaders in **hitting** (5th), **RBI** (T9th), **multi-hit games** (36, T4th), **hits** (3rd) and **total bases** (12th)...**All-Star 3B Eugenio Suárez** ranks among the NL leaders in **RBI** (2nd), **hitting** (9th), **HR** (5th), **total bases** (T10th), **on-base percentage** (9th), **slugging percentage** (3rd), **fewest AB per RBI** (4.2, 2nd) and **fewest AB per HR** (13.9, 2nd)...**SS José Peraza** leads the National League in **most at bats per strikeout** (9.4) while ranking among the leaders in **hits** (T9th) and **stolen bases** (8th).

SLAMMING: The Reds and Red Sox are tied for the Major League lead with **9 grand slams**, tying Cin's **2002 franchise single-season record** and including a streak of **6 slams** over a **17-game span** from **6/13-7/1**...the **1996 Expos**, **1997 Braves** and **2006 Mets** are the only other teams in **Major League history** to produce at least **6 grand slams** over a **17-day span**...the **9 grand slams** tie the **2010 Yankees** for most ever prior to the **All-Star** break...the National League record for grand slams in a season is **12** (1997 Braves, 2000 Cardinals), while the Major League record is **14** (2000 Athletics, 2006 Indians)...the Reds hit 5 in **June**, a new club record for **grand slams** in a calendar month...the Reds' **9 grand slams** were hit by **Adam Duvall** (2), **Scouter Gennett**, **Eugenio Suárez**, **Joey Votto**, **Jesse Winker**, pitcher **Anthony DeSclafani**, **Michael Lorenzen** (pinch-hit) and **José Peraza**...on **6/23 vs Chi** (off **Brian Duensing**), **DeSclafani** became only the fourth pitcher in Reds history to hit a **grand slam** (**Bob Purkey** 1959, **Al Hollingsworth** 1936, **Ice Box Chamberlain** 1892)...**Lorenzen** on 6/30 off Mil's **Jacob Barnes** became the first pitcher to produce a pinch-hit slam since **Tommy Byrne** of the **WSox** on **5/16/1953** at **NYY**.

IN A PINCH: As a pinch hitter, **RHP Michael Lorenzen** is **3-for-8** (2hr, 5rbi) this season and **4-for-15** (3hr, 6rbi, 1bb, 4k, 1sh) in his career, with **home runs** on **4/6/17** off Phi's **Adam Morgan**, **6/24/18** off Chi's **Mike Montgomery** and **6/30/18** off Mil's **Jacob Barnes** (grand slam)...**Lorenzen** most recently hit in the 9-4 loss on **7/26 vs Phi**, entered the game in the first inning in relief of starter **Tyler Mahle** and finished 0-for-2...5 times in his career came off the bench to homer, as a reliever or as a pinch hitter...all other active Major League pitchers have done it just twice.

Today's Pitcher - #28 Anthony DeSclafani, RHP

RED HOTS

Anthony DeSclafani's last name is pronounced DEE-sclafani...this afternoon is making his 11th start of the season...will be his seventh career appearance and fourth start vs the **Nationals** and his fifth career appearance and third start at **Nationals Park**...over **6 starts** from **6/10-7/9** went **4-0, 4.04**...his **4-game winning streak** ties **Tyler Mahle's** and **Matt Harvey's** for the longest by a Reds pitcher this season...in the 11-2 win on **6/23 vs Cubs** hit a grand slam (off **Brian Duensing**), the first home run of his career and only the fourth grand slam by a Reds pitcher (**Bob Purkey** on 8/1/59 vs Cubs, **Al Hollingsworth** on 5/28/1936 at Cubs, **Ice Box Chamberlain** on 4/30/1892 vs Wsh)...in the **9-6 loss on 6/5 vs Col** made his first appearance for the Reds since a **2-1 win on 9/28/16 at StL**...between his **September 2016** and **June 2018 apps, 17 pitchers** made starts for the Reds...began the **2018 season** on the 60-day disabled list while recovering from a **left oblique strain** suffered in his third spring training appearance...before he was reinstated the day of his **6/5 start vs Col**, from **5/14-5/30** made **4 rehabilitation starts** for Class AA **Pensacola** and Class AAA **Louisville (0-3, 4.66)**...spent the entire **2017 season** on the disabled list with a **sprained ulnar collateral ligament** in his **right elbow**.

Tonight's Pitcher - #32 Matt Harvey, RHP

RED HOTS

Matt Harvey tonight is making his 15th appearance and start for the Reds...will be his **17th career** appearance and **16th start** vs the **Nationals**, his second appearance and start of the season...the Reds were **8-27** before he was acquired on **5/8** and **40-34** since then prior to today's first game...in the 9-2 loss on **7/22 vs Pit** allowed 8 earned runs and 4 HR, both career highs, snapping a streak in which he did not allow more than 2 earned runs in any of his **previous 5 starts** (4-0, 1.86, 29ip, 6er)...that **4-game winning streak** was his longest since he won his **first 5 starts** in **2015** and ties **Tyler Mahle's** and **Anthony DeSclafani's** for the longest by a Reds pitcher this season...his **ERA for the Reds** in his other 13 starts is **3.63** (69.1ip, 28er)...between starts on **6/8 vs StL** (3hr) and **7/22 vs Pit** (career-high 4hr) produced season-high homerless streaks of **37.0 innings** and **6 starts**...began the season with the **Mets** and went **0-2, 7.00** in **4 starts** and **4 relief apps** before he was **designated for assignment** on **5/5**...on **5/8** was acquired by the Reds in exchange for **C Devin Mesoraco** and **cash**...from **2012-2018** for the **Mets** went **34-37, 3.66** in **104 starts** and **5 relief apps**.

- On 1/18 was signed by the Rangers to a minor league contract...on 3/21 was released...on 3/22 was signed by the Rays to a minor league contract...prior to his trade to the Reds spent the season at Class AAA Durham (28g, .274, 5 2b, 4hr, 20rbi).

4 BRANDON DIXON, inf/of Road Trip: 2g, 1gs in RF, 1-4

- Since his promotion on 7/21 is 1-for-11 in 7 apps, including a start at 2B on 7/23 vs StL and a start in RF on Tue at Det.
- In the ninth inning Thu at Wsh singled to snap an 0-for-13 skid, his longest of the season and of his career...was his first hit since he singled on 6/27 at Atl.
- Was recalled on 7/21, when Alex Blandino was disabled...in 49 apps for Louisville hit .346 (18 2b, 2 3b, 6hr, 23rbi, 9sb, 14gs at 1B, 12gs at 2B, 5gs at 3B, 11gs in LF, 2gs in RF).
- Made his 5 starts for the Reds at 1B (5/24 vs Pit), 2B (6/7 vs Col, 7/23 vs StL) and RF (5/26 at Col, 7/31 at Det)...was credited with a sixth start on 6/27 at Atl, when he played 1B in the bottom of the first following Joey Votto's ejection in the top of the inning.
- In the ninth inning on 6/16 at Pit, on his father's birthday, produced his only Major League home run (solo off Michael Feliz).
- Was promoted the first time on 5/22 and that night vs Pit pinch hit in his Major League debut (P9 off Jameson Taillon).
- In the 5-4 win on 5/24 vs Pit made his first start, played 1B and produced the first 3 hits of his Major League career (2 singles, 1 double).
- Began the season at Louisville and hit .326 in 37 apps there before he was promoted on 5/22...made 29 apps and 3 starts for the Reds before he returned to Louisville on 7/4...in his most recent stint with the Bats (7/4-7/20) hit .400 in 12 apps and in that span led the International League in runs (12) and OPS (1.114) while tying for the lead in hits (20).
- On 7/18 at Rochester became the sixth player in Louisville history to hit for the cycle (Scott Schebler 7/26/2016, Chris Dickerson 7/26/2007, Anderson Machado 5/18/2007, David Bell 8/11/1995, Stan Royer 7/19/1991).

27 PHILLIP ERVIN, of Road Trip: 3g, 2gs in LF, 4-9, 1 2b, 1 3b, 2r

- Started 3 of the Reds' last 4 games (RF, LF, LF)...since the All-Star break started 8 of the Reds' 13 games (5gs in RF, 1gs in CF, 2gs in LF) and hit safely in 9 of his 12 apps (13-32, .406, 4 2b, 1 3b, 5rbi, .594slg, .412obp).
- On 7/20 was promoted from Louisville to replace disabled OF Scott Schebler.
- Is his third stint with the Reds this season...began the year with the Reds and made 16 apps and 8 starts before he was optioned to Louisville on 4/26...from 6/21-6/23 was on the roster for 3 days during Schebler's stint on the bereavement list (3g, 0-1).
- In 48 games overall for the Bats hit .289 (12 2b, 4 3b, 5hr, 38rbi, 10sb, 35gs in LF, 8gs in CF, 3gs in RF)...in his last 23 apps at Louisville hit .384 with 13 multi-hit games (5hr, 29rbi, .450obp, .663slg, 1.113 ops).

4 SCOOTER GENNETT, 2b Road Trip: 2-12, 1 2b, 1bb

- Is a first-time All-Star.
- Ranks fifth in the National League in hitting.
- Hit .326 in the first half to become the first Reds batter to lead the NL in hitting at the All-Star break since George Foster in 1979...no Reds batter has finished a season leading the NL in batting average since Pete Rose hit .338 in 1973...the list of Reds batters who led the league in hitting is on media guide page 397.
- His team-high 115 hits were the most by a Reds batter prior to the All-Star break since Sean Casey had 118 hits in 1999.
- Since the All-Star break is hitting .222 (10-45, 3 2b, 1hr, 4rbi).
- In his last 162 apps beginning 7/26/17 is hitting .301 with 32 doubles, 1 3b, 26 HR and 106 RBI (.486slg, .350obp).
- Was born in Cincinnati and lived in nearby Lebanon until he was 9 years old, when his family moved to Sarasota.

6 BILLY HAMILTON, cf Road Trip: 3-10, 1rbi, 1sb

- With 23 steals ranks T4th in the National League, 7 behind leader Trea Turner of Wsh.
- In each of the last 4 seasons finished second in the league in stolen bases.
- Is tied for the National League lead with 10 outfield assists.
- Hit safely in 7 of his last 9 apps (9-29, .310, 1 2b, 3rbi, 1sb).
- Wed at Det recorded his first stolen base since 7/9 at Cle, snapping a career-high streak of 15 apps without a stolen base or caught stealing.
- Since his debut on 9/3/13 leads all Major League players in steals with 266, sixth on the Reds' all-time list since 1898...Reds Hall of Famer Eric Davis is fifth at 270.
- Has made 9 starts batting leadoff, 1 start batting eighth (4/2 vs Chi) and 82 starts batting ninth...his 82 starts batting ninth are the most by any player in the Major Leagues at that spot in the order...has made 71 straight starts batting ninth since he last led off on 4/26 vs Atl...since he started batting ninth regularly on 4/27 is hitting .246 overall (64-260, .313obp).

15 DILSON HERRERA, inf Road Trip: 1gs at 2B, 1-3

- Since he was promoted from Louisville on 7/6, in his Reds debut has made 15 apps, including 2 starts at 2B (7/10 at Cle, 7/31 at Det)...are his first apps in the Major Leagues since 10/3/15 for NYM vs Wsh.
- His 2-out, RBI-single on 7/23 off StL's Bud Norris was the first walkoff hit of his career (2-1 win).
- In the 5-run seventh inning of the 9-1 win on 7/13 at StL produced a pinch-hit HR (3-run off Sam Tuivailala), his first Major League hit, HR and RBI since 9/27/15 for NYM at Cin...was his first career pinch-hit home run and tied his career high for RBI in a game (3).
- In 9 apps and 4 starts for the Reds during spring training hit .263 (1 3b, 2rbi)...on 3/13 cleared waivers and was outrighted off the roster.
- Began the season at Class A Daytona (21g, .298, 3 2b, 2hr, 8rbi)...on 5/3 was promoted to Louisville (50g, .297, 10 2b, 7hr, 27rbi)...at both stops combined to make 54 apps at 2B and 11 apps at 3B.

9 JOSÉ PERAZA, ss Road Trip: 1-14, 1 2b, 2rbi

- Accent mark on the "e" in José.
- Leads the National League in most plate apps per strikeout (9.4)...this season has produced 3 streaks of at least 40 plate apps without a strikeout (45pa from 7/11-7/25, 43pa from 4/15-4/25, 40pa from 5/22-6/2)...current streak is 4 plate apps.
- With 2 outs in the ninth inning Thu at Wsh produced a 2-run double to snap an 0-for-17 skid, 1 shy of his season and career high (0-18, 5/16-5/22).
- In his last 54 apps beginning 5/27 is hitting .321, raising BA from .243 (69-215, 12 2b, 3 3b, 3hr, 25rbi, 9sb, .447slg, .372obp).
- From 5/26-6/24 reached base safely in 23 consecutive apps (.330ba, .392obp)...was the longest on-base streak of his career, the longest by a Reds batter this season and when snapped the third-longest active streak in the Major Leagues.
- Leads the team in starts at 3 spots in the batting order, including leadoff (36gs), second (36gs) and seventh (22gs)...also has batted eighth (8gs).
- Produced 11 hits at StL in the series preceding the All-Star break, tying the club record for most hits over any 3-game span (Vada Pinson vs Mil/Phi, 8/12-8/14, 1959)...Peraza is the only player in Reds history with 11 hits in a 3-game series.

7 EUGENIO SUÁREZ, inf Road Trip: 4-11, 1 2b, 1hr, 3rbi

- First name is pronounced Ay-you-hay-nee-oh...accent mark on the "a" in Suárez.
- Was voted by his peers to his first All-Star team.
- Hit safely in all 3 games of this road trip.
- Despite missing 16 games in April with a fractured right thumb ranks second in the National League in RBI...Dave Parker in 1985 was the last Reds batter to lead the NL in RBI (125)...the list of Reds batters who led the NL in RBI is on page 397.
- Became only the third Reds batter since 2000 with at least 70 RBI (71) prior to the All-Star break, joining Ken Griffey Jr. in 2000 (72) and Brandon Phillips in 2013 (74).
- Beginning 7/23 has homered in 6 of his last 10 apps, including a streak of 5 straight from 7/23-7/27 that tied the club record for consecutive games with a HR...produced an RBI in 8 of his last 10 apps (12rbi).
- In his last 61 apps beginning 5/22 is hitting .312, raising his season BA from .274 (73-234, 10 2b, 1 3b, 18hr, 51rbi, .594slg, .394obp)...this stretch includes a pair of career-high 13-game hitting streaks (6/8-6/23, 6/27-7/10), the longest hitting streaks by any Reds batter this season.
- In his last 162 apps beginning 7/14/17 is hitting .287 with 29 doubles, 2 triples, 39 HR and 121 RBI (.543slg, .380obp, .923ops).
- From 4/9-4/25 was disabled with a fractured right thumb...suffered the injury on 4/8 at Pit, when he was hit by a Jameson Taillon pitch...missed 16 games (3-13).
- On 3/16 signed a 7-year contract extension through the 2024 season with a club option for 2025...following last season was eligible for arbitration for the first time while under team control through 2020.

12 PRESTON TUCKER, OF Road Trip: 1gs at DH, 1gs in LF, 2-8, 1 2b, 1rbi

- In Wed's 7-4 loss at Det made his Reds debut, started at DH and went 1-for-4 with an RBI-double...Thu at Wsh started in LF.
- Was acquired late Mon night from the Braves, along with RHP Lucas Sims and RHP Matt Wisler, in exchange for LF Adam Duvall...joined the club mid-game on Tue.
- This season made 62 apps for the Braves (.256, 10 2b, 4hr, 22rbi) and 15 apps at Class AAA Gwinnett (.232, 4 2b, 1hr, 5rbi)...for Atl, made all 25 starts in LF.
- Originally was selected by Hou in the seventh round of the 2012 first-year player draft...was traded to Atl in December 2017 in exchange for cash considerations.

19 JOEY VOTTO, 1b Road Trip: 2-9, 1 2b

- Was voted by his peers to his sixth All-Star team, the most All-Star apps ever by a player born in Canada (Larry Walker, 5)...in the 10th inning, became the first player born in Canada to homer in the All-Star Game (off Tor's J.A. Happ).
- Leads the National League in on-base percentage and ranks second in walks...is the only NL player and 1 of only 4 Major League players with an OBP of at least .400.
- Is trying to lead the NL in walks for the sixth time, in on-base percentage for the seventh time and in both categories in the same season for the fifth time...is trying to become only the sixth player in Major League history to lead his league in on-base percentage at least 7 times (Ted Williams 12, Babe Ruth 10, Barry Bonds 10, Rogers Hornsby 7, Ty Cobb 7).
- Hit safely in 5 of his last 7 apps (9-23, .391, 1 2b, 2rbi, .517obp).
- Reached base safely in 94 of the 107 apps in which he has a plate appearance...from 5/20-6/12 produced a season-high 20-game on-base streak...current streak is 11 games (10-33, .303, .489obp).
- In the Reds' 109 games has made 108 apps and 105 starts...missed his 4 starts on 4/12 vs StL, 5/15 at SF, 5/24 vs Pit and 7/20 vs Pit...missed his only full game on 4/12 vs StL, snapping at 202 games his streaks of consecutive games played and consecutive games started.
- From 4/23-4/29 was the NL Player of the Week, his fifth career weekly award.

46 MASON WILLIAMS, of Road Trip: 2gs in RF, 2-8

- Was promoted from Louisville on 7/26, when OF Jesse Winker was disabled with a season-ending right shoulder injury.
- Started 5 of the Reds' last 6 games (4gs in RF, 1gs in CF) and hit safely in 4 of the 5 starts (6-19, .316, 3-run HR, 4r)...Thu at Wsh went 0-for-4, snapping a 4-game hitting streak that tied his career high (2015, 2016).
- On 7/27 vs Phi made his second appearance for the Reds and first start, played RF and in the fourth inning hit a 3-run HR off Nick Pivetta that snapped the 2-2 tie...was his second career HR (6/12/15 at Bal, 2-run off Ubaldo Jiménez, his first career hit).
- On 7/26 vs Phi pinch hit in his Reds debut and first Major League appearance since 6/25/17 for NYY vs Tex...prior to this season, made all 25 career apps for NYY.
- In 87 apps for the Bats hit .280 (18 2b, 4 3b, 6hr, 30rbi, 5sb)...made all 83 of his starts in CF...after the Class AAA All-Star break hit safely in 12 of his 13 apps prior to his promotion (.362, 4 2b, 2 3b, 3rbi, .474obp, .532slg, 1.006ops).
