PITTSBURGH PIRATES (59-56) vs. SAN FRANCISCO GIANTS (57-58)

August 9, 2018 at AT&T Park, San Francisco, CA --- GAME #116/ROAD #54

RHP IVAN NOVA (6-6, 4.49 ERA) vs. LHP ANDREW SUAREZ (4-7, 4.60 ERA)

THE PIRATES... have won back-to-back games after dropping three in a row...Have gone 6-7 in their last 13 games after winning 11 in a row between 7/11-24...Have produced the best record in the National League (19-9) since July 7...Have won 17 of their last 24 games and have gone 23-15 in their last 38 games, dating back to 6/25 (the fifth-best record in MLB in that time)...Were a season-high nine games over .500 following the action on 5/17 (26-17)...Were 57-58 after 115 games in 2017 (58-58 after 116).

DIALED IN AT AT&T: The Pirates have gone 7-2 in their last nine games played in San Francisco and are 9-3 at AT&T Park since the 2014 season...In the last 12 games played here, the Bucco pitching staff has posted a 3.43 ERA (105.0ip/40er) and has surrendered just four home runs (none in the last five games - 43.0ip).

START ME UP: In the last nine games played on the road, the Bucco starting pitchers have produced a 2.12 ERA (59.1ip/14er) and have pitched at least 6.0 inning seven times...The starters have pitched at least 7.0 innings in four of the last five road games and into the seventh inning six times in the last nine...Overall (home and road), Pittsburgh starting pitchers have posted a National League-leading 3.18 ERA (164.1ip/58er) since July 7.

TAKING IT THE EXTRA MILE: Among all National League outfielders, **Gregory Polanco** is tied for first along with Bryce Harper and Rhys Hoskins with 48 extra-base hits...Since June 25, Polanco's 21 extra-base hits are tied for fourth among all players in the senior circuit.

WELCOME ABOARD: Yesterday afternoon in Denver, **Adeiny Hechavarria** made his debut with the Pirates and went 1-for-3 with a double while playing the entire game at shortstop...He is the 41st different player to appear in a game this season.

HAPPY RETURNS: **Kyle Crick**, who was one of the two players acquired from the Giants in exchange for Andrew McCutchen, has been scored upon just three times in his last 22 appearances (21.2ip/3er/25so - 1.25 ERA) and has been scored upon eight times in his 46 appearances overall this season...Crick has held right-handed batters to a .172 average.

FRAZIER ON FIRE: **Adam Frazier** went 3-for-5 with two doubles Wednesday afternoon in Colorado and has gone 10-for-21 (.476) in his first six games this month...Since being recalled from Indianapolis on 7/25, Frazier has gone 16-for-37 (.432) with eight doubles, a home run and six RBI while hitting safely in eight of his 12 games.

RUNNING BUCCO: **Starling Marte** swiped a pair of bases on Wednesday and enters today's action tied for second among the National League leaders with 27 stolen bases this season, trailing only Trea Turner (31)...Since 1900, Marte's 208 career steals rank seventh on the club's all-time list - **Barry Bonds** is fifth with 251.

LOCKING IT DOWN: All-Star closer **Felipe Vázquez** has converted each of his last 16 save opportunities and has set the single-season club record for most saves by a left-handed pitcher (26)...Vázquez was named the N.L. reliever of the month for July and has surrendered just two runs while striking out 35 batters in his last 22 outings (21.1ip - 0.84 ERA).

THE OFFENSE RETURNS: After leading the National League in home runs (36) and batting .275 as a team during the month of July, the Bucs began the month of August hitting .215 with two home runs in the first five games...However, they have gone 21-for-72 (.292) with three home runs and 14 runs scored in the last two games.

ERA MOVEMENT: Dating back to July 7, the Pirates lead the National League with a 3.08 ERA (248.0ip/85er) and a 19-9 record...Only the Athletics (2.84) have a lower ERA in the Majors in that time.

ROAD TRIP: The Pirates are 2-1 on this 10-day, nine-game road trip after winning two-of-three in Colorado...The trip continues with this four-game series in San Francisco and concludes with two against the Twins following a day off Monday...The Bucs have won seven of their last nine road games and have gone 12-7 in their last 19.

MERCER MERCER ME: **Jordy Mercer** has hit safely in 12 of his last 15 games and has reached base safely in 19 of his last 20 games, going 21-for-61 (.344) with eight walks and 2 HBPs.

FROM THE TOP: In his 14 games as the leadoff batter this season, **Corey Dickerson** is hitting .339 (20-for-59) with 16 runs, five home runs and 10 RBI (the Pirates are 11-3 in the 14 games)...Dickerson has six career leadoff home runs, having hit all six while playing with Tampa Bay last year (last one on June 13 at Seattle).

RIGHT ON: **Gregory Polanco** has hit 19 home runs as a right fielder this season; second in the league behind Bryce Harper's 21 from that position...In team history, only four other Pirates have hit 20 or more home runs in one season while playing right field...**Dave Parker** did it four times, **Roberto Clemente** did it three times while **Bobby Bonilla** and **Reggie Sanders** accomplished it one time each...Sanders was the last to do it, hitting 22 as a right fielder in 2003.

HOW MAY I ASSIST YOU?: Pittsburgh's outfielders have recorded a National League-leading 27 assists this season, including four in the last three games...**Starling Marte** shares the league lead with 10 assists, which are also the most by a Pirates center fielder since **Andrew McCutchen** had 11 in 2013...**Corey Dickerson** is tied for second in the league with seven assists among left fielders and **Gregory Polanco** is tied for first among right fielders with seven assists.

ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY

August 9, 1976: John Candelaria became the first Pirates pitcher in 69 years to throw a no-hitter in Pittsburgh as he led the Bucs to a 2-0 victory over the Dodgers at Three Rivers Stadium. It was Candelaria's 11th win on the year and he struck out seven batters on the way to his historic accomplishment. Bill Robinson led the way on offense, knocking in both runs.

TREVOR WILLIAMS: The 26-year-old righthander is expected to make his 23rd start of the season tomorrow night...His last start was a 2-1 loss to Jack Flaherty and the Cardinals at PNC Park Sunday afternoon (5.0ip/9h/2r/2er/0bb/3so)...Has surrendered two runs in his last four starts (22.0ip) and had a streak of 21.0 consecutive scoreless innings end in his last start...Has been the starting pitcher in six of the club's 12 shutouts this season...Has posted a 2.92 ERA (92.1ip/30er) in his 16 starts following the All-Star break in 2017-18...Pitched 6.0 scoreless innings in his last road start...Has gone 1-3 in his last six starts on the road after winning each of his first two road assignments.

vs. SAN FRANCISCO: 0-0 with a 2.25 ERA (12.0ip/3er) in two career starts - both coming in 2017...Gave up one run in 6.0ip in a 2-1 Bucco loss on 7/26...Also allowed two runs in 6.0-plus innings on 7/2 at PNC Park and left with a 2-0 lead, but had a no-decision in a 5-3 loss on 7/2 at PNC Park.
