ATLANTA BRAVES (90-70) vs PHILADELPHIA PHILLIES (78-82)

Saturday, September 29, 2018 – 7:05 p.m. EDT – Citizens Bank Park – Game 161 – Home 80
RHP Anibal Sanchez (7-6, 2.96 ERA) vs RHP Aaron Nola (16-6, 2.45 ERA)

- YESTERDAY'S RECAP:** The Phillies fell to the Atlanta Braves, 10-2, at Citizens Bank Park in South Philly ... Starter Jerad Eickhoff (L, 0-1) made his first start of the season in electric fashion, striking out 8 of the 15 batters he faced, including seven in a row at one point ... Rhys Hoskins cranked his 34th home run of the season.
- A STAR IS BORN:** Today, 2018 All-Star **Aaron Nola** will make his final start of the 2018 season ... Among all ML starters, he ranks 4th in ERA (2.45), 5th in OPP OPS (.576), 6th in IP (205.1) & OPP SLG % (.317), 8th in WHIP (0.98) & HR/9.0 IP (0.75), 10th in OPP AVG (.200), T-10th in strikeouts (216), wins (16) and starts (32) ... His 18 starts allowing four or fewer hits are two more than any other Phillies since the current mound distance was established in 1893, and he could Join Hall of Famer Grover Cleveland Alexander as the only two Phillies pitchers since at least 1908 with 200 or more strikeouts and an opponent's batting average .200 or lower.
- BEAST OF THE EAST:** **Nola** enters tonight's start with a 9-4 record and 2.27 ERA (29 ER, 115.0 IP) in 18 divisional starts in 2018, the 3rd-lowest single season ERA (min. 15 GS) by a Phillie against the NL East since the division started in 1969, trailing Roy Halladay in 2010 (1.61) and Steve Carlton in 1972 (1.73) ... With his start today, he will join Jeremy Hellickson (19 in 2016) as the only Phillies in the last 30 years (since 1989) to make 19 starts against the NL East in a season ... No other pitcher in the major leagues has made 19 starts against the division since 2002 (Tom Glavine, 19) ... In fact, no player in baseball has made 19 starts against any division since 2016 ... Nola owns a career 2.30 ERA (18 ER, 70.1 IP) in his 11 starts against Atlanta, surrendering three earned runs or fewer in all of them, which is the longest such streak against the Braves since Nola's debut season in 2015.
- THANK YOU FOR YOUR PATIENCE:** Philadelphia's 571 walks are its most in a season since 2009, when the club had 589 ... **Carlos Santana** (108), **Cesar Hernandez** (95) and **Rhys Hoskins** (85) are just the third trio of Phillies with 85 or more walks in one season in franchise history and the first to do so since 2006 (Bobby Abreu – 91, Pat Burrell – 98, Ryan Howard – 108) ... The only time Philadelphia had four players with 85 or more walks in a season was in 1993 when the quartet of Darren Daulton (117), Lenny Dykstra (129), Dave Hollins (85) and John Kruk (111) did so ... **The Phils are the only team in MLB that has multiple players with 80 or more walks in 2018, let alone three with 85... There are only four other National League players with 85 walks or more: Bryce Harper (129), Joey Votto (107), Matt Carpenter (102) and Paul Goldschmidt (90).**
- NOTHING BUT RHYS-PECT:** Thursday, **Rhys Hoskins** played in his 200th career game, accruing 51 home runs and 122 walks in those 200 games ... **Per Elias, Hoskins joined NYY's Aaron Judge (61 HR, 152 BB) as the only players in major league history to have at least 50 HR and 120 BB through 200 career games** ... Since he burst onto the scene August 10, 2017, Hoskins' 52 home runs rank 4th in MLB, trailing only NYY's Giancarlo Stanton (58 HR), OAK's Khris Davis (59 HR) and BOS' J.D. Martinez (65 HR) for the major league lead in that stretch.
- MR. NO DAYS OFF:** The Phils are in the midst of 17 consecutive games without an off day to finish their season ... This marks the longest stretch this year for the club without an off day ... Per Elias, this is the first time the Phillies have finished a season with at least 17 straight games and no days off since the year 2000 when they also finished with 17 straight from 9/15-10/1.
- CLEAN BILL OF HEALTH:** The Phillies are currently the only team in MLB without a player on the DL ... As it stands, this would be the first time since at least 1994, as far as the Phillies internal records go back, that Philadelphia finished a season without a single player on the DL.
- DALLAS GREEN AWARD:** International Coordinator **Jesús "Chalao" Méndez** has been selected as the 2018 recipient of the Dallas Green Award, and will receive his award on the field prior to tonight's game ... Méndez, a native of Caracas, Venezuela, is in his second year as the international coordinator, and his 22nd as a member of the Phillies' international scouting department ... He was hired by the club in 1997 as the Venezuela scouting supervisor, a title he held until his promotion to Latin American crosschecker in 2010 ... He was named to his current position in 2017 ... Mendez was instrumental in signing players such as **Cesar Hernandez, Freddy Galvis, Carlos Carrasco and Carlos Tocci** ... "This really is an honor for me to receive this award," Méndez said. "I never could have imagined it. We have so many people that work so hard for this organization, and for me to be the recipient of the Dallas Green Award is incredibly special to myself and my family."
- TRULY AN HONOR:** Prior to tomorrow's game, the Phillies will present the Richie Ashburn & David Montgomery Special Achievement Award to Director of Minor League Operations, **Lee McDaniel** ... A 23-year Phillies employee, McDaniel is the first to receive the award since Montgomery's name was added... Montgomery, who currently serves as chairman, has embodied the spirit of the award over his 48-year accomplished Phillies career ... Perhaps his greatest legacy has been his demonstration of class, benevolence, integrity and philanthropy ... "Lee attributes how he conducts business to what he has learned from David over the years which explains, in part, why he is so deserving of this award," said Phillies President, Andy MacPhail ... "Aside from his level of professionalism, Lee's love of the game and his career accomplishments in player development, his instrumental role in establishing the academies in the Dominican Republic and Venezuela, and his tireless work during the Florida Instructional League and spring training are just a few highlights of why Lee is such a worthy recipient."

LAST START: 9/23 at ATL: L, 6.0 IP, 4 H, 2 R, 2 ER, HR, BB, 6 SO ... Nola vs Sanchez ... Scott Kingery provided Philadelphia with their lone run, a solo-shot to left in the 3rd inning.

TONIGHT'S START:

- **Counting Ks:** Nola's 210 strikeouts are the 3rd-most ever by a Phillie age 25 or younger, trailing only Grover Cleveland Alexander (227 in 1911), Kid Gleason (222 in 1890) ... Jim Bunning (4x), Curt Schilling (2x), Grover Cleveland Alexander (2x), Roy Halladay (2x) and Gleason are the only Phils RHP evert to strike out more than Nola's 216 ... He became the first Phillie since 2013 (Lee, 222 & Hamels, 202) to strike out 200 batters in a season, and only the 13th different Phillies pitcher ever to do so
- **This Means WAR:** Per Baseball Reference, Nola's pitching WAR of 9.8 is the highest by any pitcher since 2009, when Zack Greinke posted a 10.4 bWAR ... In the last 100 years, only two NL pitchers have posted a higher WAR in or before their age 25 season (age on 6/30): Dwight Gooden in 1985 (12.2) and Dick Ellsworth in 1963 (10.3)
- **vs NL East:** 19-13, 3.24 ERA (98 ER, 272.1 IP) in 45 starts ... He will join Jeremy Hellickson (19 in 2016) as the only Phillies in the last 30 years (since 1989) to make 19 starts against the NL East in a season ... No other pitcher has made 19 starts against the division since 2002 (Tom Glavine, 19)
- **Left Lost:** Nola has held LHH to a .190 AVG (69-363) this season, which would be the lowest mark by any Phillies pitcher in a season (min. 400 LHH faced) since that data was completely tracked in 1974 ... It is the best mark in baseball this season among pitchers with 400 LHH faced
- **Double Digits:** Has 6 double-digit strikeout games in 2018, joining Steve Carlton (4x), Curt Schilling (3x), Jim Bunning (2x), Cliff Lee and Chris Short as the only Phillies to do so since the current mound distance was established in 1893, per Elias
- **Consistency is Key:** Has allowed 4 runs or fewer in 36 straight starts (since 9/7/17), the 2nd-longest active streak in MLB behind Clayton Kershaw (37) and tied with Tommy Greene for the franchise record (since 1908)

HOME:

- **2018:** 9-2, 2.50 ERA (29 ER, 104.1 IP) in 16 starts
- **Career:** 23-14, 3.16 ERA (100 ER, 285.0 IP) in 45 starts

2018 SEASON:

- Won his first 9 home decisions to start 2018, joining Tommy Greene (10, 1993) as the only Phillies starters to do so since at least 1908, and is 1 of 4 ML pitchers to do so since 2014: Greinke-'17, Porcello-'16, Keuchel-'15
- His 17 straight home starts allowing 3 or fewer runs (8/28/17-8/28/18) was the second-longest streak in Phillies history since the current mound distance was established in 1893 (longest: 19, Jim Bunning)
- Went 3-0, 1.06 ERA (4 ER, 34.0 IP) and 35 strikeouts in Aug., the 3rd-best ERA in MLB in Aug. ... Had a 17.0-inning scoreless streak, 8/17-28
- Per Elias, his 2.236 ERA through 25 starts was the lowest ERA by a Phillie through 25 starts since 1964 (Chris Short, 1.97)
- Made his first career All-Star game (1.0 IP, 2 SO), becoming the first Phillies starting pitcher named to the All-Star team since Cliff Lee in 2013, and the youngest Phillies starting pitcher to be an All-Star since a 23-year-old Cole Hamels in 2007
- Joined Steve Carlton (2.14 ERA, 155 SO in 1980) as the only Phillies pitchers with an ERA of 2.30 or lower and 130 or more SO by the All-Star break, and was the 5th Phillie to win 12 games or more by the break
- Reached 500 career strikeouts in 480.0 innings, becoming the fastest Phillie to reach that mark, both among pitchers who started their career in PHI and any pitcher to strike out 500 in a PHI uniform
- Became 1 of just 7 Phillies in the last 20 seasons (since 1999) with 10 wins before July 1 (Hamels in 2012, Halladay in 2011, Milton in 2004, Padilla in 2002, Byrd in 1999, Schilling in 1999)
- Per Elias, he had the 2nd-most strikeouts (467) through 75 career starts by any pitcher that began his career with Philadelphia (Cole Hamels, 469) and the 5th-most by any pitcher in his first 75 starts in a Phillies uniform
- Posted a 1.80 ERA (8 ER, 40.0 IP) with 46 SO and a 0.90 WHIP in May
- Carried a no-hitter through 6.2 innings, 5/26 vs TOR, the longest no-hit bid of his career ... Retired 18 straight at one point ... Struck out 10
- Won each of his first 5 home starts, something no Phillie had done since 2010 (Roy Oswalt)
- Allowed 3 ER or fewer in 13 straight starts, 9/7/17-5/13/18
- Made his first career Opening Day start on 3/29 at ATL ... At 24 years, 298 days old, he was the club's youngest Opening Day starter since Dennis Bennett in 1964 (24 years, 192 days old)

CAREER:

- Selected by the Phillies in the 1st round (7th overall) of the June 2014 draft out of Louisiana State University ... Was signed by Mike Stauffer ... Originally selected by Toronto in the 22nd round of the June 2011 draft, but did not sign
- His 23.0-inning scoreless streak, 4/22-5/8/16 remains the longest by a Phillies starter since Cole Hamels' 24.2-inning streak, 6/1-21/14
- Was the first player drafted by Philadelphia to make his ML debut the very next season since Pat Combs in 1989
