118th HOME OPENER

» Today the City of Cleveland is set to celebrate the 118th home opener in Indians history and the 25th* home opener played here at Progressive Field.

*Due to winter weather conditions that wiped out a 4-game series against Seattle from April 6-9, Cleveland was, in essence, forced to re-play the 2007 home opener against a different opponent at an out-of-town venue...the Indians played an entire 3-game series from April 10-12 against the Los Angeles Angels at Miller Park in Milwaukee, WI, which would technically make today the 24th home opener played to completion at this venue...Cleveland has gone 60-57 (.513) all-time in home openers (2007 game included), which includes a 11-12 mark at Progressive Field (2007 game excluded). » Cleveland has dropped 7 of the club's last 9 home openers (wins in 2014 vs. MIN & 2017 vs. CWS) - this after winning 9 of the first 14 home openers played at Progressive Field...Tribe last won consecutive home openers played exclusively in Cleveland from 1997-99 (3 straight); the '07 "home" opener win in Milwaukee also gave club 3 straight from 2006-08.

A ROYAL WELCOME

» Today will mark the 3rd time in franchise history that Cleveland has hosted the Kansas City Royals for a home opener, having previously done so in 1978 and 1999...Cleveland has now hosted an A.L. Central opponent in 12 of the last 18 home openers. » Cleveland has won both of its previous home openers vs. Kansas City...on April 8, 1978, the Indians bested the Royals 8-5 on the strength of homers by Ron Pruitt, Paul Dade and Andre Thornton...on April 12, 1999, Cleveland prevailed 5-2 in 10 innings thanks to a walk-off three-run homer by Travis Fryman. » The Indians and Royals also meet this afternoon for the first of 19 scheduled matchups in 2018, nine of which will come here at Progressive Field. » The Tribe posted a record of 12-7 (.632) against the Royals in 2017, including a mark of 7-3 at home...since Terry Francona became manager in 2013, the Indians have gone 55-40 (.579) vs. Kansas City...the two teams have combined to win each of the last three A.L. Central division championships.

ROAD TRIP RECAP

» Cleveland returns to Progressive Field for its first homestand of the year after beginning the season with a 2-4 road trip against the Mariners and Angels. » The Tribe scored six runs apiece in victories on March 31 at Seattle and April 2 at Los Angeles-AL, but were held to just nine runs total in the four losses...the club hit just .161 (33-205) on the trip and batted .214 (6-28) with runners in scoring position. » In their most recent game on Wednesday, the Indians lost 3-2 to the Angels in 13 innings, falling on a walk-off solo homer by Zack Cozart...marked the Tribe's longest contest (in innings played) since a 19-inning affair at Toronto on July 1, 2016 (W, 2-1)...Cleveland went 4-2 over six extra-inning games in 2017, five of which came at Progressive Field.

CENTRAL FOCUS

» This series vs. Kansas City serves as the beginning of the Tribe's 76-game slate against divisional foes. » Success against the A.L. Central has proven critical to Cleveland's consecutive division championships...after posting a club-high 49 intra-divisional wins in 2016 (49-26, .653), the Tribe broke that record last season, going 50-26 (.658) in divisional matchups. » Cleveland enters play this afternoon tied with Detroit for 3rd in the A.L. Central, 2.0 games behind leaders Minnesota...the Indians spent seven days in 3rd place in 2017 (last on April 18).

» **1984:** The Indians steal six bases while Bert Blyleven (7.0IP) and George Frazier (2.0IP) combine to spin a six-hit shutout, as the Indians blank the Royals 2-0 at Royals (now Kauffman) Stadium.
» **1997:** 9th-inning homers by Brian Giles and Sandy Alomar Jr. propel the Indians to a wild 10-8 victory over the Angels in Anaheim.

BACK IN THE COOKIE JAR

» The Indians will turn to CARLOS CARRASCO to start the home opener for a second consecutive season.
» Carrasco will become the first pitcher to receive back-to-back home opener nods for Cleveland since Roberto Hernandez (then Fausto Carmona) did so in 2010 & 2011...in 2017, Carrasco took a no-decision vs. Chicago-AL despite tossing 7.0 strong innings, allowing one run on four hits with no walks and seven strikeouts.
» No Indians starting pitcher has picked up the win in a home opener since CC Sabathia in 2007 (game in Milwaukee)...the last Tribe starter to win a home opener in Cleveland was Paul Byrd in 2006.

UNLUCKY KLUBER

» COREY KLUBER has pitched dominantly over his first two starts of the season, pitching a complete game on Opening Day at Seattle and tossing 7.0 strong innings on Wednesday at Los Angeles-AL...he has allowed just four runs in 15.0 innings (2.40 ERA), all of which have come on a pair of two-run homers (Nelson Cruz & Shohei Ohtani).
» However, Kluber has gone 0-1 in those starts, taking the loss in Seattle and picking up a no-decision in Wednesday's extra-inning loss...Kluber is the first Indians pitcher to toss at least 7.0 innings in each of his first two starts and remain winless since CC Sabathia in 2004 (0-0, 1.80).
» Kluber's 14 strikeouts this season rank T5th in the American League, while his 15.0 innings pitched are good for 2nd.

A SMOOTH RE-ENTRY

» MICHAEL BRANTLEY was activated from the 10-day Disabled List today after recovering from October 18 ankle surgery...to make room for Brantley on the 25-man roster, TYLER NAQUIN has been optioned to AAA Columbus.
» Brantley appeared in just three spring training contests (4-10, HR, 2 RBI) while rehabbing a right ankle injury suffered on August 8 vs. Colorado...the injury cut short his 2017 All-Star campaign and limited him to just three games as DH in the Tribe's 2017 ALDS vs. New York-AL.
» Brantley's return comes one year after playing the hero in the Tribe's 2017 home opener, giving Cleveland a 2-1 win over the White Sox with a walk-off double in the bottom of the 10th inning.
» Naquin has batted .143 (2-14) in five games with the Tribe this season, hitting a two-run homer on April 2 at Los Angeles-AL.

HOME COOKING

» The Indians finished 2017 with a 49-32 (.605) record at Progressive Field, the 2nd-best home record in the American League and 4th-best in the Majors.
» Since the 2017 All-Star Break, Cleveland has gone 28-8 (.778) at home, including wins in 17 of their past 20 games here.
» Last season, Tribe batters hit .264 with 95 homers at Progressive Field, while Indians pitchers posted an A.L.-best 3.19 home ERA.

LIVE AND DIE BY THE SWORD | HOME RUNS

» Throughout the season's first six games, home runs have proven dominant in the offenses of both Cleveland and its opponents.
» 15 of the Tribe's 21 runs this season have scored via the long-ball, including a grand slam and four two-run homers.
» Conversely, 19 of the 28 runs scored by Tribe opponents have come via home run.
» The Indians' eight home runs this season rank T6th in the American League (T9th in MLB)...their 12 homers allowed are 2nd-most in both the A.L. and MLB.
» EDWIN ENCARNACION leads the team with three longballs this season, T3rd in the American League.

MISC. NOTES

» LONNIE CHISENHALL and EDWIN ENCARNACION have reached safely in each of the Tribe's first six games...they are the first Indians pair to do so simultaneously since Michael Brantley, Jason Kipnis and Carlos Santana each turned the trick in 2014...Santana and Kipnis would go on to extend their streaks to eight games apiece before failing to reach base.

59 CARLOS CARRASCO RHP

(1-0, 7.94 ERA)

TODAY'S START

» The 31-year-old right-hander is scheduled to make his second start of the 2018 season in the Tribe's home opener this afternoon vs. Kansas City...marks the 177th appearance and 143rd start of Carrasco's career.
 » Will be pitching on five days' rest after starting on March 31 at Seattle...picked up the win despite allowing five runs on seven hits over 5.2 innings (0BB, 4K), as the Tribe beat the Mariners 6-5 for their first victory of the season.
 » Set to make his 18th career start (23rd) appearance against the Kansas City Royals...owns a lifetime record of 9-6 with a 3.58 ERA (44ER/110.2IP) vs. the divisional rival...made three starts against the Royals in 2017, posting a 2-1 record with a 4.50 ERA (9ER/18.0IP).
 » Dating back to August 27, 2017, Carrasco has won each of his last seven decisions, a career-best winning streak that spans his last eight starts.

HOME OPENER

» Carrasco is set to take the hill in the Tribe's home opener for a second consecutive season...he started for the Tribe on April 11, 2017 vs. Chicago-AL and took a no-decision, allowing just one run on four hits (0BB, 7K) over 7.0 innings...the Indians went on to beat the White Sox, 2-1, on a walkoff double by Michael Brantley in the 10th inning.
 » Carrasco will become the first Indians pitcher to start consecutive home openers since Roberto Hernandez (then Fausto Carmona) got the nod in both 2010 and 2011...will become the fifth pitcher to make multiple home opener starts at Progressive Field (see chart below)...CC Sabathia's 2007 start came at Milwaukee's Miller Park due to inclement weather in Cleveland.
 » No Cleveland starting pitcher has earned the win in the home opener since Sabathia in 2007...the last Indians starter to win a home opener at Progressive Field was Paul Byrd in 2006.

LAST TIME OUT

» Carrasco made his 2018 debut on March 31 at Seattle, in the Tribe's second game of the season...was touched for five runs on seven hits over 5.2 innings of work (0BB, 4K), but picked up his first win of 2018 as the Indians held on to beat the Mariners, 6-5...improved to 3-4 with a 6.98 ERA (38ER/49.0IP) in his first start of the season.

VS. KANSAS CITY | A.L. CENTRAL

» Carrasco will be making his 18th career start (23rd appearance) against the Kansas City Royals...holds a career record of 9-6 vs. the Royals with a 3.58 ERA (44ER/110.2IP).
 » Made a total of three starts against Kansas City in 2017, going 2-1 with a 4.50 ERA...two of those starts came here at Progressive Field, both of which resulting in wins for Carrasco...tossed 6.0 shutout innings on six hits with no walks and eight strikeouts on August 27, while he allowed four runs on eight hits (2BB, 5K) over 6.2 innings on September 16.
 » Carrasco made 16 starts against A.L. Central foes in 2017, going 12-2 with a 1.94 ERA (23ER/106.2IP)...his 1.94 ERA against the A.L. Central ranked as the second-lowest intradivisional ERA in Major League Baseball last season, (min. 60.0IP) trailing only Clayton Kershaw (1.90 ERA vs. NL West).
 » Owns a lifetime record of 30-28 with a 3.97 ERA (188ER/426.1IP) in 71 starts (85 appearances) against the A.L. Central.

AT PROGRESSIVE FIELD

» Today will mark Carrasco's 1st start at Progressive Field this season, as well as his 72nd career start (88th appearance) here.
 » Carrasco posted a 7-4 record in Cleveland last season with a 3.99 ERA (42ER/94.2IP), compared to an 11-2 mark with a 2.65 ERA (31ER/105.1IP) on the road...has earned a career record of 25-30 with a 4.45 ERA (220ER/444.2IP) at Progressive Field.
 » His lifetime 4.45 home ERA is over one run higher than his 3.19 mark (164ER/463.1IP) on the road (3rd-lowest in MLB since 2010).

A LEADER OF THE TRIBE

» Since making his Major League debut with Cleveland in 2009, Carrasco ranks 3rd among Indians pitchers in innings pitched (908.0), 2nd in strikeouts (900), 3rd in games started (142) and second in wins (63).
 » Since the beginning of 2015, Carrasco has amassed 10.01 strikeouts-per-9.0IP, the 4th-highest total among American League pitchers with at least 500.0 innings pitched in that span (Chris Sale, Chris Archer, Corey Kluber ranks 3rd with 10.31 K/9.0IP)...Carrasco sports a 4.85 K/BB ratio over the past three seasons, which also ranks 4th in the A.L., trailing Chris Sale, Corey Kluber and Masahiro Tanaka.

2017 SEASON HIGHLIGHTS

» Enjoyed the most prolific season of his career, finishing fourth in American League Cy Young voting as he set new career-highs in wins (18), starts (32), innings pitched (200.0) and strikeouts (226)...Carrasco finished in the A.L. Top 10 in wins (T1st), ERA (3.29, 6th), strikeouts (5th) and innings (8th)...joined Corey Kluber as the first teammates to accumulate 18 wins and 220 strikeouts each since Arizona's Randy Johnson & Curt Schilling in 2002 (6th duo all-time).
 » Was the Tribe's most consistent starter over the first two months of the season, going 5-1 with a 2.89 ERA (21ER/65.1IP) in his first 10 starts...Carrasco's 2.04 ERA in the month of April (8ER/35.1IP) was the lowest by an Indians starter (min. 30.0IP) since Cliff Lee posted a 0.96 ERA in his 2008 Cy Young campaign.
 » Threw his eighth career complete game on September 6 at Chicago-AL, allowing just one run on three hits with no walks and nine strikeouts...faced just one batter over the minimum in the Tribe's 5-1 victory (Game 14 of the Tribe's historic 22-game winning streak).
 » Went 5-0 with a 1.48 ERA (7ER/42.2IP) and 51 strikeouts in six September starts, finishing the season on a career-best six-decision winning streak...Carrasco and Corey Kluber simultaneously became the first pitchers to post five wins, 50 strikeouts, and an ERA of 1.50-or-less in a calendar month since Sam McDowell in June 1969 (6-0, 50K, 1.05 ERA; courtesy of ELIAS).
 » Notched his 200th inning in his final start of the year, an 8.1-inning, 14-strikeout performance on September 28 vs. Minnesota...marked a single-game season-high as well as the 2nd-highest total of his career (15, 9/25/2015 at Kansas City).
 » Made his Postseason debut in Game 3 of the ALDS against New York-AL after missing the 2016 playoffs with a broken metacarpal in his right hand...tossed 5.2 shutout innings on just three hits (3BB, 7K) but took a no decision in the Tribe's eventual 1-0 loss at Yankee Stadium.
 » Struck out six-or-more batters in 25 of his 32 starts, including a career-best eight-start streak with at least six strikeouts from August 6 - September 11.
