PLAYER OF WEEK(S), PLAYER OF MONTH...ALL-STAR?

Scooter Gennett leads the National League in hitting and ranks among the NL leaders in **total bases** (2nd), **hits** (3rd), **slugging percentage** (3rd), **multi-hit games** (21, T4th), **RBI** (T5th), **extra-base hits** (T9th) and **on-base percentage** (10th)...beginning 5/7 he leads the Major Leagues in **hits** (37, tied w/ Sea's Jean Segura), **HR** (9), **RBI** (25), **batting average** (.425) and **slugging percentage** (.793) while ranking third in the majors in **on-base percentage** (.446).

ROAD WARRIORS

This 3-city road trip is the second in a stretch in which the Reds are scheduled to play **5 straight road series** and **16 straight road games** in the **Mountain and Pacific Time Zones**...so far are **1-3 in completed series** and **8-6 in games**...last year out west the Reds went **5-12 in 17 games** and **1-3-1** in their **5 series** (1-3 at SF, 0-3 at LAD, 0-3 at SD, 2-2 at Col, 2-1 at Ari).

TONIGHT'S GAME: Is **Game 2** (1-0) of a 3-game series vs **Bill Blakeslee's Padres** and **Game 8** (3-4) of a 10-day, 9-game road trip that included **2-1 series losses** at Col's **Coors Field** and at Ari's **Chase Field**...following this series and Monday's day off, the Redlegs return to **Great American Ball Park** for a **6-game homestand** vs the **Rockies** (3g) and **Cardinals** (3g).

TODAY'S TRANSACTIONS: The Reds have reinstated from the 10-day disabled list **RHP Austin Brice** and placed on the 10-day DL, retroactive to Tuesday, **RHP Homer Bailey** (right knee inflammation)...additionally, **IF/OF Rosell Herrera**, who was designated for assignment yesterday to make room on the 40-man roster for **C Curt Casali**, has been claimed off waivers by the Royals.

SERIES NOTES: The Reds haven't won a **season series** vs **Ted Leitner's Padres** since **2012** (6-2) and since then are **13-20**, including **10-17** the last 5 years...over the last 5 seasons, Cin is **5-11 at Petco Park**...**Reds vs Padres** information is on media guide **Page 329**.

ROCKIES UP NEXT: Beginning Tuesday night, the Reds and Rockies will finish their season series with 3 games at **Great American Ball Park**...last weekend, the Rockies earned a **2-1 series win** at **Coors Field**...**Reds vs Rockies** information is on media guide **Page 321**.

PLAYER OF THE MONTH: **Scooter Gennett**, named National League **Player of the Week** twice in the last 3 weeks, has been named NL **Player of the Month** for **May**...is his first career monthly award...is the first Reds player to win **Player of the Month** since **Jay Bruce** in **May 2011**...he finished the month ranked first in the NL in **slugging percentage** (.720), second in **hitting** (.398), third in **RBI** (24), T3rd in **HR** (8), fourth in **hits** (37) and **on-base percentage** (.418) and T7th in **extra-base hits** (14).

DYNAMIC DUO: In May, **Scooter Gennett** (8hr, 24rbi) and **Eugenio Suarez** (8hr, 29rbi) became the first Reds teammates to produce at least **8 HR** and **24 RBI** in the same month since **Adam Dunn** (12hr, 27rbi) and **Ken Griffey Jr.** (11hr, 29rbi) did it in **August 2001**...**Dunn** and **Griffey** was the first Reds duo to do it since **Johnny Bench** (9hr, 32rbi) and **George Foster** (9hr, 38rbi) in **June 1977**...since RBI became an official statistic in **1920**, **Gennett** is the only **Reds second baseman** to produce at least **8 HR** and **24 RBI** in a calendar month (June 2017, May 2018) and **Suarez** is the only **Reds third baseman** to produce at least **8 HR** and **29 RBI** in a calendar month (May 2018).

REHABBING: **RHP Anthony DeSclafani** (left oblique strain) since 3/29 has been on the **60-day disabled list**...beginning 5/14 he made **4 rehabilitation starts** (0-3, 4.66, 19.1ip, 20h, 11r, 10er, 3bb, 22k, 5hr)...made his first 2 apps for Class AA Pensacola and his 2 most recent starts for Class AAA Louisville...he last pitched **Wed vs Scranton/Wilkes-Barre** and suffered the **3-1 Bats loss** (6.1ip, 7h, 2er, 1bb, 2k, 2hr, 95 pitches, 59 strikes).

APRIL 19: The Reds are **18-22** since 4/19, when they replaced manager **Bryan Price** and pitching coach **Mack Jenkins**...bench coach **Jim Riggleman** became interim manager, Class AAA Louisville manager **Pat Kelly** (#60) was promoted to serve as interim bench coach, and Class AA Pensacola pitching coach **Danny Darwin** (#52) joined the Reds' Major League staff as interim pitching coach...**Price** went **279-387 (.419)** in his 5 seasons as manager, including **3-15 this year**.

7-YEAR ITCH: The **10-4 Reds victory** on 4/23 vs **Atl** was the first for **Jim Riggleman** as his team's full-time manager since a **1-0 Nationals win** vs the **Mariners** on 6/23/11...the Reds' **4-1 win** on 5/4 vs **Mia** was his **1,500th game** as a Major League manager...since 1900, **Riggleman** is **1 of 14 managers** to work for at least **5 Major League teams** (SD, Chc, Sea, Wsh, Cin)...**Jimmy Dykes**, **John McNamara** and **Dick Williams** each managed **6 teams**...the others who managed **5 teams** are **Chuck Dressen**, **Bucky Harris**, **Rogers Hornsby**, **Davey Johnson**, **Billy Martin**, **Bill McKechnie**, **Jack McKeon**, **Lou Piniella**, **Jeff Torborg** and **Joe Torre**.

ABOUT THE NEW GUYS: Interim manager **Jim Riggleman** managed in all or parts of **12 Major League seasons** with the **Padres**, **Cubs**, **Mariners** and **Nationals**, leading the **1998 Cubs** to the **NL Wild Card** game...interim bench coach **Pat Kelly** was in his first season as manager at Class AAA **Louisville** after spending the previous 3 years at Class AA **Pensacola**...he also managed in the Reds' system at Class A **Bakersfield** in 2014 and from 2011-2013 at **Rookie Billings**...interim pitching coach **Danny Darwin** was in his third season as **Pensacola's** pitching coach.

PLAYER DEVELOPMENT: With promotions to the Major League staff of **Pat Kelly** and **Danny Darwin**, **Dick Schofield** moved from bench coach to manager at Class AAA Louisville, roving outfield/quality control coach **Darren Bragg** joined the Louisville staff as bench coach, and minor league rehabilitation coach **James Baldwin** became Pensacola's pitching coach.

JUNE 4 DRAFT: The Reds will select **fifth overall** in the **Monday's** first-year player draft, then **47th** (2nd round), **72nd** (Competitive Balance Round B), **82nd** (3rd round) and **109th** (4th round)...the **Tigers**, **Giants**, **Phillies** and **White Sox** will pick first through fourth, respectively...Senior Director of Amateur Scouting **Chris Buckley** will be available in Great American Ball Park's **Crosley Room** following the Reds' final selection of the day...a member of the **baseball operations department** will be available soon after the team's first pick...the draft will begin at **7:00 p.m.** with the live broadcast on **MLB Network**...2018 Reds Hall of Fame inductee **Adam Dunn** will represent the organization at the draft...the draft will have **40 rounds**...**Rounds 3-10** will begin at **1:00 p.m. June 5**...**Rounds 11-40** will begin at **noon June 6**...the lists of Cin's **2017 draft picks** and **No. 1 draft picks** are on media guide pages **216-217**.

FRONT OFFICE NEWS: Reds President of Baseball Operations **Dick Williams** on 5/10 announced the promotion of **Nick Krall** to **General Manager**...**Krall** had been the club's Vice President, Assistant General Manager since November 2015...**Williams** will remain the club's President of Baseball Operations and will continue to oversee that entire department.

Matt Harvey tonight is making his fifth appearance for the Reds...will be his **eighth career** appearance and **sixth career start** vs the **Padres** and his **fourth career start** at **Petco Park**...earlier this season, while pitching for the Mets, made 2 relief apps here...the Reds won **3 of his 4 starts (1-1, 3.72)**...began the season with the **Mets** and went **0-2, 7.00** in **4 starts** and **4 relief apps** before he was **designated for assignment** on 5/5...on 5/8 was acquired by the Reds in exchange for **C Devin Mesoraco** and **cash**...from 2012-2018 for the **Mets** went **34-37, 3.66** in **104 starts** and **5 relief apps**.

RED HOTS

Luis Castillo at just **25 years old** is in his second **Major League** season...tomorrow will make his 13th start of the season and his **28th Major League** appearance and start...will be his second career appearance and start vs the **Padres**, his first appearance at **Petco Park**...his **3-game winning streak** from 5/8-5/24 (4gs, 3-0, 2.78) was the **first winning streak** of his career and the longest winning streak by a Reds pitcher this season...the Reds won **4 of his last 5 starts**...with **4 quality starts** is tied with **Tyler Mahle** for the staff lead...in his 7-2 win on 5/8 vs **NYM**, retired his **first 14 batters** before **Amed Rosario** singled with 2 outs in the fifth inning...in the **10-4 win** on 4/16 at **Mil**, took a 2-hitter and a 9-0 lead into the bottom of the seventh inning before allowing 2 runs on 3 hits and a walk...during spring training, from 3/13-3/17 spent time in New York with wife **Delores** while celebrating the birth of their first child, **Brittany**.

- In the ninth inning of the 10-inning, 2-1 win on 5/9 vs NYM entered the game as a defensive replacement in LF, then led off the bottom of the 10th with his first career walkoff HR (off AJ Ramos).
- In 2016 was a National League All-Star and in each of the 2016 and 2017 seasons was a finalist for the Rawlings Gold Glove Award.

- Was the National League Player of the Month for May and twice that month's NL Player of the Week...in May produced 8 HR and 24 RBI...in June 2017 produced 9 HR and 24 RBI...since RBI became an official statistic in 1920, is the only Reds second baseman ever to record at least 8 HR and 24 RBI in a calendar month.
- Beginning Sunday has led the National League in hitting 4 days this week, including today...no Reds batter has led the NL in batting average since Pete Rose hit .338 in 1973...the list of Reds batters who led the league in hitting is on media guide page 397.
- Ranks among the National League leaders in hitting (1st), total bases (2nd), hits (3rd), slugging percentage (3rd), multi-hit games (21, T4th), RBI (T5th), extra-base hits (T9th) and on-base percentage (10th).
- In his last 22 apps beginning 5/7 is hitting .425, including 12 multi-hit games and raising BA from .282 (37-88, 5 2b, 9hr, 25rbi, .793slg, .446obp).
- Beginning 5/7 leads the Major Leagues in hits (tied w/ Sea's Jean Segura), HR, RBI, batting average and slugging percentage while ranking third in the majors in on-base percentage.

- Hasn't struck out since 5/22 vs Pit...his 39 plate apps without a strikeout is his second-longest streak of the season (43pa w/out a K, 4/15-4/25) and the second-longest active streak in the Major Leagues (LAA's Andrelton Simmons, 58pa).
- Started at SS in 54 of the Reds' 58 games and has appeared in 56 games.
- In the batting order hit first (12gs), second (29gs), seventh (11gs) and eighth (2gs, 4/1 vs Wsh, 4/7 at Pit).
- Received consideration for the National League Player of the Week Award for 4/23-4/29, won by teammate Joey Votto...in 7g that week hit .441 with 2 HR and 5 RBI (.618slg, .457obp).

43 SCOTT SCHEBLER, of Road Trip: 4-22, 1hr, 3rbi, 3bb, 2hbp, 4r

- Hit .320 through April (3hr, 11rbi) and .200 in May (3hr, 9rbi).
- Has made a team-high 27 starts in RF, 8 starts in CF and 1 start at DH...last started in CF on 5/24 vs Pit.
- On 4/23 vs Atl made his sixth career start batting leadoff, just his second the last 2 seasons in that spot in the order...in 2017, made his only start batting leadoff on 9/21/17 vs StL.
- On 5/14 at SF fell a triple shy of becoming the sixth Reds batter to hit for the cycle... Eric Davis was the last Reds batter to do it (6/2/89 vs SD).
- From 4/9-4/19 missed 10 games (1-9) while on the 10-day disabled list with a right ulnar nerve contusion...suffered the injury in the third game of the season, when he was hit on the right elbow by a Sean Doolittle pitch.

7 EUGENIO SUÁREZ, inf Road Trip: 11-26 (.423), 1 2b, 2hr, 5rbi, 7r

- First name is pronounced Ay-you-hay-nee-oh...accent mark on the "a" in Suárez.
- Has a 4-game hitting streak, including a career-high 4 hits on Mon and 3 hits on Wed to raise his season BA from .274 to .305 (9-16, .563, 1 2b, 1hr, 3rbi, .813slg, .632obp)...in his last 10 apps is hitting .395 (15-38, 3 2b, 3hr, 11rbi).
- In May led the Major Leagues in RBI (29) while ranking T3rd in both extra-base hits (15) and HR (8)...since RBI became an official statistic in 1920, is the only Reds third baseman ever to record at least 8 HR and 29 RBI in a calendar month.
- Missed 16 games in April but still is tied with Chi's Javier Baez for the National League lead in RBI...no Reds batter has led the NL in RBI since Dave Parker drove in 125 runs in 1985...the list of Reds batters who led the league in RBI is on media guide page 397.
- Tied the franchise record for most RBI by a Reds player in his first 20 games of a season (25)...played in his 20th game on 5/8 vs NYM and produced 4 RBI to give him 25 on the season...George Crowe (1958), Vada Pinson (1962) and Ken Griffey Jr. (2006) each produced 25 RBI in his first 20 games of those respective seasons.
- From 4/9-4/25 was disabled with a fractured right thumb...suffered the injury on 4/8 at Pit, when he was hit by a Jameson Taillon pitch...missed 16 games (3-13).
- On 3/16 signed a 7-year contract extension through the 2024 season with a club option for 2025...following last season was eligible for arbitration for the first time while under team control through 2020.

19 JOEY VOTTO, 1b Road Trip: 11-27 (.407), 2 2b, 5bb, 5r

- Last night went 0-for-2 with 3 walks, snapping a 7-game hitting streak during which he hit .387 (12-31, 3 2b, .441obp).
- Reached base safely in 49 of his 57 apps, including each of his last 11 apps beginning 5/20 (14-40, .350, 3 2b, 7bb, .447obp).
- Beginning 5/22 struck out just once in his last 39 plate apps, including a streak of 28 plate apps without a strikeout snapped in the eighth inning on Tue at Ari.
- In the Reds' 58 games has made 57 apps and 55 starts...missed his 3 starts on 4/12 vs StL, 5/15 at SF and 5/24 vs Pit...missed his only full game on 4/12 vs StL, snapping at 202 games his streaks of consecutive games played and consecutive games started...prior to that 4/12 day off, had appeared in and started every Reds game since he was given the day off at StL on 9/2/16, when Ivan De Jesus Jr. played 1B...during his 202-games started streak played 1,733.1 of the Reds' 1,782.1 innings in the field (97%)...was the longest games started streak by a Reds player since Pete Rose started 370 consecutive games from 1973-1976.
- On 4/17 at Mil reached 1,000 walks in 1,446 apps, the fourth-fewest games to 1,000 walks in National League history.
- Pete Rose (1,210) is the only other player in Reds history with at least 1,000 walks... Miguel Cabrera and Albert Pujols are the only other active players in the Major Leagues with at least 1,600 hits and 1,000 walks.
- From 4/23-4/29 was the NL Player of the Week, his fifth career weekly award.
- Is approaching 1,500 career apps (1,487)...if he plays every day will reach that milestone on Sun, 6/17 at Pit.

33 JESSE WINKER, of Road Trip: 3gs in LF, 1g as PH, 0-10, 5bb

- Leads National League rookies in walks and outfield assists (3, tied) while ranking among the rookie leaders in on-base percentage (4th), hits (5th) and multi-hit games (10, T3rd)...among all NL batters ranks eighth in hitting with RISP (.357).
- In his last 12 apps is 5-for-35 (.143, .268obp).
- Has made 23 starts in RF, second on the team to Scott Schebler's 27 starts, 15 starts in LF and 1 start at DH...leads the team with 32 starts batting leadoff...on 4/12 vs StL, with Votto off, made his only career start batting third in the order.
- His career-high 9-game hitting streak from 4/18-4/27 ranks as the longest by a Reds batter this season.
- In 5 consecutive pinch-hit apps from 4/16-5/4 he walked, singled (RBI), doubled, singled and singled.
- Made his first Opening Day roster...was 1 of 5 rookies on the Opening Day roster (RHP Tyler Mahle, RHP Jackson Stephens, RHP Zack Weiss, OF Phillip Ervin).
- Was the Reds' Opening Day starter in LF...batted leadoff.
