LEADING OFF: Angels play the final contest of a 10-game trip (6-3) to Houston (2-2), Texas (2-1) & Chicago White Sox (2-0)...LAA has won four of last five, are 4-3 this month and 7-4 last 11 games...Today Angels seek seventh sweep of season and third on road...Halos are 21-24 since the break...Angels have spent last 73 days in fourth place...19 remaining games are with divisional foes: six with Texas (6 at home), six vs. Oakland (3 home, 3 road), four vs. Seattle (all at home) & three at Houston...Tomorrow, Halos return home to open a seven-game home stand vs. Rangers (Sept. 10-12) & Seattle (Sept. 13-16)...Halos are 20-20-7 in 47 series decided this season.

KNOW THIS: Last night, Joe Hudson became the 59th player to appear for LAA this season to extend the club record...He is the 15th player to make MLB debut with LAA in 2018 (also extended a club record)...Andrew Heaney is one strikeout shy of 150, would be first Halo to reach the mark since 2015 (Garrett Richards; 176 & Hector Santiago; 162).

FISH FACTS: Last night, Mike Trout went 5-for-5 with two HRs and five RBI – marked his 14th career multi-HR game, fourth this season (second in 2018 vs. CWS)...Also second career five-hit game (May 26, 2018 at NYY)...Five of Trout's eight career hits against James Shields have been HRs...On Friday Trout tied the Angels' record reaching base 4+ times for the 16th time this season to equal the mark set by Brian Downing in 1987. (STATS LLC).

SHO OFF: In his last three games, Shohei Ohtani is 7-for-12 with a triple, three HRs and nine RBI...He is riding a six-game hit streak (.455; 10/22, 10 R, 3B, 4 HR, 10 RBI) and has homered in three of four games and five of last 10 contests overall (6 HR total)...With his 19th HR Friday night, Ohtani passed Seattle's Kenji Johjima (18 HR in 144 games in 2006) for most rookie HRs by a Japanese native...Ohtani has 19 HRs in 84 non-pitching games...With next HR, he will be second-fastest Halo rookie to reach 20 HR (Wally Joyner hit 20 by his 82nd game in 1986)...With his next home run, Ohtani will be the eighth rookie in club history to reach 20 HRs...Ohtani is lone MLB player this season with multiple games of two HRs and a stolen base – ESPN STATS.

OHTANI MEDICAL UPDATE: On Wednesday, Ohtani underwent an MRI on his right elbow which revealed new damage to his ulnar collateral ligament (UCL). UCL reconstruction surgery is the recommended plan of care. Updates to come when appropriate.

DID YOU KNOW? Since August 14th, David Fletcher is batting .386 (27/70) in 17 road affairs...RHP Junichi Tazawa is the fifth Japanese native in Angels' history (Shigetoshi Hasegawa, Hideki Matsui, Hisanori Takahashi & Ohtani)...Ohtani is batting .316 (6/19) with four runs, a double, two home runs and four RBI as a pinch hitter this season - tied for A.L. lead among pinch hitters with 13 total bases (D. Palka, CWS).

YOUTH SERVED: In his last eight outings, Jaime Barria is 6-1 with 2.43 ERA (40.2 IP – 11 ER)...Has allowed one earned run or less five of last six starts...Leads MLB rookie starters with 10 wins (min. 10 GS).

PUJOLS SURGERY: On August 30th, Albert Pujols underwent an arthroscopic debridement of his left knee. A general timetable to return to playing following this procedure is 6-8 weeks...Pujols ranks 23rd all-time with 3,082 hits (Ichiro is 22nd with 3,089) and sixth all-time with 633 home runs (Willie Mays is 5th w/660 HR)...He is one of four players with 3,000 hits & 600 HR (Mays, Hank Aaron & ARod).

2019 SCHEDULE: Angels' highlights of the 2019 schedule include a two-game series (May 4-5) against Houston at Estadio de Béisbol in Monterrey, Mexico...LAA heads south of the border for first time since 2000 when hosting an exhibition game vs. Arizona in Hermosillo, Mexico...Angels previously played internationally in San Juan, Puerto Rico for a three-game series with Montreal in 2003...Matching up against the N.L. Central for interleague play, LAA faces St. Louis at Busch Stadium (June 21-23), Albert Pujols' first visit to St. Louis as an opponent.

HI, MY NAME IS... 59 players (35 pitchers-15 starters) have appeared in 2018 to set single-season franchise marks (MLB record for players used is 64 by 2014 Texas Rangers)...15 players have made MLB debuts in 2018 breaking team record of 12 (1996 & 1975).

THE NEW ME: In 68 games in return from D.L., Kole Calhoun is batting .277 (69/249) with 52 runs, 14 doubles, a triple, 17 HRs & 44 RBI (hit .145 with 1 HR and 11 RBI over first 50 games)...Calhoun's 17 HRs since June 18th rank tied for fourth in A.L.

TROUT TRIFECTA: Trout is the first player in MLB history with three seasons of 25 home runs, 20 stolen bases and 100 walks by age-26 season-or- younger...Joins Jeff Bagwell (3), Bobby Abreu (3) & Barry Bonds (7) as only players with at least three such seasons in career.

GOLD STANDARD: Three-time Gold Glover Andrelton Simmons leads MLB shortstops with 209 putouts and has second fewest errors (8) in junior circuit among shortstops (min. 100 GS)...Leads MLB with a 16.1 Ultimate Zone Rating in 2018 (UZR) – FanGraphs...Since 2015, his 95 defensive runs saved (DRS) also lead MLB...Thru 910 career games, Simmons' defensive WAR is 25.0 – best by any shortstop in MLB history.

GLOVE STORY: With 67 errors committed, Angels are on pace to break club record for fewest miscues in a full campaign (80 set last season)...Fewest in a strike-shortened season is 76 in 1994...Club ranks fourth in A.L. with .987 fielding pct...Halos lead MLB turning 154 double plays (team record is 203 in 1985)...Catchers own a 40.6 caught stealing pct. (28 of 69), tops in A.L...Mike Trout is only CF in MLB (min. 70 G) with a 1.000 fielding pct...Kole Calhoun's 27 OF assists since 2016 lead A.L.

BULLPEN BITS: 3.70 bullpen ERA ranks sixth in A.L...Halo relievers lead MLB in inherited runners scored pct. allowing just 22.0 % to score (49 of 223)...Bullpen has logged 538 IP, second in A.L. to Tampa Bay...Since 2016, Jose Alvarez's 198 games pitched lead A.L. (164.2 IP)...Over last two seasons (2017-18), Alvarez is tied for A.L. lead with 134 games pitched and Blake Parker ranks tied for third in the span (132 games pitched).

THIS N' THAT: 35 players are on Angels' current active roster...Club is 19-26 when lefty starts (51-46 vs. RHP)...LAA had a club-record 15 players on D.L. simultaneously twice this season...Halos sent 25 different players to D.L., most in MLB this season...Angels are one of seven teams in A.L. with a positive run differential (+41)...Halos' 186 HRs hit rank fifth in A.L...Andrelton Simmons leads MLB in PA per 50 at 15.76 (536 PA/34 K) - also ranks second in MLB batting .296 (50/169) with two strikes...Mike Scioscia (1,640 wins) ranks 18th on the all-time managerial wins list (Jim Leyland 17th with 1,769)...Trout leads the Majors with 111 walks...Ohtani is the first player in MLB history with 15+ HR & 50+ pitching Ks in same season (STATS).

TWO KIDS: Mike Trout & Willie Mays are only players with three 30 HR/20 SB seasons by age-26 season-or-younger (Trout is only player in A.L. history)...Trout turned age 27 on August 7th...His 62.7 career WAR is currently second-highest all time by a position player through age-26 season (Ty Cobb, 63.4).

HOT HALOS: Ohtani is batting .368 (28/76) with three doubles, a triple, 10 home runs, 28 RBI, 22 runs scored and six stolen bases over his last 27 games (raised average from .267 to .290 in span)...Over his last five starts, Felix Pena has posted a 2.81 ERA (32 IP – 10 ER)...Andrelton Simmons has 10 RBI his last 10 games (3 HR last 8 G)...Jose Fernandez has hit safely in 14 of 20 games with Angels this season (hits in 11 of 14 starts)...19 of last 22 outings for Justin Anderson are scoreless...David Fletcher has hits 19 of last 22 games (10 multi-hit efforts) and is batting .356 (32/90) with 17 runs, six doubles, a triple and 11 RBI in span...Jose Alvarez has not been scored upon in 18 of last 20 outings (1.02 ERA; 17.2 IP – 2 ER)...Mike Trout has successfully reached base in 23 of his last 24 games with 21 runs, eight home runs, 18 RBI and 27 walks in that span.

@ WHITE SOX: Angels lead 2018 season series 4-2...LAA has won 16 of last 19 meetings at home but have dropped nine of last 14 in Chicago...Angels are 36-20 overall vs. CWS since 2011.

RANGERS ON DECK: Halos lead 2018 season series 8-5 (3-1 at home)...Six games remain with Texas (all at home)...Angels are 29-19 in Arlington since 2014...David Fletcher is batting .414 (12/29) against Texas this season.

THIS DATE IN ANGELS HISTORY

September 9

(1971) Second baseman Billy Parker becomes the first player in MLB history to hit a 'walk-off' home run in his MLB debut...The HR comes with two outs in the 12th frame; (1989) Devon White stole for the cycle (2B, 3B, Home) in an 8-5 win over Boston, only player in club history to do so; (2012) Mike Trout hits a lead-off homer for the second straight game in a win vs. Detroit, 3-2.

September 10

(2008) Angels clinched their fourth division crown in five seasons and seventh overall...The Sept. 10 clinch date (Game #145) earliest any A.L. West team ever clinched the division; (1986, '88, '89) Angels were involved in three "marathon" games on this same date: the 7-6 win in 14 innings at Cleveland in 1986, a 3-2 loss in 17 innings at Texas in 1988, and a 2-1 win in 14 innings vs. Texas at Anaheim Stadium in 1989

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER – LHP ANDREW HEANEY

8-9, 4.16 ERA

First start vs. White Sox since Aug. 17, 2015

- **BACK ON THE MOUND:** Making 27th start of the season and 15th on the road...Opened the year on the disabled list with left elbow inflammation (missed Angels first 14 games).
- **APPROACHING 150K:** Is one strikeout shy of 150 on the season...Would be first Angels pitcher to reach the mark since 2015, when **Garrett Richards** (176) and **Hector Santiago** (162) both topped the plateau.
- **ROCKY ROAD:** In 14 road starts this season, is 1-6 with a 5.02 ERA (80.2 IP – 45 ER)...Road victory on Aug. 30 at Houston was his first since Sept. 2, 2015 at Oakland; streak of 17 straight road starts without a win is the longest in Angels history (previous was 16 by **Rudy May** from 1965-69)...It was also the longest active streak in the Majors.
- **HOT AT HOME:** In last 11 starts at Angel Stadium, is 7-2 with a 2.59 ERA (73 IP – 21 ER) and 66 strikeouts...**His home ERA ranks third in the American League in that span** (since April 27); additionally, his seven home wins are fourth-most in the Major Leagues in that span.
- **CAREER HIGHS:** Has set new career highs in wins, starts, strikeouts and innings pitched this season.
- **LEFT OUT:** Has not allowed a home run to a left-handed batter since April 5, 2016 (**Anthony Rizzo**)...Since that game, he ranks second among A.L. starters with 169 left-handed batters faced without allowing a homer behind only **Chris Sale** (STATS LLC).
- **RECENT QUALITY:** Has registered quality starts in nine of last 15 outings, including five straight from July 3-27...Has been charged with two-or-fewer earned runs in 13 of last 24 starts, while pitching to a 3.81 ERA (148.2 IP – 63 ER) in that span...During eight game stretch from April 27 – June 5, pitched to a 1.93 ERA (51.1 IP – 11 ER).
- **LAST TIME OUT:** Charged with loss in last start on Tuesday at Texas after tossing six innings and allowing four earned runs on seven hits with one walk and five strikeouts.
- **GOING DEEP:** Is first Angels pitcher to have four starts of 8+ IP in a season since **C.J. Wilson** in 2015.
- **FIRST PITCH SWINGING:** Opponents have swung at the first pitch 31.3% of the time vs. Heaney, which is the ninth highest rate in the American League.
- **INSIDE THE PARK:** Allowed just one home run during an eight start span from April 27 – June 5 (51.1 IP), but has allowed 17 home runs across 16 starts since.
- **VS. CHICAGO (A.L.):** In two career starts against the White Sox, is 0-0 with a 2.31 ERA (11.2 IP – 3 ER); both previous starts came during 2015 season.
- **AT GUARANTEED RATE FIELD:** Is 0-0 with a 3.18 ERA (5.2 IP – 2 ER)...Did not factor in decision in only previous game at the ballpark on Aug. 12, 2015 (5.2 IP, 6 H, 2 ER, 1 BB, 4 SO).
- **MONTH OF JULY:** Finished July with a 2-1 record and 2.88 ERA (34.1 IP – 11 ER) in five starts...In 10 career starts in the month of July, is 6-1 with a 3.03 ERA (65.1 IP – 22 ER)...In last nine July starts, is pitching to a 2.48 ERA (61.2 IP – 17 ER).
- **BACK-TO-BACK 10K:** Recorded career-high 10 strikeouts in consecutive starts on July 3 at Seattle and July 8 vs. Dodgers...He is the first Angels pitcher with consecutive 10+ strikeout games since **Matt Shoemaker** (May 21 & 27, 2016).
- **FIRST HALF RECAP:** Finished the first half with a 5-6 record and 3.78 ERA (102.1 IP – 43 ER) in 17 starts for the Angels...Led Angels pitching staff in inning pitched and ranked second on the club with 102 strikeouts before the Break.
- **HAPPY BIRTHDAY:** Tossed a one-hit shutout on June 5 (his 27th birthday) vs. Kansas City...Marked first complete game and shutout of career...First shutout by an Angel since **Ricky Nolasco** on July 1, 2017 vs. Seattle...It was the first CG one-hitter for Angels since **Ervin Santana** on June 16, 2012 vs. Arizona...First Angels lefty with a one-hit shutout since **Chuck Finley** on May 26, 1989 at Boston...Became first Major Leaguer to throw a one-hit shutout on his birthday since Cardinals' **Vicente Palacios** on July 19, 1994 at Houston...First Angel to throw a shutout on his birthday since **Andy Messersmith** on August 6, 1971 vs. Minnesota.
- **9 K's IN 5 IP:** On April 27 vs. New York (A.L.), became first Angels pitcher with 9+ strikeouts in five-or-fewer innings since **Hector Santiago** on July 20, 2015 (Game 1) vs. Boston.
- **STARTING NINE:** With first start of year on April 13, became ninth different starting pitcher used by Angels this season...Nine different starting pitchers through the first 15 games of a season set a new Angels record and were the most by any team since the 1960 Orioles. (STATS LLC)
- **OFFSEASON TRIPS:** Participates in offseason humanitarian mission trip to Honduras each offseason along with several other Major League and Minor League players to help build a new learning center, distribute new backpacks and shoes and teach kids the basics of baseball.
- **CAREER NOTES:** Originally selected by Miami in first round (ninth overall) of 2012 First-Year Player Draft...On Dec. 10, 2014, was traded twice in one day; Was first sent by Miami to Dodgers along with C/INF **Austin Barnes**, RHP **Chris Hatcher** and OF **Enrique Hernandez** in exchange for INF **Dee Gordon**, RHP **Dan Haren**, INF **Miguel Rojas** and cash considerations...Later that day was dealt by Dodgers to Angels for INF **Howie Kendrick**.
