Among all Reds players during his time here (5/27/08 - 7/31/16), **Jay Bruce** ranked first in games, HR, RBI, extra-base hits and triples; second in doubles, slugging percentage, walks, total bases and runs; and third in hits, game-winning RBI and times on base.

HR DERBY CHAMPION

In 2015 at Great American Ball Park, **Todd Frazier** became the third Reds player to win the All-Star Game's Home Run Derby and only the second player ever to win it at his home field (Chi's **Ryne Sandberg**, 1990)... **Frazier** defeated **Prince Fielder** (14-13), **Josh Donaldson** (10-9) and then **Joc Pederson** on a walkoff (15-14)...listed below are Reds' All-Star Game Home Run Derby participants:

TODAY'S GAME: Is **Game 3** (1-1) of a 3-game series vs **Jay Horwitz' Mets** and **Game 9** (2-6) of a 9-game homestand that included the **Brewers'** first 3-game sweep here since **July 2015** and a **2-1 series loss** to the **Marlins**... is **Game 16** (6-9) of a stretch in which the Reds will play **13 of 16 games** at **Great American Ball Park** (2-2 vs Atl, 2-1 at Min, 0-3 vs Mil, 1-2 vs Mia, 1-1 vs NYM)...tomorrow night the Redlegs begin a 7-game road trip on the **West Coast** at LAD's **Dodger Stadium** (4g) and at SF's **AT&T Park** (3g).

TRADE WINDS: Yesterday the Reds acquired from the New York Mets **RHP Matt Harvey** (#32) in exchange for **C Devin Mesoraco** and cash... **Harvey** went **0-2, 7.00** in 4 starts and 4 relief apps for NYM before he was designated for assignment on **Saturday**...he is expected to join the team during the upcoming series in **Los Angeles**.

SERIES NOTES: At **.640** (32-18) the Mets have the highest winning percentage at **Great American Ball Park** of any team in the National League, including the **Reds (631-603-1, .511)**...beginning **9/24/13** the Reds have lost **24** of the **last 30 games** vs NYM (**0-2** in 2013, **2-4** in 2014, **0-7** in 2015, **0-6** in 2016, **3-4** in 2017, **1-1** in 2018), including a **14-game losing streak** from **9/7/14-9/7/16** that ranks as Cin's **longest ever** vs the Mets and its longest vs any team since a **16-game skid vs Ari** from **5/8/01-8/13/03**... dating back to **1962**, the **7-0 series win** by the Mets in **2015** was the **first season series sweep** by either team, followed by NY's **6-0 series win** in **2016**...**Reds vs Mets** info, media guide **Page 325**.

DODGERS UP NEXT: In the **last 6 series** over the **last 3 seasons**, the Reds went **0-5-1 vs LAD** (1-3 at LA, 0-3 at Cin, 0-3 at LA, 2-2 at Cin, 0-3 at LA, 0-3 at Cin)...Cin has lost **17** of its **last 20 games vs LAD**, including each of the **last 8 games**... dating back to a 10-3 win on **8/13/15**, the Reds have lost their **last 9 games** at **Dodger Stadium** and were swept in each of the **last 2 series there**...since a **3-game series sweep** in **June 2011**, the Reds have lost the **last 6 series** at **Dodger Stadium** (1-2 in 2012, 1-3 in 2013, 1-2 in 2014, 1-3 in 2015, 0-3 in 2016, 0-3 in 2017)...**Reds vs Dodgers** information is on media guide **Page 322**.

FOLLOWED BY THE GIANTS: The Reds won the first 4 games of the 2017 season series vs SF but lost the last 3 games... the **31 runs scored** in the Reds' 13-3, 14-2 and 4-0 wins from **5/5-5/7** of last season at **Great American Ball Park** was their highest total for any **3-game series** since they scored **32 runs** from **8/19-8/21 vs Ari, 2005**...beginning with the **2008 season** the Reds are **40-27 vs SF** (.597), the best winning percentage of any Giants opponent since then (minimum 50 games) and including **29-19** (.604) over the **last 7 seasons**...**Reds vs Giants** information is on media guide **Page 330**.

WE LEAVE OUR HEARTS...: Beginning **6/29/12**, including that 2012 season's **National League Division Series**, the Redlegs have won **15** of the last **23 meetings** at SF's **AT&T Park**...the Giants' 17-inning, 3-2 win there on **5/12/2016** was the Reds' longest game by inning since a **19-inning**, 5-4 loss on **5/25/2011 at Phi** and the second-longest game in the history of **AT&T Park (5/29/2001, 1-0 Giants loss vs Diamondbacks in 18 innings)**...from **6/26-6/29, 2014**, the Reds outscored the Giants, **20-6**, in the first **4-game series sweep** ever by an opponent at **AT&T Park**.

IN A PINCH: In his **last 5 pinch-hit apps**, **Jesse Winker** walked, singled (RBI), doubled, singled and singled...he is the first Reds batter to **reach base safely in 5 consecutive pinch-hit apps** since **Todd Frazier** did it from **4/20-5/2, 2012** and the first Reds batter to **produce a hit in 4 straight pinch-hit apps** since **Brayan Pena** from **7/8-8/9, 2014**...courtesy Elias.

REHABBING: RHP **Michael Lorenzen** (right shoulder strain) **tomorrow** is scheduled to throw 1.0 inning (20 pitches) in an extended spring training game at the team's player development complex in **Goodyear**...RHP **Anthony DeSclafani** (left oblique strain) **this afternoon** is scheduled to pitch in an extended spring training game in **Goodyear** (3ip, 45-50 pitches).

APRIL 19: The Reds are **6-12** since **4/19**, when they replaced manager **Bryan Price** and pitching coach **Mack Jenkins**... bench coach **Jim Riggleman** became interim manager, Class AAA Louisville manager **Pat Kelly** (#60) was promoted to serve as interim bench coach, and Class AA Pensacola pitching coach **Danny Darwin** (#52) joined the Reds' Major League staff as interim pitching coach...later in the year, the team will conduct a thorough managerial search for a permanent replacement...**Price** went **279-387** (.419) in his 5 seasons as manager, including **3-15 this year**.

7-YEAR ITCH: The **10-4 Reds victory** on **4/23 vs Atl** was the first for **Jim Riggleman** as his team's full-time manager since a **1-0 Nationals win** vs the **Mariners** on **6/23/11**...since 1900, he is **1 of 14 managers** to work for **at least 5 Major League teams** (SD, Chc, Sea, Wsh, Cin)...**Jimmy Dykes**, **John McNamara** and **Dick Williams** each managed **6 teams**... the others who managed **5 teams** are **Chuck Dressen**, **Bucky Harris**, **Rogers Hornsby**, **Davey Johnson**, **Billy Martin**, **Bill McKechnie**, **Jack McKeon**, **Lou Piniella**, **Jeff Torborg** and **Joe Torre**.

THE NEW GUYS: Interim manager **Jim Riggleman** managed in all or parts of **12 Major League seasons** with the **Padres**, **Cubs**, **Mariners** and **Nationals**, leading the **1998 Cubs** to the **NL Wild Card** game...the Reds' **4-1 win** on **5/4 vs Mia** was his **1,500th game** as a Major League manager...interim bench coach **Pat Kelly** was in his first season as manager at Class AAA **Louisville** after spending the previous 3 years at Class AA **Pensacola**...he also managed in the Reds' system at Class A **Bakersfield** in 2014 and from 2011-2013 at **Rookie Billings**...interim pitching coach **Danny Darwin** was in his third season as **Pensacola's** pitching coach.

YOUNGSTERS: The Reds' **33 Major League debuts** over the **last 3 seasons** are the most of any team in either league and include **4 this season (3B Alex Blandino** on 4/10 at Phi, **RHP Tanner Rainey** on 4/10 at Phi, **RHP Zack Weiss** on 4/12 vs StL, **IF/OF Rosell Herrera** on 4/26 vs Atl)...have **5 rookies** on the active roster (**Blandino**, **Herrera**, **OF Jesse Winker**, **RHP Tyler Mahle**, **RHP Jackson Stephens**) and another rookie on the disabled list (**RHP Rookie Davis**)...the Reds' **Opening Day roster** included **5 rookies (Mahle, Stephens, Weiss, Ervin, Winker)**, **21 players age 30 & under**, **17 players age 27 & under** and **11 players age 25 & under**...according to **Elias Sports Bureau**, the average age for the Reds' 25-man **Opening Day roster (27 years, 196 days)** was the second-youngest in the Major Leagues behind the **Phillies (26.334)** and ahead of the **Marlins (27.351)**.

RED HOTS

Sal Romano at just **24 years old** is in his **second Major League season**...this afternoon is making his eighth start of the season and his **24th Major League** appearance and start...will be his **third career appearance** vs the **Mets**...was born in **Syosset, NY** and graduated from **Southington (CT) High School**...in 2017, in his Major League debut made 16 starts during 3 stints with the Reds...made spot starts in April and in early July before joining the rotation for good after the All-Star break...during the second half led Reds pitchers in innings (79.0) while tying Homer Bailey for the staff lead in starts (14)...in his last 8 starts of the season for the Reds went 3-3, 3.17 with 4 quality starts...overall after the All-Star break went 4-7, 4.44 in his 14 starts...the Reds went 7-9 in his 16 starts.

Tomorrow at Dodgers - #30 Tyler Mahle, RHP

RED HOTS

Tyler Mahle's last name rhymes with **RALLY**...at just **23 years old** is in his **second Major League season**...tomorrow night at LAD will make his eighth start of the season, the 12th appearance and start of his **career**...will be his first career appearance vs the **Dodgers**...leads the Major Leagues in strikeouts among all pitchers **age 23 and younger**...his career-high **11 strikeouts** on **4/24 vs Atl** are the most by a Reds pitcher this season...leads the staff with **4 quality starts**...in the 12-inning, 9-7 win on **4/24 vs Atl**, took a 5-0 lead and a no-hitter into the seventh before **Freddie Freeman** led off the inning with a solo HR...was the victim of a **blown save** when the Braves tied it at 7-7 with 4 runs in the ninth inning off **Amir Garrett** and **Raisel Iglesias**, including a second HR by **Freeman**, but the Reds won it on **Scouter Gennett's** 2-run, walkoff HR off **Max Fried**...pitched into the seventh inning for the first time in his career, then recorded 1 out in the seventh of his next start (4/29 at Min)...his third-inning single in the 5-0 loss on **4/8 at Pit** was the only Reds hit in **Jameson Taillon's** first career complete game...was the first **Reds pitcher** to record the team's only hit in a game hit since **Earl Yingling** did it on **9/19/1914 at Brooklyn Robins**...was 1 of 5 rookies on the **Opening Day roster** (RHP **Jackson Stephens**, RHP **Zack Weiss**, OF **Phillip Ervin**, OF **Jesse Winker**) and the only rookie to begin this season in the Reds' starting rotation...when he earned the 1-0 win in his season debut on 4/2 vs Cubs, at **23 years, 185 days** was the youngest pitcher in the Major Leagues with a victory.

RED HOTS

Brandon Finnegan on **4/14** turned **25 years old** but already is in his fifth Major League season...Fri at LAD will make his sixth start of the season...will be his third career appearance and start vs the **Dodgers** and his second career appearance at **Dodger Stadium**...made his only other appearance there in a 1-0 loss on **5/23/16**, when he and **Clayton Kershaw** each threw a complete game...**Finnegan's** complete game was the first by a **Reds lefthanded pitcher** **Lance Davis** beat the **Tigers** on **7/16/01** at Cin's **Cinergy Field**, snapping a streak in which **25 Reds lefthanders** had made **339 regular season starts** without finishing a game...**Finnegan's** complete game there in **May 2016** was the last complete game thrown by a **Reds lefthanded pitcher**...since then, **4 Reds lefthanders** (**Finnegan**, **Cody Reed**, **Amir Garrett**, **John Lamb**) have made **66 starts** without a CG.

- In 18 apps beginning 4/18 is hitting .295 (18-61, .410slg, .362obp), including a career-high 9-game hitting streak from 4/18-4/27 that ranks as the longest by a Reds batter this season.
- Tue vs NYM went 0-for-5, snapping a career-high streak in which he had reached base safely in 22 consecutive apps (21-71, .296, .386obp)...is the longest on-base streak by a Reds batter this season and when snapped was the second-longest active on-base streak in the Major Leagues (Phi's Odubel Herrera, 35g).
- In his last 5 pinch-hit apps walked, singled (RBI), doubled, singled and singled.
