HERE'S THE STORY

- ♦ The D-backs are 7-3 in their last 10 home games vs. NL East opponents and 12-5 in their last 17 overall games vs. NL East.
- ♦ The D-backs have won/tied their last 5 home series vs. Braves (2017: 2-1; 2016: 2-2; 2015: 2-1; 2014: 2-1; 2013: 2-1).
- ♦ 13 of the D-backs last 16 games have been decided by 3 runs or fewer: 1 run - 8 times; 2 runs - 3 times; 3 runs - twice.
- ♦ **Zack Greinke**, who needs 4 strikeouts to tie Luis Tiant (2,416) for 43rd place on the all-time list, is 3-2 with a 1.86 ERA (8 ER in 38.2 IP) in his last 6 home starts...overall, has allowed 2 or fewer runs in 13 of 14 starts @ Chase Field...won on July 14 @ Braves, tossing 7.2 scoreless innings...in 9 career starts vs. Braves, is 4-1 with a 2.56 ERA (17 ER in 59.2 IP).
- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt**, in his last 25 games, is hitting .385 (37-for-96)/1.136 OPS with 8 doubles, 7 home runs, 20 RBI and 10 walks. • Has reached base safely in 38 of his last 39 games.
- ♦ **David Peralta**, in his last 18 home games, is batting .481 (37-for-77)/.500 OBP/.800 SLG with 8 doubles, 5 homers and 14 RBI.
- ♦ **Ketel Marte** has reached base via hit or walk in 17 straight home starts (hit safely in 15 contests), hitting .400 (24-for-60)/1.110 OPS with 3 doubles, 2 triples, 2 homers, 10 RBI and 11 walks.
- ♦ D-backs starters, in their last 17 home starts (12 quality), are 8-4 with a 2.45 ERA (29 ER in 106.1 IP), .193 opponent average and 130 strikeouts (11.0 K/9.0 IP).

LAST NIGHT'S RECAP

- ♦ The D-backs won, 6-0, vs. Padres to split the series.
- ♦ **Robbie Ray** tossed 6.1 scoreless innings with 2 hits and 10 strikeouts...it was his second outing this season with 6.0+ shut-out frames (also: June 27 @ Marlins).
- ♦ **Ketel Marte** went 2-for-3 with 1 RBI and 1 walk...**Nick Ahmed** had a RBI triple.

ROSTER MOVES

- ♦ The D-backs acquired INF/OF **Patrick Kivlehan** (KIV-luh-han) (@PatrickKivlehan) from the New York Mets and selected his contract from Triple-A Reno...in a corresponding move, OF **Jarrold Dyson** was transferred to the 60-day disabled list (strained right groin)...the D-backs' 40-man roster remains at 40.

DELIVERANCE

- ♦ MLB overturned an official scorer's decision from August 31.
- ♦ The decision, made on Ketel Marte's plate appearance in the top of the eighth inning, overturns an E-1 to a hit for Marte.
- ♦ With the change, Marte's average is now .252 (116-for-458).

GOLDY NAMED D-BACKS ROBERTO CLEMENTE AWARD NOMINEE

- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt** is the D-backs' nominee for MLB's 2018 Roberto Clemente Award, his fifth consecutive nomination.
- ♦ The award is the annual recognition of a player from each MLB Club who best represents the game of Baseball through extraordinary character, community involvement, philanthropy and positive contributions, both on and off the field.
- ♦ Fans are encouraged to vote at mlb.com/clemente21.

THE LONGEST YARD

- ♦ The D-backs have 23 games remaining (13 home/10 away) and their opponents' combined .543 winning pct. is higher than the Rockies (.524) and Dodgers (.500) [source: ESPN.com].
 - 15 games vs. NL West foes: 7 vs. Rockies (4 on road/3 @ home), 3 vs. Padres (on road), 3 vs. Dodgers (@ home).
 - 10 games vs. first place teams from other divisions: 4 vs. Braves (@ home), 3 vs. Astros (on road), 3 vs. Cubs (@ home).

EVENING SHADE

- ♦ The D-backs' 3.51 ERA (488 ER in 1,253.0 IP) ranks third in the Majors behind the Astros (3.08) and Dodgers (3.43) and ahead of the Red Sox (3.62) and Rays (3.68)...their .233 opponent average is fifth in the Majors behind the Astros (.216), Rays (.229), Braves (.231) and Dodgers (.232).
- ♦ Arizona's 3.53 ERA and .233 opponent average are currently the lowest single-season marks in club history:
 - **LOWEST SINGLE-SEASON ERA BY D-BACKS: 3.53 – 2018**; 3.66 – 2017; 3.77 – 1999; 3.80 – 2011; 3.84 – 2003.
 - **LOWEST SINGLE-SEASON OPPONENT AVERAGE BY D-BACKS: .233 – 2018**; .240 – 2017; .247 – 2001, '02; .249 – 1999.

TOUCHING ALL THE BASES

HISPANIC HERITAGE DAY, presented by Bud Light, SEPT. 8...will feature a pregame D-backs Fiesta, presented by APS, starting at 2 p.m. with live music by La Máxima Sonora, Folklorico dancers, Mariachi performers, games, food trucks and the Budweiser Beer Garden Experience plus a special appearance by La Liga Mexicana del Pacífico...fans can check out oversized sugar skulls created by artist Robert Ramírez in La Terraza...Univision Deportes host Lindsay Casinelli will throw out the ceremonial first pitch...D-backs players and coaches will wear Los D-backs jerseys for the 11th consecutive season and will also wear Ponlé Acento shirts during batting practice.

- ♦ Among all teams pitching staffs since 2017, the D-backs are third with a 3.59 ERA, fourth with 1,181 runs allowed, fifth with a .237 opponent average and sixth with 2,726 strikeouts. ERA: 3.40 Dodgers; 3.53 Indians; **3.59 D-backs**; 3.64 Astros; 3.67 Red Sox RUNS: 1,111 Dodgers; 1,123 Indians; 1,160 Astros; **1,181 D-backs**; 1,211 Red Sox OPP AVG: .229 Astros; .230 Dodgers; .231 Yankees; .236 Rays; **.237 D-backs** STRIKEOUTS: 3,063 Astros; 2,973 Yankees; 2,935 Red Sox; 2,918 Indians; 2,890 Dodgers; **2,726 D-backs**

GUNSMOKE

- ♦ Arizona's rotation's 1.74 ERA (13 ER in 67.1 IP) in its last 11 games is the Majors best ERA since August 25, ahead of the Mets (2.23), Giants (2.47), Cardinals (2.51) and Royals (2.63).
- ♦ Since July 22, D-backs starters lead the Majors with a 2.75 ERA (77 ER in 252.0 IP) ahead of the Dodgers (2.97), Cardinals (2.98), Indians (3.17), Mets (3.24) and Braves (3.38)...also lead with a .211 opponent average ahead of the Braves (.218), Dodgers (.222), Mets (.227) and Rays (.231)...and rank second with 272 strikeouts, behind the Indians (289) and ahead of the Mets (268), Yankees (259), Astros (249) and Dodgers (249).

SMOKEY AND THE BANDIT

- ♦ Since 2008, **Yoshihisa Hirano's** 1.98 ERA (13 ER in 59.0 IP) is third among NL rookie relievers in a season:

- ♦ Hirano's 1.98 ERA is the lowest by a D-backs rookie reliever, ahead of Jose Valverde (2.15 in 2003), while his 66 appearances are tied for fourth most (also: Andrew Chafin in 2015), behind Lance Cormier (67 in 2005), Jake Barrett (68 in 2016) and Oscar Villarreal (85 in 2003).
- ♦ Finally, Hirano's 2.02 ERA is the second lowest by a Japanese reliever in their rookie season:

BOOGIE NIGHTS

- ♦ The D-backs lead the Majors with 115 first-inning runs, ahead of the Indians (102), Mariners (100), Yankees (96) and Rockies (95)...the D-backs' .295 average, .379 on-base pct. and .903 OPS in the first inning are also best in the Majors.
- ♦ The D-backs' 115 runs in the first inning are the second most in team history, trailing the 1999 club (125).

TOMORROW'S STARTER: LHP PATRICK CORBIN (10-5, 3.06)

- ♦ Tossed 5.0 shutout frames (3 H, 1 BB, 7 K) in his last start on September 1 @ Dodgers.
- ♦ Has allowed 3 runs or less in each of his last 6 starts, going 3-1 with a 2.35 ERA (10 ER in 38.1 IP), .206 opponent average and 48 strikeouts (11.27 K/9.0 IP).
- ♦ Has 5 straight quality starts at home, since June 29, going 2-0 with a 2.01 ERA (7 ER in 31.1 IP), .226 opponent average and 36 strikeouts.
- ♦ In 6 career starts (4 quality) vs. Braves, is 3-1 with a 1.91 ERA (8 ER in 37.2 IP), .222 opponent average and 32 strikeouts.

GREINKE AT A GLANCE

- ◆ Third season with the D-backs.
- ◆ Is a 5-time All-Star (2009, '14-15, '17-18), won 3 NL Rawlings® Gold Gloves (2014-16) and earned a Louisville Slugger® Silver Slugger™ in 2013.
- ◆ Won the 2009 AL Cy Young Award and finished runner-up in 2015 race to the Cubs' Jake Arrieta.
- ◆ 1 of 3 pitchers all-time with a Cy Young, Silver Slugger and Gold Glove (also: Fernando Valenzuela and Orel Hershiser).
- ◆ Won 2 ERA titles: 2009 (2.16) & 2015 (1.66)...1.66 ERA was the lowest in the Majors since Atlanta's Greg Maddux (1.63) in 1995...6 career 200+ strikeout seasons (2009, '11-12, '14-15, '17).

WHAT TO KNOW...

- ◆ Needs 5 strikeouts to pass Luis Tiant (2,416) and move into sole possession of 43rd place on the all-time list.
- ◆ Is looking for back-to-back wins at home for the first time since April 19-30.

LAST START

- ◆ Suffered the loss on Aug. 31 @ Dodgers, allowing 3 earned runs on 6 hits in 7.1 innings.

VS. BRAVES

- ◆ Owns a 4-1 record with a 2.56 ERA (17 ER in 59.2 IP) over 9 career starts.
- ◆ Has allowed 2 runs or fewer in 6 of his last 7 starts vs. Braves (1.87 ERA; 10 ER in 48.2 IP).
- ◆ Earned the win on July 14 @ SunTrust Park, allowing just 4 hits and no runs over 7.2 innings.

VS. NL EAST

- ◆ In 48 career starts is 28-6 with a 2.71 ERA (93 ER in 309.1 IP).
- ◆ His .829 win percentage vs. NL East is the highest among starting pitchers since 2004, ahead of Jon Lester (.767) and Max Scherzer (.722) [min 40 starts].
- ◆ Has gone 3-2 with a 1.74 ERA (8 ER in 41.1 IP) over his 6 starts this season.

ON THE LEADERBOARD

- ◆ Ranks among NL leaders in walks per 9.0 IP (2nd, 1.79), strikeout-to-walk ratio (4th, 5.03), innings (4th, 176.0), WHIP (5th, 1.05), ERA (6th, 2.97), strikeouts (7th, 176) and wins (7th, 13).

PLAYER PROFILE

- ◆ Is an avid fantasy football player.
- ◆ Was a tennis prodigy at 8 years old.
- ◆ 2002 Gatorade National Baseball Player of the Year at Apopka (Fla.) High School...played shortstop...transitioned to pitcher as a senior.
- ◆ Began his career at Rookie level as a shortstop and pitcher...after just 1 workout, he gave his infielder glove to Andres Blanco because he decided to become a pitcher.
- ◆ During his 2004 rookie season with the Royals, lived with Hall of Famer George Brett.
- ◆ Gave his 2009 AL Cy Young Award to his parents but kept the samurai sword Mizuno presented him in recognition of his season.
- ◆ Committed to Clemson University.

HOME SWEET HOME

- ◆ In 45 home starts as a D-back, is 24-9 with a 3.19 ERA (100 ER in 282.0 IP), a .225 opponent average and 273 strikeouts.
- ◆ Is 6-3 with a 2.16 ERA (21 ER in 87.1 IP) and a .199 opponent average with 87 strikeouts in 14 starts @ Chase Field this season.
- ◆ Has allowed 2 runs or fewer in each of his last 6 home starts, posting a 1.86 ERA (8 ER in 38.2 IP).

RIGHT ON

- ◆ Has held righties to a .196 average (11-for-56) over his last 5 starts.

CLIMBING THE K CHARTS

- ◆ His 2,412 career strikeouts are 44th on the all-time strikeout list...needs 3 strikeouts to tie Luis Tiant (43rd; 2,416)

THE CHASE IS ON

- ◆ Ranks sixth among NL starts with a 34.5 chase pct. (swings at pitches outside the zone).
- ◆ Jacob deGrom/NYM (38.7) is first, followed by Patrick Corbin/ARI (37.2), Alex Wood/LAD (36.0), Miles Mikolas/STL (35.9) and Max Scherzer/WSH (35.2).

PITCHER OF THE MONTH

- ◆ Named NL Pitcher of the Month for July after going 4-0 with a 1.60 ERA (6 ER in 33.2 IP), .208 opponent average, 35 strikeouts and 5 walks in 5 starts.
