- Corpus Christi defeated Tulsa last night, 2-0, behind a combined 2-hit shutout from RHP Joe Musgrove (0ER/5IP) and RHP Keegan Yuhl (0ER/4IP).
- HOU's 2015 Minor League Pitcher of the Year, Musgrove allowed 1 hit and no walks in his 5.0 IP, striking out 4...threw a 1st-pitch strike to all 16 batters he faced.
- Yuhl, the Astros 35th round pick in the 2014 draft, picked up the 4.0-inning save, allowing just 1 hit and no walks with 3 strikeouts.
- DH Evan Gattis went 1x4 with a double in the first game of his rehab assignment with the Hooks.
- Mott Hyde went 2x2, hitting a solo home run and driving in both of Corpus Christi's runs.
- In their Double A debuts, SS Alex Bregman went 1x4 and RF Derek Fisher went 2x4.

- In the playoffs, Tri-City fell to Staten Island in a 3-game series, 0-2.
- **IF Bobby Wernes**, the Astros 30th round pick in the 2015 draft out of Arkansas, won the New York-Penn League batting title with a .346 (65x188) batting average...Wernes also posted a league-leading .434 on-base percentage...led all 3rd basemen in fielding percentage (.976).
- **OF Dexture McCall** was a New York-Penn League Midseason All-Star, batting .295 (59x200) with 9 doubles, 4 HR, 37 RBI and a .376 on-base percentage in 59 games...was named the **MVP of the All-Star Game** after hitting a 2-run double.

- The Greeneville Astros captured their 2nd Appalachian League Championship title in the history of the franchise in 2015...it marked their first title since their inaugural season in 2004...the club finished in 2nd place in the regular season before tearing through the playoffs and defeating Princeton, 2-1, in the championship.
- In 30 games in the GCL, **OF Daz Cameron** hit .272 (28x103) with 2 doubles, 3 triples, 11 steals and a .372 on-base percentage.
- **OF Kyle Tucker**, the 5th overall selection in the 2015 draft, played a key role in Greeneville's postseason run...batted .375 (9x24) with 3 home runs, driving in 6 total runs in the postseason...hit a crucial, 3-run homer in the final game of the Appalachian League Championship Series.
