THE TWINS: The Twins have gone 2-2 through four games on their five-game seven-day roadtrip...today the Twins are playing the two-game series finale at PNC Park...the Twins will travel home post game to begin their ninth season at Target Field with a 10-game, 11-day homestand with three against the Mariners, three against the Astros and four against the White Sox...they will continue on after that with two "home games" in Puerto Rico against the Indians...the Twins went 41-40 at home last season and have an all-time Target Field record of 301-347.

FIRST WAS THE WORST: The Twins lost to the Pirates Monday afternoon by a score of 5-4, snapping their 10-game Interleague win-streak...Lance Lynn (0-1) made his Twins debut, allowing five runs (all in the 1st inning), on three hits in 4.0 innings pitched, allowing a grand slam to Colin Moran...the offense recorded seven hits, two from Eduardo Escobar... Brian Dozier homered for the third time in his last two games.

MAUER'S OUT OF THEIR LEAGUE: Joe Mauer is hitting .322 (270-for-839) with 57 doubles, five triples, 21 home runs, 113 RBI, 134 runs scored, 112 walks and a .401 on-base percentage in 228 games against the National League...he has a six-game hitting streak vs. the NL, dating back to August 10...below are his ranks among actives in IL Play:

IL PLAY, FOR THE RECORD: The Twins went 13-7 in Interleague Play last season, playing mostly NL West opponents...the Twins are 203-180 all-time in Interleague Play, tied for eighth most wins in MLB since IL began in 1997...they are 90-103 all-time in road IL games and 113-77 at home...they have won 10 of their last 11, dating back to August 2.

☞ Eddie Rosario is hitting .329 (23-for-70) with seven doubles, six home runs and 15 RBI in 20 games vs. NL opponents since the start of last season.

☞ Brian Dozier has seven homers vs. the NL since the start of last season, tied for third most in baseball, the leaders being José Abreu and Charlie Blackmon with eight.

MINNY AND THE STEEL CITY: The Twins are playing the Pirates for the 29th and 30th time ever this week...they are 16-13 all-time, going 8-4 at the Metrodome, 0-2 at Target Field, 2-4 at Three Rivers Stadium and 6-3 at PNC Park.

CLEAR THE WAY FOR THE BULL DOZER: Brian Dozier is one of nine players in baseball with three-plus homers (Blackmon - 4, Harper - 4, T. Anderson - 3, Davidson - 3, DeJong - 3, Encarnacion - 3, Panik - 3, C. Villanueva - 3)...since 2013, he leads all second basemen in baseball with 146 home runs...additionally, he has 21 leadoff homers since 2015, ranking second in baseball, trailing only Charlie Blackmon (22)...lastly, he needs nine home runs to tie Tom Brunansky (163) for ninth on Twins all-time list; Gary Gaetti is eighth with 201.

THE STARTING LINE: Twins starters have posted a 1.80 ERA (25.0 IP, 6 ER) through five games, the third best in the AL and fourth best in baseball...their opponent batting average is 0.96 (8-for-121), the best in baseball.

WE ARE FAMILY: The Pirates are preparing to celebrate the 40th anniversary of their 1979 World Series title next season...current Twins TV analyst Bert Blyleven pitched on that team, making 37 regular season starts, going 12-5, 3.60 ERA (237.1 IP, 95 ER) with four complete games, 92 walks and 172 strikeouts...he appeared in three games (2 starts) during the postseason, including a win in a relief appearance in game five of the World Series vs. Baltimore, pitching 4.0 scoreless innings with three hits allowed.

THE OPENER: The Twins will open their ninth season at Target Field tomorrow afternoon vs. Seattle...it marks their third Opening Day of 2018, opening Camden Yards in Baltimore last Thursday and opening PNC Park in Pittsburgh on Monday...the Twins are 31-26 all-time in Home Openers, winning last season 7-1 over Kansas City, snapping a five-season Home Opener losing streak...tomorrow marks the fifth time they have opened at home vs. Seattle, last April 6, 2009 at the Metrodome, losing 6-1 (F. Hernandez over Liriano)... they are 2-2 when they open vs. Seattle, their last win coming April 11, 1986 by a score of 5-1 (Blyleven over Milt Wilcox).
☞ Notable events tomorrow include breakfast on the plaza, national anthem sung by Minneapolis musician Dessu and a ceremonial first pitch by the gold medal-winning U.S. Curling team...the first 30,000 fans will get a Twins hooded sweatshirt.

- Missed most of first four months of 2017 after undergoing offseason "Tommy John" surgery on left elbow October 6, 2016...activated from 60-day disabled list July 21, 2017...made 27 appearances and held opponents scoreless in 22 of his 27 appearances for the Cardinals in 2017.
- Held left-handed hitters to .231 average (9-for-39) and right-handed hitters to .148 (4-for-27) last year.
- Struck out four batters in one inning on 3/29 vs. BAL, first Twins pitcher to do so since Tyler Duffey in 2016.
- Twins are 8th organization (PIT 2002-10, ARI 2011, WAS 2012-13, CIN 2013, MIL 2014, CWS 2015-16, STL 2016-17).
