RECENT RESULTS: The Tigers completed a three-game sweep of the White Sox with a 1-0 win on Sunday afternoon at Guaranteed Rate Field. Mike Fiers started for Detroit and earned the win, throwing 6.0 shutout innings with three hits allowed, one walk and six strikeouts. Alex Wilson, Daniel Stumpf, Joe Jiménez and Shane Greene (SV, 2) combined to throw 3.0 innings of hitless relief to preserve the victory. Offensively, the Tigers managed just two hits, with Leonys Martin accounting for both. Detroit scored the only run of the game in the first inning when Martin led off the inning with a single to left and stole second. After advancing to third on a passed ball, Miguel Cabrera hit a sacrifice fly to center field to score Martin. The Tigers continue their seven-game road trip tonight as they begin a four-game series against the Indians. Following the four-game set vs. Cleveland, the Tigers return home for a 10-game homestand, which includes three games vs. New York (AL) (April 13-15), three games vs. Baltimore (April 17-19) and four games vs. Kansas City (April 20-22).

ONE IS ENOUGH: The Tigers played their third 1-0 game of the season yesterday and for the first time came out on the winning end. According to STATS, LLC, the Tigers are the first team to have three 1-0 games in the first eight games of a season since the 1943 Reds and Cardinals. The victory marked the first time Detroit has won 1-0 in Chicago since September 11, 2013. The game also marked just the 18th time since 1908 and the first time since July 11, 2004 at Minnesota that the Tigers have won a game while recording two-or-fewer hits.

IMPRESSIVE DEBUT FOR FIERS: Mike Fiers made his Tigers debut in yesterday's game, throwing 6.0 shutout innings and allowing three hits with one walk and six strikeouts. Fiers finished the outing by retiring 11 straight batters. According to STATS, LLC, Fiers is the third pitcher in club history to throw 6.0-or-more innings, allow zero runs and strike out six-or-more batters in his Tigers debut, joining Alex Main and Joe Niekro.

WHAT A RELIEF: Detroit's bullpen threw 3.0 hitless innings in yesterday's game. Since allowing five runs in the fifth inning of the second game of the doubleheader on April 1 vs. Pittsburgh, Tigers relievers have combined to allow just two runs in the last 21.2 innings, posting a 0.83 ERA.

MIGGY MOVING UP THE MLB ALL-TIME RBI LIST: Miguel Cabrera drove in the only run of yesterday's game with a sacrifice fly in the first inning. Cabrera now has 1,622 RBI in his Major League career and is one RBI away from tying Chipper Jones (1,623) for 31st in MLB history.

SWEEP SENSATION: The Tigers completed a three-game sweep of the White Sox yesterday. It marked their first three-game sweep at Guaranteed Rate Field since September 12-14, 2011. It was also Detroit's first road sweep of a series of three-or-more games since sweeping a three-game set at Minnesota from September 20-22, 2016.

TIGERS TIDBITS: The Tigers stole seven bases during the three-game series at Chicago (AL), which were their most in a three-game set since swiping eight bases vs. Cleveland from April 24-26, 2015...Dixon Machado has reached base safely in all eight games this season.

MIGGY ON THE MARK VS. KLUBER: Miguel Cabrera has had success in his career against tonight's Indians starter, Corey Kluber. Cabrera enters tonight's game with a .404 (23x57) batting average with three

doubles, six home runs and 12 RBI. Cabrera's six home runs vs. Kluber are the most among active players, while he also leads with a .772 slugging percentage, is second with a .404 batting average and .443 on-base percentage.

TIGERS AND INDIANS: The Tigers and Indians begin their 19-game season series tonight in Cleveland. Detroit went 6-13 against the Indians last season, including a 3-6 record at Progressive Field. After the Tigers won three straight season series against Cleveland from 2013-15, the Indians have taken the season series in each of the last two years.

NOTES ON THE SKIPPER: Ron Gardenhire is in his first season as the Tigers manager after being named to the position on October 20, 2017.

*Enters today's game with an 4-4 (.500) record as the Tigers manager and a 1,072-1,043 (.507) career record as a manager, which is the eighth-most wins among active managers and ranks 54th in baseball history.

*Spent the 2017 season as the bench coach for the Arizona Diamondbacks, who captured a National League Wild Card spot and advanced to the National League Division Series.

*Served as manager of the Minnesota Twins from 2002-14 and is the winningest manager in Twins history, posting a record of 1,068-1,039 (.507) over his 13 seasons...is one of 10 managers in baseball history to win 1,000-or-more games with a single team.

*Guided the Twins to six postseason appearances (2002-04, 2006, 2009-10), including a berth in the 2002 American League Championship Series...was the first manager in MLB history to guide his team to the postseason in six of his first nine seasons.

*Named the BBWAA American League Manager of the Year in 2010...also finished runner-up for the honor on five occasions.

THIS DATE IN TIGERS HISTORY: 2015 - The Tigers set an American League record by extending their streak of innings without allowing a run since the start of the season to 24, before giving up an unearned run in the seventh inning of a 7-1 win over the Twins. The previous mark of 22 innings was set by the 1947 Chicago White Sox, while the Major League mark of 32 innings belongs to the 1963 St. Louis Cardinals.

ABOUT FRANCISCO: Liriano will make his second start of the season tonight in the series opener at Cleveland.

LAST TIME OUT: Liriano earned the win in his Tigers debut last Monday vs. Kansas City, allowing one run on four hits with two walks and three strikeouts in 6.2 innings.

VS. CLEVELAND: Liriano has faced the Indians 20 times in his career, including 15 as a starter, and has a 5-6 record with a 4.19 ERA (86.0IP/40ER) and 97 strikeouts. He made one start against Cleveland last season and did not factor into the decision, giving up seven runs on five hits with three walks in 2.0 innings.

ON THE ROAD: Liriano has made 162 career appearances, including 137 starts, on the road and has a 51-57 record with one save, a 4.50 ERA (779.1IP/390ER) and 788 strikeouts. In 18 road outings, including eight starts, last season, Liriano was 1-3 with a 7.79 ERA (34.2IP/30ER) and 24 strikeouts.

AT PROGRESSIVE FIELD: Liriano will be making his 11th career appearance and eighth career start at Progressive Field tonight. In his previous 10 outings, he has compiled a 2-3 record with a 4.81 ERA (39.1IP/21ER) and 54 strikeouts.

AGAINST THE AL CENTRAL: Liriano has made 91 career appearances, including 70 starts, against teams from the American League Central Division and has a 28-27 record with a 4.71 ERA (415.0IP/217ER) and 411 strikeouts.

RECORD IN APRIL: Liriano has made 49 career appearances, including 41 starts, during the month of April and has a 11-21 record with a 5.01 ERA (231.2IP/129ER) and 216 strikeouts. In five April starts last season, Liriano went 2-2 with a 3.97 ERA (22.2IP/10ER) and 25 strikeouts.

LEFT VS. RIGHT: Liriano has limited lefthanded batters to a .220 (302x1373) batting average in his career, while righties have hit .248 (1164x4697). In 38 appearances last season, lefties hit .247 (23x93) against Liriano, while righties batted .289 (82x284).

PILING UP THE PUNCHOUTS: Liriano has posted 27 games of 10-or-more strikeouts in his career. His last double-digit strikeout performance came on April 13, 2017 vs. Baltimore, when he punched out 10 batters. Liriano has 1,645 strikeouts in his Major League career, ranking him seventh among Dominican-born pitchers. He is 19 strikeouts away from tying Pedro Astacio (1,664) for sixth.

DON'T CALL IT A COMEBACK: Liriano has twice earned Comeback Player of the Year honors, receiving the honor in the American League with the Minnesota Twins in 2010 and in the National League with the Pittsburgh Pirates in 2013. He is the only player to win the award multiple times.

TOSSING A NO-NO: Liriano threw a no-hitter as a member of the Minnesota Twins on May 3, 2011 at Chicago (AL). He became the fifth pitcher born in the Dominican Republic to throw a no-hitter, joining Juan Marichal (1963), Ramon Martinez (1995), Jose Jimenez (1999) and Ubaldo Jimenez (2010).

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES: Liriano was signed by the Tigers as a free agent on February 23, 2018. He was originally signed by the San Francisco Giants as a non-drafted free agent on September 9, 2000. Liriano has played with six teams at the Major League level, including Minnesota (2005-12), Chicago (AL) (2012), Pittsburgh (2013-16), Toronto (2016-17), Houston (2017) and Detroit (2018).

ABOUT MATTHEW: Boyd will make his second start of the season tomorrow night at Cleveland.

LAST TIME OUT: Boyd was the tough-luck loser in his season debut on Tuesday vs. Kansas City, throwing 6.0 innings and allowing just one run on four hits with one strikeout.

VS. CLEVELAND/AT PROGRESSIVE FIELD: Boyd has appeared in five games, including four as a starter, against the Indians, and has a 1-2 record with a 1.91 ERA (28.1IP/6ER) and 19 strikeouts. He made four starts vs. Cleveland last season and went 1-2 with a 2.28 ERA (23.2IP/6ER) and 17 strikeouts. In two career starts at Progressive Field, Boyd has a 1-1 record with a 1.64 ERA (11.0IP/2ER) and eight strikeouts.

PICKING UP WHERE HE LEFT OFF: After finishing the 2017 season on a strong note, Boyd turned in an impressive outing in his season debut on Tuesday. Over his last five starts dating back to September 12, 2017, Boyd has posted a 2.27 ERA (31.2IP/8ER) and 22 strikeouts.
