PHILADELPHIA PHILLIES (17-13) vs WASHINGTON NATIONALS (16-16)

Friday, May 4, 2018 – Nationals Park – 7:05 EDT – Game 31; Road 15

RHP Nick Pivetta (1-1, 3.27) vs LHP Gio Gonzalez (3-2, 2.67)

- WEDNESDAY'S ACTION:** The Phillies defeated the Miami Marlins, 6-0, at Marlins Park in Miami ... Aaron Nola (W, 4-1) twirled 7.1 innings of shutout ball as he held the Marlins to 4 hits with 1 walk and 7 strikeouts ... Cesar Hernandez led off the game with a home run and had two hits along with teammates Aaron Altherr (2-4), Maikel Franco (2-4) and Pedro Florimon (2-4).
 - TRACING IT BACK TO ANOTHER ACE:** On Wednesday night, **Aaron Nola** retired 17 consecutive Marlins hitters, becoming the first Phillies starter to retire that many consecutively in a start since **Cole Hamels** (also 17) did so when he tossed a no-hitter on July 25, 2015 at Wrigley Field against the Cubs, four days after Nola's big league debut ... Nola has now won each of his last three starts while going at least 7.0 innings and allowing 1 BB or none (since 4/21) ... The last Phillies starter before **Nola** to win three straight starts and go 7.0 innings while allowing 1 walk or none was **Hamels**, May 13-23, 2015.
 - ENTER STRANDMAN:** The Phillies bullpen has successfully stranded 29 of their last 31 inherited runners (4/9-current) and their 93.5 strand rate is easily tops in the majors over that stretch (next: SF, 28-34, 82.4 %) ... Overall this season, the Phils pen has stranded 36 of the 46 runners they have inherited and their 78.3% strand rate ranks 3rd among all major league bullpens (best: LAA, 82.1 %) ... Individually, **Luis Garcia** has stranded all 10 runners he has inherited.
 - RAGING BULL:** Centerfielder **Odubel Herrera** has reached base safely in a career-best 32 straight games (since 9/27/17), posting a .339/.391/.484 slash line over 138 plate appearances during the streak ... He has the longest active on-base streak in baseball and the longest by a Phillies player since Darin Ruf reached safely in 33 consecutive games from September 25, 2012 – August 6, 2013.

- STAFF NOTES:** Phillies starters have allowed 3 ER or fewer in 23 of 30 games this season, including 16 of their last 21 (4/10-current) ... Philadelphia's rotation has accumulated 3.4 fWAR this season which is tied for the most of any National League staff with the Nationals ... They also rank 3rd among NL starting staffs with a 6.8% walk rate (best: NYM, 6.6%).
 - RHYS FIRE:** **Rhys Hoskins** has now reached base safely in 27 of his 29 starts this season, and 18 of his last 19 games overall (since 4/13) ... Since making his major league debut on August 10, 2017, Hoskins has posted a .993 OPS over 338 plate appearances ... That ranks 3rd among all National League players with at least 250 plate appearances in that span, trailing only CHI's Kris Bryant (1.020) and COL's Nolan Arenado (.999) ... Hoskins has totaled 62 walks to 81 strikeouts in his career, and since his debut, only two other players in the majors have as many walks and as few strikeouts: CIN's Joey Votto (71 BB, 44 SO) & LAA's Mike Trout (65 BB, 58 SO).
 - PHILLIE SPECIAL:** After getting off to a 1-4 start, the Phillies have won 16 of their last 25 games (4/5-current) and their .652 winning percentage over that span is tied for third-best (also: ARI) among any major league team (best: BOS & NYY, .680).
 - THANK YOU FOR YOUR PATIENCE:** The Phillies have seen a total of 4,736 pitches over 1,152 plate appearances this season ... Philadelphia's 4.11 pitches per plate appearance lead the majors (next: NYY, 4.06) ... The Phils have five players who rank inside the top 12 in pitches per plate appearance in the National League: **Cesar Hernandez** (5th, 4.41), **Rhys Hoskins** (6th, 4.40), **Carlos Santana** (7th, 4.33), **Aaron Altherr** (8th, 4.31) and **Scott Kingery** (12th, 4.23) ... Additionally, the Phillies have drawn 129 walks over those 1,152 plate appearances and their 11.2% walk rate leads the majors (next: WSH, 10.9 %) ... The Phils completed the month of April with 110 walks which was tied for the third-most free passes in franchise history for the month of April (also 2003), trailing only the 2007 club (114 BB) and the 1996 team (129 BB).
 - NATITUDE PROBLEM:** The Phillies enter play tonight having won each of the last two meetings between their division rival (9/26/17-current) ... A win tonight would give the Phils their first three-game winning streak against the Nats since they won four straight games, April 17-28, 2016 ... Philadelphia is also looking to win back to back series against Washington for the first time since they won three consecutive series, August 25, 2014 to April 12, 2015.
 - MINOR LEAGUE PLAYERS OF THE MONTH:** Clearwater **1B Darick Hall**, Lehigh Valley RHP **Enyel De Los Santos**, Lakewood RHP **Spencer Howard** and Lakewood **2B Daniel Brito** have been selected as the Phillies Minor League Hitter, Co-Pitchers and Defender of the Month, respectively, for April ... Hall, 22, batted .265 (22-83) with three doubles, eight home runs, 18 RBI, eight walks, 18 runs scored and a .948 OPS in 23 April games ... The 22-year-old De Los Santos went 2-0 with a 1.40 ERA (3 ER, 19.1 IP) in his first four starts both at the triple-A level and in the Phillies organization ... Howard, the Phillies' second-round pick in the June 2017 draft, posted a 1.89 ERA (4 ER, 19.0 IP), struck out 29 batters, walked only two and held opponents to a .214 average in four April starts ... Brito, 20, played in 19 games at second base for Lakewood in April and made just one error, his only of the season in 94 total chances.

LAST START: 4/28 vs ATL: L, 5.0 IP, 6 H, 4 R, 4 ER, 3 BB, 6 SO, HR ... Pivetta vs Foltyniewicz ... The Phillies' lone run came off the bat of Maikel Franco who scorched a line drive home run to left field in the 5th inning ... Philadelphia's bullpen combined for 4.0 innings of scoreless relief as Edubray Ramos (1.1 IP), Adam Morgan (0.2 IP), Victor Arano (1.0 IP) and Yacksel Rios (1.0 IP) all made appearances.

TONIGHT'S START:

- **Crazy 8: Is 4-1, 2.52 ERA (14 ER, 50.0 IP) with 53 SO in his last 8 starts since 9/18/17** ... 3 of those starts have been scoreless and he has allowed 5 or fewer hits in all but one of them (.228 OPP AVG)
- **Strike First: Has thrown a first pitch strike to 71.6 % of the batters he has faced this season, the best percentage among all qualified ML starters (Masahiro Tanaka only other over 70 % at 70.5)** ... In 2017 threw a first pitch strike to 51.9 % of batters, 79th of 105 pitchers to throw at least 130.0 IP
- **Win Streak Ended:** The Phillies lost his last start, ending a streak of wins in 9 straight of his starts dating back to 9/12/17 ... It was the longest such streak for the Phillies since they won 9 straight Cole Hamels starts from 4/5-5/28/12 and it also ended a career-best 4-game winning streak for Pivetta
- **Learning Curve:** Has thrown his curveball 25.82 % of the time in 2018, 8th-most among all pitchers to throw at least 500 pitches ... In 2017 threw his curve 12.83 % of the time
- **NL Starter Rankings:** 8th in BB/9.0 IP (1.91), 10th in SO/BB (4.86)
- **vs NL East:** 7-4, 5.15 ERA (49 ER, 85.2 IP) in 17 starts

- **2018:** 0-0, 4.00 ERA (4 ER, 9.0 IP) in 2 starts

2018 SEASON:

- His string of 8 straight starts allowing 5 hits or fewer from 9/18/17-4/22/18 was the longest by a Phillies starter since 1994 (David West, 10)
 - Did not allow a home run in 41.2 consecutive IP over parts of 8 starts, 9/18/17 vs LAD to 4/22/18 vs PIT
 - Struck out 9 batters and did not walk any on 4/11 vs CIN, becoming the first Phillie to do so since Mark Leiter Jr. accomplished the feat in relief, 8/5/17 vs COL and the first Phillies starter to do so since Vince Velasquez, 4/14/16 vs SD
 - Had a career-best 18.0-inning scoreless streak (since 9/18/17) come to an end in the 3rd inning of his season debut, 3/31 at ATL
- 2017 SEASON:**
- Among ML rookies, was 1st in SO/9.0 IP (9.47, min. 125.0 IP), 3rd in SO (140), 4th in starts (26) and 7th in innings (133.0)
 - Was tied for the 9th-most SO in a season ever by a Phillies rookie and had the highest SO/9.0 IP and SO rate (24.0%) of any Phillies rookie ever to make at least 25 starts
 - Had the most starts (26) in a single season by a Phillies rookie since 1990, when Pat Combs started 31
 - Among all NL pitchers (min. 125.0 IP), ranked 4th in lowest % of pitches put in play (15.7), trailing ARI's Robbie Ray (13.7), WSH's Max Scherzer (14.3) and LAD's Rich Hill (14.7)
 - Struck out a career-high 11 batters 8/16 at SD, which was the most by a Phillies rookie since Cole Hamels struck out 11 on 9/16/06 at HOU and the most by any Phillie since Vince Velasquez's 16-SO game on 4/14/16 vs SD ... Since at least 1913, Pivetta is the only Phillie to finish a start with at least 11 SO in 5.0 or fewer IP
 - Allowed 1 hit in 7.0 IP on 7/2 at NYM, becoming the first Phillies rookie with just 1 hit allowed in 7.0+ IP since 8/23/01 (Brandon Duckworth)
 - Recalled for the first time on 4/30 and made his ML debut that day at LAD as the starting pitcher (first of 4 stints with the Phillies)
 - Had a 25.2-inning homerless streak, 5/18 at TEX-4th inn. on 6/21 vs STL

- Acquired by Philadelphia from WSH for RHP Jonathan Papelbon and cash, 7/28/15 ... Originally selected by WSH in the 4th round of the June 2013 draft ... Attended New Mexico Junior College
- Pitched for Canada in 2017 World Baseball Classic ... Was a member of the Canadian Junior National Team from 2009-12 ... Was the first Canadian-born starting pitcher to debut for the Phillies since 6/17/06 (Scott Mathieson vs TB)
