## HERE'S THE STORY

- ♦ The D-backs are 10-5 in their last 15 games since July 22.
- ♦ Arizona is 15-6 in their last 21 games vs. Phillies.
- ♦ The D-backs are 8-0 at home on "Teal Tuesdays."
- ♦ **Zack Greinke**, who has allowed 2 runs or fewer in 8 consecutive starts, is 7-1 with a 1.68 ERA (11 ER in 59.0 IP) and a 0.90 WHIP over his last 9 starts.
- ♦ **David Peralta** is hitting .415 (22-for-53) with 4 doubles, 4 home runs and 16 RBI in his last 14 games vs. Phillies.
- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt** needs 1 home run to set the Chase Field record...he is currently tied with Luis Gonzalez (95).

## LAST NIGHT'S RECAP

- ♦ **David Peralta's** first career walk-off home run gave the D-backs a 3-2 win vs. Phillies in 14 innings.
- ♦ Peralta finished 4-for-7 with a double, 2 home runs and 2 RBI, establishing a career high in home runs (19).
- ♦ **Steven Souza Jr.** went 2-for-5 with the game-tying RBI single in the ninth...**Eduardo Escobar** was 2-for-5 with 2 doubles.
- ♦ **Zack Godley** allowed 2 runs and struck out 7 in a season-high 7.1 innings...6 D-backs relievers who combined to toss 6.2 shutout frames.

## QUITE A NIGHT FOR PERALTA

- ♦ **David Peralta** accumulated all 4 of his hits last night vs. Phillies after the eighth inning: home run in the ninth, single in the 10th, double in 12th and walk-off home run in the 14th.
- ♦ Additional notes on Peralta's night:
  - Achieved a career high 19 home runs...third career multi-homer game.
  - First career walk-off home run (second walk-off plate appearance; walk on Sept. 27, 2017 vs. Giants).
  - First player in the modern era (since 1900) with 4+ hits & 2+ HR in a game w/all hits coming in the ninth inning or later [source: Elias Sports Bureau].
  - First player in the modern era w/11 total bases in the ninth inning or later [source: Elias Sports Bureau].
  - Is the first player in at least the last 10 years with 3 extra-base hits in the ninth inning or later of a game [source: ESPN Stats & Info].
  - Fifth home run vs. a lefty in 2018 (4 total prior to this season).

## SEND THEM HOME HAPPY, ALBEIT A LITTLE LATER THAN EXPECTED

- ♦ **David Peralta** was the third player in D-backs history whose second home run of the game was a walk-off in extra innings, joining Damian Miller (May 9, 2000 vs. Dodgers) and Paul Goldschmidt (Aug. 13, 2013 vs. Orioles).
- ♦ Goldschmidt's homer vs. Orioles in 2013 came off current Arizona reliever, T.J. McFarland.

- ♦ Last night, **David Peralta** recorded his 12th career 4+ hit game in D-backs history, 1 shy of Paul Goldschmidt (13).
- ♦ Most 4+ hit games in club history:

- ◆ Boasts a career-high in home runs (16), doubles (24) and RBI (57).
- ◆ In his last 16 games, is hitting .353 (18-for-51)/1.120 OPS with 4 doubles, 1 triple, 4 homers, 19 RBI and 5 walks.
- ◆ Is third in club history with 16 homers as a shortstop...Jay Bell (1998) is second (18).
