**ROSTER MOVES**—The Rays have selected INF/OF **Andrew Velazquez** (veh-LAS-kehzh) from Triple-A Durham, bringing the active roster to 28 players...Velazquez, 24, hit .255/.313/.417 (117-for-458) with 14 HR, 45 RBI and 31 SB in 125 games this season between Double-A Montgomery and Durham...a corresponding move to the 40-man roster will be announced later today...in addition, OF **Mallex Smith** (viral infection) is rejoining the team today in Cleveland and traveling with them to Toronto.

- + Velazquez will become the 11th player to make his major league debut for the Rays this season, which will pass 2002 and 2003 for the most in a season in club history...he will become the 21st rookie used by the Rays, extending the single-season club record.

**RAY MATTER**—Last night the Rays snapped their scoreless streak at 18 innings with a 4-run 6th inning and held on for a 5-3 win, setting up today's rubber match with the Indians...the Rays have won 10 of their last 12 games since Aug 19, matching their best 12-game stretch of the season (also April 16-30 and Aug 15-26)—a win today would give them their best 13-game stretch since July 12-30, 2014 (11-2)...they are a season-high-tying 9 games over .500 (3rd time) and they are one shy of matching their high-water mark under fourth-year **Manager Kevin Cash** (40-30 through games of June 20, 2015)...this marks the *latest date* the Rays have been at least 9 games over .500 since finishing the 2013 season at 92-71.

- + The Rays have outscored opponents, 59-32, in the last 12 games.
- + With a win today, the Rays would improve to 3-1-1 in their last five road series after going 1-7-0 in their previous eight road series.
- + The Rays are 2-2 on this 3-series, 8-game, 10-day road trip...this is the third of three consecutive series against division leaders, with the Rays going 5-2 so far against the Red Sox (3-0), Braves (1-1) and Indians (1-1)...this is the fifth time in the last six series the Rays are facing a team currently positioned to make the playoffs.
- + The Rays are 8 GB of the Athletics for the AL's second Wild Card...if they gain a game today, it will be the closest they have been to the second Wild Card spot since they were 7 GB through June 1.

**SQUAD GOALS**—At 72-63, here is what the Rays would need to do in their remaining 27 games to reach the following records:

**RAYS vs. INDIANS**—After going 2-1 at Progressive Field last season, today the Rays are attempting to win a second consecutive series in Cleveland for the third time in franchise history, following Aug 12-Sep 29, 2005 and July 23, 2010-May 12, 2011...the Rays are 59-94 (.386) all-time against the Indians, their worst mark against any AL opponent, and 26-51 (.338) on the road...they have lost the last four season series to the Indians, and the season series concludes with the Rays hosting them from Sep 10-12.

- + Today the Rays are facing **Carlos Carrasco**, who has pitched to a 2.77 ERA (55.1-IP, 17-ER) in 9 apps (8 starts) against them—but a 5.09 ERA in 4 starts here and 1.11 ERA in 5 apps (4 starts) at Tropicana Field...he came within a strike of a no-hitter on July 1, 2015 at TB.
- + The Rays are 18-10 (.643) against the AL Central this season.

**UP NEXT: BLUE JAYS**—The Rays are 7-2 against the Blue Jays this season (5-1 at home, 2-1 on the road), and their loss in the last meeting on Aug 12 at TOR snapped a 5-game winning streak over them...the Rays have allowed 4 runs or fewer in all 9 games against them, 2 runs or fewer seven times and 1 run or fewer four times...they yielded 3 runs in the last series, their fewest allowed in a 3-game series (or more) since Sep 29-Oct 1, 2017 vs. BAL (3) and fewest on the road since June 19-21, 2015 at CLE (3)...they have won the season series in eight of the last 10 years and are 192-169 (.532) all-time against them, their most wins against any opponent.

- + This is the second of three consecutive road trips to go through Toronto, and the Rays host the Blue Jays in the final series of the season from Sep 28-30...while the Rays played the Blue Jays only six times through their first 115 games, this series continues a stretch facing them 13 times in the club's final 47 games of the season.

**PITCHING PLANS**—Today's game will be started by **Diego Castillo**, the 40th time the Rays will use an opener and fourth time using Castillo in that role...the Rays opened the season with bullpen days as needed in place of a traditional starter, and since May 19, they have used openers to start games—generally facing 3-9 batters, depending on matchups.

- + In March, the Rays announced a season-opening rotation of **Chris Archer**, **Blake Snell**, **Nathan Eovaldi** and **Jake Faria**...all four pitchers spent time on the disabled list and two were traded in July...the Rays have used other starters in 71 of 135 games (52.6 pct.).
- + Since the debut of the opener on May 19 at LAA, Rays pitching ranks 2nd in the majors and 1st in the AL with a 3.33 ERA—before that, their 4.43 ERA was 22nd in the majors and 9th in the AL.
- + The Rays are 40-34 with traditional starters and 32-29 otherwise.
- + Rays starters have gone 3 IP or fewer 53 times this season, most by a team since Baseball Reference data is available (1908), ahead of the 1949 St. Louis Browns (40)...their starters have gone 2 IP or fewer 44 times, most ever by a team ahead of the 1977 Mariners (27).

**REDEFINING RELIEF**—54.6 pct. of the team's innings have been covered by the bullpen...the starters have thrown 548 IP, fewest in the majors, and the relievers have thrown 658.2 IP, most in major league history, passing the 2012 Rockies (657.0)...they have thrown 126.2 IP more than any other bullpen (Padres), and 79 pct. more than the Indians bullpen, which has combined for 367.1 IP, fewest in the majors...the Rays bullpen is one of five in major league history to reach 600 IP, and the previous four all finished with losing records...this season, Rays relievers have totaled:

- + 49 apps of at least 50 pitches and 24 apps of at least 70 pitches, both the most since Baseball Reference data is available (1908);
- + 74 decisions, most since Baseball Reference data is available;
- + 117 apps of at least 2 IP, most since the 2000 Red Sox (120);
- + 57 apps of at least 3 IP, most since the 1991 Orioles (57);
- + 38 apps of at least 4 IP, most since the 1982 Red Sox (40);
- + 26 apps of at least 5 IP, most since the 1952 Brooklyn Dodgers (27) and most in the AL since the 1931 White Sox (26)

**SAVE SAVVY**—Last night **Adam Kolarek** got a game-ending groundout on his only pitch thrown for his second career save, following Aug 16 at NYY...it was the sixth time in franchise history a pitcher threw one pitch and recorded a save, and second time this season, joining **José Alvarado** on June 29 vs. HOU...prior to this year, the last Rays pitcher to do that was **Fernando Rodney** on April 7, 2012 vs. MIN...this was the first time in club history a pitcher threw one pitch for the save in a road game.

**ABOUT THE OFFENSE**—Last night the Rays offense hit 6 2B, their most since Oct 2, 2016 at TEX (6)...they are averaging 5.6 runs in their last 10 games, including 5 runs or more in seven of those 10 games and double-digit hits in eight...the Rays rank 3rd in the AL this season with a .256 avg. behind the Red Sox (.269) and Indians (.258), and they rank 5th with a .328 OBP...in comparison, they were 12th with a .245 avg. and 10th with a .317 OBP last season...they haven't finished in the top five in avg. since 2005 (.274, 3rd), nor in the top five in on-base pct. since 2013 (.329, 3rd).

- + The Rays have three of the AL's top 11 hitters for avg. in **Mallex Smith** (.307, 6th), **Matt Duffy** (.297, tied for 9th) and **Joey Wendle** (.296, 11th)...only once in franchise history have three qualifiers finished with a .290 avg. or better (Bartlett/Crawford/Zobrist, 2009).
- + The Rays have totaled 119 HR this season, 4th-fewest in the majors...they are on pace for 143 HR, which would be 85 HR fewer than their club-record 228 HR last season...they have won 24 games this season without the benefit of a home run, most in the majors, and they are 25-5 (.833) when hitting multiple homers.
- + The Rays rank 4th in the majors with 98 SB and 1st with 82 HBP.

**MINOR MATTERS**—With 2 RBI last night vs. Triple-A Durham, INF **Nate Lowe** became the first Rays minor leaguer to reach 100 RBI since **Stephen Vogt** (105) in 2011...Lowe has totaled 101 RBI between Class-A Charlotte (44), Double-A Montgomery (42) and Durham (15) to tie for 5th among all minor leaguers...he is tied for 8th for a single season in club history.

- + Entering today's regular season finale, Class-A Charlotte can clinch a playoff berth with a win today or a Fort Myers loss...it would be the first time the Rays top six affiliates all make the postseason.

**TODAY'S START**

- + Last pitched on Wed at ATL, going 2 IP in his third start...was given a 3-0 lead before taking the mound but allowed a single, single and 3-run homer to **Johan Camargo**, all with 2 outs in the 1st inning...the homer came on a 99.7 mph sinker, the fastest pitch thrown by a Ray this season to be hit for a home run.
- + Is 1-1 with a 2.81 ERA (16-IP, 5-ER) in his last 11 apps (3 starts), including nine scoreless outings, after allowing 9 runs in his previous 5 apps, July 15-29.
- + Has gone 1.1 IP or longer 13 times this season, and 2 IP or longer eight times... has thrown as many as 36 pitches, 2x-last Wed at ATL (2 IP).
- + His avg. fastball velocity this season is 96.9 mph, according to StatCast, and his max velocity is 100.8 mph in his start on Wed at ATL.
- + Recalled from Triple-A Durham on June 5...went 0-1 with a 1.03 ERA (26.1-IP, 3-ER), 4 saves, 32 SO and .167 opp avg. in 19 apps for the Bulls.
- + Will be making his fourth career start—has gone 1.2, 1.2 and 2 IP in his first 3 starts...is one of a club-record 16 different starting pitchers used by the Rays this season, most in the majors ahead of the Angels (15)...the Rays used eight starting pitchers all of last season—in fact, the 16 starters this season are more than the team's total from the previous three seasons combined (14, 2015-17)...is also one of a club-record 31 different pitchers used by the Rays this season.
- + Made 1 start in his minor league career, July 25, 2017 at Triple-A Buffalo (1 IP).

**SEASON HIGHLIGHTS**

- + On July 1 vs. HOU, inherited the bases loaded with 1 out in the 8th inning... struck out **José Altuve** in a 10-pitch at-bat and got a groundout for the third out.
- + Recorded multiple strikeouts in the first 5 apps of his career, all as a reliever, the first reliever to do that since LAD **Grant Dayton** in 2016, and first AL reliever to do it since TEX **Neftalí Feliz** in 2009, according to Baseball Reference...was the only Rays reliever to begin his career in this fashion.
- + On June 13 vs. TOR, recorded his first career win in his fourth career app...his only baserunner allowed in 2 IP was a 8th-inning, 2-out single.
- + On June 6 at WAS, made his major league debut and pitched a perfect 7th inning, including strikeouts of **Brian Goodwin** and **Trea Turner**.

**2017 SEASON**

- + Split the season between Double-A Montgomery and Triple-A Durham, earning a June 3 promotion...marked the third straight year he received an in-season promotion...combined to go 4-5 with a 2.76 ERA (71.2-IP, 22-ER) and 15 saves in 51 apps (1 start) between the two levels.
- + Named Minor League Reliever of the Year by the Rays Baseball Operations dept. ...led the Rays system in saves (15) for a second consecutive year.
- + Recorded the save in the Governors' Cup clinching win over Scranton/Wilkes-Barre (Yankees) and the Triple-A National Championship Game over Memphis (Cardinals)...did not allow a run in 4 apps in the IL postseason spanning 5 IP (1-H, 0-BB, 8-SO).

**X-RAY REPORT**

- + Diego is one of 10 children—and all of them are married...he has six brothers and three sisters.
- + Diego is known to cook for his teammates...he learned to cook as a 10-year-old by watching his mother in the kitchen...he once shared his special family recipe of chicken, rice and plantains in a November 2016 cooking video on the Rays Twitter account.

**#16 KEVIN CASH, MANAGER**

- + Selected by Astros Manager **A.J. Hinch** to join the AL coaching staff for the All-Star Game for a second consecutive season.
- + Is in his fourth season as Rays manager...at age 40, is the majors' youngest active skipper—5 months younger than SD **Andy Green**.
- + His last ejection was July 18, 2017 at OAK, his seventh ejection as Rays manager...his 7 ejections are tied for 4th in franchise history.
- + Is the sixth Tampa-born manager in major league history, and second

to manage the Rays...that list includes Hall of Famers **Al Lopez** and **Tony La Russa**, **Lou Piniella**, **Dave Miley** and **John Hart**.

- + Played 12 professional seasons as a catcher, incl. parts of eight seasons in the majors (2002-10) and two years (2005-06) in the Rays org.
- + Played in the 1989 Little League World Series (Tampa Northside LL), 1999 College World Series (Florida State) and earned World Series rings in 2007 (Red Sox) and 2009 (Yankees).

- + Is 1-for-his-last 18 and 4-for-his-last-55...yesterday at CLE, his 5th-inning double snapped a 0-for-16, his first extra-base hit since Aug 2 vs. LAA.
- + Batting .149/.267/.281 (18-for-121) with 4 HR and 18 RBI in 37 games (34 starts) since the All-Star break, compared to .252/.368/.496 in the first half.
- + Since his June 7 recall, ranks among major league rookies in doubles (17, 1st), RBI (36, tied for 3rd), extra-base hits (28, 4th) and walks (43, 2nd).
- + Has 9 HR in 252 AB with the Rays, compared to 5 HR in 197 AB with Triple-A Durham...his 14 HR between the two levels tie a career high (2016).
