**TONIGHT'S GAME:** Is **Game 2** (0-1) of a 3-game series vs **Abby Sanders' Rockies** and **Game 2** (0-1) of a 6-game homestand that includes an upcoming weekend series vs the **NL Central** rival **Cardinals** (3g)...the Redlegs are coming off a **3-6 road trip** to Col's **Coors Field** (1-2), Ari's **Chase Field** (1-2) and SD's **Petco Park** (1-2)...following this homestand and Mon's off day, beginning Tue night the Reds return to the road for a **5-game trip to KC** (2g) and **Pit** (off day, 3g).

**SERIES NOTES:** The Rockies lead this season's series, 3-1, including last night's 9-6 win and a **2-1 series win** at **Coors Field** from **5/25-5/27**...**Reds vs Rockies** information is on media guide **Page 321**.

**CARDINALS UP NEXT:** The Reds have **998 wins vs StL** since 1900...since a 4-game sweep from **6/5-6/8, 2017** at **Great American Ball Park**, the Reds have lost each of the **last 5 series vs StL** (1-2 at Cin, 1-2 at StL, 0-3 vs StL, 0-4 vs StL, 0-3 at StL)...the Cardinals have won the **last 11 games overall** dating back to a 6-0 Reds win on **9/13/17** at **Busch Stadium**, their longest **winning streak vs Cin** since they won **11 straight** in **1949**...StL hasn't won **12 straight games vs Cin** since **6/1/1931-4/25/1932**...is the Reds' **longest active losing streak** vs any team and their longest vs any team since a **14-game losing streak to the Mets** from **9/7/2014-9/7/2016**...earlier this season, from **4/12-4/15** at **GABP** the Cardinals earned their fourth **4-game series sweep in Cincinnati (1914 & 1930 at Redland Field, July 1949 at Crosley Field)**...they have been visiting the **Queen City** since **1892**...the Cardinals have won the **last 9 games at GABP** dating back to a 3-2 Reds home win here on **8/4/17**...StL's **9-game road winning streak** is its longest in **Cincinnati** since they won **10 straight games at Crosley Field** over the **1930 and 1931 seasons**...**Reds vs Cardinals** information is on media guide **Page 328**.

**DRAFTED:** The Reds selected University of Florida junior **3B Jonathan India** with the **fifth overall pick** of Major League Baseball's first-year player draft...beginning Saturday the Gators are hosting an **NCAA Super Regional vs Auburn**...the lists of Cin's **2017 draft picks** and **No. 1 draft picks** are on media guide pages **216-217**.

**PLAYER OF THE MONTH:** **Scouter Gennett** in **May** (.398, 8hr, 24rbi) became the first Reds player to win the National League **Player of the Month Award** since **Jay Bruce** in **May 2011**...is **Gennett's** first career monthly award...twice in a 3-week span that month he was named **Player of the Week** (5/7-5/13, 5/21-5/27), the first Reds player to win the weekly award twice in a season since **Bruce** in **2012** and the first Reds player to win it twice in the same month since **Dave Parker** in **May 1985**...**Gennett** finished **May** ranked first in the NL in **slugging** (.720), second in **hitting** (.398), third in **RBI** (24), T3rd in **HR** (8), fourth in **hits** (37) and **on-base percentage** (.418) and T7th in **extra-base hits** (14).

**DYNAMIC DUO:** In **May**, **Scouter Gennett** (8hr, 24rbi) and **Eugenio Suárez** (8hr, 29rbi) became the first Reds teammates to produce at least **8 HR** and **24 RBI** in the same month since **Adam Dunn** (12hr, 27rbi) and **Ken Griffey Jr.** (11hr, 29rbi) did it in **August 2001**...**Dunn** and **Griffey** was the first Reds duo to do it since **Johnny Bench** (9hr, 32rbi) and **George Foster** (9hr, 38rbi) in **June 1977**...since RBI became an official statistic in **1920**, **Gennett** is the only **Reds second baseman** to produce at least **8 HR** and **24 RBI** in a calendar month (June 2017, May 2018) and **Suárez** is the only **Reds third baseman** to produce at least **8 HR** and **29 RBI** in a calendar month (May 2018).

**APRIL 19:** The Reds are **18-25** since **4/19**, when they replaced manager **Bryan Price** and pitching coach **Mack Jenkins**...bench coach **Jim Riggleman** became interim manager, Class AAA Louisville manager **Pat Kelly** (#60) was promoted to serve as interim bench coach, and Class AA Pensacola pitching coach **Danny Darwin** (#52) joined the Reds' Major League staff as interim pitching coach...**Price** went **279-387 (.419)** in his 5 seasons as manager, including **3-15 this year**.

**7-YEAR ITCH:** The **10-4 Reds** victory on **4/23 vs Atl** was the first for **Jim Riggleman** as his team's full-time manager since a **1-0 Nationals** win vs the **Mariners** on **6/23/11**...the Reds' **4-1** win on **5/4 vs Mia** was his **1,500th game** as a Major League manager...since 1900, **Riggleman** is **1 of 14 managers** to work for at least **5 Major League teams** (SD, Chc, Sea, Wsh, Cin)...**Jimmy Dykes**, **John McNamara** and **Dick Williams** each managed **6 teams**...the others who managed **5 teams** are **Chuck Dressen**, **Bucky Harris**, **Rogers Hornsby**, **Davey Johnson**, **Billy Martin**, **Bill McKechnie**, **Jack McKeon**, **Lou Piniella**, **Jeff Torborg** and **Joe Torre**.

**ABOUT THE NEW GUYS:** Interim manager **Jim Riggleman** managed in all or parts of **12 Major League seasons** with the **Padres**, **Cubs**, **Mariners** and **Nationals**, leading the **1998 Cubs** to the **NL Wild Card** game...interim bench coach **Pat Kelly** was in his first season as manager at Class AAA **Louisville** after spending the previous 3 years at Class AA **Pensacola**...he also managed in the Reds' system at Class A **Bakersfield** in 2014 and from 2011-2013 at **Rookie Billings**...interim pitching coach **Danny Darwin** was in his third season as **Pensacola's** pitching coach.

**FRONT OFFICE NEWS:** Reds President of Baseball Operations **Dick Williams** on 5/10 announced the promotion of **Nick Krall** to **General Manager**...**Krall** had been the club's Vice President, Assistant General Manager since November 2015...**Williams** will remain the club's President of Baseball Operations and will continue to oversee that entire department.

**YOUNGSTERS:** The Reds' **34 Major League debuts** over the **last 3 seasons** are the most of any team in either league and include **5 this season** (**3B Alex Blandino** on 4/10 at Phi, **RHP Tanner Rainey** on 4/10 at Phi, **RHP Zack Weiss** on 4/12 vs StL, **IF/OF Rosell Herrera** on 4/26 vs Atl, **IF/OF Brandon Dixon** on 5/22 vs Pit)...**RHP Jesus Reyes** was on the roster for 1 day, on **5/29 at Ari**, but did not pitch...Cin has **4 rookies** on the current roster (**Blandino**, **Dixon**, **OF Jesse Winker**, **RHP Tyler Mahle**) and **another rookie** on the **disabled list** (**RHP Rookie Davis**)...the average age for the Reds' 25-man **Opening Day roster** (**27 years, 196 days**) was the second-youngest in the Major Leagues behind the **Phillies** (**26.334**).

# Tonight's Pitcher - #47 Sal Romano, RHP

## RED HOTS

**Sal Romano** at just **24 years old** is in his **second Major League season**...tonight is making his 13th start of the season and his **29th Major League** appearance and start...will be his **third career appearance** and **start vs the Rockies**, his second of the season...in 2017, in his Major League debut made 16 starts during 3 stints with the Reds...made spot starts in April and in early July before joining the rotation for good after the All-Star break...during the second half led Reds pitchers in innings (79.0) while tying Homer Bailey for the staff lead in starts (14)...in his last 8 starts of the season for the Reds went 3-3, 3.17 with 4 quality starts...overall after the All-Star break went 4-7, 4.44 in his 14 starts...the Reds went 7-9 in his 16 starts.

# Tomorrow's Pitcher - #30 Tyler Mahle, RHP

## RED HOTS

**Tyler Mahle's** last name rhymes with **RALLY**...at just **23 years old** is in his **second Major League season**...tomorrow afternoon will make his 13th start of the season and 17th appearance and start of his **career**...will be his second appearance and start of his career and this season vs the **Padres**...ranks second in the Major Leagues in strikeouts among all pitchers **age 23 and younger** (61, Col's **German Márquez** 62)...his career-high **11 strikeouts** on **4/24 vs Atl** are the most by a Reds pitcher this season...with **4 quality starts** is tied with **Luis Castillo** for the staff lead...in the 12-inning, 9-7 win on **4/24 vs Atl**, took a 5-0 lead and a no-hitter into the seventh before **Freddie Freeman** led off the inning with a solo HR...was the victim of a **blown save** when the Braves tied it at 7-7 with 4 runs in the ninth inning off **Amir Garrett** and **Raisel Iglesias**, including a second HR by **Freeman**, but the Reds won it on **Scooter Gennett's** 2-run, walkoff HR off **Max Fried**...pitched into the seventh inning for the first time in his career, then recorded 1 out in the seventh of his next start (4/29 at Min)...his third-inning single in the 5-0 loss on **4/8 at Pit** was the only Reds hit in **Jameson Taillon's** first career complete game...was the first **Reds pitcher** to record the team's only hit in a game hit since **Earl Yingling** did it on **9/19/1914 at Brooklyn Robins**...was 1 of 5 rookies on the **Opening Day roster** (**RHP Jackson Stephens**, **RHP Zack Weiss**, **OF Phillip Ervin**, **OF Jesse Winker**) and the only rookie to begin this season in the Reds' starting rotation...when he earned the 1-0 win in his season debut on 4/2 vs Cubs, at **23 years**, **185 days** was the youngest pitcher in the Major Leagues with a victory.

- In his last 22 apps beginning 5/6 is hitting .311, raising his BA from .224 and including 8 multi-hit games (28-90, 5 2b, 1 3b, 1hr, 10rbi).
- Made each of his last 10 starts batting second, his first career starts at that position in the order (14-46, .304, 1 2b, 4rbi)...his 10 starts batting second are the most by a Reds catcher in that spot in the order since Smoky Burgess made 56 starts there in 1955.

- Has a 4-game hitting streak, including 2 hits in each of his last 2 apps (6-17, .353, 1 2b, 2hr, 4rbi).
- In 200 career apps for the Reds is hitting .311 (36 2b, 3 3b, 39hr, 139rbi, .897ops).
- In May (.398, 8hr, 24rbi) became the first Reds player to win the National League Player of the Month Award since Jay Bruce in May 2011...twice in a 3-week span that month won the NL Player of the Week Award (5/7-5/13, 5/21-5/27), the first Reds player to win the weekly award twice in a season since Bruce in 2012 and the first Reds player to win it twice in the same month since Dave Parker in May 1985.
- Since RBI became an official statistic in 1920, is the only Reds second baseman ever to record at least 8 HR and 24 RBI in a calendar month...has done it twice (8hr, 24rbi in May 2018 & 9hr, 24rbi in June 1017).
- Ranks second in the National League in hitting, just .0005 behind LAD's Matt Kemp...no Reds batter has led the NL in batting average since Pete Rose hit .338 in 1973...the list of Reds batters who led the league in hitting is on media guide page 397.
- Ranks among the National League leaders in hitting (2nd), total bases (3rd), hits (3rd), RBI (T3rd), multi-hit games (23, T3rd), slugging percentage (4th), home runs (T7th) and extra-base hits (T8th).
- In his last 25 apps beginning 5/7 is hitting .420, including 14 multi-hit games and raising BA from .282 (42-100, 6 2b, 10hr, 28rbi, .780slg, .438obp).
- Beginning 5/7 leads the Major Leagues in hits, RBI, batting average and slugging percentage while leading the National League in home runs (T2nd in majors).
- Played in 59 of the Reds' 61 games, off only on 5/9 vs NYM and 5/13 at LA and including 53 starts...from 4/30-5/4 missed 4 starts with inflammation in his right shoulder but pinch hit in each game.
- Was born in Cincinnati and lived in nearby Lebanon until he was 9 years old, when his family moved to Sarasota.

## 6 BILLY HAMILTON, cf

**Road Trip: 7-32, 1 3b, 1rbi, 2sb**

- In his last 4 apps is 1-for-14 following a 5-game hitting streak during which he hit .333 to raise his BA from .199 to .213 (6-18, 1 3b, 1rbi).
- Has made 9 starts batting leadoff, 1 start batting eighth (4/2 vs Chi) and a team-high 41 starts batting ninth...has made 30 straight starts batting ninth since he last led off on 4/26 vs Atl.
- Since his debut on 9/3/13 leads all Major League players in steals with 253, sixth on the Reds' all-time list since 1898...Reds Hall of Famer Eric Davis is fifth at 270.
- If he reaches 60 stolen bases in 2018 will become the first player in Major League history to steal at least 10 bases in each of his first 6 seasons while establishing a career high in each of those 6 years...is tied with Jose Reyes, Cesar Cedeno and Bert Campaneris as the only players to do it in 5 straight years.
- On 5/26 at Coors Field was timed at 10.39 seconds from home plate to third base, the quickest triple since Statcast started tracking in 2015.

## 9 JOSÉ PERAZA, ss

**Homestand: 1-4, 1r**

- Accent mark on the "e" in José.
- Has a season-high 8-game hitting streak, raising BA from .243 and including 4 multi-hit games (13-33, .394, 2 2b, 4rbi, 1sb, .412obp)...is the longest active hitting streak on the team...the longest hitting streak of his career is 13 games (5/13-5/28, 2017).
- Among National League shortstops ranks second in both hits (62, Brandon Crawford 66) and stolen bases (9, Trea Turner 16).
- Twice this season made at least 40 plate apps without a strikeout, from 4/15-4/25 (43pa) and from 5/22-6/2 (40pa).
- Started at SS in 57 of the Reds' 61 games and has appeared in 59 games.
- In the batting order hit first (13gs), second (29gs), seventh (12gs) and eighth (3gs, 4/1 vs Wsh, 4/7 at Pit, 6/5 vs Col).

## 43 SCOTT SCHEBLER, of

**Homestand: 2-5, solo HR**

- Has a 5-game hitting streak, 2g shy of his season high and extended by a pinch-hit single Sun at SD (8-17, .471, 3hr, 4rbi, 5r 1.000slg, .526obp).
- Hit .320 through April (3hr, 11rbi), .200 in May (3hr, 9rbi) and .462 so far in June (6-13, 2hr, 2rbi, .923slg, .500obp).
- Has made a team-high 28 starts in RF, 9 starts in CF and 1 start at DH.
- On 4/23 vs Atl made his sixth career start batting leadoff, just his second the last 2 seasons in that spot in the order...in 2017, made his only start batting leadoff on 9/21/17 vs StL.
- From 4/9-4/19 missed 10 games (1-9) while on the 10-day disabled list with a right ulnar nerve contusion...suffered the injury in the third game of the season, when he was hit on the right elbow by a Sean Doolittle pitch.

## 7 EUGENIO SUÁREZ, inf

**Homestand: 2-5**

- First name is pronounced Ay-you-hay-nee-oh...accent mark on the "a" in Suárez.
- In his last 13 apps is hitting .360, raising BA from .274 and including 5 multi-hit games (18-50, 3 2b, 4hr, 12rbi, .431obp).
- Missed 16 games in April but still ranks second in the National League in RBI, just 1 behind Javier Baez of the Cubs...no Reds batter has led the NL in RBI since Dave Parker drove in 125 runs in 1985...the list of Reds batters who led the league in RBI is on media guide page 397.
- Also ranks among the NL leaders in OBP (10th) and hitting with RISP (.360, 8th).
- In May led the Major Leagues in RBI (29) while ranking T3rd in both extra-base hits (15) and HR (8)...since RBI became an official statistic in 1920, is the only Reds third baseman ever to record at least 8 HR and 29 RBI in a calendar month.
- Tied the franchise record for most RBI by a Reds player in his first 20 games of a season (25)...played in his 20th game on 5/8 vs NYM and produced 4 RBI to give him 25 on the season...George Crowe (1958), Vada Pinson (1962) and Ken Griffey Jr. (2006) each produced 25 RBI in his first 20 games of their respective seasons.
- From 4/9-4/25 was disabled with a fractured right thumb...suffered the injury on 4/8 at Pit, when he was hit by a Jameson Taillon pitch...missed 16 games (3-13).
- On 3/16 signed a 7-year contract extension through the 2024 season with a club option for 2025...following last season was eligible for arbitration for the first time while under team control through 2020.

## 19 JOEY VOTTO, 1b

**Homestand: 3-5**

- Leads the National League in batting average vs RHP (.362) and ranks among the leaders in on-base percentage (3rd), hitting with RISP (.360, 9th), hits (T9th) and batting average (10th).
- His .306 batting average is at its highest point since he was 3-for-9 in the third game of the season.
- Produced his last RBI on 5/16 at SF...this active 17-game streak without an RBI is the longest of his career (previous, 13g, 6/14-6/28, 2015)...during this 17-game streak without an RBI is hitting .344 (22-64, 4 2b, 1 3b, 0hr, .438slg, .425obp).
- Reached base safely in 52 of his 60 apps, including each of his last 14 apps beginning 5/20 (21-54, .389, 3 2b, 1 3b, 7bb, .459obp).
- In the Reds' 61 games has made 60 apps and 58 starts...missed his 3 starts on 4/12 vs StL, 5/15 at SF and 5/24 vs Pit...missed his only full game on 4/12 vs StL, snapping at 202 games his streaks of consecutive games played and consecutive games started...prior to that 4/12 day off, had appeared in and started every Reds game since he was given the day off at StL on 9/2/16, when Ivan De Jesus Jr. played 1B...during his 202-games started streak played 1,733.1 of the Reds' 1,782.1 innings in the field (97%)...was the longest games started streak by a Reds player since Pete Rose started 370 consecutive games from 1973-1976.
- On 5/18 vs Cubs made his 29th career start batting cleanup (0-3, 1bb), his first appearance there since he hit fourth in both games of a DH on 5/15/14 vs SD.
- On 4/17 at Mil reached 1,000 walks in 1,446 apps, the fourth-fewest games to 1,000 walks in National League history...Pete Rose (1,210) is the only other player in Reds history with at least 1,000 walks...Miguel Cabrera and Albert Pujols are the only other active players in the Major Leagues with at least 1,600 hits and 1,000 walks.
- From 4/23-4/29 was the NL Player of the Week, his fifth career weekly award.
- Is approaching 1,500 career apps (1,490)...if he plays every day will reach that milestone on Sun, 6/17 at Pit.

## 33 JESSE WINKER, of

**Homestand: 1-4, 1rbi, 1bb**

- Leads National League rookies in walks and outfield assists (3, tied).
- Is 3-for-7 over 2 apps following a career-high 0-for-14 skid snapped Sun at SD.
- Has made 25 starts in RF, second on the team to Scott Schebler's 28 starts, 15 starts in LF and 1 start at DH...leads the team with 34 starts batting leadoff...on 4/12 vs StL, with Votto off, made his only career start batting third in the order.
- His career-high 9-game hitting streak from 4/18-4/27 ranks as the longest by a Reds batter this season.
- Made his first Opening Day roster...was 1 of 5 rookies on the Opening Day roster (RHP Tyler Mahle, RHP Jackson Stephens, RHP Zack Weiss, OF Phillip Ervin).
- Was the Reds' Opening Day starter in LF...batted leadoff.
