2016 SEASON: Entered the season rated by *Baseball America* as the organization's fastest baserunner...Spent majority of season with Triple-A Indianapolis...Set career high in stolen bases...Shared International League lead in caught stealings...Was recalled by Pittsburgh on 5/16 when Starling Marte went on the Paternity List; made big league debut that night and struck out as a pinch hitter vs. Atlanta...Singed off Atlanta's Bud Norris for first Major League hit on 5/17...Returned to Indy on 5/19 and went 2-for-34 in 10 Triple-A games between 5/20-30...Hit .486 (17-for-35) in an 11-game stretch with

Indianapolis between 7/1-9...Had a 13-game hitting streak between 7/30 and 8/12 (19-for-55, .345) and hit safely in 20 of his final 23 Triple-A games (32-for-99, .323)...Hit a walkoff grand slam on 8/15 vs. Louisville...Was recalled on 8/30 and remained with the Pirates for the rest of the season...Made first Major League start (second base) on 9/17 at Cincinnati (game 1) and went 1-for-2 with two walks while also collecting first big league RBI...Produced first career two-hit and two-run game on 9/23 vs. Washington...Went 3-for-15 with an RBI in his five starts with the Pirates (all at second base).

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

2015: Entered season ranked by *Baseball America* as the organization's seventh-best prospect...Also rated by the same publication as the "Best Athlete" and "Fastest Baserunner" in the Pirates minor league system...Spent entire season with Indianapolis and was selected to the International League mid-season All-Star team...Shared league lead in stolen bases and ranked second among International League leaders in triples...Made 111 appearances at second base, seven at third base and one at shortstop (8/5 at Durham)...Led league second basemen in fielding percentage (.984), assists (352) and total chances (559)...Was the club's most-used leadoff batter, appearing in 109 games from the top spot of the order...Had season-high four hits on 5/1 vs. Lehigh Valley and went on to capture the league's Player-of-the-Month award for May after hitting .362 with 22 runs, 16 extra-base hits and 18 RBI in 28 games...Became the first Indy player to win the monthly honor since Zach Duke in May of 2005...Was on the D.L. from 6/17-30...Returned to action and had an inside-the-park home run on 7/1 - the first for an Indianapolis player since 2011...Missed four games while on the temporary inactive list from 8/25-28.

2014: Entered season ranked by *Baseball America* as organization's sixth-best prospect...Spent entire season with Double-A Altoona and was named to the Eastern League mid-season All-Star team...Led the league in triples and was tied for fourth in total bases (213)...Was tied for third among Pirates minor leaguers in stolen bases...Made 100 starts at shortstop and 17 at second base; committed 29 of his 33 errors while playing short...His first home run was a leadoff shot on 5/1 at Erie (game 1)...Hit safely in 13 straight games from 6/1-17 (20-for-55, .364)...Was removed from game one of doubleheader on 6/21 at Portland and missed next six games...Returned to action on 6/27 vs. Binghamton...Led off game on 7/2 at Bowie with a home run and led off bottom of first with a homer on 7/5 vs. Harrisburg...Went 0-for-2 in the Eastern League All-Star Game and scored a pair of runs...Tallied game-winning hit for Curve with a single in top of the ninth on 7/22 at New Britain...Took over second base duties on 8/2...Connected for his fourth leadoff home run on 8/19 at Akron...Was placed on disabled list on 8/25 with hamstring injury...Reached base safely in each of his last 27 games from 7/22 to 8/22 before going

2013: Began season ranked by *Baseball America* as the fifth-best prospect in the Pirates system and the second-highest position player behind Gregory Polanco...Was also ranked by MLB.com as the 54th-best prospect in MiLB entering the season...Hit .274 (138-for-504) with 27 doubles, 13 triples, eight home runs, 58 RBI and 30 stolen bases in 127 minor league games between High-A Bradenton and Altoona...Made all 127 defensive appearances at shortstop and made 32 errors...Ranked fourth among Bucco farmhands in stolen bases...Established career highs in games and at bats...Was selected to the Florida State League mid-season All-Star team; went 1-for-5 with a three-run homer in the contest and was named the game's MVP...Tripled twice while collecting four hits on 5/22 vs. Tampa...Was on 7-day D.L. with a left hamstring strain from 6/29 thru 7/6...Had 17 RBI in 20 games with the Marauders during the month of July...Was promoted to Altoona on 7/30...Collected his first Double-A hit while beating out an infield single on 7/31 vs. Binghamton...Hit lone homer with Altoona on 8/14 vs. Portland...Tripled twice on 8/29 at Harrisburg...Hit safely in 12 of his last 14 Double-A games (20-for-55, .364) to raise average from .183 to .255...Participated in the Arizona Fall League and hit .253 (20-for-79) with a homer, 10 RBI and six stolen bases in 21 games with the Scottsdale Scorpions...Also played six games with Toros del Este in the Dominican Winter League; went 4-for-17 (.235) with a walk and two stolen bases.

doubles, three homers and 12 RBI in 20 games as the designated hitter...Hit .410 (43-for-105) in 24 games during the month of April, which included a 16-game hitting streak from 4/9-26 (30-for-72, .417)...Was hitting .402 with a 1.111 OPS following the action on 5/3 (27 games)...Went 4-for-4 on 5/26...Scored at least one run in nine straight games from 7/1-10 and in 15 of his 16 games from 6/23 thru 7/10...Recorded his second four-hit game on 7/5...Was selected as the league's best shortstop following the season in a poll conducted from the 14 SAL team's field managers, general managers, sports writers and broadcasters.

2010: Began professional career playing with Dominican Summer League Pirates...Ranked eighth in the league in batting, tied for fourth in runs and fifth in total bases (109)...Made 40 appearances at second base, 21 at third base and 11 in left field...Hit .353 (18-for-51) against LHP and .316 (61-for-193) against RHP...Spent majority of the season batting second in the lineup.

2017 TIGERS

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

The 2017 season will mark the second year of a two-year contract Pelfrey agreed to with the Tigers on December 6, 2015.

- Named the National League Player of the Week for the week ending July 13, 2008.

SEASON HIGHLIGHTS

Completed his first season with the Tigers in **2016**, appearing in 24 games, including 22 starts.

- Ranked third in the American League with 24 double plays induced.
- Earned his first win of the season on June 4 vs. Chicago (AL), allowing two runs on five hits with three walks and three strikeouts in 6.0 innings...the win snapped an 18-start winless streak for Pelfrey and was his first victory since August 12, 2015 vs. Texas.
- Pitched out of the bullpen in the game on June 24 vs. Cleveland, allowing three hits and striking out two in 4.1 scoreless innings -- marked his fifth career relief appearance and his first since August 16, 2011 at San Diego.
- Started six games in July and had a 2-2 record with a 3.99 ERA (29.1IP/13ER) and 11 strikeouts.
- Placed on the 15-day disabled list on August 3, retroactive to August 1, with a lower back strain.
- Began an injury rehab assignment with Triple A Toledo on August 29 -- made two injury rehab starts with the Mud Hens and had an 8.53 ERA (6.1IP/6ER) with three strikeouts.
- Activated from the 15-day disabled list on September 5.
- Made his second relief appearance of the season on September 25 against Kansas City, tossing 2.0 innings and allowing two runs on three hits with three strikeouts.
- Lefthanded hitters posted a .351 (86x245) batting average, while righthanders batted .312 (74x237) against him.
- Appeared in 13 games, including 11 starts, at home and posted a 3-4 record with a 6.40 ERA (57.2IP/41ER) and 30 strikeouts, while he went 1-6 with a 3.82 ERA (61.1IP/26ER) and 26 strikeouts in 11 starts on the road.
- Posted a 2-8 record with a 4.58 ERA (98.1IP/50ER) and 46 strikeouts in 18 games, including 17 starts, prior to the All-Star break, while he was 2-2 with a 7.40 ERA (20.2IP/17ER) and 10 strikeouts in six games, including five starts, following the All-Star break.

Made 30-or-more starts for the fifth time in his career and first time since 2011 as he completed his third season with the Minnesota Twins in **2015**.

- Posted a 6-11 record with a 4.26 ERA (164.2IP/78ER) and 86 strikeouts.
- Finished the season tied for the major league lead with 29 ground ball double plays, while he led the American League with 0.60 home runs per nine innings and ranked sixth in the AL with a 2.14 ground ball-to-fly ball ratio.
- Earned his first win of the season on April 22 at Kansas City, throwing 7.0 shutout innings with five hits allowed, two walks and four strikeouts -- the win was his first since August 20, 2013.





2017 TIGERS

- Made four starts in the month of April and compiled a 2-0 record with a 2.25 ERA (24.0IP/6ER) and 15 strikeouts.
- Threw a season-high 8.0 shutout innings and tied a season high with seven strikeouts in a win on June 7 vs. Milwaukee -- also threw 8.0 innings on August 2 vs. Seattle.
- Did not allow more than two earned runs in nine of his first 11 starts from April 11-June 7 -- posted a 2.28 ERA (67.0IP/17ER) during that stretch.
- Appeared in the 200th game of his career on June 18 vs. St. Louis, allowing one run on four hits with one walk and three strikeouts in 8.0 innings.
- Made his 200th career start on July 9 vs. Detroit, giving up four runs on eight hits with four strikeouts in 7.2 innings.
- Recorded the 700th strikeout of his career on September 25 at Detroit.
- Started 13 games at home and had a 4-4 record with a 2.61 ERA (82.2IP/24ER) and 45 strikeouts, while he made 17 starts on the road and had a 2-7 record with a 5.93 ERA (82.0IP/54ER) and 41 strikeouts.

Made just five starts for the Twins in **2014** before missing the rest of the season due to injuries.

- Posted a 0-3 record with a 7.99 ERA (23.2IP/21ER) and 10 strikeouts in five starts.
- Made an Opening Day roster for the seventh time in his career.
- Sidelined from May 2-October 30 with a left groin strain.
- Assigned to Triple A Rochester for an injury rehabilitation assignment on May 16 -- made two injury rehab starts and had a 1-0 record with a 0.90 ERA (10.0IP/1ER) and three strikeouts.
- Missed the rest of the season after undergoing season-ending surgery to clean up scar tissue in his right elbow that was causing pressure on ulnar nerve -- surgery was performed by Dr. James Andrews on June 10.

Completed his first season with the Minnesota Twins in **2013**, starting 29 games and compiling a 5-13 record with a 5.19 ERA (152.2IP/88ER) and 101 strikeouts.

- Finished the season tied for the team lead in strikeouts and ranked second in innings pitched.
- Earned the victory in his Twins debut on April 4 vs. Detroit, allowing two unearned runs on five hits with two walks and one strikeout in 5.1 innings.
- Struck out a season-high seven batters on May 5 at Cleveland -- also had seven strikeouts on June 12 vs. Philadelphia, August 31 at Texas and September 6 vs. Toronto.
- Sidelined from June 19-July 4 with a back strain.
- Assigned to Single A Cedar Rapids for an injury rehabilitation assignment on July 1 -- made one rehab start, allowing two runs on two hits with six strikeouts in 6.0 innings.
- Made five starts during the month of July and had a 1-3 record with a 3.25 ERA (27.2IP/10ER) and 21 strikeouts.

Made just three starts for the New York Mets in **2012** before undergoing season-ending Tommy John surgery.

- Had a 2.29 ERA (19.2IP/5ER) and 13 strikeouts in three starts.
- Tossed 8.0 innings on April 21 vs. San Francisco, allowing one run on six hits with one walk and three strikeouts.
- Sidelined from April 22-October 29 with a right ulnar collateral ligament injury -- had Tommy John surgery on right elbow May 1...the procedure was performed by Dr. James Andrews in Gulf Breeze, FL.

Ranked fourth in the National League with 33 starts, while he was ninth with two complete games as a member of the New York Mets in **2011**.

- Posted a 7-13 record with a 4.74 ERA (193.2IP/102ER) and 105 strikeouts in 33 starts -- became the third Mets pitcher since 1980 to start at least 31 games and throw at least 175.0 innings in at least four straight seasons, joining Ron Darling (1984-89) and Tom Glavine (2003-07).
- Made the first Opening Day start of his career on April 1 at Florida and suffered the loss after giving up five runs on four hits with four walks and two strikeouts in 4.1 innings.
- Notched his first win of the season on April 22 vs. Arizona, allowing one run on five hits with two walks and four strikeouts in 7.0 innings.
- Finished the month of May with a 2-1 record, a 3.09 ERA (35.0IP/12ER) and 18 strikeouts -- held opponents to a .217 (28x129) average during the month.
- Threw the third complete game of his career on June 18 vs. Los Angeles (AL) -- also went the distance on July 27 at Cincinnati.
- Started five games in July and had a 2-2 record with a 3.38 ERA (32.0IP/12ER) and 15 strikeouts.
- Did not allow a home run from July 27-September 9, a stretch of 10 games, including nine starts.





Established career highs with 15 victories, 204.0 innings pitched and 113 strikeouts with the Mets in **2010**.

- Ranked sixth in the National League with 33 games started and 0.53 home runs allowed per nine innings, while he ranked ninth with 15 victories.
- Earned his first professional save on April 17 at St. Louis, throwing a scoreless inning with one hit allowed and one walk.
- Had a 27.0 inning scoreless streak from April 9-May 1.
- Went 4-0 with one save, a 0.69 ERA (26.0IP/2ER) and 19 strikeouts in five appearances, including four starts, during the month of April -- his 0.69 ERA led the majors and tied a franchise record (Nolan Ryan - 1970).
- Posted a 8-1 record with a 2.23 ERA (80.2IP/20ER) in his first 12 starts, becoming just the third Mets pitcher since 1991 to win at least eight of his first 12 starts and record an ERA under 2.50, joining Bobby Jones in 1997 (10-2, 2.22 ERA) and Johan Santana in 2009 (8-3, 2.39 ERA).
- Won his ninth game in his 10th decision on June 13 at Baltimore, becoming the fifth pitcher in franchise history to win nine-plus games in their first 10 decisions, joining Terry Leach (10-0 in 1987), David Cone and Dwight Gooden (both 9-1 in 1988) and Al Leiter (9-1 in 2000).
- Made five starts during August and had a 3-2 record with a 1.82 ERA (34.2IP/7ER) and 15 strikeouts.
- Recorded his 15th win of the season on September 16 vs. Pittsburgh, becoming the 10th righthander in Mets history to win at least 15 games in a season.
- Started 19 games at home and had a 10-3 record with a 2.83 ERA (124.0IP/39ER) and 72 strikeouts...went 5-6 with one save, a 4.95 ERA (80.0IP/44ER) and 41 strikeouts on the road.

Made 31 starts in his fourth season with the Mets in **2009**.

- Finished the season with a 10-12 record, a 5.03 ERA (184.1IP/103ER) and 107 strikeouts.
- Started the first ever regular season game at Citi Field on April 13 vs. San Diego and allowed five runs on eight hits with two walks and three strikeouts in 5.0 innings.
- Won four straight decisions from April 8-May 7.
- Made six starts during the month of May and went 2-1 with a 2.93 ERA (40.0IP/13ER) and 17 strikeouts in six starts.
- Recorded his first career extra-base hit, a double, on June 10 vs. Philadelphia.
- Threw a season-high 8.0 innings on September 6 vs. Chicago (NL), allowing one run on five hits with one walk and five strikeouts in a winning effort.

Made an Opening Day roster at the major league level for the first time in his career in **2008** as a member of New York (NL).

- Started 32 games for the Mets and had a 13-11 record with a 3.72 ERA (200.2IP/83ER) and 110 strikeouts.
- Tied for the National League lead and established a Mets franchise record with 29 ground ball double plays.
- Ranked fifth in the National League with 0.54 home runs per nine innings, while he was sixth with two complete games.
- Named National League Player of the Week for the week ending July 13 after going 2-0 with a 0.00 ERA (15.0IP/0ER) and 10 strikeouts in two starts.
- Threw back-to-back complete games on August 20 vs. Atlanta and August 25 vs. Houston -- became the first Mets pitcher to throw consecutive complete games since Rick Reed in 2001.
- From May 31 through the end of the season, ranked fifth in the National League with 151.2 innings pitched, while he was sixth with 11 wins.

Had four stints with the New York Mets in **2007**, pitching in 15 games, including 13 starts.

- Finished the season with a 3-8 record, a 5.57 ERA (72.2IP/45ER) and 45 strikeouts in 15 outings, including 13 starts, with the Mets.
- Made 15 starts between Single A St. Lucie and Triple A New Orleans and had a 3-6 record with a 3.94 ERA (80.0IP/35ER) and 58 strikeouts.
- Assigned to Single A St. Lucie to begin the season -- made his only start on April 7 vs. Vero Beach, allowing three runs, two earned, on five hits with three walks and two strikeouts in 6.0 innings.
- Recalled from Single A St. Lucie by the Mets on April 13.
- Made his first start of the season with the Mets on April 13 vs. Washington, allowing two runs on six hits with four walks and two strikeouts in 5.2 innings -- became the youngest Mets pitcher to make an April start since 1996.
- Optioned to Triple A New Orleans by the Mets on May 13.
- Made four starts with New Orleans in June and had a 2-1 record with a 3.38 ERA (21.1IP/8ER) and 21 strikeouts.
- Recalled from Triple A New Orleans by the Mets on July 1.
- Recorded the first hit of his major league career on July 1 at Philadelphia, singling off Kyle Kendrick.
- Optioned to Triple A New Orleans by the Mets on July 15.
- Recalled from Triple A New Orleans by the Mets on July 28 -- optioned back to New Orleans following that day's doubleheader.
- Threw a season-long 7.0 innings on August 2 at Sacramento, allowing two runs on nine hits with two walks and two strikeouts.

- Recalled from Triple A New Orleans by the Mets on September 1 -- made five appearances, including four starts, with the Mets in September and had a 3-1 record with a 4.88 ERA (24.0IP/13ER) and 18 strikeouts.

Made his major league debut in his first season in professional baseball in **2006**.

- Started four games for the Mets and had a 2-1 record with a 5.48 ERA (21.1IP/13ER) and 13 strikeouts.
- Selected to the Eastern League midseason All-Star team.
- Assigned to Single A St. Lucie to begin the season -- made four starts with St. Lucie and had a 2-1 record with a 1.64 ERA (22.0IP/4ER) and 26 strikeouts.
- Made his professional debut on April 6 vs. Vero Beach, throwing 5.0 shutout innings with two hits allowed, one walk and six strikeouts.
- Promoted to Double A Binghamton on April 26 -- started 12 games with Binghamton and went 4-2 with a 2.71 ERA (66.1IP/20ER) and 77 strikeouts.
- Started five games in June with Binghamton and had a 3-1 record with a 2.32 ERA (31.0IP/8ER) and 36 strikeouts.
- Recalled from Double A Binghamton by the Mets on July 8.
