LEADING OFF: LAA plays the final contest of a five-game road trip (2-1) to Seattle (May 4-6; 2-1) and Colorado (May 8-9; 0-1).. LAA has won five of last seven games to move a half-game behind first place Houston...Halos are 8-11 since a club-record 13-3 start...LAA owns an MLB-best 13-4 road record (LAA won 11 consecutive on road, March 30-April 24)...Halos are 8-3-0 in 11 series played...Following this series, the club heads home for an 11-game home stand vs. **Minnesota** (May 10-13), **Houston** (May 14-16) and **Tampa Bay** (May 17-20).

GET THIS: On April 2, 2001 **Albert Pujols** collected his first hit at Coors Field off **Mike Hampton**.

WALK IN THE PARK: With his 600th career walk last night, **Mike Trout** is just the fifth with 600 walks and 200 home runs prior to age-27 season, **joining Mickey Mantle, Eddie Matthews, Mel Ott and Jimmie Foxx**.

DID YOU KNOW? With six strikeouts Sunday, **Shohei Ohtani** (32 Ks) became just the third Angel pitcher to reach 30+ Ks thru five outings joining **Bo Belinsky** (35) and **Jered Weaver** (31). With the win, he is the 8th Angels' pitcher with a winning decision in three of his first five career starts (first since **Sean O'Sullivan** in 2009).

3,000!!! With a fifth inning single to right field Friday (off **Mike Leake**), **Albert Pujols**...

- Became 32nd player all-time to reach 3,000 hits - second in as many seasons (**Adrián Beltré**; July 30, 2017 vs. Baltimore).
- Fourth player in MLB history with at least 3,000 knocks and 600 HRs (**Hank Aaron, Willie Mays & Alex Rodriguez**).
- 6th foreign-born player to reach 3K (2nd Dominican – **Beltre**).
- Is one of four players with 3,000 hits, 450 HRs and 600 doubles (**Aaron, Carl Yastrzemski, Beltre & Musial**) - **STATS LLC**.
- Joins **Rod Carew** (Aug. 4, 1985 vs. Minnesota) as only players to log 3,000th hit in an Angels' uniform.

3x3x3: **Pujols** has matched **Stan Musial** and **Alex Rodriguez** as only players with 3+ MVP Awards and 3,000 hits.

SIMBA SIZZLIN': **Andrelton Simmons** boasts a 12-game hit streak batting .438 (21/48) with eight runs, six doubles, a triple, two home runs and 13 RBI in the span...Hit streak is second of 8+ games this season (March 29-April 6)...His **.350 season ranks third in A.L.**

VIRGIN ISLAND TEAMMATES: If **Jabari Blash** and **Akeel Morris** both appear in a game for Angels, it would be first time two natives of the U.S. Virgin Islands play as teammates since **RHP Al McBean** and **C Elmo Plaskett** both played for Pittsburgh from 1961-63.

A.L. ROOKIE OF THE MONTH: **Shohei Ohtani** was named American League Rookie of the Month for April...As a DH, he batted .359 (14/39) with four HR, 12 RBI and a 1.148 OPS...In four starts, went 2-1 with 26 strikeouts in 20.1 IP.

TWO-WAY SHOHEI: **Ohtani** is just fourth player in modern era with 25+ pitching strikeouts and four+ batting home runs in a month – first since **Fergie Jenkins** in Sept., 1971...**Ohtani** tied the club record for most XBH (7) through first 13 career games with a plate appearance (**Jackie Warner** in 1966)...**Ohtani** has a hit in 12 of 14 starts at DH this season.

THIS N' THAT: **Halos' average home attendance of 39,525 leads A.L.**...Club boasts six sellouts already...**LAA has committed 15 errors thru 35 games (third fewest in A.L.) and rank second in circuit with a .989 fielding pct.**...Halos hurlers have issued **138 free passes, second-most in A.L.**...**Angels' bullpen has tossed 146 IP to lead all of baseball (average 4.1 IP per game)**...**Trout** has four 9+ WAR seasons through his 26 year-old campaign - Only others to do so? **Rogers Hornsby** (4) and **Ty Cobb** (4)...**Angels' pitching staff** has recorded 10+ strikeouts 16 times this season – a new franchise record for most double-digit strikeout games through the team's first 35 games of the season (previous was 12; three times).

THIS DATE IN ANGELS HISTORY

May 9

(1961) **Jerry Casale** hit the first home run by an Angels' pitcher as the club defeats Boston, 8-7, at Wrigley Field in LA.

May 10

(2002) Angels post a 19-0 shutout victory over Chicago White Sox, marking the most runs ever scored at home (until 2004; 21 runs)... Halos collected 24 hits, also the most ever at home...19-0 shutout was the largest margin of victory ever for the club in a shutout...The 19-run victory was the second such margin of victory in 11 days for Angels (also April 30 at Cleveland - 21-2 win)...Angels became just the fourth team since 1901 to win two-or-more games by 19-or-more runs in one season.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER – RHP JAIME BARRIA

2-1, 3.46 ERA

Began last start with 5.1 no-hit innings on Thursday vs. Baltimore

- **BACK WITH THE HALOS:** Making fourth start of the season for Angels and second on the road...Recalled from Triple-A Salt Lake prior to last start on May 3 for third stint of season with Angels.
- **LAST TIME OUT:** Earned the win in last start on Thursday vs. Baltimore after pitching six innings and allowing two earned runs on four hits with two walks and two strikeouts...**Carried a no-hitter through first 5.1 innings before allowing a single to Trey Mancini.**
- **RECORD BREAKING FRAME:** During start on April 22 vs. San Francisco, tossed 49 pitches in a scoreless first inning, including a Major League record 21-pitch at-bat vs. **Brandon Belt** (previous record was 20 pitches seen by Houston's **Ricky Gutierrez** vs. Cleveland RHP **Bartolo Colon** on June 26, 1998...Became first pitcher to throw 49+ pitches in an inning without allowing a run since D-backs **Nick Bierbrodt** on June 13, 2001 vs. Cubs.
- **VS. COLORADO:** Today marks first career appearance vs. Rockies.
- **INTERLEAGUE:** Is 0-1 with a 9.00 ERA (2 IP – 2 ER)...Only previous interleague appearance came on April 22 vs. Giants.
- **AT COORS FIELD:** Today marks first career outing at Coors Field.
- **AT THE PLATE:** Has not had a plate appearance in professional career (Major Leagues or Minor Leagues).
- **BIG LEAGUE DEBUT:** Made Major League debut with Angels on April 11 at Texas and earned the win after tossing five innings and allowing one run on one hit (HR by **Ryan Rua**) with three walks and three strikeouts...He is the youngest player (21.267) to have earned a winning decision in the American League this season (next youngest is Tigers' **Joe Jimenez** – 23.078).
- **STARTING WITH A START:** In Major League debut on April 11, became the first player to make his Major League debut as a starting pitcher for the Angels since **Matt Shoemaker** on Sept. 20, 2013 vs. Seattle...He also became the first player to earn a win in MLB debut as a starter since **Sean O'Sullivan** on June 16, 2009 at San Francisco.
- **HALOS FROM PANAMA:** Barria is the first Panama-born pitcher in Angels history...The only other player in franchise history who was born in Panama is Hall of Famer **Rod Carew**.
- **YOUNG ANGELS:** At 21 years, 267 days, Barria was the youngest Angels player to make his Major League debut since **Mike Trout** (19 years, 335 days) on July 8, 2011...He's the youngest pitcher to debut with Angels since **Tyler Chatwood** (21 years, 185 days) on June 19, 2011.
- **WITH THE BEES:** In three starts with Triple-A Salt Lake this season, is 0-0 with a 2.92 ERA (12.1 IP – 4 ER) and 12 strikeouts.
- **IN THE RANKINGS:** Entered 2018 ranked by *Baseball America* as the #6 prospect in the Angels organization and is the top pitching exclusive prospect (RHP/DH **Shohei Ohtani** is ranked #1)...He is also ranked #7 by *MLB.com* in the Halos system.
- **2018 SPRING TRAINING:** Appeared in five games (one start) for Angels this Spring and went 1-2 with a 4.82 ERA (9.1 IP – 5 ER) and 12 strikeouts...Lone start of the Spring came on March 22 at Camelback Ranch against the Dodgers (L; 3 IP, 3 H, 2 ER, 2 H, 2 BB, 4 SO).
- **2017 RECAP:** Opened 2017 season with Adv.-A Inland Empire and pitched to a 2.48 ERA (65.1 IP – 18 ER) with 57 strikeouts in 11 starts before being promoted to Double-A Mobile on June 1...Promoted to Triple-A Salt Lake on Aug. 22 and did not allow an earned run in two of his three starts for the Bees.
- **MINOR LEAGUE HONORS:** Was selected to 2017 All-Star Futures Game at Marlins Park & pitched one scoreless inning in relief with one walk and two strikeouts for Team World...Named a 2017 California League Mid-Season All-Star and 2016 Midwest League Mid-Season All-Star...Selected as Angels Organizational Player of the Month for May and June 2017.
- **CAREER NOTES:** Native of Panama City, Panama...Signed with Angels as an international free agent, April 11, 2013.
