DEADLINE DAY—Major League Baseball's non-waiver trade deadline was today at 4 p.m. ET...the Rays acquired OF **Tommy Pham** from the Cardinals, traded C **Wilson Ramos** to the Phillies and traded RH **Chris Archer** to the Pirates (see separate releases for more information)...the Rays traded six veteran players in the week leading up to the trade deadline (also **Nathan Eovaldi**, **Matt Andriese**, **Jonny Venters**) and nine over the past 10 weeks (also **Alex Colomé**, **Denard Span**, **Brad Miller**).

- + The Rays have made 16 trades involving 40-man players since Jan 1, already their 2nd-most for an entire calendar year (18 in 2017).
- + The Rays have already used a club-record 19 rookies and a club-record-tying 30 pitchers this season...they have used 48 players, approaching the club record that was set last season (53).

ROSTER MAKEOVER—Since the last time the Rays and Angels met (May 20 at Angel Stadium), the Rays have turned over 52 pct. of their active roster—in other words, 13 players on tonight's active roster weren't on it for the last meeting...six of these players were recalled from the minors (**Willy Adames**, **Jake Bauers**, **Diego Castillo**, **Andrew Kittredge**, **Jaime Schultz**, **Hunter Wood**), four were reinstated from the DL (**Yonny Chirinos**, **Carlos Gómez**, **Adeiny Hechavarria**, **Kevin Kiermaier**) and three were acquired via trade (**Jalen Beeks**, **Ji-Man Choi**, **Michael Perez**).

- + Only 16 of the 41 players (39.0 pct.) from last year's season-ending active roster or disabled list remain in the organization.
- + Only one player remains in the organization from **Kevin Cash's** managerial debut on April 6, 2015: CF **Kevin Kiermaier**.
- + Only four players have been on the active roster all season, without a stint on the disabled list or in the minors: **C.J. Cron**, **Sergio Romo**, **Mallex Smith** and **Jesús Sucre**.

RAY MATTER—The Rays have lost three consecutive games and are 4-6 since the All-Star break, and 5-9 in their last 14 games since July 12...this 14-game stretch has brought the Rays from a season-high 4 games over .500 (48-44) to 53-53, the 10th time this season they've held a .500 record...the Rays would need to win tonight to avoid falling under .500 for the first time since the end of play on July 6 at NYM (43-44).

- + Tonight the Rays begin a 9-game homestand against the Angels, White Sox and Orioles...since June 11, the Rays are 17-4 (.810) at home, 2nd-best in the majors behind the Red Sox (15-3, .833)...they have gone 27-13 (.675) at home since April 18 after a 2-7 start.
- + Five times in their last 13 games the Rays have lost when scoring 5 runs or more...they were 31-1 (.969) on 5+ runs before that.
- + The Rays are 12-12 in July and haven't been better or worse than two games of .500 in a calendar month this season.
- + The Rays are 19-13 (.594) in 32 games since June 22 and 49-40 (.551) in 89 games since April 18 following a 4-13 start to the season.

THIRD DEGREE—The Rays have been outscored, 37-12, over the last 3 games, losing 15-5, 11-2 and 11-5...they have allowed double-digit runs in three consecutive games for only the second time in franchise history, following April 4-6, 2001 vs. TOR, at BOS...they have allowed at least 15 hits in each game, matching the longest such streak in club history (4th time, last June 19-22, 2007 at ARI, vs. LAD)...on Sun at BAL, the Rays yielded 4 HR to tie a season high (4th time, last June 20 at HOU)...they also dropped to 10-1 this season when hitting at least 3 HR—it was their first loss on 3 HR (or more) since Sep 15, 2017 vs. BOS.

HOUSE OF HORRORS—The Rays allowed 40 runs in the 4-game series at Camden Yards, the 2nd-most for a single series in club history behind the 4-game series from July 20-22, 2007 at NYY (49)...the Rays went 4-6 at Camden Yards this season and their 84 runs and 25 HR allowed there were both their most all-time for a single season at a visiting venue...previous records were 77 runs (2004 at NYY) and 22 HR (2017 at NYY).

NOT THE RAYS WAY—Rays pitching has a 6.45 ERA (121.1-IP, 98-R/87-ER) in the last 14 games since July 12, highest in the majors over that stretch (Rangers, 6.02)...the 98 runs are their most allowed over a 14-game span since July 21-Aug 5, 2007 (102)...they have yielded 4 runs or more in 11 of these 14 games, 6 runs or more in 8 games and double-digit runs in 5 games...over this stretch, the starters have pitched to a 5.70 ERA (47.1-IP, 30-ER), 3rd-highest in the majors and highest in the AL, and the bullpen has a 6.93 ERA (74-IP, 57-ER), 3rd-highest in the majors in the AL.

- + Rays pitching has allowed at least 4 runs in a frame 12 times in 20 games since July 6, compared to once in the previous 26 games.

PITCHING PLANS—Tonight's game will be started by **Ryne Stanek**, the 25th time the Rays will use an opener and their 16th time using Stanek in that role...the club debuted the opener this season at Angel Stadium in May, when **Sergio Romo** started consecutive games on May 19-20.

- + The Rays announced in spring training a season-opening rotation of Archer (traded), Snell (DL), Eovaldi (traded) and Faria (DL), but they have used other starters in 45.7 pct. of their 106 games.
- + The Rays have used an opener in 24 games, and they are 11-13 in these games...the openers have pitched to a 4.45 ERA (32.1-IP, 16-ER), including a 1.85 ERA (24.1-IP, 5-ER) in the last 16 games...the team has a 3.84 ERA (213.1-IP, 91-ER) in games started by openers.
- + The Rays have employed a bullpen day in an additional 19 games this season, and are 9-10 when doing so...they have used a traditional starter in 63 games, and have gone 33-30 in those games.

REDEFINING RELIEF—So far this season, Rays relievers have totaled:

- + 34 apps of at least 50 pitches, most in the majors, ahead of the Marlins (14), and their most for any season in club history (2003, 29)
- + 15 apps of at least 70 pitches, most in the majors, ahead of the Marlins (7), and their most for any season in club history (2004, 7)
- + 87 apps of at least 2 IP, most in the majors (Padres, 73)
- + 40 apps of at least 3 IP, most in the majors (Padres/Royals, 16)
- + 24 apps of at least 4 IP, most in the majors (Marlins, 8)

RAYS vs. ANGELS—The Rays went 3-1 in a 4-game series at Angel Stadium, May 17-20, and they are 77-98 all-time against the Angels (37-47 at home, 40-51 on the road)...14 of the club's 22 runs (63.6 pct.) against them this season have scored via 8 HR (4 solo, three 2-run, one grand slam)...the Rays are 45-35 against them in the Rays era, including 4-3 last season (2-2 at home, 2-1 on the road)...since the start of the 2010 season, the visiting team has dominated the matchup of these two clubs: the Angels have gone 17-11 at Tropicana Field, including 7-1-1 in series play, while the Rays are 26-11 at Angel Stadium and have gone 9-1-1 in series play.

- + **C.J. Cron** is the only player on the active roster who has previously played for the Angels...he has recorded a career-high 22 HR with the Rays this season, including a multi-HR game on Sun at BAL.

THAT'S OFFENSIVE—The Rays offense has averaged 5.67 runs over the last 18 games since July 8 at NYM, but the club has gone just 9-9 over that 18-game stretch...they have scored 4 runs or more in 13 of those 18 games, 5 runs or more in 11 games and 8 runs or more in 4 games.

- + The Rays are 1-for-their-last-23 with RISP.

FOUNTAIN OF YOUTH—The Rays have used a club-record 19 rookies this season, most in the majors ahead of the Marlins (18) and Angels (17)...Rays rookies have combined for 407 games, most in the majors ahead of the Phillies (401)...the Rays have used seven different rookies as the starting pitcher, totaling 39 starts, 2nd-most in the majors behind the Marlins (47)...tonight will be the third consecutive game they use a rookie starter, as well as the seventh time in the last 8 games and the eighth time in the last 10 games.

- + 16 players on the active roster have less than 2 years of service time, including 11 players with less than 1 year of service time.
- + The average age of the Rays active roster is 27 years, 1 month.

CLOSE SHAVES—The Rays are 20-23 (.465) in 1-run games this season, leading the majors in 1-run games (Mariners, 41) and 1-run losses (Orioles, 20)...they started the season 0-5 and 5-12 in 1-run games; since then, they are 20-18 and 15-11 in 1-run games, respectively, and they are 10-4 in 1-run games since June 19...40.6 pct. of Rays games have been decided by 1 run, compared to 27.6 pct. of games in the majors...47.8 pct. of their 1-run losses have come against the Red Sox (1-6) and Mariners (0-5).

LAST OUTING—On Sat at BAL, faced the minimum in the 1st inning, erasing a lead-off walk with an inning-ending double play...allowed a 1-out walk and back-to-back 2-out homers to **Trey Mancini** and **Joey Rickard** on consecutive pitches in the 2nd inning, snapping a 36 IP homerless streak...his 3 R/ER tied a career high (also June 10, 2017 (G2) vs. OAK) and matched his total from his previous 23 apps (12 starts) combined...was the second time in his career he yielded multiple homers in an outing...tied season highs with 2 IP, 2 hits and 2 BB, and took his third loss of the season.

HARD TO HIT—Min. 30 IP, ranks 8th in the AL with a .167 opp avg. (24-for-144)...since the beginning of June, is 0-2 with a 1.74 ERA (31-IP, 6-ER) in 24 apps (13 starts), 7th-best ERA in the AL over that stretch (min. 25 IP)...has pitched to a 1.95 ERA (37-IP, 8-ER) in 29 apps (15 starts) since May 22 to lower his season ERA from 7.36 to 2.43.

- + Min. 15 IP, his 0.45 ERA (20-IP, 1-ER) at home is best in the majors, ahead of **SEA James Pazos** (0.59)...his only run allowed here came in relief on July 9 vs. DET...hasn't allowed a run in 9 starts spanning 12.1 IP at Tropicana Field.

THE LONG BALL—All 4 HR allowed this season have come on the road, including a grand slam by **Manny Machado** on May 11 at BAL and 2-run homer by **Mike Trout** on May 19 at LAA...hasn't allowed a home run at Tropicana Field since Aug 5, 2017 vs. MIL (**Hernán Pérez**)...has yielded 2 HR in his last 29 apps (15 starts) spanning 37 IP, compared to 8 HR in his first 23 IP in the majors spanning two seasons.

A NEW LOOK—Will be making his third start in a 6-game span, and pitching for the sixth time in an 10-day span...all 15 starts this season have come since May 26 vs. BAL...this will be the 25th time the Rays will use an opener, all since May 19 at LAA...he is 0-2 with a 2.38 ERA (22.2-IP, 6-ER) in his 15 starts, while other Rays openers have combined to pitch to a 9.31 ERA (9.2-IP, 10-ER) in their 9 starts.

- + Twelve of his 15 starts this season have been scoreless...hasn't gone more than 2 IP or thrown more than 40 pitches (as a starter or reliever).

BRINGING THE HEAT—His avg. fastball velocity this season is 98.0 mph, according to StatCast, and his max velocity is 100.5 mph in his start on May 26 vs. BAL...last season he averaged 98.1 mph on his fastball, and he made 14 pitches of 100 mph or more, the most by a Ray since **Fernando Rodney** (23) in 2013...entered the season ranked by *Baseball America* as the Best Fastball in the organization.

QUIRKS OF THE OPENER—He has made 4 starts without allowing a hit, most for any pitcher within a single season since Baseball Reference data is available (1908)...according to Stats LLC, his 10 scoreless starts before the All-Star break were a major league record, passing **STL Adam Wainwright** (9) in 2014 and **LAD Sandy Koufax** (9) in 1963...from June 7-July 10, made nine consecutive scoreless starts to set a major league record—though he totaled 13.2 IP over this span—passing **LAD Zack Greinke** (6, 43.2 IP), **LAD Orel Hershiser** (6, 55 IP) and **LAD Don Drysdale** (6, 54 IP).

MAKING THE LEAP—Recalled on May 19 for his second stint with the Rays this season (also May 5-12)...started the season with Triple-A Durham, with a 1.86 ERA (9.2-IP, 2-ER) in 10 apps for the Bulls...over the last two minor league seasons, he has a 1.33 ERA (54.1-IP, 8-ER) with 77 SO and .210 opp avg.

MIX & MATCH—Is one of 14 different starting pitchers used by the Rays so far this season, most in the majors, ahead of the Angels (12), Athletics (12) and Mets (12), and tied for the most for a single season in club history (2003, 2004)...the Rays used eight starters all of last season—in fact, the 14 starters this season matches their total from the previous three seasons combined...is one of a club-record-tying 30 pitchers used by the club this season.

ELITE COMPANY—Named after Hall of Famer **Ryne Sandberg** despite being born into a family of Cardinals fans...last season, became the third "Ryne" in major league history, following Sandberg and All-Star pitcher **Ryne Duren**...his manager in Durham was Sandberg's nephew, **Jared Sandberg**.

#16 KEVIN CASH, MANAGER

- + Selected by Astros Manager **A.J. Hinch** to join the AL coaching staff for the All-Star Game for a second consecutive season.
- + Is in his fourth season as Rays manager...at age 40, is the majors' youngest active skipper—5 months younger than **SD Andy Green**.
- + His last ejection was July 18, 2017 at OAK, his seventh ejection as Rays manager...his 7 ejections are tied for 4th in franchise history.
- + Is the sixth Tampa-born manager in major league history, and second

to manage the Rays...that list includes Hall of Famers **Al Lopez** and **Tony La Russa**, **Lou Piniella**, **Dave Miley** and **John Hart**.

- + Played 12 professional seasons as a catcher, incl. parts of eight seasons in the majors (2002-10) and two years (2005-06) in the Rays org.
- + Played in the 1989 Little League World Series (Tampa Northside LL), 1999 College World Series (Florida State) and earned World Series rings in 2007 (Red Sox) and 2009 (Yankees).
