### MARINERS NOTES:

- The Mariners have lost 4 in a row, dropping to 35-23 at Safeco Field.
- Kyle Seager** (2x4, 2B, RBI, K) hit his 25th double of the year in the second inning, the second most on the team behind **Jean Segura's** 26.
  - Notched his 31st RBI against a left-handed pitcher this season, 2<sup>nd</sup>-most in the Major Leagues behind only Nolan Arenado-COL, who entered play today with 32 vs. lefties.
  - Recorded his 30th multi-hit game of the year (last: 7/24 vs. SF).
- Jean Segura** (1x4) has reached base safely in 11 of his last 13 games against the Blue Jays... he is batting .375 (21x56) with 8 runs, 6 doubles, 1 RBI, 4 walks and 3 stolen bases vs. Toronto.
- Marco Gonzales** is now 5-2 with a 3.13 ERA (23 ER, 66.1 IP) with 66 strikeouts and 15 walks in 11 starts at Safeco Field this season.
  - In the last 132.2 innings pitched this season, he has issued just 25 walks compared to 118 strikeouts.
- Mitch Haniger** (2x4, R) had his 27th multi-hit game of the year, 2<sup>nd</sup> in a row.
  - In 6 games since July 29, has reached base 11 times via hit, walk or HBP in 24 plate appearances for a .458 on-base percentage...has 7 hits, 3 walks and 1 HBP during that span.
  - Has hit safely in 5 of his last 6 games, including 4 straight games and back-to-back games with multiple hits.

### BLUE JAYS NOTES:

- The Blue Jays are 7-7 since the All-Star Break... they are 3-2 against the Mariners this year, 12-4 in the last 16 matchups vs. Seattle, and are 98-96 all-time at Safeco Field.
- The Blue Jays tallied 1 double in tonight's game and have now doubled in 18 consecutive games, extending their longest such streak of the season.
- Ryan Borucki** earned his first Major League win...tossed a career-high 8.0 innings, allowing 1 run (0 earned runs) on 4 hits while striking out 2...his 4 hits allowed are the fewest in a start in his career (previous: 6, 4x, last: 7/29 at CWS).
  - Is the first Blue Jays starter to toss at least 8.0 innings without allowing an earned run since Marcus Stroman (8.0 IP, 0 ER) on Aug. 11, 2017 vs Pittsburgh.
  - Becomes the 3<sup>rd</sup> pitcher with a start of at least 8.0 innings for the Blue Jays this season (also: J.A. Happ, 8.1, 6/20 vs. ATL and Aaron Sanchez, 8.0, 4/10 at BAL).
  - His previous career-high in innings pitched was 7.0 (2x, last: vs. NYY).
  - Has yet to give up a home run... this was his 3<sup>rd</sup> game without allowing a walk.
- Randal Grichuk** (4x5, 2B, RBI, 2 R) equaled his career-high with 4 hits (also: 7/26/17 vs. COL w/STL).
  - Had his 13th multi-hit game of the year, 2<sup>nd</sup> in the last 3 games (also: 8/1 at OAK)... it was his 5<sup>th</sup> game of at least 3 hits this season (last: 7/25 vs. MIN).
  - Has 12 extra base hits in his last 15 games (9 2B, 3 HR)...leads the AL in XBH since the All-Star Break.
  - Has hit safely in 4 straight games, batting .421 (8x19) in that span.
- Devon Travis** (2x5, HR, 3 RBI, R, K) had his 11th multi-hit game (last: 7/23 vs. MIN) and 7th multi-RBI game (last: 8/2 at SEA) of the season... it was his 3<sup>rd</sup> game this year with 3 or more RBI in a game, 9<sup>th</sup> of his career.
  - Had at least 2 hits and 3 RBI in a game for the 5<sup>th</sup> time in his career (last: 5/26/17 vs. TEX).
  - In his career against the Mariners, he is batting .294 (25x85) with 5 doubles, 1 home run and 9 RBI in 15 games... he has had 6 multi-hit games against Seattle.
- Russell Martin** (2x4, HR, 2 RBI, 2 R, K) hit a solo home run in the 4<sup>th</sup> inning...marked his 64<sup>th</sup> career home run while playing catcher for Toronto; surpassed J.P. Arencibia (63) for 2<sup>nd</sup>-most homers as the Blue Jays catcher, trailing only Ernie Whitt, 127)
  - Has hit safely in 5 straight games, batting .500 (8x16) with 7 runs, 2 doubles, 3 home runs and 6 RBI in that span.
  - Earned his 8th multi-hit game of the season, 2<sup>nd</sup> in his last 3 games (also: 8/1 at OAK).
