### TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

**April 11, 2004:** The Yankees defeat the White Sox, 5-4, as Mike Mussina records his 200th career victory.

**April 11, 1912:** In their final home opener at Hilltop Park, the Yankees debut pinstripes for the first time in franchise history in a 5-3 loss vs. Boston. Though the Yankees would abandon the look in the following two seasons (1913-14), by 1915, pinstripes were back on their home uniforms for good.

**TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY**

**April 12, 1993:** Paul O'Neill makes his Yankee Stadium debut, going 4-for-4 with 1 double, 1 triple and 2 RBI as the Yankees defeat Kansas City, 4-1.

**April 12, 1935:** Lou Gehrig is officially named captain of the Yankees, the club's first since Everett Scott was placed on waivers in June 1925.

## NEW YORK YANKEES (5-6) at BOSTON RED SOX (9-1)

**AT A GLANCE:** The Yankees are 0-1 on their six-game road trip, which continues in Boston the next two nights...will also visit Detroit for 3G (Fri.-Sun.)...went 3-3 on their six-game homestand (2-0 vs. TB, 1-3 vs. BAL).

- ▶ Are below .500 for the first time this season...have a sub-.500 record through 11G for the fourth time in the last five seasons (also 5-6 in 2014, '15, '16).
- ▶ Are scheduled to play their first 13G vs. the AL East...following this series, will not visit another AL East city until a four-game series from 5/31-6/3 at Baltimore.
- ▶ Are 3-4 thus far on a stretch of 16-of-22G at home (4/3-26): 3-3 at home, 0-1 on the road.

**YESTERDAY'S NEWS:** The Yankees dropped the opener of their three-game series at Boston on Tuesday, 14-1...was their largest margin of defeat and most runs allowed since a 15-1 loss on 8/25/15 vs. Houston...**RHP Luis Severino** (5.0IP, 8H, 5ER, 3BB, 6K) took the loss, snapping his streak of seven consecutive road starts with 1R-or-fewer allowed...**RF Aaron Judge** (3-for-4) hit a solo HR in the fifth for the Yankees' lone run, extending his hitting streak to 8G...**LF Giancarlo Stanton** (2-for-4, 1 double) and **SS Didi Gregorius** (2-for-4) had multi-hit games...**CF/LF Shane Robinson** (1-for-3, 1BB) made his Yankees debut and singled in the seventh for his first hit.

▶ Allowed 9R in the sixth, their largest inning since giving up 10R in the third inning on 5/23/15 vs. Texas.

**TANAKA TIME:** **RHP Masahiro Tanaka** is responsible for two of the Yankees' rotation's four quality starts in 2018 (6.0IP, 1ER on 3/30 at Toronto, 6.1IP, 3ER on 4/5 vs. Baltimore)...ranks 10th in the Majors with a 0.73 WHIP.

- ▶ His 15K are the most by any pitcher without a walk this season...has struck out 15-of-45 batters faced, tied for the seventh-best strikeout rate in the Majors.
- ▶ Is the first Yankees pitcher since 1908 (and one of eight MLB pitchers) to record at least 7K with 0BB in each of his first two starts in a season...no Major League pitcher in that span has done it in each of his first three starts.
- ▶ Only eight Yankees pitchers since 1908 have begun a season by issuing no walks through their first three starts, the last being Randy Johnson in 2006 (16K, 0BB through 3GS).

▶ In two starts at Fenway Park in 2017, was 1-1 with a 1.62 ERA (16.2IP, 11H, 3ER, 0BB, 12K, 1HR)...tossed a three-hit shutout on 4/27/17 and struck out nine over 7.2IP in a loss on 7/16/17-G2.

**LITERALLY:** **INF Neil Walker** has walked in 13 of the 18 games of his current on-base streak (since 9/20/17)...is batting .250 (16-for-64) with a .392 OBP and 15BB during the streak.

▶ Has also hit safely in 8-of-9 games as a Yankee.

**HERE TO HELP:** **OF Shane Robinson** went 1-for-3 with 1BB in his Yankees debut on Tues. at Boston.

▶ All six position players to make their Yankees debuts this season have hit safely in their debuts...the others: Brandon Drury, Giancarlo Stanton, Neil Walker, Billy McKinney, Jace Peterson.

**RELIEF HEATING:** **Yankees relievers** lead the Majors with 67K and a 13.30 K/9.0IP ratio (67K/45.1IP).

▶ **RHP Chad Green** is tied for the lead among AL relievers with 11K in just 5.0IP...**RHP Dellin Betances** (10K in 6.0IP) is tied for fifth and **LHP Aroldis Chapman** (9K in 5.0IP) is tied for seventh.

**THE PRICE IS RIGHT:** **Yankees batters** have scored at least 5R in five of seven games vs. Red Sox starter David Price since the start of 2016, batting .344 (62-for-180) against him...over the same span, Price has gone 2-4 with a 6.75 ERA (42.2IP, 32ER) in his seven starts against the Yankees...eight of his 17 career games with at least 6ER allowed – and seven of his 20 games with at least 10H allowed – have come against the Yankees.

▶ Price leads active pitchers in runs allowed (122), starts (37), wins (15) and strikeouts (202) vs. the Yankees.

**ALL RISE:** **RF Aaron Judge** set a season high in hits and extended his hitting streak to 8G, going 3-for-4 with a solo HR on Tues. at Boston...is the longest hitting streak by a Yankee in 2018 and tied for the fifth-longest active streak in the Majors...is batting .400 (12-for-30) with 8BB and 9K during the streak.

▶ Was 3-for-3 with a HR off Red Sox starter Chris Sale on Tuesday...entered 0-for-12 with 10K in his career vs. Sale...became the first player to record 3H off Sale in one game since he joined the Red Sox before the 2017 season...prior to Judge, the last player with a three-hit game vs. Sale was Detroit's Miguel Cabrera, who went 4-for-4 with two solo HRs against Sale on 9/5/16 at Chicago-AL.

▶ His HR on Tuesday was the 59th of his career (in his 193rd career game), which tied the all-time Major League record for HRs through 200 career games, set by Mark McGwire and Rudy York (see chart)...McGwire is the fastest ever to 60HR, reaching the mark in 202 games.

▶ His 3H on Tuesday matched his career total at Fenway Park entering 2018 (went 3-for-36 here in 2016-17)...is batting .333 (21-for-63) with 7HR in his last 19 road games (since 8/22/17) after hitting just .218 (58-for-266) with 14HR in his first 75 career road contests.

▶ Has RBI in six of his last 7G (8RBI)...his five-game RBI streak from 4/3-7 is tied with Pittsburgh's Corey Dickerson (active) for the longest in the Majors this season.

**SS Didi Gregorius** returned to the starting lineup on Tues. at Boston and went 2-for-4...is batting .389/.522/.861 through 11G this season.

▶ Leads the Majors with 10 extra-base hits and 31 total bases...leads the AL in slugging average and OPS (1.383), both second in MLB to Bryce Harper (.879 SLG, 1.408 OPS)...is tied for second in the AL with 10RBI, fourth in BA and tied for fourth with 10R.

▶ Leads the Majors with 1.2 WAR (FanGraphs).

▶ Has 14 hits in 2018, including 10 for extra-bases (4 singles, 6 doubles, 1 triple, 3HR)...in 2017, did not pick up his 10th (and 11th) extra-base hits until his 32nd game of the season on 6/3/17.

▶ Has reached safely (via H/BB/HP) multiple times in five straight games, tied for the second-longest such streak of his career (7G from 7/18-25/17)...has reached in 10-of-11G this season.

▶ Is tied for third in the AL with 9BB in 46PA in 2018 (19.6%)...drew walks in just 4.4% of his PAs over his first three years with the Yankees...did not draw his ninth walk last season until his 58th game of the year (7/3/17).

▶ Has 3HR and 3K in 46PA in 2018...is one of five hitters in 2018 (min. 30PA) with at least as many home runs as strikeouts, joining Bryce Harper (6HR/5K), Elvis Andrus (2HR/1K), Adam Eaton (2HR/2K) and José Ramírez (2HR/2K).

▶ Was the fifth Yankee (sixth occurrence) since 1908 to tally at least 10XBH through the team's first 10G of a season...the others: Derek Jeter (12XBH in 1999), Alex Rodriguez (11 in 2007), Nick Swisher (10XBH in 2009) and Babe Ruth (10XBH in both 1921, '26).

▶ In 29 career games at Fenway Park, is batting .301/.357/.437 (31-for-103) with 18R, 5 doubles, 3HR, 6RBI and 7BB.

**GOING, GOING, GIAN:** **OF Giancarlo Stanton** has 270 home runs in 997 career games...marks the fourth-most HRs through a player's first 1,000 career games, behind Ryan Howard (279), Ralph Kiner (277) and Harmon Killebrew (272).

## TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP MASASHIRO TANAKA (1-1, 2.92 ERA)

**RHP Masahiro Tanaka** will make his third start of the season tonight at Boston...the 29-year-old will pitch on extended five days' rest due to Monday's off day...took the loss in his last start on Thursday vs. Baltimore (6.1IP, 6H, 3ER, 0BB, 7K, 1HR)...is the only Yankees pitcher and the eighth in the Majors since 1908 to record at least 7K and not walk a batter in his first two starts of a season...His 15K are the most among pitchers who have not walked a batter...went 13-12 with a 4.74 ERA (178.1IP, 180H, 100R/94ER, 41BB, 194K, 35HR) in 30 starts in 2017...the Yankees went 16-14 in his 30 starts in 2017...recorded his 600th strikeout on 8/27/17 vs. Seattle, becoming the sixth Japanese pitcher to record at least 600 Major League strikeouts...was the first Yankee to record at least 600K through his first four Major League seasons...has 152 career wins between MLB (53) and NPB (99)...his 5.23 career K/BB ratio (654K/125BB) is the highest (min. 500.0IP) in the Modern Era (since 1900)...the 2014 AL All-Star was acquired by the club via the posting system from the Rakuten Golden Eagles of Japan and signed to a seven-year contract on 1/22/14...his contract runs through the 2020 season.

**LAST START:** Took a shutout into the seventh but suffered his first loss of the season on Thursday (6.1IP, 6H, 3ER, 0BB, 7K, 1HR)...extended his Yankee Stadium scoreless streak to 28.0IP (regular and postseason) before allowing a two-run HR to Adam Jones in the seventh inning...had not permitted a run at home since Trey Mancini's solo HR in the sixth inning of a start vs. Baltimore on 9/14/17.

- ✦ Suffered his first loss and failed to complete 7.0IP or earn a win at home for the first time since 8/2 vs. Detroit, snapping a streak of six starts (regular and postseason) for each...snapped a streak of four consecutive winning starts at home (regular season) and six such starts (including postseason).

**2018:** Earned the win on 3/30 at Toronto, giving up just 3H and 1ER in 6.0IP (8K, 0BB)...permitted his only run on a Randal Grichuk solo HR in the second...retired his last 13BF...threw just 79 pitches (61 strikes) to get through 6.0IP, his second-lowest pitch count for a start of at least 6.0IP (fewest: 78 in 7.0IP on 6/3/15 at Seattle)...marked his first win in a season debut since winning his Major League debut in 2014.

- ✦ Is the only Yankees pitcher since 1908 and the eighth in the Majors in that span to record at least 7K and not walk a batter in his first two starts of a season...no Major League pitcher has done it in each of his first three starts in a season.
- ✦ His 15K are the most among pitchers who have not walked a batter.

**VS. BOSTON:** Is 7-4 with a 3.65 ERA (88.2IP, 36ER) in 14 career starts vs. Boston...has allowed 3ER-or-fewer in six of his last seven starts against Boston (2.42 ERA, 48.1IP) since 4/29/16.

- ✦ Went 2-2 with a 2.83 ERA (28.2IP, 9ER) in four starts vs. the Red Sox in 2017...tossed a three-hit complete-game shutout on 4/27/17 at Fenway Park (0BB, 3K), the second shutout of his career (also 5/14/14 at the Mets)...faced just two batters over the minimum and threw only 97 pitches (72 strikes)...marked his fewest hits allowed in a complete game (previously 4H in his other CGSHO on 5/14/14 at the Mets)...was the first complete-game shutout by a Yankee at Fenway Park since Mike Mussina on 8/28/02.
- ✦ Is 3-2 with a 3.35 ERA (45.2IP, 17ER) in seven career starts at Fenway Park...has posted a 1.78 ERA (30.1IP, 6ER) in his last four starts in Boston.

**DOZEN BY DOZEN:** Is one of two pitchers in Yankees history to win at least 12 games in each of his first four Major League seasons (also Andy Pettitte, first nine seasons, 1995-2003)...is one of five Major League pitchers to earn at least 12 wins in each of the last four seasons (Greinke, Kershaw, Sale, Scherzer).

**K ZONE:** Has recorded 654K in 107 career regular season starts, the most strikeouts through 107 career regular season games in Yankees history...are tied for the 16th-most through 107G in Major League history...was the first pitcher in Yankees history to record at least 600 strikeouts through his first four Major League seasons by a Yankees pitcher.

- ✦ Recorded a career-high 194K in 2017 (previously 165K in 2016), the ninth-highest strikeout total by a Japanese pitcher (second in 2017 to Yu Darvish-209)...along with Luis Severino (230K), marked the first time the Yankees have had two pitchers each record at least 190K in a season since 2009 (CC Sabathia-197, A.J. Burnett-195).

**2017:** Went 13-12 with a 4.74 ERA (178.1IP, 180H, 100R/94ER, 41BB, 194K, 35HR) in 30 starts in 2017...ranked eighth in the AL in strikeouts, seventh in K/9.0IP ratio (9.79), fourth in K/BB ratio (4.73), and third in BB/9.0IP ratio (2.07).

- ✦ Was placed on the 10-day D.L. on 8/12/17 (retroactive to 8/10) with right shoulder inflammation (team record: 6-5)...was his third career trip to the D.L., first since 4/29-6/3/15 (right wrist tendinitis and a right forearm strain).

**2017 POSTSEASON:** Made three postseason starts on the Yankees' run to the ALCS, going 2-1 with a 0.90 ERA (20.0IP, 10H, 2ER, 3BB, 18K)...was the fifth-lowest ERA by a Yankee in one postseason (min. 18.0IP)...was the third Yankees pitcher to record multiple scoreless starts of at least 7.0IP in a single postseason, joining Roger Clemens (2000) and Whitey Ford (1960)...was the fifth pitcher in Baseball history with multiple scoreless starts with at least 7.0IP and 3H-or-fewer in one postseason, joining San Diego's Kevin Brown (1998), the Yankees' Roger Clemens (2000), Arizona's Randy Johnson (2001) and Detroit's Kenny Rogers (2006).

**FOUR STRIKES:** Is one of four Japanese-born pitchers to earn at least 10 wins in four different Major League seasons (Hideo Nomo-7x, Hiroki Kuroda-5x, Yu Darvish-4x) and the first to do it over his first four MLB seasons.

## THURSDAY'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP SONNY GRAY (1-0, 3.60 ERA)

**RHP Sonny Gray** will make his third start of the season on Thursday vs. Boston...the 28-year-old will pitch on regular four days' rest...earned his first win of the season on Saturday vs. Baltimore (6.0IP, 4H, 3ER, 2BB, 4K)...has 49 career wins in 125 career starts, with 32-of-49 wins coming while not allowing a home run...made his fourth career Opening Day active roster (also: 2014-16 with Oakland)...was on the 10-day disabled list and missed the start of the 2017 season...went 4-7 with a 3.72 ERA (65.1IP, 27ER) in 11 regular season starts with the Yankees in 2017 after being acquired along with international signing bonus pool money from Oakland in exchange for OF Dustin Fowler, RHP James Kaprielian and INF/OF Jorge Mateo on 7/31/17...has thrown at least 6.0IP in 91-of-125 career starts...was an AL All-Star and finished third in AL Cy Young Award voting in 2015...was originally selected by Oakland in the first round (18th overall) of the 2011 First-Year Player Draft out of Vanderbilt University.
