HERE'S THE STORY...

- ♦ The D-backs' 24-11 record is the club's second-best 35-game start all-time, behind 25-10 in 2000...their best 36-game starts are 25-10 in 2000 and 23-12 in 2008.
- ♦ The D-backs have the NL's best record (.686) and Majors' third best behind the Red Sox (25-10; .714) and Yankees (25-10, .714).
- ♦ **Patrick Corbin**, in 2 starts vs. Dodgers, is 1-0 with a 0.68 ERA (1 ER in 13.1 IP), .091 average (4-for-44), 3 walks and 17 strikeouts.
- ♦ **Daniel Descalso**, in his last 8 games, is hitting .421 (8-for-19)/1.402 OPS with 3 doubles, 1 triple, 1 homer, 5 RBI, 4 walks and 2 hit-by-pitches.
- ♦ **T.J. McFarland**, since joining the D-backs in 2017, has held the Dodgers scoreless in 6 of 9 games, going 2-0 with a 2.13 ERA (3 ER in 12.2 IP), a .196 average (9-for-46) and 5 strikeouts.
- ♦ **A.J. Pollock's** 7 homers (11 games) are third most by a D-back in a season vs. Dodgers behind Luis Gonzalez (11 HR/19 G in 2001) and Paul Goldschmidt (8 HR/19 G in 2015).
- ♦ **Archie Bradley** has 10 consecutive scoreless outings (10.1 IP).
- ♦ Of the D-backs 265 hits, 113 have been for extra bases...their 42.64 percent of extra base hits-to-hits leads the NL (average is 34.87%), ahead of Dodgers (37.58%; 112:298), Braves (37.39%; 123:329) and Cubs (37.11%; 108:291).

YESTERDAY'S RECAP

- ♦ The D-backs won, 8-5, @ Dodgers in 12 innings on **Daniel Descalso's** go-ahead, 3-run homer in the top of the 12th.
- ♦ The D-backs hit 4 homers, their third such game this season, all against the Dodgers.
- ♦ **A.J. Pollock** had a 2-run homer in the first inning, **Chris Owings** hit a solo shot in the third inning and **John Ryan Murphy** hit a 2-run homer in the fourth inning.
- ♦ **T.J. McFarland** got the win with 1.1 perfect frames (1 K).
- ♦ **Zack Godley** allowed 4 runs in 5.2 innings, while the bullpen allowed 1 run over 6.1 innings.

THE NAME IS DESCALSO...DANIEL DESCALSO

- ♦ **Daniel Descalso's** 6 go-ahead RBI are second on the team behind A.J. Pollock (12), while his 3 game-winning RBI are fourth behind Pollock (5), Paul Goldschmidt (4) and David Peralta (4).
- ♦ Last season, Descalso set career highs with 8 go-ahead RBI and 6 game-winning RBI.
- ♦ In his last 15 games, is hitting .378 (14-for-37)/1.210 OPS with 5 doubles, 1 triple, 2 homers, 12 RBI, 8 walks and 2-hit-by-pitches.
 - Among NL players since April 21 (min. 30 PA), he ranks second with a 1.210 OPS, third with a .378 average and .730 SLG, tied for third with 3 game-winning RBI, fourth with a .480 OBP, tied for eighth with 8 extra-base hits, 10th with a .414 batting average on balls in play, tied for 11th with 12 RBI.
- ♦ With runners on base, he has a 1.005 OPS with 9 hits (7 for extra bases with 3 doubles, 1 triple, 3 homers), 17 RBI and 6 walks.

McFARLAND MAKING AN IMPACT

- ♦ **T.J. McFarland**, among NL relievers (min. 10 GR), ranks second with 22.2 inning, tied for second with 90 batters faced, third with 1.19 walks per 9.0 innings, fourth with .033 walks per batters faced and fourth fewest with 3 walks.
- ♦ McFarland's season stats are trending as career bests (personal best in parentheses) with a 1.06 WHIP (1.41 in 2014), 2.38 ERA (2.76 in 2014), .244 opponent average (.277 in 2013), .267 opponent OBP (.337 in 2013), .662 opponent OPS (.737 in 2013) and .260 opponent batting average on balls in play (.322 in 2013).
- ♦ Holding lefties to a .192 average (5-for-26)/.192 OBP/.269 SLG with 2 doubles, 2 RBI and 5 strikeouts.
- ♦ In his last 6 games with runners in scoring position, opponents are hitting .133 (2-for-15) with 2 RBI, 1 walks and 2 strikeouts.
- ♦ Among NL relievers on the road since the start of 2017 (min. 25 GR), is third with 205 batters faced and fourth with 46.1 innings.

EL POLLO LOCO

- ♦ **A.J. Pollock**, in 11 games vs. Dodgers, is hitting .349 (15-for-43)/.391 OBP/.930 SLG with 4 doubles, 7 homers, 11 RBI, 3 walks and 3 stolen bases.
 - Since April 17, 2017, in 26 games vs. Dodgers, is hitting .333 (33-for-99)/1.127 OPS with 9 doubles, 10 homers, 20 RBI and 10 walks.
- ♦ In his last 18 games, is hitting .347 (25-for-72)/1.156 OPS with 2 doubles, 2 triples, 8 homers, 19 RBI, 6 walks and 4 stolen bases.
- ♦ Ranks among the NL leaders in OPS (1st, 1.038), SLG (1st, .677), total bases (1st, 88), extra-base hits (2nd, 23), RBI (2nd, 31), homers (T-2nd, 11), stolen bases (T-5th, 8), average (T-8th, .308).

BOXBERGER LOCKING DOWN THE BACK END

- ♦ **Brad Boxberger's** 11 saves are third in the Majors behind Wade Davis/COL (14) and Edwin Diaz/SEA (13).
- ♦ Has held the Dodgers scoreless in 5 of 6 games (1 ER in 6.0 IP), going 4-for-5 in save opps with 3 hits, 4 walks and 8 strikeouts.
 - Has held NL West scoreless in 8 of 11 games (4 ER in 10.0 IP), going 6-for-7 in save opps with 10 hits, 5 walks, 14 strikeouts.

SNAKEBITES

- ♦ D-backs cleanup hitters, among NL teams, rank first with a 1.021 OPS, .679 slugging pct., 12 homers, 25 extra-base hits, 95 total bases and 13 go-ahead RBI and second with a .307 average.
- ♦ D-backs leadoff hitters, among NL teams, rank first in average (.282) and RBI (21), second in SLG (.486), third in hits (40), tied for third in OBP (.360) and fourth in extra-base hits (16).
- ♦ The D-backs' 113 extra-base hits are second in the NL behind the Braves (123).
- ♦ The D-backs are 18-1 (.947) when scoring 4+ runs, the best mark in the Majors ahead of the Angels (17-2, .895), Yankees (23-3, .885), Giants (17-3, .850), Mets (15-3, .833)...the D-backs have won 13 straight games when scoring 4+ runs, 21 of 22 games (since Sept. 26, 2017), 25 of 27 (since Sept. 13, 2017) and 35 of 40 (since Aug. 22, 2017).

#BRINGINTHEBEARD

- ♦ **Archie Bradley** has held opponents scoreless in 7 of 8 road games with 2.35 ERA (2 ER in 7.2 IP), .185 opponent average and 6 strikeouts.
- ♦ Among NL relievers on the road since 2017 (min. 25 G), ranks third with a 1.94 ERA and tied for 11th with 46 strikeouts and 41.2 innings.

LAD Series: 2-4, BB, R **Trip:** 2-4, BB, R

- ◆ Is hitting .270 (10-for-37) vs. Dodgers in 2018 (.205 vs. rest of MLB).
- ◆ Had a career-high 5 RBI on March 30 vs. Rockies, tying D-backs record for a shortstop (also: Stephen Drew, April 28, 2011 vs. Cubs).
- ◆ His 36 defensive runs saved at shortstop ranks third in the NL since 2015, behind Brandon Crawford (49) and Addison Russell (49).
- ◆ Limited to 53 games in 2017 after suffering a pair of right-hand injuries.
- ◆ Rated by *Baseball America* as the NL's second-best defensive shortstop in 2017.

- ◆ Is hitting .240 (6-for-25) on the road (.094 @ Chase Field).
- ◆ His 2.77 catchers ERA is the best in the NL [min. 125.0 IC].
- ◆ In 2017 with the Tigers and Cubs, had 13 doubles, 14 homers, 49 RBI in 112 games.
- ◆ From 2010-17, ranked second in the AL with 133 catcher caught stealing (Salvador Perez, 135) and fourth with a 29.3 caught-stealing pct.
- ◆ 2011 AL starting catcher in the All-Star Game and Silver Slugger Award™ winner.

- ◆ Is batting .378 (14-for-37)/.480 OBP/.730 SLG with 5 doubles, 1 triple, 2 home runs, 12 RBI, 8 walks and 7 runs scored in his last 15 games.
- ◆ Has gone 6-for-16 (.375) with RISP in his last 15 games.
- ◆ Hit the go-ahead, 3-run homer in the 12th inning on May 8 @ Dodgers.
- ◆ Made his fourth career pitching appearance May 4 vs. Astros (0 ER in 0.2 IP)...hasn't allowed a baserunner in 3.0 career innings, the first position player in the live ball era (since 1920) to retire 9+ consecutive hitters [source: STATS LLC].
- ◆ Has made 17 starts at third base, 3 at second base and 2 in left field.
- ◆ Since 2010, ranks among active NL pinch hitters in plate appearances (1st, 251), times on base (1st, 75), home runs (T-3rd, 5) and hits (4th, 46).

- ◆ 7 of his 13 hits are for extra-bases (3 2B, 2 3B, 2 HR).
- ◆ Homered twice in a 3-game span from April 24-26 after hitting 1 home run in his previous 62.
- ◆ Is 1 of 3 players in MLB with 20+ steals in every season since 2012 (also: Elvis Andrus and Jose Altuve).
- ◆ Ranks seventh among outfielders since 2012 with 68 defensive runs saved [min. 4,000 innings]...is fifth among center fielders in that time (48) [min. 3,000 innings].

- ◆ In 78 games between Triple-A Rochester and Reno last season, threw out 40.7 percent of attempted base stealers (24-for-59).
