SWEET RELIEF

Brandon Morrow on Saturday picked up his 20th save, making him the first Cub to reach that mark in the season's first half since Kerry Wood in 2008 (24) ... Randy Rosario on Saturday improved to 4-0, with the four wins leading Cubs relievers.

EXTRA, EXTRA: Kyle Hendricks (8.1 IP, 0 ER) was dominant but so was the opposition as the Chicago Cubs last night fell to the San Francisco Giants, 2-1, in 11 innings at AT&T Park to start their two-city, seven-day, six-game West Coast swing through San Francisco (0-1) and San Diego leading up to the All-Star Break.

Ⓞ Hendricks last night became only the second Cubs pitcher in the last 25 years to toss more than 8.0 innings without allowing an earned run and recording a no-decision, joining Jeff Samardzija on May 5, 2014 ... Samardzija allowed one unearned run in 9.0 innings in an eventual 3-1, 12-inning Cubs setback vs. the White Sox.

Ⓞ Last night marked Chicago's 10th extra inning game this season (5-5) and already the third time the club has played extras in back-to-back affairs, joining March 30-31 in Miami and May 5-6 at St. Louis.

Ⓞ The Cubs have already collected four wins in N.L. West ballparks this season after going 4-11 at the N.L. West a season ago.

QUITE THE FEAT WITH THE BAT AND FEET: Javier Báez yesterday swiped his 17th stolen base of the season to join his 17 home runs to date ... he has become only the second player in franchise history to reach 17 in each category prior to the All-Star Break, joining outfielder Sammy Sosa with 27 homers and 18 stolen bases prior to the Break in 1996.

Ⓞ Overall, Báez is only the fourth major leaguer to turn the trick in the last 10 seasons, joining Cleveland's Jose Ramirez (24 HR, 19 SB in 2018), the Dodgers' Matt Kemp (22 HR, 27 SB in 2011) and Texas' Ian Kinsler (20 HR, 18 SB in 2009).

Ⓞ Additionally, Báez is just the fourth player ever to reach 20 doubles, 15 homers, five triples, 60 RBI and 15 stolen bases prior to the All-Star break ... he joins the Giants Willie Mays in 1960, the Rockies Carlos Gonzalez in 2013 and the Pirates Andrew McCutchen in 2014.

Ⓞ Furthermore, Báez has become the first Cubs middle infielder to reach 17 homers before the All-Star Break since Hall of Famer Ryne Sandberg, who had 24 homers at the Break in 1990.

Ⓞ Projected over 162 games, Báez is on pace to record 41 doubles, 31 homers, 31 stolen bases and 120 RBI this season.

Q QUOTIENT: Cubs pitcher José Quintana tonight is scheduled to make his final start before the All-Star Break ... a year ago, Quintana joined the Cubs from the White Sox as part of a five-player trade during the All-Star Break on July 13.

Ⓞ Since joining the Cubs, Quintana has gone 14-9 with a 3.99 ERA (78 ER/176.0 IP) in 31 starts ... he is one of only four National League southpaws to reach 14 wins since last year's Break, joining teammate Jon Lester (19-4), Arizona's Patrick Corbin (14-7) and Washington's Gio Gonzalez (14-10).

IT'S JOB ONE: Kyle Hendricks last night recorded a quality start (8.1 IP, 0 ER), just the second by a Cubs pitcher in the last 17 games starting June 21 (Jose Quintana has the only other Cubs quality start in this span on July 4 vs. Detroit) ... the Cubs enjoyed 11 quality starts in 15 games between May 31-June 16 in the days leading up to this recent drought.

Ⓞ Cubs starting pitchers are 21-7 with a 1.39 ERA (35 ER/226.0 IP) in 35 quality starts this season.

LOFTY AVERAGE: Albert Almora Jr. leads the N.L. with a .323 batting average (86-for-266), one point ahead of Cincinnati's Scooter Gennett (.322) ... Almora aims to be the first Cub in the top five in the league in batting average at the Break since Derrek Lee in 2007.

Ⓞ Almora is hitting .368 (14-for-38) with three doubles, a homer and six RBI in his last 10 games since June 28.

HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR! MLB on Sunday announced that second baseman Javier Báez (starting via fan vote), catcher Willson Contreras (starting via fan vote) and pitcher Jon Lester (elected via player vote) were named to the N.L. All-Star Team.

Ⓞ Contreras has been named to his first All-Star team and is the first Cubs catcher to make the club since Geovany Soto started the game in 2008.

Ⓞ Báez makes his first career All-Star team and is the first Cubs second baseman to start the game since Ben Zobrist in 2016 ... prior to Zobrist, the previous Cubs second baseman to be named to the squad had been Ryne Sandberg, who started in 1993.

Ⓞ Lester has been named an All-Star for the fifth time in his career, his second as a Cub, as he previously earned A.L. honors in 2010, 2011 and 2014 and with the Cubs in 2016.

ON THE RECORD: In Chicago's last 42 games since May 25, the team has gone 26-16 (.619) for the second-best winning percentage in the N.L. (Dodgers, 27-14/.659) and sixth-best in the majors.

Ⓞ The Cubs have won nine of their last 12 games following a 4-9, 13-game stretch from June 12-25.

Ⓞ With 51 wins, the Cubs have surpassed their pre-All-Star Break total from a season ago with five games to go until the Break ... last year, the Cubs took a 43-45 record into the Break.

Ⓞ This is just the seventh time the Cubs have reached 50 wins prior to the All-Star Break ... the others: 61 in 1969, 57 in 2008, 54 in 1977, 53 in 2016, 52 in 1973 and 51 in 2001.

SINCE THE LAST ASB: As we near next week's All-Star Break, Kyle Schwarber's 34 homers since last season's Mid-Summer Classic are tied for third-most in the N.L., trailing only Colorado's Nolan Arenado (42) and Arizona's Paul Goldschmidt (36).

Ⓞ Jon Lester's 19 victories since last year's All-Star break are tops in the N.L. and tied for third-most in the majors behind only Cleveland's Corey Kluber (23) and the Yankees Luis Severino (23).

Ⓞ Since the last All-Star break, Javier Báez is hitting .293 (159-for-546) with 30 homers and 107 RBI in 153 games ... Anthony Rizzo has driven in 112 runs since last All-Star break, second-most in the N.L. in that span (Colorado's Nolan Arenado leads with 123).

WHAT'S THE DIFFERENCE?: The Cubs lead the National League and are fourth in the majors with a run differential of +104, trailing only Houston (+186), Boston (+154) and the Yankees (+123) ... the Cubs 447 runs scored lead the N.L. and rank fourth in the majors, while Chicago's 343 runs allowed are second-lowest in the N.L. (Milwaukee, 340) and fifth-fewest in the majors.

Ⓞ The Cubs were 16-15 with a +21 run differential through May 6 ... since May 7, the Cubs have gone 35-22 with a +83 run differential, outscoring opponents 300-217 during that stretch.

NIFTY FIFTY AND SIXTY: Javier Báez has upped his season total to 65 RBI, second-most in the N.L. behind Cincinnati's Eugenio Suarez (68) ... with five games to go until the All-Star Break, Báez is the first Cubs middle infielder to reach 65 RBI prior to the Break since Ernie Banks had 76 RBI prior to the All-Star Break in 1960 while manning shortstop.

Ⓞ Meanwhile, Anthony Rizzo has 59 RBI so far, tied for sixth-best in the N.L. ... he's also the last Cubs first baseman to reach 60 RBI prior to the All-Star Break, having netted 63 in 2016 ... prior to that, Derrek Lee had turned the trick with 72 in 2005 ... Rizzo has reached 50 RBI by the Break for the fourth time in his career (also 2013, 2016 and 2017) ... he is only the Cub first baseman in franchise history to do so four times before the Break (Ernie Banks did so three times while playing 1B).

José tonight makes his 18th start of the season, and 11th on the road ... has taken a decision in 13 of his 17 starts ... has a 2.93 ERA (14 ER/43.0 IP) in night games this season ... is 13-4 with a 2.77 ERA (66 ER/214.2 IP) and 196 strikeouts in 33 career starts in July.

- Ⓢ Did not allow an earned run in three-straight road starts, May 4-31 (17.0 consecutive innings) ... tied for the most consecutive road starts with 0 ER by a Cubs starter since 1912.
- Ⓢ Has a 2.12 ERA (8 ER/34.0 IP) in the first and second innings this season and a 5.46 ERA (35 ER/57.2 IP) after the second inning.
- Ⓢ With 10 strikeouts in 5.2 innings against the Phillies on June 6, he became the first Cubs pitcher to record at least 10 strikeouts in an outing shorter than 6.0 innings since Jake Arrieta on June 5, 2016 vs. Arizona (12 SO, 5.0 IP).
- Ⓢ Made his season debut April 1 at Miami ... allowed six runs in 6.0 innings in the Cubs' 6-0 setback.
- Ⓢ Has four starts of at least 6.0-scoreless innings this season (including two starts of 7.0-scoreless frames).
- Ⓢ Earned his first win of the season in the Cubs' 3-0 victory at Milwaukee on April 8, allowing just three hits and striking out six over 6.0 scoreless innings.
- Ⓢ Recorded his 1,000th-career strikeout during the Cubs' 9-7 win at Colorado on April 22 ... became the first Colombian-born pitcher to reach 1,000 career strikeouts.
- Ⓢ Collected his fourth win of the season on May 9 in a 13-4 win over Miami ... threw a season-high 108 pitches and recorded his third quality start of the season ... was his fourth start of the season allowing one or zero earned runs.
- Ⓢ Has gone 3-3 with a 1.80 ERA (8 ER/40.0 IP) in seven starts vs. the N.L. Central this season ... overall is 7-4 with a 2.45 ERA (24 ER/88.1 IP) in 15 starts vs. divisional opponents since joining the Cubs.

2017 Season

Began the season with the White Sox before being traded to the Cubs during the All-Star Break ... after joining the Cubs he went 7-3 with a 3.74 ERA (35 ER/84.1 IP) and a complete game shutout in 14 starts.

- Ⓢ Allowed three or fewer earned runs in 11 of his 14 outings with the Northsiders.
- Ⓢ Led all Cubs starters after the All-Star Break in strikeouts (98), opponents average (.228), strikeouts per nine innings (10.46) and WHIP (1.10).
- Ⓢ Established career bests in hits per nine IP (8.1) and strikeouts per nine innings (9.9).

- Ⓢ José made his 200th career start on July 4, becoming the 14th active left-handed pitcher to reach the mark ... his 3.58 ERA (490 ER/1231.1 IP) ranks sixth among all active lefties with at least 200 starts ... with his seven strikeouts against Colorado on April 22, he also became the 14th active left-handed pitcher to reach 1,000-career strikeouts ... since the start of the 2013 season, José ranks in the top 10 among all left-handed pitchers in games started (178), innings pitched (1,095.0), strikeouts (991) and wins (58).
- Ⓢ Joins teammate Jon Lester as the only lefties to start at least 32 games in each of the last five campaigns.
- Ⓢ Debuted with the White Sox in 2012 and went 50-54 with a 3.51 ERA (412 ER/1,055.1 IP) in 172 appearances, all but three as a starter on the South Side.
- Ⓢ Was named a 2016 A.L. All-Star ... finished 13-12 with a 3.20 ERA (74 ER/208.0 IP) in 32 starts in 2016.
- Ⓢ Pitched in the 2017 World Baseball Classic for Colombia ... made one start, allowing one run on just one hit in 5.2 innings pitched.
- Ⓢ Is one of 20 Colombian-born players to appear in the majors all-time.
- Ⓢ Has 182 strikeouts since the Cubs traded for him on July 13, 2017, the most of any Cubs pitcher during that span.

Mike will make his ninth start of the season and his 27th appearance tomorrow ... allowed three runs in 5.0 innings in his last start July 6 vs. Cincinnati ... took a loss in the Cubs' 3-2 setback ... has pitched at least 5.0 innings in all eight of his starts, going 3-2 with a 2.76 ERA (14 ER/45.2 IP).

- Ⓢ Is 13-14 with a 3.93 ERA (105 ER/240.2 IP) in 45-career starts, including two complete game shutouts ... is 5-8 with three saves and a 2.80 ERA (47 ER/151.0 IP) in 90-career relief outings.
- Ⓢ Is 8-7 with a 3.55 ERA (55 ER/139.1 IP) in 27-career starts with the Cubs, including 7-4 with a 2.68 ERA (24 ER/80.2 IP) in his last 15 starts.
- Ⓢ Has gone 0-1 with a save and a 3.78 ERA (7 ER/16.2 IP) in four-career games against the Giants, including two starts ... in two outings last season, both in relief, he did not allow a run in 5.1 innings of work ... picked up a save May 25 of last season at Wrigley Field, tossing 4.0-scoreless innings.
