SCARY MOVIE

- The Colorado Rockies continue their first East Coast road trip of 2017 with the second of four games against the Washington Nationals ... they will also play three games at Pittsburgh, April 16-18.
- Won the first game of the series against the Nationals last night, 5-1 ... Chad Bettis pitched seven innings and allowed a solo homer along with three hits, two walks and five strikeouts ... it was his seventh start of his career in which he pitched at least seven innings and allowed one run or fewer ... Bettis is now 2-0 with a 2.04 ERA (17.2 IP, 4 ER).
- DJ LeMahieu went 4-for-5 with two doubles, two home runs and four RBI, his second career multi-home run game (also: Aug. 26, 2017 at Atlanta) ... the four RBI were a career high and he also tied his career high with four hits (10x, last: Aug. 16, 2017 vs. Atlanta) ... is the third player in franchise history with two doubles and two homers in the same game, joining Corey Dickerson and Todd Walker.

BLOW-BY-BLOW

- Three Rockies were ejected from Wednesday's game against San Diego after Nolan Arenado charged pitcher Luis Perdomo in the third inning ... Arenado, Gerardo Parra and starting pitcher German Márquez were all ejected as well as Padres catcher A.J. Ellis and Perdomo ... the Rockies eventually scored five runs in the inning, tied for their most runs in a single frame this season.

ALL THAT POWER

- DJ LeMahieu is 7-for-10 with three doubles and two home runs his past two games ... he has reached base in 12 of 14 games, has at least one hit in 10 games and has multiple hits in seven contests.
- His four home runs on the season are half way to his 2017 season total of eight ... in 2017, he did not hit his fourth home run until July 6 ... the quickest he has ever reached four home runs was in 2016, when he recorded his fourth home run on June 9.

IN THE PINCH

- Pat Valaika's pinch-hit single in the third inning of Wednesday's game snapped the Rockies' 0-for-22 hitless streak in the pinch ... the Rockies' 25 pinch-hit at-bats are the most in the Major Leagues.

SLUGFEST

- The Rockies are tied for the National League lead with 19 home runs (St. Louis) ... in 2017, Colorado ranked 10th in the NL with 192 home runs.
- The Rockies .233 team batting average ranks tied for 10th in the National League ... their .273 batting average in 2017 led the Major Leagues.
- The Rockies .282 batting average on balls in play ranks 11th in the National League ... they led MLB with a .332 BABIP in 2017.

in center field and went 1-for-4 last night in his first game at Nationals Park since his last season with the club in 2015 ... Desmond was with the Rockies when they visited D.C. in 2017 but was on the 10-day disabled list at the time.

- Desmond's 927 games played with the Nationals are the second-most in franchise history ... he hit .264 with 185 doubles, 21 triples, 110 home runs and 432 RBI ... was named an All-Star in 2012 and won the Silver Slugger at shortstop in 2013 and 2014.

MAIN EVENT

- Colorado will play the Nationals seven times this year, including the Rockies' first four-game set in Washington since 2013.
- All-time vs. Washington and Montreal, Colorado is 108-83 ... the Rockies are 52-37 vs. Washington since the move to D.C. in 2005.
- In Washington, the Rockies are 28-16, including 21-12 at Nationals Park ... the Rockies have won two of three in D.C. each of the last three seasons, going 7-3 over that span ... have won five of the past six here.
- DJ LeMahieu is a career .391 hitter (45-for-115) against the Nationals ... he has reached base safely in 12 consecutive games against Washington since the 2016 season with multiple hits in seven games ... is 24-for-50 (.480) that span since Aug. 15, 2016 ... LeMahieu is a career .390 hitter in D.C., going 23-for-59 with four doubles, four homers and 14 RBI ... he has hit safely in 12 of 15 games at Nationals Park ... at Nationals Park, his average leads all active players with 60 or more plate appearances.
- In 30 career games against the Nationals, Nolan Arenado has batted .316 (36-for-114) with six home runs ... in 14 games at Nationals Park, Arenado has hit .364 (20-for-55) with three doubles, two triples and four home runs ... his average at Nationals Park ranks third among active players with 60 or more PA.

OTTOMATIC

- Adam Ottavino has multiple strikeouts in six of his seven games, including striking out the side three times ... is currently second in the Major Leagues among relievers with 16 strikeouts ... has allowed one hit and one walk over his eight innings of work across seven appearances.

WE THREE KINGS

- Since the start of the 2015 season, Charlie Blackmon (587), DJ LeMahieu (571) and Nolan Arenado (561) rank first, second and third, respectively, among National League players in hits.
- Since the start of the '15 season, LeMahieu's .320 batting average is the highest in NL.
- Nolan Arenado leads all Major Leaguers with 460 RBI since 2014.

WHERE HE LEFT OFF

- Charlie Blackmon, who has missed the last three games due to right quad tightness, is 11-for-39 (.282) to begin the season with two doubles, four home runs and six RBI ... signed a six-year contract that includes two player options April 3.

MOVING UP

- With two hits April 2, Carlos González passed Vinny Castilla to move into fourth place all-time in Rockies history with 1,207 hits ... he is 66 hits from passing Dante Bichette (1,278) for third-most in franchise history.

BACK IN BLACK

- Manager Bud Black led the Rockies to a postseason appearance in his first season in 2017 with the club going 87-75 and advancing to the National League Wild Card game ... it was the Rockies' first winning season since 2010.
- Black and Nationals Manager Dave Martinez were teammates on the San Francisco Giants from 1993-94.

FREE AS A BIRD

- Second-year southpaw is a native of Denver who graduated from Thomas Jefferson High School ... will be making his third start of the season, his second ever against Washington.
- Is a member of his second Opening Day roster ... earned his first win and recorded his first hit in his Major League debut in the Rockies Home Opener on April 7, 2017 vs. the Los Angeles Dodgers.
- Pitched collegiately at the University of Evansville in Southern Indiana ... drafted by Colorado in the first round of the 2014 First-Year Player Draft (eighth overall).

CAPITAL

- Will make his second career start against Washington, second at Nationals Park ... secured the win on July 30, 2017 after allowing four runs (three earned) on nine hits with two home runs and four strikeouts over five innings.

LAST TIME OUT

- Pitched for the first time at home in his last start on Sunday and suffered the loss against the Atlanta Braves ... pitched six innings, allowing three runs on seven hits with two home runs, two walks and five strikeouts.
- Allowed back-to-back to home runs (Markakis and Swanson) ... has now allowed two homers in each of his starts this season.

ROAD WARRIOR

- Has made one road start in 2018, and lost at San Diego on April 3 ... pitched 5.1 innings, allowing four runs on five hits with two home runs, two walks and six strikeouts.
- In 2017, went 5-3 with a 4.57 ERA (69.0 IP, 35 ER) with 28 walks and 41 strikeouts in 14 games, 12 starts, on the road.
- Started 4-0 with a 3.18 ERA (34.0 IP, 12 ER) over his first six road starts last season, with the Rockies going 4-0 ... finished the season going 1-3 with a 5.91 ERA (35.0 IP, 23 ER) over his last eight road appearances, including six starts.
- The Rockies went 9-3 over his 12 road starts in 2017.

NEWSFLASH, HE'S FROM DENVER

- Went 6-8 with a 3.75 ERA (84.0 IP, 35 ER), 34 walks and 63 strikeouts in 16 starts at home in 2017 ... recorded nine quality starts at Coors Field.
- Made three relief appearances in Denver, went 0-0 with a 3.00 ERA (3.0 IP, 1 ER), one walk and three strikeouts.
- His ERA in Denver was the 10th-lowest home mark in Colorado history among all pitchers ... lowest mark at Coors Field since Jorge De La Rosa had an ERA of 2.76 in 2013 and 3.08 in 2014 ... second-lowest ERA by a Rockies rookie (Denny Stark, 3.21, 2002).

SPRING FLING

- Went 1-1 with a 4.82 ERA (18.2 IP, 10 ER), 23 hits, four walks and 15 strikeouts in five starts this Spring.
- Made his last Spring Training outing in a Minor League game on March 28 on the Salt River Fields backfields ... his last Cactus League appearance was March 23.

ROOKIE CARD

- Last season tied for the Major League lead among rookies with 11 wins (also: German Márquez) ... ranked third in innings (156.0), fifth in ERA (4.10, min. 15 starts) and seventh in strikeouts (107).
- His 4.10 ERA was the fourth-lowest by a rookie in franchise history, the lowest since Jhoulys Chacin set the franchise record for rookies in 2010 (3.28).
- Became the first starting pitcher to make his Major League debut in his hometown in his club's home opener since Chuck Dobson did so on April 19, 1966 as a member of the Kansas City Athletics.

WHAT A RELIEF

- Made his first professional relief appearance July 15 at New York-NL ... pitched three scoreless, hitless innings with one walk and four strikeouts.
- In five relief appearances last season, went 0-0 with a 2.84 ERA (6.0 IP, 2 ER)
