TREAT YOUR MOTHER RIGHT—The Rays are 10-10 all-time on Mother's Day...they have won their last four road games on Mother's Day (2017 at BOS, 2016 at LAA, 2012 at BAL, 2011 at BAL)...this weekend the Rays, Orioles and all major league clubs are wearing newly designed caps highlighted by a pink crown and team color brim...a matching pair of pink socks is optional for every player, while regular club jerseys will be adorned by a pink ribbon on the left chest...many players will use pink bats and don pink wristbands...the game-worn caps will be available for auction at raysbaseball.com/auctions beginning on Tues., May 22.

- + Three years ago, Manager **Kevin Cash** was ejected from a 2-1 loss against the Rangers at home with his mother **Patsy** in the stands.
- + The Rays were on the wrong end of **Dallas Braden's** perfect game on Mother's Day 2010 in Oakland.

ROSTER MOVE—Following yesterday's doubleheader, the Rays returned LH **Anthony Banda** to Triple-A Durham per MLB's 26th Man Rule...the Rays also optioned RH **Ryne Stanek** to Durham and recalled RH **Austin Pruitt** from Durham, his second stint of the season.

TWIN BILL SPLIT—Yesterday the Rays and Orioles split a traditional, single-admission doubleheader, with the Rays losing, 6-3, in the first game and winning, 10-3, in the nightcap...it was the 27th doubleheader in club history and eighth traditional doubleheader, and the Rays are 4-12-11 and 1-2-5, respectively, including 1-2-3 and 1-0-1 against the Orioles.

- + The first pitch of yesterday's first game was 3:07 p.m., and the last pitch of the second game was 10:30 p.m. ...the second game included a 1:19 rain delay, the Rays first in-game delay of the season.
- + The first game lasted 2 hours, 27 minutes, the shortest game involving the Rays since July 28, 2017 at NYY (2:23).

RAY MATTER—Last night's win at BAL snapped a 5-game losing streak, the Rays 2nd-longest of the season...the Rays are 3-7 in their last 10 games and 4-8 in their last 12 games on the heels of an 8-game winning streak.

- + With a win today, the Rays would improve to 5-2-1 over their last 8 series, compared to 1-4-0 in their first 5 series this season...with a loss, they would fall to 1-3 in their last 4 series after a 4-0 run.
- + In the first game of yesterday's doubleheader, the Rays scored 3 runs in the 1st inning before allowing 6 unanswered runs...it was their 11th time this season the Rays held a lead and lost, tied for 4th in the majors...they allowed 3 HR, the first time they allowed 3 HR or more in consecutive games since Sep 27-28, 2017 at NYY.
- + In the nightcap of yesterday's doubleheader, the Rays scored 10 runs, their most since April 28 at BOS (12)...it was their third time this season scoring double-digit runs...they drew 7 BB—all after the rain delay off O's relievers—tied for their 2nd-most this season.
- + The Rays have scored at least 3 runs in a single inning in all 3 games so far this series...prior to this series, they hadn't scored 3 runs in an inning since the 9th inning on April 30 at DET (3).

TAKE A CHANCE—In the 2nd inning of yesterday's first game, BAL **Jace Peterson** and **Chance Sisco** pulled off a double steal, with Sisco stealing home...it was the 13th steal of home by a Rays opponent, first since **Mike Trout** on July 7, 2016 vs. LAA on a double steal with **Albert Pujols**.

DOES NOT COMPUTE—The Rays lost yesterday's first game despite out-hitting the Orioles, 8-7...the Rays are 12-10 (.545) this year when out-hitting their opponent, compared to 62-12 (.838) when doing so last season.

- + The Rays have a 3.64 ERA (72-IP, 27-ER) in May, 4th-best in the AL behind the Astros, Twins and Angels, but they are 3-7 this month.
- + The Rays are 10-10 (.500) when scoring first and only three AL teams have a lower winning percentage when doing that: the Royals (7-11, .389), Orioles (5-9, .357) and White Sox (5-12, .294).
- + The Rays are 4-7 (.364) when allowing 2 runs or fewer and 7-10 (.412) when allowing 3 runs or fewer...excluding the Rays, the rest of the majors is 307-55 (.848) when yielding 2 runs or fewer and 392-108 (.784) when yielding 3 runs or fewer.

RAYS vs. ORIOLES—Today is the sixth of 19 games between the two clubs this season, and the Rays are 3-2 thus far...they have outscored the Orioles, 34-27, and outhit them, 62-42, but have been outthomered, 11-6...the Rays have allowed at least 1 HR in all 5 games, including multiple homers

in 3 games...the Rays are 10-4 in their last 14 games against the Orioles (since July 25, 2017)...last season the Rays went 11-8 against them, their first season series win over the Orioles since 2013 (13-6).

ON THE ROAD AGAIN—This is the third of four consecutive 3-city road trips to start the season—the first time in franchise history the Rays have ever had four consecutive three-city trips...this 11-game jaunt to Baltimore (4 games), Kansas City (3 games) and Anaheim (4 games) is the Rays first trip of 11 games or more since September 2016, when they went 5-6 visiting NYY (1-3), TOR (1-2) and BAL (2-2)...the Rays welcomed new hitting coach **Chad Mottola** at the onset of that trip...the last time the Rays covered had a road trip to three different time zones was June 2008, when they went 3-6 in Boston (0-3), Texas (2-1) and Anaheim (1-2)—including the famous **James Shields-Coco Crisp** brawl at Fenway Park.

- + Yesterday the Rays began a stretch of 7 games with seven different start times...this series was the beginning of a stretch of 24 games in 24 days and 40 games in 41 days.

BATTLING THE ELEMENTS—Last night's game at BAL was the fifth of the Rays 19 games on the road this season impacted by weather:

- + April 2 at NYY (PPD, snow; made up the following day);
- + April 4 at NYY (1 hour, 32 minute rain delay);
- + April 9 at CWS (start time moved up; 21 minute snow delay);
- + April 24 at BAL (PPD, rain; made up with doubleheader);
- + May 12 (G2) at BAL (1 hour, 19 minute rain delay during game)

UP NEXT: ROYALS—The Rays are 76-77 all-time against the Royals (47-35 at home, 29-42 on the road)...since the start of 2012, the Rays are 11-29 against them (8-13 at home, 3-16 on the road)...they are 1-9-1 in 11 series since 2012 and 1-7-1 in nine series at Kauffman Stadium since 2010...they took two of 3 games at The K last Aug 28-30, their first series win over the Royals since Aug 20-22, 2012 at home and first on the road since July 17-19, 2009...the Rays are attempting to win consecutive series over the Royals for the first time since June 2-Aug 3, 2009 (3) and back-to-back series at Kauffman Stadium for the first time in club history...the Rays are 2-9 in their last 11 games at The K and 3-16 in their last 19 games there.

- + The Rays will face **Jason Hammel** on Wed at KC, which will be the eighth time in the first 41 games the club will face a former Ray.

SNELL-ZILLA—Today's starter **Blake Snell** has yielded 2 runs or fewer in six consecutive starts, longest streak by a Ray since **Erasmus Ramirez** (9) from May 30-July 18, 2015...his streak of 6 IP or more and 2 runs or fewer is tied with **James Shields** in 2011 and **Scott Kazmir** in 2008 for the longest in club history...he has allowed 5 hits or fewer in a club-record 12 consecutive starts dating back to Sep 12, 2017 vs. NYY.

ROAMING BUFFALO—Yesterday at BAL (G2), **Wilson Ramos** singled leading off the 9th inning to extend his hitting streak to 18 games...it was the fifth time overall and third time in his last 5 games he kept his streak alive with a hit in his final at-bat of the game.

- + Ramos is batting .375/.416/.611 (27-for-72) with 5 2B, 4 HR and 17 RBI over the streak, which dates back to April 14 vs. PHI.
- + His streak is the longest in the majors this season, is one game shy of tying the franchise record and one game shy of tying his career high (April 24-May 19, 2015, with the Nationals).

THIS DATE IN RAYS HISTORY—On May 13, 2014 at SEA, the Rays scored twice in the 9th inning off former teammate **Fernando Rodney** for a 2-1 win...**David DeJesus** hit the game-tying homer in the 9th, and **Matt Joyce** hit the go-ahead single...**David Price** pitched the 10th CG of his career, and it was the fourth time in franchise history at the time a pitcher recorded at least 12 SO without a walk.

LAST START—On Tues vs. ATL, his only run allowed in the 1-0 loss was a 3rd-inning homer to **Ronald Acuña Jr.** ...took his first loss since April 4 at NYY, snapping his unbeaten streak at 5 starts (4-0, 1 ND)...lost to an opponent other than the Yankees for the first time since July 24, 2017 vs. BAL...was the first Ray to take a loss in a start of more than 6 IP and 1 run or fewer since **Chris Archer** on Sep 26, 2014 at CLE (7.2-IP, 1-ER)...his line: L, 6.1 IP, 4 H, 1 R, 2 BB, 5 SO, 1 HR, 105 pit, 65 str.

WHEN HE'S ON—Has yielded 2 runs or fewer in six consecutive starts, longest streak by a Ray since **Erasmus Ramirez** (9) from May 30–July 18, 2015...has yielded 1 run or fewer in 5 starts this season, tied for 3rd in the majors behind STL **Carlos Martínez** (6) and HOU **Justin Verlander** (6) and tied for 2nd in the AL with HOU **Gerrit Cole**, TB **Jake Faria**, OAK **Sean Manaea**, HOU **Charlie Morton** and BOS **Chris Sale**.

- + While Faria and Snell have combined to allow 1 run or fewer 10 times in 16 starts, the rest of the Rays rotation has done this seven times in 21 starts.
- + Twice this year, has allowed 1 run or fewer and not gotten the win.

WHERE HE LEFT OFF—In 18 starts since his Aug 8 recall last season, he is 9-3 with a 2.64 ERA (105.2-IP, 31-ER) and .193 opp avg. (72-for-373)...min. 75 IP, his ERA over this span ranks 5th in the AL behind DET/HOU **Justin Verlander** (1.47), CLE **Corey Kluber** (1.95), CLE **Mike Clevinger** (2.24) and CLE **Carlos Carrasco** (2.59)...has yielded 2 runs or fewer in 14 of these 18 starts, 1 run or fewer in 11 starts and hasn't allowed an earned run in 5 starts...he is 5-1 with a 1.61 ERA (61.2-IP, 11-ER) in 10 starts at home over this span, compared to 4-2 with a 4.09 ERA (44-IP, 20-ER) in 8 starts on the road.

LEADERBOARDS—Ranks among AL leaders in wins (4, tied for 8th), starts (8, tied for 6th), ERA (2.40, 7th), hits per 9 IP (5.92, 7th), opp avg. (.188, 7th), WHIP (0.95, 8th), and pct. of swings that miss (31.0, 7th)...is averaging a career-high 95.1 mph on his fastball, 2nd among major league left-handed starters behind SEA **James Paxton** (95.5)...13.4 pct. of his total pitches are swings and misses, 11th in the AL and 3rd among AL lefties behind BOS **Chris Sale** (16.7) and SEA **James Paxton** (14.4).

- + His 1.07 ERA (25.1-IP, 3-ER) at home leads the AL and is tied with PHI **Jake Arrieta** for the major league lead...has allowed 1 run or fewer in seven consecutive starts at home since last Sep 12, longest such streak in franchise history passing **Scott Kazmir** (6) from Sep 27, 2007–June 17, 2008...has only allowed 3 runs in his last 43.1 IP at Tropicana Field dating back to the end of last season.

HARD TO HIT—Has allowed 5 hits or fewer in a club-record 12 consecutive starts since Sep 12, 2017...previous mark was 9 straight by **Drew Smyly** from Aug 11, 2014–May 5, 2015 and **Matt Moore** from Sep 11, 2012–April 27, 2013...this is the longest active streak in the majors, the longest by any pitcher since OAK **Sean Manaea** (16) from Aug 23, 2016–June 5, 2017 and the longest by an AL East pitcher since TOR **Marco Estrada** (13) in 2016.

PITCHING DEEPER—Has gone at least 6 IP in six consecutive starts, the longest such streak of his career (prev. 5, Aug 10–Sep 1, 2017)...has allowed 2 runs or fewer in all 6 starts—this streak of 6 IP or more and 2 runs or fewer is tied with **James Shields** in 2011 and **Scott Kazmir** in 2008 for the longest in club history...has gone at least 7 IP six times in his last 16 starts since Aug 20, 2017 vs. SEA, compared to once in 35 career starts prior to that.

vs. BALTIMORE—Is 1-1 with a 3.44 ERA (18.1-IP, 7-ER) in 3 starts against the Orioles...has made 1 start at Oriole Park at Camden Yards, on Sep 15, 2016, yielding 4 ER in 4.1 IP but took no decision...last faced them in the season finale last year, the best start of his career, totaling 7 IP, 2 H, 0 R, 0 BB and 13 SO in a 6-0 victory...the 13 SO were a career high, the most by a Rays pitcher since **Chris Archer** on June 2, 2015 at LAA (club-record 15) and most by a Rays lefty since **David Price** on Sep 25, 2012 at BOS (13)...it was only the third time in Rays history a pitcher recorded at least 13 SO without allowing a run, joining Price on Aug 28, 2011 at TOR (14) and **James Shields** on May 22, 2011 at FLA (13).

NO BRUISES INFLICTED—Has never hit a batter in 51 career starts, the longest streak by a Rays starter at any point in franchise history, passing **James Shields** (38) in 2009–10...it is the longest active streak in the majors, ahead of LAD **Clayton Kershaw** (43).

TOMORROW'S STARTER: LH RYAN YARBROUGH (2-2, 4.30 ERA)

LAST START—On Wed vs. ATL, yielded a career-high-tying 5 runs and career-high 5 ER, including 4 runs over a stretch of 10 pitches in the 3rd inning on a single, single, hit batter, sacrifice fly and 3-run homer by **Nick Markakis**...was his third homer allowed this season, all coming against left-handed batters...allowed more hits to lefties (4) than he did in his first 8 apps (1 start) combined (3)...the single allowed to Markakis leading off the 2nd inning snapped a streak of 18 consecutive batters retired since May 4 vs. TOR...his line: L, 5 IP, 6 H, 5 R, 0 BB, 7 SO, 1 HR, 79 pit, 52 str.

- + Is 0-2 with a 6.52 ERA (9.2-IP, 10-R, 7-ER) in his 2 starts this season, both against NL East opponents at home (Phillies, Braves)—and

both have included a 4-run 3rd inning against him...in comparison, is 2-0 with a 3.20 ERA in his 7 relief apps.

LOCAL PRODUCT—Ryan grew up a Rays fan and kept some 2008 World Series gear in his bedroom of his Lakeland home, which he found after he was acquired in a four-player trade from the Mariners...he would often watch games in his bedroom, and his dad followed along as he worked in the garage...the two would sometimes meet in the middle of the house after the game's most pivotal moments.

#16 KEVIN CASH, MANAGER

- + Is in his fourth season as Rays manager...at age 40, is the majors' youngest active skipper—5 months younger than SD **Andy Green**.
- + His last ejection was July 18, 2017 at OAK, his seventh ejection as Rays manager...his 7 ejections are tied for 4th in franchise history.
- + Is the sixth Tampa-born manager in major league history, and second to manage the Rays...that list includes Hall of Famers **Al Lopez** and **Tony La Russa**, **Lou Piniella**, **Dave Miley** and **John Hart**.

- + Played 12 professional seasons as a catcher, incl. parts of eight seasons in the majors (2002-10) and two years (2005-06) in the Rays org.
- + Played in the 1989 Little League World Series (Tampa Northside LL), 1999 College World Series (Florida State) and earned World Series rings in 2007 (Red Sox) and 2009 (Yankees).

- + Has multiple hits in four consecutive games, matching the longest such streak of his career (3rd time, last Aug 28-31, 2016, with LAA).
- + Has reached base safely in a career-high 18 consecutive games, dating back to April 21 vs. MIN...batting .311/.366/.581 (23-for-74) with 2 2B, 6 HR and 16 RBI over this stretch, including .316/.386/.395 (12-for-38) with 1 HR and 4 RBI since 10 games (all starts) since the beginning of May.
- + Batting .259/.302/.469 (21-for-81) with 4 HR and 12 RBI on the road, compared to .311/.371/.508 (19-for-61) with 4 HR and 11 RBI at home.
- + Has appeared in 36 games and made 35 starts (18-DH, 17-1B)...his 18 starts at designated hitter are his most since 2015 with the Angels (46).

- + Batting .262/.284/.369 (17-for-65) in 14 games, all starts, on the road, compared to .378/.420/.467 (17-for-45) in 13 games, all starts, at home.
- + Has appeared in 27 games, all starts at third base...has made 4 errors in 65 chances for a .938 fielding pct. at third base.

- + On May 4 vs. TOR, became the first Rays rookie with 3 XBH in a game since Steven Souza Jr. did it on May 31, 2015 at BAL...he became the second rookie in club history with 3 XBH in a single game out of the No. 9 spot in the batting order, following Reid Brignac on Sep 14, 2009 at BAL.
- + Has appeared in 15 games and made 11 starts (4-RF, 4-LF, 3-CF) since his selection from Triple-A Durham on April 13.

- + Despite his .199 avg., his 5 HR rank 2nd on the team...batting .270 (10-for-37) since the start of May, compared to .173 (18-for-104) thru April.
- + On Fri at BAL, hit his first triple since April 29, 2017 vs. LAA (with TEX)...marked his second multi-RBI game of the season (April 22 vs. MIN).
- + Is tied for 7th in the AL with 47 SO...has struck out in 31.3 pct. of his plate appearances this year, compared to 23.9 pct. in his career from 2007-17.
- + Has appeared in 35 games and made 34 starts (29-RF, 3-CF, 2-DH)...since the start of 2013, no other player in the majors can match his combination of 94 HR and 125 SB...is one of seven active players with at least 100 HR and 200 SB in his career, according to Baseball Reference.
