MIAMI MARLINS (46-66) vs PHILADELPHIA PHILLIES (62-48)

Sunday, August 5, 2018 – 1:35 EDT – Citizens Bank Park – Game 111 – Home 56
RHP Dan Straily (4-5, 4.41) vs RHP Aaron Nola (12-3, 2.35)

- LAST NIGHT'S ACTION:** The Phillies defeated the Miami Marlins, 8-3, on one of the most emotional nights at CBP in recent memory ... Prior to the game Roy Halladay and Pat Gillick were enshrined on the Phillies Wall of Fame ... As for the game on the field, starter Zach Eflin was dynamite, tossing 8.0 innings and allowing only 3 runs on 4 hits with 0 walks and 6 strikeouts ... The Phils brought the lumber as Nick Williams, Carlos Santana and Asdrubal Cabrera all went deep.
- A NIGHT TO CELEBRATE:** Last night, **Pat Gillick**, the architect of the 2008 World Championship team and **Roy Halladay**, were forever enshrined on the Phillies Wall of Fame ... Halladay, who pitched four seasons for the Phillies from 2010-13, won the NL Cy Young award in 2010, was twice named an All-Star while in pinstripes (2010-11) and authored the 20th perfect game as well as the second postseason no-hitter in MLB history ... Last night's game, which didn't start until 7:45pm due to the ceremonies honoring both Halladay and Gillick, took a mere 2:20 to complete ... It marked the fastest Phillies/Marlins game since Halladay's perfect game, May 29, 2010 in Miami (2:13) ... Two other items of note from last night: catcher Bryan Holaday entered the game for Miami as a defensive replacement in the 7th inning and the Phillies finished the night with 34 at bats.
- CITIZENS BANK SPARK:** The Phillies have won 11 of their last 13 games at home, 13 of their last 16 and are 37-18 (.673) at CBP this season ... They have the best home winning percentage in the National League and their win percentage at home is third-best in baseball, trailing only the Red Sox (.732) and Yankees (.704).
- REMEMBER THE FIGHTINS:** Since starting the season 1-4, the Phillies are 17 games over .500 at 61-44 and have the second-best winning percentage in the NL in that span (.581), trailing only the Cubs (.590) ... At 62-48 with a .564 winning percentage this season, the Phils currently sport a 1.5 game lead over the Atlanta Braves (59-48, .551) in National League East ... Last night's win brought the Phillies to an even 21-21 vs the NL East this season, giving them a .500 record or better against every division in the majors ... Philadelphia is one of only seven teams in MLB this year with a .500 record or better against each division (others: CHI, LAD, ARI, NYY, BOS, HOU).
- PROGRESS IN THE PROCESS:** Thus far, through 110 games, the Phils are 14 games above .500 at 62-48 and have scored 486 runs and allowed 451 (+35) ... Last season, through 110 games, they were 28 games under .500 at 41-69 and had scored 442 and allowed 528 (-86) ... The Phillies didn't notch their 62nd win last season until September 24.
- BELIEVE IT:** Friday night night marked the 150th game of **Rhys Hoskins'** young career ... His .938 career OPS (648 plate appearances) is the second-best mark among all Phillies players dating to 1900, through the first 150 games of a career, trailing only Hall-of-Famer **Chuck Klein** (1.041 OPS) ... Among all players, through their first 150 games with the Phillies, Hoskins has the fourth-best OPS since 1900, trailing only **Lefty O'Doul** (1.080), **Klein** and Hall-of-Famer **Jim Thome** (.956) ... Among all major league players who have made their debut since the year 2000, Hoskins has the eighth-best OPS through 150 games to begin a career (see chart below) ... Hoskins, 25, crushed his 40th career home run in his 149th career game on Thursday night, becoming the 2nd-fastest Phillies player to 40 career home runs (fastest: Klein, 148 G) ... Finally, On May 29 at Dodger Stadium, facing LA closer Kenley Jansen, Hoskins fouled a ball off his face resulting in a fractured jaw ... Hoskins returned on June 9 and in 224 plate appearances since being activated off the DL, he is slashing .298/.393/.623 with 35 runs, 14 2B, 16 HR, 44 RBI and 29 walks ... The only other player in the majors with as many walks and home runs as Hoskins since June 9, when he came off the DL, is STL's Matt Carpenter (21 HR, 37 BB).

- MAIK ON A MISSION:** Since he resumed a full-time role at third base on June 17, **Maikel Franco** has hit .319 with a .364 OBP and .589 SLG over 151 plate appearances and 40 games ... Franco, with 18 home runs on the season, has struck out a mere 49 times ... Among 54 players in the majors with 18 or more home runs this season, Franco's 49 strikeouts are the fewest.
- SERIESLY:** Over their last 16 series (6/12-current), the Phillies are 11-3-2 ... Philadelphia's three series losses in that span have come against the Yankees at Citizens Bank Park (1-2, 6/25-27), the Marlins in Miami (1-2, 7/13-15) and the Reds last weekend in Cincinnati (1-3) ... Philadelphia's 11 series wins in that span have come against the Rockies, Brewers, Cardinals, Nationals (2x), Orioles (2x), Pirates, Padres, Dodgers and Marlins.

LAST START: 7/30 at BOS: ND, 8.0 IP, 4 H, R, ER, BB, 6 SO ... Nola vs Price ... Rhys Hoskins had two doubles and Seranthony Dominguez (1.0 IP), Pat Neshek (0.2 IP) and Tommy Hunter (1.1 IP) all made scoreless appearances in relief.

- TODAY'S START:**
- **Go Home:** Leads all qualifying pitchers in home winning percentage (1.000), is T-1st in wins (8) and is 3rd in ERA (1.99), trailing only Blake Snell (0.97) and Jacob deGrom (1.71) ... **He is 1 of 4 Phillies starters to win at least 8 straight home decisions to start a season (Tommy Green-10 in 1993, Jack Sanford-8 in 1957, Bob Miller-8 in 1950)** ... Allowed 1 run in 6 straight home starts, 5/8-7/4, joining Woodie Fryman (1968, 6) and George McQuillan (1908, 7) as the only PHI starters to do so since at least 1908 ... Since 6/22/17, Nola is 16-3, 2.07 ERA (33 ER, 143.2 IP), 170 SO, 0.95 WHIP in 21 home starts
 - **This Means WAR:** Per Baseball Reference, Nola's WAR of 6.6 is the highest among all major league pitchers, and highest by a Phillies right-hander since Roy Halladay led the league with a WAR of 8.8 in 2011 ... **Since 1895, the only Phillies pitchers as young as Nola (age 25) to post 6.6 WAR or better in an entire season were Robin Roberts (3x), Grover Cleveland Alexander, George McQuillan and Wayne Twitchell**
 - **ML Starter Rankings:** 1st in OPP SLG % (.284), T-5th in wins (5), 6th in WHIP (0.97) & OPP AVG (.199), 7th in ERA (2.35), T-10th in IP (142.0)
 - **Limiting Homers:** His 0.44 HR/9.0 IP is 2nd among all ML starters, trailing CLE's Trevor Bauer (0.41) ... **Has allowed 1 HR in his last 50.0 IP (and had a 40.0-inn. homerless streak, 6/17-7/24)**
 - **vs NL East:** 16-11, 3.39 ERA (83 ER, 220.2 IP) in 37 starts

- HOME:**
- **2018:** 8-0, 1.99 ERA (15 ER, 68.0 IP) in 10 starts
 - **Career:** 22-12, 3.11 ERA (86 ER, 248.2 IP) in 39 starts

- 2018 SEASON:**
- Made his first career All-Star game (1.0 IP, 2 SO), becoming the first Phillies starting pitcher named to the All-Star team since Cliff Lee in 2013, and the youngest Phillies starting pitcher to be an All-Star since a 23-year-old Cole Hamels in 2007
 - Joined Steve Carlton (2.14 ERA, 155 SO in 1980) as the only Phillies pitchers with an ERA of 2.30 or lower and 130 or more SO by the All-Star break, and was the 5th Phillie to win 12 games or more by the break
 - Reached 500 career strikeouts in 480.0 innings, becoming the fastest Phillie to reach that mark, both among pitchers who started their career in PHI and any pitcher to strike out 500 in a PHI uniform
 - Became 1 of just 7 Phillies in the last 20 seasons (since 1999) with 10 wins before July 1 (Hamels in 2012, Halladay in 2011, Milton in 2004, Padilla in 2002, Byrd in 1999, Schilling in 1999)
 - Per *Elias*, he had the 2nd-most strikeouts (467) through 75 career starts by any pitcher that began his career with Philadelphia (Cole Hamels, 469) and the 5th-most by any pitcher in his first 75 starts in a Phillies uniform
 - Became the first Phillies pitcher 25 or younger to have multiple starts in a season with 10+ SO and no walks
 - Since the NL started recording ER in 1912, the only other two Phillies pitchers (min. 10 GS) to have both a lower season ERA than his 2.18 and lower season WHIP than his 0.932 through the end of May were Hall of Famers Robin Roberts (1.99 ERA, 0.919 WHIP, 1952) & Grover C. Alexander (1.58 ERA, 0.928 WHIP, 1915) - *Elias*
 - Posted a 1.80 ERA (8 ER, 40.0 IP) with 46 SO and a 0.90 WHIP in May
 - Carried a no-hitter through 6.2 innings, 5/26 vs TOR, the longest no-hit bid of his career ... Retired 18 straight at one point ... Struck out 10
 - Won each of his first 5 home starts, something no Phillie had done since 2010 (Roy Oswalt)
 - Allowed 3 ER or fewer in 13 straight starts, 9/7/17-5/13/18
 - Struck out a career-high 12 batters on 5/8 vs SF, becoming the first Phillies since 8/3/06 (Hamels) to finish a start with at least 12 strikeouts and 25 or fewer batters faced
 - Had a 14.1-inning scoreless streak, 4/27-5/8
 - Surrendered 2 runs or fewer in 8 straight starts from 9/13/17 to 4/21/18, marking the 7th time a Phillies starter has accomplished the feat since 1893 when the current mound distance was established
 - Made his first career Opening Day start on 3/29 at ATL ... At 24 years, 298 days old, he was the club's youngest Opening Day starter since Dennis Bennett in 1964 (24 years, 192 days old)

- CAREER:**
- Selected by the Phillies in the 1st round (7th overall) of the June 2014 draft out of Louisiana State University ... Was signed by Mike Stauffer ... Originally selected by Toronto in the 22nd round of the June 2011 draft, but did not sign
 - His 23.0-inning scoreless streak, 4/22-5/8/16 remains the longest by a Phillies starter since Cole Hamels' 24.2-inning streak, 6/1-21/14
 - Was the first player drafted by Philadelphia to make his ML debut the very next season since Pat Combs in 1989
