RECENT RESULTS: The Tigers dropped the series opener to the White Sox, 4-2, on Monday afternoon at Guaranteed Rate Field. Niko Goodrum and Victor Martinez each hit a solo home run in the loss, while Jeimer Candelario, JaCoby Jones and Victor Reyes each had one hit. Michael Fulmer started for Detroit and threw 5.2 innings, allowing one run on one hit with four walks and five strikeouts. Shane Greene took the loss after giving up three runs on three hits. The Tigers and White Sox play the second game of their three-game series tonight. Following the series against Chicago (AL), Detroit returns home for a six-game homestand, which includes three games vs. St. Louis (September 7-9) and three games vs. Houston (September 10-12).

V-MART STAYS HOT: Victor Martinez belted a solo home run in the ninth inning of yesterday's game, his ninth round-tripper of the season. The home run was Martinez's eighth career go-ahead homer in the ninth inning-or-later (last, August 9, 2016 at Seattle, 15th inning). Martinez now has 246 homers in his Major League career, tying him with Ken Singleton for the 16th-most among switch-hitters in MLB history. Over his last 22 games, Martinez is batting .316/.349/.519 with seven doubles, three home runs and 14 RBI.

GOODY TWO SHOES: Niko Goodrum belted his 16th home run of the season in the seventh inning yesterday. Goodrum's 16 homers are the most by a Tigers rookie since 2003 when Craig Monroe hit 23 and Eric Munson hit 18. Goodrum enters tonight's game ranked second among American League rookies with 26 doubles and 44 extra-base hits, while he ranks tied for second with 37 walks, third with 10 stolen bases, tied for third with 47 runs scored, fourth with 91 hits, 16 home runs and 169 total bases, sixth with 45 RBI and tied for sixth with 18 multi-hit games.

FILTHY FULMER: Michael Fulmer threw 5.2 innings yesterday, allowing just one run on one hit with four walks and five strikeouts. In three starts vs. the White Sox this season, Fulmer has posted a 0.57 ERA (15.2IP/1ER) with nine hits allowed and 13 strikeouts.

V-MART ON THE MARK VS. THE SOX: Victor Martinez has put up impressive numbers in his career against the White Sox. Entering tonight's game, Martinez is hitting .322/.397/.499 with 44 doubles, 32 home runs and 129 RBI in 222 games vs. Chicago (AL). He leads all active players with 255 hits and 129 RBI vs. the White Sox, while he ranks second with 32 home runs, third with a .322 batting average and fourth with a .397 on-base percentage. In 111 career games at Guaranteed Rate Field, Martinez is hitting .340/.413/.541 with 55 runs scored, 18 doubles, 21 home runs and 72 RBI.

ON THE ROAD: The Tigers are 2-5 on their current nine-game road trip, which includes two games at Kansas City (0-2), four games at New York (AL) (2-2) and three games at Chicago (AL) (0-1). Detroit is 21-49 (.300) on the road this season and has lost 29 of its last 37 games away from home. As a team, the Tigers are hitting .232 (557x2403) on the road in 2018, while the pitching staff has compiled a 5.04 ERA (592.1IP/332ER).

TIGERS AND WHITE SOX: The Tigers have a 10-7 lead in the season series against the White Sox, including a 6-1 edge in games played at Guaranteed Rate Field. Detroit has clinched the season series against Chicago (AL) for the eighth time in the last nine seasons.

CENTRAL FOCUS: The Tigers are 26-35 against American League Central opponents this season. Detroit has gone 10-7 vs. Chicago (AL), 4-12 vs. Cleveland, 6-7 vs. Minnesota and 6-9 vs. Kansas City. Detroit has finished with a winning record against AL Central teams in eight of the last nine seasons.

FULMER NAMED TIGERS NOMINEE FOR ROBERTO CLEMENTE AWARD: Michael Fulmer has been named the Tigers nominee for the 2018 Roberto Clemente Award, the most prominent individual player award from Major League Baseball. The Roberto Clemente Award is the annual recognition of a player who best represents the game of baseball through extraordinary character, community involvement, philanthropy

and positive contributions, both on and off the field. Wednesday, September 5, marks the 17th annual Roberto Clemente Day, which was established by Major League Baseball to honor Clemente's legacy and to officially acknowledge local Club nominees of the Roberto Clemente Award. The league-wide winner of the award, who will be announced during the 2018 World Series, will be selected among the group of nominees via a blue ribbon panel that includes individuals connected to the game. Additionally, fans can vote for the overall winner of the Roberto Clemente Award by visiting mlb.com/clemente21. Fan voting will run from Wednesday, September 5, until Tuesday, September 18.

NOTES ON THE SKIPPER: Ron Gardenhire is in his first season as the Tigers manager after being named to the position on October 20, 2017.

*Enters tonight's game with a 55-83 (.399) record as the Tigers manager and a 1,123-1,122 (.500) career record as a manager, which is the eighth-most wins among active managers and ranks 53rd in baseball history.

*Earned the 1,100th win of his managerial career on June 13 vs. Minnesota.

*Spent the 2017 season as the bench coach for the Arizona Diamondbacks, who captured a National League Wild Card spot and advanced to the National League Division Series.

*Served as manager of the Minnesota Twins from 2002-14 and is the winningest manager in Twins history, posting a record of 1,068-1,039 (.507) over his 13 seasons...is one of 10 managers in baseball history to win 1,000-or-more games with a single team.

*Guided the Twins to six postseason appearances (2002-04, 2006, 2009-10), including a berth in the 2002 American League Championship Series...was the first manager in MLB history to guide his team to the postseason in six of his first nine seasons.

*Named the BBWAA American League Manager of the Year in 2010...also finished runner-up for the honor on five occasions.

WHITECAPS CLINCH PLAYOFF BERTH: Single A West Michigan defeated Fort Wayne, 3-2, in 10 innings to clinch a second half wild card spot in the Midwest League playoffs. It marks the fifth straight season that the Whitecaps have advanced to the postseason. West Michigan will face Great Lakes in the first round of the playoffs, which starts Wednesday night at Fifth Third Ballpark.

ABOUT FRANCISCO: Liriano will make his 23rd appearance overall and 22nd start of the season tonight at Chicago (AL).

LAST TIME OUT: Liriano did not factor into the decision in his start on Thursday at New York (AL), allowing five runs, four earned, on seven hits with two walks and two strikeouts in 4.1 innings.

VS. CHICAGO (AL): Liriano has faced the White Sox 19 times, including 13 as a starter, posting a 6-5 record with a 4.66 ERA (85.0IP/44ER) and 76 strikeouts. He started against the White Sox earlier this year on May 26 at Comerica Park and took the loss, allowing five runs on six hits with three walks and eight strikeouts in 5.0 innings.

ON THE ROAD: Liriano has made 176 career appearances, including 151 starts, on the road, posting a 52-63 record with one save, a 4.52 ERA (847.2IP/426ER) and 836 strikeouts. In 14 road starts this season, Liriano has a 1-6 record with a 4.74 ERA (68.1IP/36ER) and 48 strikeouts.

AT GUARANTEED RATE FIELD: Liriano is making his 19th career outing and 14th career start at Guaranteed Rate Field tonight. In 18 previous appearances at the venue, Liriano has a 4-5 record with a 6.38 ERA (72.0IP/51ER) and 57 strikeouts.

AGAINST THE AL CENTRAL: Liriano has made 101 appearances, including 79 starts, in his career against teams from the American League Central, compiling a 28-32 record with a 4.75 ERA (460.0IP/243ER) and 451 strikeouts. In 11 appearances, including 10 starts, vs. AL Central foes this season, Liriano has a 1-5 record with a 4.70 ERA (51.2IP/27ER) and 43 strikeouts.

RECORD IN SEPTEMBER: Liriano has made 62 appearances, including 41 starts, in his career during the month of September, posting a 15-14 record with a 4.22 ERA (243.0IP/114ER) and 266 strikeouts. In 10 relief outings last September, Liriano had a 0-0 record with a 1.59 ERA (5.2IP/1ER) and seven strikeouts.

LOOKING BACK AT LIRIANO'S AUGUST: Liriano started five games during the month of August, compiling a 0-4 record with a 7.17 ERA (21.1IP/17ER) and 12 strikeouts.

LEFT VS. RIGHT: Liriano has limited lefthanded hitters to a .217 (314x1444) batting average in his career, while righties have hit .250 (1251x5003). In 22 appearances, including 21 starts, this season, lefties are hitting .146 (12x82), which is the third-lowest batting average against lefthanded hitters among American League pitchers (min. 80 at-bats). Righthanded batters are hitting .287 (91x317) against Liriano.

PILING UP THE PUNCHOUTS: Liriano has posted 27 games of 10-or-more strikeouts in his career. His last double-digit strikeout performance came on April 13, 2017 vs. Baltimore, when he punched out 10 batters. Liriano enters tonight's game with 1,724 strikeouts in his Major League career, which are the fifth-most by a Dominican-born pitcher in MLB history.

IMPRESSIVE START TO 2018: Liriano began the season by allowing three runs-or-fewer in each of his first seven starts. The streak was his second longest to start a season in his career, trailing only a streak of 10 straight starts from May 19-July 8, 2006.

TIGERS PITCHER OF THE MONTH FOR MARCH/APRIL: Liriano was named the Tigers Pitcher of the Month for March/April after posting a 3-1 record with a 3.38 ERA (29.1IP/11ER) and 21 strikeouts in five starts. He ranked 10th in the American League with a .196 (20x102) opponents batting average.

DON'T CALL IT A COMEBACK: Liriano has twice earned Comeback Player of the Year honors, receiving the honor in the American League with the Minnesota Twins in 2010 and in the National League with the Pittsburgh Pirates in 2013. He is the only player to win the award multiple times.

TOSSING A NO-NO: Liriano threw a no-hitter as a member of the Minnesota Twins on May 3, 2011 at Chicago (AL). He became the fifth pitcher born in the Dominican Republic to throw a no-hitter, joining Juan Marichal (1963), Ramon Martinez (1995), Jose Jimenez (1999) and Ubaldo Jimenez (2010).

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES: Liriano was signed by the Tigers as a free agent on February 23, 2018. He was originally signed by the San Francisco Giants as a non-drafted free agent on September 9, 2000. Liriano has played with six teams at the Major League level, including Minnesota (2005-12), Chicago (AL) (2012), Pittsburgh (2013-16), Toronto (2016-17), Houston (2017) and Detroit (2018).

ABOUT JORDAN: Zimmermann will make his 21st start of the season tomorrow night in the series finale at Chicago (AL).

LAST TIME OUT: Zimmermann turned in a quality start on Friday at New York (AL), but did not factor into the decision after allowing four runs, only one earned, on three hits with one walk and six strikeouts in 6.0 innings. Zimmermann threw 5.1 no-hit innings before allowing a home run to Brett Gardner to break up the no-no.

VS. CHICAGO (AL)/AT GUARANTEED RATE FIELD: Zimmermann has made 12 career starts against the White Sox, posting a 5-4 record with a 6.26 ERA (64.2IP/45ER) and 43 strikeouts. He has faced Chicago (AL) four times this season and is 0-2 with an 8.85 ERA (20.1IP/20ER) and 16 strikeouts. In five career starts at Guaranteed Rate Field, Zimmermann is 1-1 with a 6.35 ERA (28.1IP/20ER) and 17 strikeouts.

TRACKING THE TIGERS
