MARINERS NOTES:

- The Mariners improve to 35-18 in 1-run games this season, the most 1-run wins in the Majors...the Mariners 35 one-run wins equal the single-season club record (also: 2009).
- The Mariners improve to 19-15 against the AL East this season.
- The Mariners bullpen has allowed only 2 runs over its last 16.0 innings dating back to 9/5 vs. BAL... during that span, the bullpen has posted a 1.13 ERA (2 ER, 16.0 IP) with 18 strikeouts.
- The Mariners bullpen picked up their 29th win of the season... is tied for 4th most wins by the bullpen in club history (also: 1996 & 2007)... the club record is 33 wins by the bullpen (2x, 2001 & 2002).
- Edwin Díaz** recorded his Major League-leading 54th save of the season...his 54 saves are 5th-most in single-season Major League history.
 - Improves to 27-for-30 (90.0%) in one-run save opportunities this season, extending his single-season Major League record (previous: Eric Gagne-LAD, 24, 2003)...in those 30 appearances, Díaz has a 0.89 ERA (3 ER, 30.1 IP) with 55 strikeouts and 5 walks.
- Shawn Armstrong** has yet to allow a run with the Mariners this season, tallying 7.1 scoreless innings with 6 strikeouts and only 3 hits allowed... has retired 21 of the 25 batters he has faced.
- Alex Colomé** improves to 4-0 1.57 ERA (5 ER, 28.2 IP) over his last 28 appearances (6/30 – c)... during this span, he has recorded 35 strikeouts, and 9 walks, while limiting opposing batters to a .200 (21x105) average against.
- Robinson Canó** (2x4, R, RBI) has hit safely in 21 of 28 career games against the Yankees, including reaching base safely in 24 of 26 starts...overall, is batting .330 (34x103) with 14 runs scored, 4 doubles, 4 home runs, and 15 RBI in 28 career games against New York-AL.
 - Recorded his 18th multi-hit game of the season.
 - Is batting .333 (7x21) with 4 runs, 1 double, 1 home run, and 2 RBI on the current homestand.
 - Drove in Mitch Haniger in the 8th inning to record his 6th game-winning RBI of the season.
- Ryon Healy** (1x4, RBI) is batting .333 (24x72) with 7 runs scored, 2 doubles, 3 home runs, 14 RBI, and 4 walks in his last 20 games.
- Guillermo Heredia** (1x2, BB) reached base safely multiple times for the 25th time this season, ranks T9th most on team... ranks 4th on the team with an 8.9% walk rate, trailing Mitch Haniger (10.4%), Robinson Cano (10.3%), and Nelson Cruz (9.3%).
- Erasmó Ramirez** has tossed at least 5.0 innings and allowed 2 or fewer earned runs in 5 of his last 6 starts.

YANKEES NOTES:

- The Yankees are now 14-8 in their last 22 games.
- The Yankees failed to hit a home run today, snapping a streak of 14 consecutive games with a home run at Safeco Field... streak was the 2nd-longest streak by an opponent at Safeco Field (Oakland, 23, 9/13/14-5/16/17).
- Yankees pitchers have recorded 8+ strikeouts in a Major League-record 23 consecutive games.
- CC Sabathia** is 14-6 with a 2.60 ERA (55 ER, 190.2 IP) in 29 career starts against the Mariners... is his lowest ERA against any opponent... his 2.24 ERA (25 ER, 100.1 IP) at Safeco field is the 3rd-lowest ERA at Safeco Field (min. 75.0 IP), trailing Bartolo Colon (1.98) and Dan Haren (2.00)... is the 8th-lowest ERA by any active pitcher at any ballpark.
 - Is 7-0 with a 1.34 ERA (9 ER, 60.2 IP) in his last 8 starts at Safeco Field.
- Gleyber Torres** (1x4) has hit safely in 18 of his last 22 games, including 9 multi-hit games...he's batting .318 (28x88) during that span.
- Miguel Andújar** (2x4, RBI, 2B) picked up his 77th RBI with a double in the 1st inning...leads all rookies in multiple offensive categories, including: RBI (77), runs (74), hits (150) and doubles (39).
 - Recorded his 47th multi-hit game of the season, ranks T6th in the AL (most: J.D. Martinez, 55).
- Giancarlo Stanton** recorded his 30th double of the season, joining J.D. Martinez as the only other player in the Majors this season to record 30 doubles and 30 home runs so far this year... Stanton is the first Yankees player to record 30 doubles and 30 home runs in a single season since **Robinson Cano** in 2012 (33 HR, 48 2B).
- Luke Voit** is batting (5x19) with 3 runs, 2 home runs, and 3 RBI on the current road trip.
 - Recorded his 6th multi-hit game of the season.

NEW YORK MANAGER AARON BOONE:

On if he thought the strike zone was an issue all game long:

"I'm going to have to go back and look. It seemed a little, both ways, some in and out calls, but I'd really have to review it and talk to our guys."

On CC Sabathia struggling in the 1st inning, but settling in as the game progressed:

"Yeah he did, because I thought he was really scuffling there in the first couple of innings. He was able to make the adjustment. I thought he started throwing his cutter, driving it inside, which had been a little bit of a problem for him the last couple of starts. I thought his slider was good. I thought he had a really good feel for his slider as the game went on, and was able to flip that in for a strike whenever he needed it. Overall, I thought he pitched well for us."

On if he thought the ball would drop in for a hit on the fly ball to right field for the last out of the game:

"I wasn't sure. The bat went flying over our heads, so you're kind of flinching at that initially. Haniger is a great outfielder, and not sure where it was going to end up, and seeing him lay out for it, so a great play by him. He's a really good right fielder."
